6. Resolution No. 9605 - Request for Parking Restrictions during Certain Hours on Clark Street between Springdale Avenue and Bloomfield Avenue

- Appropriate \$9,300 from the General Fund reserves to the Contract Patrol activity to adjust the budgeted funds available for FY 2018-19 lease financing debt service.
