The City Manager stated that Mayor Pro Tem Moore and Councilmember Sarno recommended that the City renegotiate the billing terms with the contractor to reflect a change in the billing from hourly to a flat rate. Mayor Rios tabled Item.

CITY COUNCIL

6. CITY MANAGER REPORT

The City Manager reported the he and Councilmembers Rounds and Trujillo would be going to Sacramento on Wednesday, April 29, for the League of California Cities Legislative Action Day; water conservation issues will be discussed. New State mandates require that the City reduce water usage by 16%. On May 21, the Dept. of Health services will conduct a training exercise involving the landing of helicopters at the Sculpture Garden. Chief Crook will confirm details as the event nears.

NEW BUSINESS

8. Update on the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

Noe Negrete gave the report which was for informational purposes only.

Councilmember Rounds asked for more information on the Activity Center Flooring Project. Mr. Negrete stated that the use of gymnastics equipment on the basketball courts makes it difficult to change the flooring material from the current rubberized material to wood. Community Services will re-examine programming before determining the best flooring choice. Mayor Pro Tem Moore suggested that this question be posed to the Parks & Recreation Committee. Maricela Balderas stated that staff will meet with the gymnastics coaches to discuss programming options.

Councilmember Rounds asked for more information on the Lakeview Park Restroom renovation. Mr. Negrete stated that it will be necessary to close the restrooms during the renovation and signs stating the closure must be posted. Plans should be completed in next two months. Construction is planned to begin as soon as school is out in June 2016.

Councilmember Trujillo asked if the exterior painting at the Clarke Estate is being done now. Mr. Negrete replied that some interior painting is being done now in conjunction with wall repair. The exterior painting will be done next year.

Councilmember Trujillo asked if the Town Center Hall audio/visual replacement had been completed. Technology Director Alex Tong stated that it was. Councilmember Trujillo asked if additions could still be made. Mr. Tong stated that changes could still be made, but currently work is being done at the Gus Velasco Neighborhood Center.

Councilmember Sarno asked if the citywide network upgrade had been completed. Alex Tong stated that the wires were all in place, but structural work needed to be completed. Councilmember Rounds stated that the Soaring Dreams fountain was dark at 8:00 p.m. Mr. Negrete stated that it should be lit at that time and that he will check the schedule.

9. Real Property Lease Agreement – Horizon Nursery

Three revisions to the agreement were distributed to Council. On page one under rental, \$7850 was changed to \$4,000; on page two, sublease, tenants shall not sublease was added; on page three, item 8, insurance is binding upon insurance rating of A++.

Family & Youth Intervention Program Supervisor Mary Tavera gave a presentation on the program. Mayor Rios presented plaques to the contributors. The Mayor recognized the staff that coordinated this program: Supervisor Rick Brown, Program Coordinator Mary Tavera, Case Worker Paul Brascia, and Fire Protection Inspector I Crista King.

26. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Oral Communications were opened at 7:58 p.m. There being no one wishing to speak, Oral Communications were closed.

27. EXECUTIVE TEAM REPORTS

Noe Negrete reported that the Clarke Estate Reception Area project has been completed. The first event is scheduled on May 1. He commended Associate Civil Engineer Robert Garcia for managing the project and staying on schedule. The fallen wall has been reconstructed and the balconies and walls have been seismically reinforced. A temporary traffic signal has been installed at Florence and Roseton due to the I-5 Widening project. Councilmember Rounds stated that he was pleased that the artwork in the concrete at the Clarke Estate was preserved during the construction projects.

Dino Torres reported that May 15 is National Peace Officers Day. A new program designed to introduce Police Officers to the community, "Coffee with a Cop," will be held at the Starbucks adjacent to the Police Services Center.

Rick Brown reported on the Cesar Chavez Day of Service at the National Chavez Center. A recognition event for the volunteers will be held on May 13.

Mike Crook reported that truck 811, an aerial apparatus, was damaged by another vehicle while being serviced at a repair shop. The JPIA has accepted this incident as a valid claim and will pursue damage recovery. Currently, this company will use a pickup truck to the carry the necessary equipment. Firefighters will once again participate in "Fill the Boot" for Muscular Dystrophy research on May 12, 19, and 21.

Jose Gomez reported on a computer-related CIP project by Technology staff to expand storage capacity.

Maricela Balderas reported on the Volunteer Recognition Reception.

Councilmember Sarno complimented the SFS Soroptimist on the Miss SFS program and the staff of the Explorer program for their success. He also thanked the Family & Youth Intervention staff for their work on "Every 15 Minutes."

Councilmember Trujillo remarked that the Miss SFS pageant was run by volunteers and thanked them all. She also thanked the Fire personnel that volunteer in the Explorer program.

Councilmember Rounds complimented staff at Heritage Park on the Children's Day event, and remarked that the City was very active this past week. He thanked the staff and volunteers for doing so much.

Mayor Pro Tem Moore stated that the Dept. of Fire-Rescue responded to a 93 year-old friend's house and was impressed with professionalism of the personnel.

Mayor Rios thanked the staff and volunteers for accomplishing all the good and serving the community and Council.
