Mr. Morrell noted the RFP has already been done, and if directed to do so a notice can be sent to each interested party that responded to the RFP. The time frame would range close to two (2) months.

Mayor Sarno inquired whether it would be close to one month to begin.

Mr. Morrell inquired whether the item would be brought forward to Council for approval once the firm is selected and whether the process would begin immediately after approval.

Mayor Sarno inquired if a rough estimate timeline could be provided.

Mr. Morrell noted around six to seven months.

Mayor Sarno inquired whether that would be enough time to begin and meet requirements.

Mr. Morrell noted it would be enough time.

Mr. Morrell continued his presentation.

Council Member Moore inquired whether the RFP was sent out or it was just prepared.

Mr. Morrell noted that the RFP was already prepared.

Bob Kishita, Vice President from MDG Associates, Inc. provided additional information in regards to the development of the housing program.

Mayor Sarno inquired about the development on Carmenita, if there is any low moderate housing in that location.

Mr. Morrell noted there is not, however, there can credit above that area, however, there is a low possibility within the 30% mark.

Council Member Zamora asked the developer how they can work this development alongside the CRIA project.

Mr. Kishita noted that he did not have an answer at the time however can further research and provide further information at a later time.

Council Member Zamora inquired what income bracket the veterans fall into.

Mr. Kishita noted that veterans are generally considered really low income.

Council Member Zamora noted that it just makes it competitive.

Mr. Kishita referred to the chart that was distributed to Council, listing the housing cost for each home.

Council Member Moore requested the representative from Janice Hahn's office, Ivan Sulic to speak on the support that will be given from Janice Hahn's office for this project.

Ivan Sulic, representative from Janice Hahn's office noted they would be in full support of the project as noted in the letter provided to Council.

Mr. Sulic noted that they would do their best to support the program.

(SFS Hospitality, LLC)

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council:

- Open the Public Hearing and receive any comments from the public regarding Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 75, and thereafter close the Public Hearing.
- Approve Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 75 subject to the conditions of approval contained within this report.

BACKGROUND

The Sculpture Garden, located on the southwest corner of Telegraph Road and Norwalk Boulevard, was designed in 1997 to provide a park setting and a retail/hotel mixed-use land activity to cater to the future housing development on the east side of Norwalk Boulevard (The Villages at Heritage Springs) and to the general business community in the City. The park portion of Sculpture Gardens was built, however the mixed-use element was not developed due to an economic downturn. Since then, the mixed-use portion of the Sculpture Garden has remained undeveloped.

Recently, there has been an interest to develop a 1.07-acre portion of the Sculpture Garden. The Applicant, under the name of SFS Hospitality, LLC, approached City Staff with plans to construct a 77,900 Sq. Ft. five-story hotel (four stories of hotel amenities and one story for their open roof terrace). After productive negotiations, the Applicant and Staff came to an agreement to build the hotel. Concurrent with this request, the Applicant is seeking the necessary land entitlements for the hotel development. The hotel will become part of the Hilton Garden chain with a substantial number of amenities catering to the business consumers such as a roof terrace, and a banquet room for large meetings and assemblies, which may be partitioned for smaller occupancies.

The hotel will further provide a swimming pool area equipped with a pleasant garden setting and a roof terrace with views to the San Gabriel Mountains. As part of the amenities, the Applicant is proposing to provide alcoholic beverages to its adult guests while they repose in the pool area, the garden area or the roof terrace.

In accordance with Section 155.628 of the City's Zoning Regulations, the Applicant is requesting approval of Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 75 to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption. Also, concurrent with this request, the Applicant is seeking approval for an alcohol license from the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC), which is the state government authority overseeing alcohol sales. If the ABC license is denied to the Applicant, he will have one-year to look for an alternative approach in purchasing or transferring an ABC license, otherwise, the Applicant will need to request to have this Permit extended accordingly.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject hotel site will be located on the southwest corner of Telegraph Road and Norwalk Boulevard, The main entry will be on Norwalk Boulevard. Both Telegraph Road and Norwalk Boulevard are classified as a Major Highways within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan.

ZONING AND LAND USE

The subject property, as well as the surrounding properties are zoned Heavy Manufacturing (M-2). The property to the north, formally developed with a Chevron Service station, is currently undeveloped; no plans are in sight to develop the corner lot. The property to the east is developed with a 3-story bank building with office spaces on the upper floors. The property to the south is developed with light-industrial multi-tenant buildings commonly known as Heritage Corporate Center. The property to the west is developed with a 2-story office building and Geezers Restaurant. The property to the northeast is developed with a 3-story office building currently occupied by medical and rehabilitation offices, a food court, and a pedestrian bridge that extends across and above the street intersection into the proposed hotel development, conveniently accessible to the future hotel guests.

LEGAL NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

This matter was set for Public Hearing in accordance with the requirements of Sections 65090 and 65091 of the State Planning, Zoning and Development Laws and the requirements of Sections 155.860 through 155.864 of the City's Municipal Code.

On October 25, 2018, legal notice of the Public Hearing for the proposed Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit was sent by first class mail to all property owners whose names and addresses appear on the latest County Assessor's Roll within 500-feet of the exterior boundaries of the subject property. The legal notice was also posted in Santa Fe Springs City Hall, the City Library and Town Center as required by the State Zoning and Development Laws and by the City's Zoning Regulations. A Notice was also published in the Whittier Daily Newspaper on October 25, 2018. To date, Staff has not received any inquiries regarding the proposal.

ZONING ORDINANCE REQUIREMENTS

Section 155.628 (B), regarding the sale or service of alcoholic beverages, states the following:

"A Conditional Use Permit shall be required for the establishment, continuation or enlargement of any retail, commercial, wholesale, warehousing or manufacturing business engaged in the sale, storage or manufacture of any type of alcoholic beverage meant for on or off-site consumption. In establishing the requirements for such uses, the Planning Commission and City Council shall consider, among other criteria, the following:

- a. Conformance with parking regulations. Based on the project's Development Plan Approval submittal, the proposed hotel will provide sufficient parking for its guests and employees. Moreover, the hotel will be providing parking equipped with charging stations for electric powered vehicles.
- b. Control of vehicle traffic and circulation. According to the plans submitted for the Development Plan Approval entitlement for this hotel project, the subject property has on-site vehicle circulation with ingress and egress driveways on Norwalk Boulevard.
- c. Hours and days of operation. The hotel itself will be operational 24-hours a day, seven days per week. Alcohol Sales will be not be permitted from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. as required by ABC.
- d. Security and/or law enforcement plans. As part of the conditions of approval, the Applicant is required to submit and maintain a Security Plan.
- e. Proximity to sensitive and/or incompatible land uses, such as schools, religious facilities, recreational or other public facilities attended or utilized by minors. The proposed hotel is over ¾-miles within walking distance to schools, and religious facilities. The hotel will allow children into the premises. The proposed conditions of approval and the ABC regulations are designed to mitigate any foreseeable negative impacts related to the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- f. Proximity to other alcoholic beverage uses to prevent the incompatible and undesirable concentration of such uses in an area. The proposed hotel is within walking distance to other restaurants selling alcohol beverages. Each use within the City is regulated by their respective conditional use permit, the City's Municipal Code, and ABC's regulations. The established regulations minimize and/or mitigate any negative impacts usually associated with overconcentration of alcoholic beverage establishments.
- g. Control of noise, including noise mitigation measures. According to the

proposed plans, there is no indication that the hotel will generate noise. Moreover, the proposed hotel is not proposing outdoor entertainment that may create noise. Upon the hotel's desire to provide outdoor entertainment, management will be required to obtain an Entertainment Permit. The hotel is also subject to the City's allowable ambient noise regulations.

- h. Control of littering, including litter mitigation measures. As part of the conditions of approval, the Applicant, and/or his employees, are required to maintain the property free of trash and debris; moreover, the City's Property Maintenance Ordinance prohibits trash and debris on any property.
- i. Property maintenance. As part of the conditions of approval, the Applicant is required to maintain the immediate area in compliance with the City's Property Maintenance Ordinance.
- j. Control of public nuisance activities, including, but not limited to, disturbance of the peace, illegal controlled substances activity, public drunkenness, drinking in public, harassment of passersby, gambling, prostitution, sale of stolen goods, public urination, theft, assaults, batteries, acts of vandalism, loitering, curfew violations, sale of alcoholic beverages to a minor, lewd conduct or excessive police incident responses resulting from the use. Staff has generated conditions of approval to mitigate or fully eliminate these negative impacts should they become a public nuisance. It should be noted that some of the listed activities are out of the control of the Applicant and/or his employees, but the Applicant is aware that he or his employees and/or security are to immediately contact the Whittier Police whenever they see these activities take place.

STAFF COMMENTS

As part of the permit review process, staff has conducted a review of the Applicant's proposed plans for the new hotel to ensure compliance with other regulatory ordinances and codes. Currently, the Applicant is proposing to serve alcoholic beverages from a portable/mobile bar within the pool area, the roof terrace, or during private engagements inside the banquet room(s). The listed conditions of approval have been prepared to ensure the proper and lawful ongoing operation of the alcoholic beverage sales use.

Staff is recommending approval of the Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit request by the Applicant, subject to the conditions of approval set forth herein. Staff is also recommending a compliance review report of this Permit within one year from the approval date by the City Council (November 20, 2019), at which time Staff will evaluate the on-going business activities as they relate to the alcohol sales. Within the compliance review report, Staff will make recommendation to modify, add or remove conditions of approval as they see necessary and in agreement with the Applicant.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. That the Alcoholic Beverage License, allowing the on-site sale of alcoholic beverages, shall be restricted to the sale for consumption of alcohol beverages on the subject site only; the use shall not sell alcoholic beverages for transport and/or for consumption off the subject premise.
- 2. That the Applicant shall install a video recording surveillance system with the following minimum configuration: Cameras capable of recording in HD at 5Mbs to capture 1080P video at 30 FPS, and a Network Video Recorder (NVR) which can record at 1080P video per channel. Moreover, the Applicant shall allow City law enforcement officers to view security surveillance video footage immediately upon their request.
- 3. That it shall be the responsibility of the on-site management to ensure that all alcoholic beverages purchased on the subject site shall be consumed within the business establishment; all stored alcoholic beverages shall be kept in a locked and secured area that is not accessible to patrons.
- 4. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person who is intoxicated, or under the influence of any drug, to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises, as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the Business and Professions Code.
- 5. That there will be a corporate officer or manager, 25 years of age or older, on the licensed premises during all public business hours, who will be responsible for the business operations concerning the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- 6. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not sell, furnish, or give any alcohol to any habitual drunkard or to any obviously intoxicated person, as set forth in Section 25602 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 7. That the applicant shall not have upon the subject premises any alcoholic beverage(s) other than the alcoholic beverage(s) which the licensee is authorized to sell under the licensee's license, as set forth in Section 25607 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 8. That the Applicant and/or any of his employees shall not sell, furnish, or give any alcoholic beverage to any person under 21 years of age, as set forth in Section 25658 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 9. That solicitation of drinks is prohibited; that is, an employee of the licensed premises shall not solicit alcoholic drinks from customers. Refer to Section 303

of the California Penal Code and Section 25657 of the Business and Professions Code.

- 10. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not permit any person less than 21 years of age to sell alcoholic beverages.
- 11. That a copy of these conditions shall be posted and maintained with a copy of the City Business License, in a place conspicuous to all employees of the location.
- 12. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person to loiter on the subject premises, shall report all such instances to Whittier Police; and, shall post signs, as approved by the Department of Police Services, prohibiting loitering.
- 13. That in order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the Applicant shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. The sign shall prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles and indicate that unauthorized vehicles will be removed at the owner's expense and also contain the California Vehicle Code that permits this action. The sign shall also contain the telephone number of the local law enforcement agency (Police Services Center (562) 409-1850). The lettering within the sign shall not be less than one inch in height. The applicant shall contact the Police Services Center for an inspection no later than 30 days after the project has been completed and prior to the occupancy permit being issued.
- 14. That the proposed buildings, including any lighting, fences, walls, cabinets, and poles shall be maintained in good repair, free from trash, debris, litter and graffiti and other forms of vandalism. Any damage from any cause shall be repaired within 72 hours of occurrence, weather permitting, to minimize occurrences of dangerous conditions or visual blight. Paint utilized in covering graffiti shall be a color that matches the color of the existing and/or adjacent surfaces.
- 15. That it shall be the responsibility of the Applicant and/or his employees to monitor outdoor consumption of alcoholic beverages; consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted within the outdoor pool area, however, not permitted in the outer perimeter such as the parking areas, entry garden, adjacent parks or such. Signs shall be placed in a conspicuous areas to notify customers that consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited outside of the pool area.
- 16. That security personnel shall not perform any law enforcement functions; instead, security personnel shall report immediately to the Whittier Police Department all incidents in which a person could be charged with a misdemeanor or a felony offense.

- 17. That security personnel, as well as the owner, corporate officers and managers, shall cooperate fully with all city officials, and law enforcement personnel, and, shall not obstruct or impede their entrance into the licensed premises while in the course of their official duties.
- 18. That in the event the Applicant intends to sell, lease or sublease the subject business operation or transfer the subject Permit to another owner/applicant or licensee, the Director of Police Services shall be notified in writing of said intention not less than (60) days prior to signing of the agreement to sell, lease or sublease.
- 19. That this permit is contingent upon the approval by the Department of Police Services of an updated security plan which shall address the following for the purposes of minimizing risks to the public health, welfare, and safety:
 - (A) A description of the storage and accessibility of alcoholic beverages on display, as well as surplus alcoholic beverages in storage;
 - (B) A description of crime prevention barriers in place at the subject premises, including, but not limited to: placement of signage, landscaping, ingress and egress controls, security systems, and site plan layouts;
 - (C) A description of how the applicant plans to educate employees on their responsibilities; actions required of them with respect to enforcement of laws dealing with the sale of alcohol to minors; and, the conditions of approval set forth herein;
 - (D) A business policy requiring employees to notify the Police Services Center of any potential violations of law or this Conditional Use Permit, occurring on the subject premises, and the procedures for such notifications.
 - (E) The City's Director of Police Services may, at his discretion, require amendments to the Security Plan to assure the protection of the public's health, welfare, and safety.
- 20. That this Permit shall be subject to a compliance review in one year, commencing from the date that the Certificate of Occupancy is issued from the Building Department, to ensure the alcohol sales activity is still operating in strict compliance with the original conditions of approval. At this time, Staff may recommend to the Planning Commission that additional conditions be added to address any concerns or mitigate potential negative impacts to the general community.

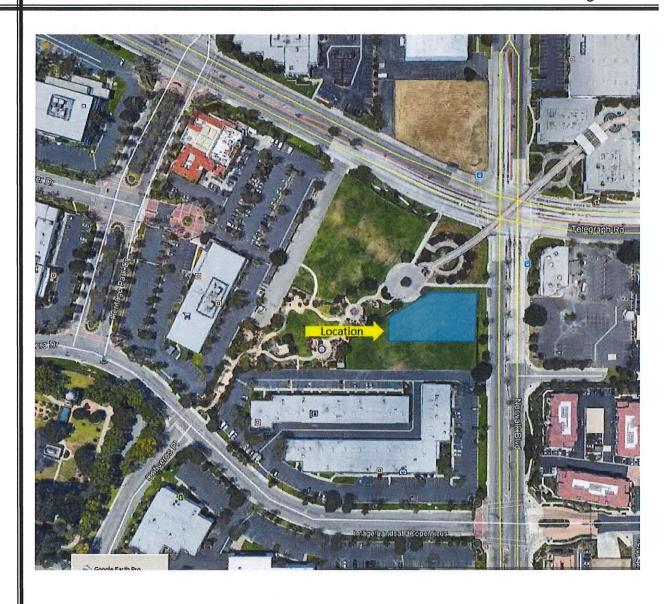
- 21. That all other applicable requirements of the City Municipal Code, Uniform Building Code, Uniform Fire Code, the security plan, and all other applicable regulations shall be strictly complied with.
- 22. That ASCUP Case No. 75 shall be subject to any other conditions the City Council may deem necessary to impose.
- 23. It is hereby declared to be the intent, that if any provision of this permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute, or ordinance is violated, this Permit shall be subject to the revocation process at which time, the Permit may become terminated and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

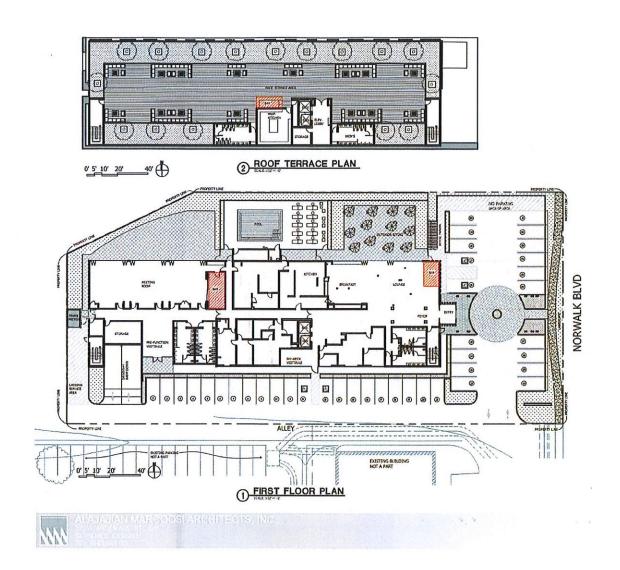

ORDINANCE FOR INTRODUCTION

Ordinance No. 1096 – An Ordinance of the City of Santa Fe Springs amending Section 97.340 (Underground Storage Tank Standards) of Chapter 97 (Environmental Protection) of Title IX (General Regulations) of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code to Update the Section to Comply with State Law

RECOMMENDATION(S)

That the City Council take the following actions:

Waive further reading and introduce Ordinance No. 1096.

BACKGROUND

On July 14, 2015 The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published a revision of the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Regulations. These changes established Federal requirements that were similar to the Energy Policy Act of 2005. These changes included: adding secondary containment requirements for new and replaced tanks and piping; adding operator training requirements; adding periodic operation and maintenance requirements for UST systems; addressing UST systems deferred in the 1988 UST regulation; adding new release prevention and detection technologies; updating codes of practice; making editorial corrections and technical amendments; and updating state program approval requirements to incorporate these new changes. EPA thinks these changes will protect human health and the environment by reducing the number of releases to the environment and quickly detecting releases, if they occur. The State of California incorporated these revisions into the California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16 (Underground Tank Regulations.

SUMMARY

The new State underground storage tanks regulations became effective October 1, 2018. Some of the new requirements conflict with City Ordinance. The proposed Ordinance revisions will remove the conflicts between local Ordinance and new State regulations. Specific changes include, but are not limited to, removing the City's local requirement to test the secondary containment of underground tank in a manner that is different than State regulation and eliminating overfill protection exemptions that are no longer allowed by State regulation. This review was also used as an opportunity to look at other necessary changes which are the result of both regulatory and procedural changes.

ORDINANCE NO. 1096

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS AMENDING SECTION 97.340 (UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK STANDARDS) OF CHAPTER 97 (ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION) OF TITLE IX (GENERAL REGULATIONS) OF THE SANTA FE SPRINGS MUNICIPAL CODE TO UPDATE THE SECTION TO COMPLY WITH STATE LAW

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published a revision to the Underground Storage Tank Regulations;

WHEREAS, the State of California revised the Code of Regulations to implement the EPA revisions regarding Underground Storage Tanks and the new regulations became effective on October 1, 2018;

WHEREAS, the revised regulations are in conflict with the underground storage tank standards in Section 97.340 of the Municipal code;

WHEREAS, in addition Section 97.340 needs to be updated to institute regulatory and/or procedural changes to more efficiently effectuate the provisions of the Section; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend Section 97.340 for the aforementioned reasons.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- **SECTION** 1. Section 97.340 (Underground Storage Tank Standards) of Chapter 97 (Environmental Protection) of Title IX (General Regulations) of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code is hereby repealed.
- **SECTION 2.** Chapter 97 (Environmental Protection) of Title IX (General Regulations) of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code is hereby amended with the addition of the following new Section 97.340 (Underground Storage Tank Standards) as follows:

§ 97.340 UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK STANDARDS.

(A) Underground storage tanks, their installation, modification, repair, upgrade, removal, closure, and modification, shall, at all times, comply with the guidelines, standards, and forms that have been established in the Fire Department's Underground Storage Tank Installation Application Package and Underground Storage Tank Closure Application Package, and pursuant to this chapter, California Code of Regulations, California Health and Safety Code, and any other applicable_adopted laws and regulations. Applications for a change of

underground storage tank ownership or permit transfer shall be done using the "Underground Storage Tank Change of Ownership/Permit Transfer Package."

- (B) It shall be unlawful for any business, handler, owner or other person, to construct, install, modify, repair, upgrade, maintain, temporarily close, remove or abandon in place any underground storage tank system, any associated piping or any monitoring equipment without first obtaining a permit as defined in § 97.405 and written approval from the Fire Department. The Fire Chief may waive this requirement for the replacement of sensors and line leak detectors with identical make and model numbers as the existing equipment. Procurement of a permit pursuant to this section shall not excuse a business, handler, owner or other person from complying with all permit and other requirements of Title XV [Land Usage] of the code.
- (C) Spill Container Testing shall, at all times, be performed in accordance with the city's "Standard for Annual Spill Container Testing." Variations to this standard may be requested in writing and are subject to the Fire Chief's written approval.
- (D) Sensors used to detect liquid for purposes of detecting a leak from an underground storage tank system shall, at all times, be retestable.
- (E) In accordance with H&SC § 25299.2(a), the Fire Department hereby adopts the following local regulations in addition to the California Underground Storage Tank Regulations Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16, CCR and Chapter 6.7 of the H&SC:
- (1) Interior tank lining referenced in 23 CCR §§ 2662(c) and 2663 is not allowed unless approved by the Fire Chief in writing.
- (2) The use of bladder systems referenced in 23 CCR § 2662(c) and § 2664 is not allowed unless approved by the Fire Chief in writing.
- (3) Cathodic protection for underground storage tank systems referenced in 23 CCR § 2662(c) and § 2666(b) is not allowed as a means of meeting corrosion protection requirements unless approved by the Fire Chief in writing.
- (4) Underground tanks used for emergency spill containment tank must comply with § 97.335(B) of the Spill Containment and Secondary Containment Standards.
- (5) Installation of discriminating sensors for purposes of meeting the requirements for underground storage tanks system monitoring as described in 23 CCR Division 3, Chapter 16, Sections 2620- 2666 is prohibited unless the sensors are programmed to alarm upon the detection of any hazardous substance. Water alarm and warning levels are subject to the approval of the Fire Chief.

APPROVED: ITEM NO.:

- (6) Construction of a new underground storage tank inside any buried or partially buried underground storage tank to replace the primary or secondary containment or to provide a new interstitial space is not allowed.
- (F) Underground storage tank systems installed after July 1, 2004 shall be constructed using rigid penetration fittings for sumps.
- (G) The installation of below grade vaulted tanks containing a California Fire Code Class I, II, or IIIA liquid is subject to the approval of the Fire Chief.

NEW BUSINESS

City-Wide Striping 2018 - Award of Contract

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council take the following actions:

- Appropriate \$194,000 from the Bond Capital Improvement Funds to Account PW180022;
- Accept the bids; and
- Award a contract to Superior Pavement Markings Inc. of Cypress, California, in the amount of \$235,496.35.

BACKGROUND

On June 14, 2018 the City Council rejected all City-Wide Striping Bids and authorized the City Engineer to re-bid the project due to the bids exceeding the project budget. Staff revised and streamlined the bid documents in an attempt to clarify the bid items and reduce the total project cost. On September 13, 2018, the City Council authorized the City Engineer to re-advertise for construction bids for the project comprising of stenciling traffic legends, traffic striping, and the removal/replacement of raised reflective pavement markers on the City's major arterials and minor collectors.

The construction bids were opened October 23, 2018 and once again the construction bids exceeded the project budget. Staff has confirmed the bids received are a reflection of the current fair market value for this specialized type of work. IN THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS

This Contract Agreement is made and entered into the above-stated project this <u>8th</u> day of <u>November, 2018</u> BY AND BETWEEN the City of Santa Fe Springs, as AGENCY, and <u>Superior Pavement Markings</u> as CONTRACTOR in the amount of <u>\$235,496.35</u>.

WITNESSETH that AGENCY and CONTRACTOR have mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I

The contract documents for the aforesaid project shall consist of the Notice Inviting Sealed Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, General Specifications, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Plans, and all referenced specifications, details, standard drawings, CDBG contract provisions and forms, and appendices; together with this Contract Agreement and all required bonds, insurance certificates, permits, notices, and affidavits; and also including any and all addenda or supplemental agreements clarifying, or extending the work contemplated as may be required to ensure its completion in an acceptable manner. All of the provisions of said contract documents are made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE II

For and in consideration of the payments and agreements to be made and performed by AGENCY, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish all materials and perform all work required for the above-stated project, and to fulfill all other obligations as set forth in the aforesaid contract documents.

ARTICLE III

CONTRACTOR agrees to receive and accept the prices set forth in the Proposal as full compensation for furnishing all materials, performing all work, and fulfilling all obligations hereunder. Said compensation shall cover all expenses, losses, damages, and consequences arising out of the nature of the work during its progress or prior to its acceptance including those for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and time specified in the aforesaid contract documents; and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties or obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work, suspension or discontinuance of the work, and all other unknowns or risks of any description connected with the work.

ARTICLE IV

AGENCY hereby promises and agrees to employ, and does hereby employ, CONTRACTOR to provide the materials, do the work and fulfill the obligations according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the prices aforesaid, and hereby contracts to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions set forth in the contract documents. No work or portion of the work shall be paid for until it is approved for payment by the City Engineer. Payment made for completed portions of the work shall not constitute final acceptance of those portions or of the completed project.

<u>ARTICLE V</u>

CONTRACTOR acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code and certifies compliance with such provisions. Contractor further acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to pay at least the minimum prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft classification or type of workman needed to execute this contract as determined by the Director of Labor Relations of the State of California. The Contractor is required to pay the higher of either the State or Federal Wages.

ARTICLE VI

CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless AGENCY and all of its officers and agents from any claims, demand or causes of action, including related expenses, attorney's fees, and costs, based on, arising out of, or in any way related to the work undertaken by CONTRACTOR hereunder.

ARTICLE VII

CONTRACTOR affirms that the signatures, titles and seals set forth hereinafter in execution of this Contract Agreement represent all individuals, firm members, partners, joint venturers, and/or corporate officers having principal interest herein.

On-Call Land Development Plan Checking Services - Award of Contract

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council take the following actions:

- Accept the Proposals to Provide On-Call Land Development Plan Checking Services;
- Award Contracts to: Coory Engineering of Orange, California; Huitt-Zollars of Irvine, California; and PencoENG of Irvine, California, to provide On-Call Land Development Plan Checking Services; and
- Authorize the Mayor to execute Professional Services Agreements with Coory Engineering, Huitt-Zollars and PencoENG for a term of forty-eight (48) months.

BACKGROUND

The City Council authorized the Director of Public Works to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for On-Call Development Plan Checking Services at its August 23, 2018 meeting. The City received proposals from the following six (6) firms on September 25, 2018:

- 1. Coory Engineering, Orange
- 2. PENCOENG, Irvine
- 3. Huitt-Zollars, Irvine
- 4. N|V|5, Irvine
- 5. KDM Meridian, Lake Forest
- 6. Transtech, Chino

A three-member evaluation team reviewed each proposal based on the RFP scope of work. The evaluation team consisted of Robert Garcia, Public Works CIP Manager, Arthur Cervantes, Associate Civil Engineer, and Al Fuentes, Project Manager. A summary of the proposal evaluation team's individual ratings for each proposal is attached.

Staff is recommending that the City Council award three (3) separate contracts to provide On-Call Development Plan Checking Services. Having three (3) firms available for on-call services will enhance the City's capacity to provide timely and cost-effective land development plan checking services.

LEGAL REVIEW

The City Attorney's office has reviewed the proposed Professional Services Agreements.

CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH COORY ENGINEERING

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this <u>8TH</u> day of <u>November, 2018</u> ("Effective Date"), by and between the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, a municipal corporation ("City"), and <u>Coory Engineering</u> ("Consultant").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City proposes to utilize the services of Consultant as an independent contractor to provide On-Call Land Development Plan Checking Services as more fully described herein; and

WHEREAS, Consultant represents that it has that degree of specialized expertise contemplated within California Government Code section 37103, and holds all necessary licenses to practice and perform the services herein contemplated; and

WHEREAS, City and Consultant desire to contract for the specific services described in Exhibit "A" (the "Project") and desire to set forth their rights, duties and liabilities in connection with the services to be performed; and

WHEREAS, no official or employee of City has a financial interest, within the provisions of sections 1090-1092 of the California Government Code, in the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0. SERVICES PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

- 1.1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the professional services described in the City's Request for Proposals ("RFP"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and Consultant's Response to City's RFP ("Consultant's Proposal"), attached hereto as Exhibit "B," both incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.2. <u>Professional Practices</u>. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel experienced in their respective fields and in a manner consistent with the standards of care, diligence and skill ordinarily exercised by professional consultants in similar fields and circumstances in accordance with sound professional practices. Consultant also warrants that it is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise City of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement.
- 1.3. Performance to Satisfaction of City. Consultant agrees to perform all the work to the complete satisfaction of the City and within the hereinafter specified. Evaluations of the work will be done by the City Manager or his or her designee. If the quality of work is not satisfactory, City in its discretion has the right to:
 - (a) Meet with Consultant to review the quality of the work and resolve the matters of concern;

- (b) Require Consultant to repeat the work at no additional fee until it is satisfactory; and/or
- (c) Terminate the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.
- 1.4. Warranty. Consultant warrants that it shall perform the services required by this Agreement in compliance with all applicable Federal and California employment laws, including, but not limited to, those laws related to minimum hours and wages; occupational health and safety; fair employment and employment practices; workers' compensation insurance and safety in employment; and all other Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the services required under this Agreement. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless City from and against all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, proceedings, and judgments of every nature and description including attorneys' fees and costs, presented, brought, or recovered against City for, or on account of any liability under any of the above-mentioned laws, which may be incurred by reason of Consultant's performance under this Agreement.
- 1.5. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. In performing this Agreement, Consultant shall not engage in, nor permit its agents to engage in, discrimination in employment of persons because of their race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military or veteran status, except as permitted pursuant to section 12940 of the Government Code.
- 1.6. <u>Non-Exclusive Agreement</u>. Consultant acknowledges that City may enter into agreements with other consultants for services similar to the services that are subject to this Agreement or may have its own employees perform services similar to those services contemplated by this Agreement.
- 1.7. <u>Delegation and Assignment</u>. This is a personal service contract, and the duties set forth herein shall not be delegated or assigned to any person or entity without the prior written consent of City. Consultant may engage a subcontractor(s) as permitted by law and may employ other personnel to perform services contemplated by this Agreement at Consultant's sole cost and expense.
- 1.8. Confidentiality. Employees of Consultant in the course of their duties may have access to financial, accounting, statistical, and personnel data of private individuals and employees of City. Consultant covenants that all data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by City. City shall grant such authorization if disclosure is required by law. All City data shall be returned to City upon the termination of this Agreement. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

2.0. COMPENSATION AND BILLING

2.1. <u>Compensation</u>. Consultant shall be paid in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in Exhibit "C," attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement by this reference (the "Fee Schedule"). Consultant will be paid on a Time and Material basis as work is requested by the City.

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- 2.2. <u>Additional Services</u>. Consultant shall not receive compensation for any services provided outside the scope of services specified in the Consultant's Proposal unless the City or the Project Manager for this Project, prior to Consultant performing the additional services, approves such additional services in writing. It is specifically understood that oral requests and/or approvals of such additional services or additional compensation shall be barred and are unenforceable.
- 2.3. Method of Billing. Consultant may submit invoices to the City for approval on a progress basis, but no more often than two times a month. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to City's sole satisfaction. City shall pay Consultant's invoice within forty-five (45) days from the date City receives said invoice. Each invoice shall describe in detail, the services performed, the date of performance, and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.
- 2.4. <u>Records and Audits</u>. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to City or its Project Manager for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times from the Effective Date until three (3) years after termination of this Agreement.

3.0. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

- 3.1. <u>Commencement and Completion of Work</u>. The professional services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall commence within five (5) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Failure to commence work in a timely manner and/or diligently pursue work to completion may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- 3.2. Excusable Delays. Neither party shall be responsible for delays or lack of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of the party or parties. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire, strikes, material shortages, compliance with laws or regulations, riots, acts of war, or any other conditions beyond the reasonable control of a party.

4.0. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 4.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue for a period of <u>48</u> months, ending on <u>November 8, 2022</u>, unless previously terminated as provided herein or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties.
- 4.2. <u>Notice of Termination</u>. The City reserves and has the right and privilege of canceling, suspending or abandoning the execution of all or any part of the work contemplated by this Agreement, with or without cause, at any time, by providing written notice to Consultant. The termination of this Agreement shall be deemed effective upon receipt of the notice of termination. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall immediately stop rendering services under this Agreement unless directed otherwise by the City.
- 4.3. <u>Compensation</u>. In the event of termination, City shall pay Consultant for reasonable costs incurred and professional services satisfactorily performed up to and including the date of City's written notice of termination. Compensation for work in progress shall be

prorated based on the percentage of work completed as of the effective date of termination in accordance with the fees set forth herein. In ascertaining the professional services actually rendered hereunder up to the effective date of termination of this Agreement, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in progress, to complete and incomplete drawings, and to other documents pertaining to the services contemplated herein whether delivered to the City or in the possession of the Consultant.

4.4. <u>Documents</u>. In the event of termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by Consultant in its performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, finished or unfinished design, development and construction documents, data studies, drawings, maps and reports, shall be delivered to the City within ten (10) days of delivery of termination notice to Consultant, at no cost to City. Any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from Consultant shall be at City's sole risk and without liability or legal expense to Consultant.

5.0. INSURANCE

- 5.1. <u>Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall obtain, maintain, and keep in full force and effect during the life of this Agreement all of the following minimum scope of insurance coverages with an insurance company admitted to do business in California, rated "A," Class X, or better in the most recent Best's Key Insurance Rating Guide, and approved by City:
 - (a) Commercial general liability, including premises-operations, products/completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual liability, independent contractors, personal injury or bodily injury with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - (b) Business automobile liability for owned vehicles, hired, and non-owned vehicles, with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - (c) Workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California. Consultant agrees to waive, and to obtain endorsements from its workers' compensation insurer waiving subrogation rights under its workers' compensation insurance policy against the City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers arising from work performed by Consultant for the City and to require each of its subcontractors, if any, to do likewise under their workers' compensation insurance policies.
 - (d) Professional errors and omissions ("E&O") liability insurance with policy limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence and aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage shall be endorsed to include contractual liability. If the policy is written as a "claims made" policy, the retro date shall be prior to the start of the contract work. Consultant shall obtain and maintain, said E&O liability insurance

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during the life of this Agreement and for three years after completion of the work hereunder.

- 5.2. <u>Endorsements</u>. The commercial general liability insurance policy and business automobile liability policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:
 - (a) Additional insureds: "The City of Santa Fe Springs and its elected and appointed boards, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers are additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant pursuant to its contract with the City; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the Consultant."
 - (b) Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, be suspended, or voided, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage or limits reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to City."
 - Other insurance: "The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. Any other insurance maintained by the City of Santa Fe Springs shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
 - (d) Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.
 - (e) The Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 5.3. <u>Deductible or Self Insured Retention</u>. If any of such policies provide for a deductible or self-insured retention to provide such coverage, the amount of such deductible or self-insured retention shall be approved in advance by City. No policy of insurance issued as to which the City is an additional insured shall contain a provision which requires that no insured except the named insured can satisfy any such deductible or self-insured retention.
- 5.4. <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall provide to City certificates of insurance showing the insurance coverages and required endorsements described above, in a form and content approved by City, prior to performing any services under this Agreement. The certificates of insurance shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "E" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 5.5. <u>Non-Limiting</u>. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as limiting in any way, the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement, or the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for payments of damages to persons or property.

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GENERAL PROVISIONS 6.0.

- This Agreement constitutes the entire Entire Agreement. 6.1. agreement between the parties with respect to any matter referenced herein and supersedes any and all other prior writings and oral negotiations. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, and signed by the parties in interest at the time of such modification. The terms of this Agreement shall prevail over any inconsistent provision in any other contract document appurtenant hereto, including exhibits to this Agreement.
- Representatives. The City Manager or his or her designee shall be the 6.2. representative of City for purposes of this Agreement and may issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of the City, called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a representative for purposes of this Agreement who shall be authorized to issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Consultant called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Project Managers. City shall designate a Project Manager to work directly with 6.3. Consultant in the performance of this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a Project Manager who shall represent it and be its agent in all consultations with City during the term of this Agreement. Consultant or its Project Manager shall attend and assist in all coordination meetings called by City.

Notices. Any notices, documents, correspondence or other communications concerning this Agreement or the work hereunder may be provided by personal delivery or mail and shall be addressed as set forth below. Such communication shall be deemed served or delivered: (a) at the time of delivery if such communication is sent by personal delivery, and (b) 48 hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail as reflected by the official U.S. postmark if such communication is sent through regular United States mail.

- 6.5. Attorneys' Fees. In the event that litigation is brought by any party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof.
- 6.6. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California without giving effect to that body of laws pertaining to conflict of laws. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this Agreement, the parties hereto agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a court of competent jurisdiction located in Los Angeles, California.
- 6.7. <u>Assignment</u>. Consultant shall not voluntarily or by operation of law assign, transfer, sublet or encumber all or any part of Consultant's interest in this Agreement without City's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment, transfer, subletting or encumbrance shall be void and shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and cause for termination of this Agreement. Regardless of City's consent, no subletting or assignment shall release Consultant of Consultant's obligation to perform all other obligations to be performed by Consultant hereunder for the term of this Agreement.
- Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, hold free and harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees, at Consultant's sole expense, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits or other legal proceedings brought against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees arising out of the performance of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, of the work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. The defense obligation provided for hereunder shall apply without any advance showing of negligence or wrongdoing by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, but shall be required whenever any claim, action, complaint, or suit asserts as its basis the negligence, errors, omissions or misconduct of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, and/or whenever any claim, action, complaint or suit asserts liability against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees based upon the work performed by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors under this Agreement, whether or not the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors are specifically named or otherwise asserted to be liable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultant shall not be liable for the defense or indemnification of the City for claims, actions, complaints or suits arising out of the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. This provision shall supersede and replace all other indemnity provisions contained either in the City's specifications or Consultant's Proposal, which shall be of no force and effect.
- 6.9. Independent Contractor. Consultant is and shall be acting at all times as an independent contractor and not as an employee of City. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not, at any time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of City. Consultant shall secure, at its sole expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Tax, Social Security, State Disability Insurance Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for Consultant and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, if any are required, in connection with the services to be performed hereunder. Consultant shall indemnify and hold City harmless from any

and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against City by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Agreement. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold City harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with the applicable worker's compensation laws. City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Agreement any amount due to City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to promptly pay to City any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this paragraph.

6.10. PERS Eligibility Indemnification. In the event that Consultant or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Consultant providing services under this Agreement claims or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) to be eligible for enrollment in PERS as an employee of the City, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City for the payment of any employee and/or employer contributions for PERS benefits on behalf of Consultant or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the responsibility of City.

Notwithstanding any other agency, state or federal policy, rule, regulation, law or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing service under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including but not limited to eligibility to enroll in PERS as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contribution and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

- 6.11. <u>Cooperation</u>. In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance or services rendered under this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which City might require.
- 6.12. Ownership of Documents. All findings, reports, documents, information and data including, but not limited to, computer tapes or discs, files and tapes furnished or prepared by Consultant or any of its subcontractors in the course of performance of this Agreement, shall be and remain the sole property of City. Consultant agrees that any such documents or information shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior consent of City. Any use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement, and any use of incomplete documents, shall be at the sole risk of City and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. City shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from City's use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement or use of incomplete documents furnished by Consultant. Consultant shall deliver to City any findings, reports, documents, information, data, in any form, including but not limited to, computer tapes, discs, files audio tapes or any other Project related items as requested by City or its authorized representative, at no additional cost to the City.
- 6.13. Public Records Act Disclosure. Consultant has been advised and is aware that this Agreement and all reports, documents, information and data, including, but not limited to, computer tapes, discs or files furnished or prepared by Consultant, or any of its subcontractors, pursuant to this Agreement and provided to City may be subject to public disclosure as required by the California Public Records Act (California Government Code section 6250 *et seq.*). Exceptions to public disclosure may be those documents or information that qualify as trade secrets, as that term is defined in the California Government Code section 6254.7, and of which

Consultant informs City of such trade secret. The City will endeavor to maintain as confidential all information obtained by it that is designated as a trade secret. The City shall not, in any way, be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any trade secret including, without limitation, those records so marked if disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by order of the Court.

- 6.14. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants, if any, will comply with all conflict of interest statutes of the State of California applicable to Consultant's services under this agreement, including, but not limited to, the Political Reform Act (Government Code sections 81000, *et seq.*) and Government Code section 1090. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants shall not, without the prior written approval of the City Representative, perform work for another person or entity for whom Consultant is not currently performing work that would require Consultant or one of its officers, employees, associates or subconsultants to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute.
- 6.15. Responsibility for Errors. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the City's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to City. In the event that an error or omission attributable to Consultant occurs, then Consultant shall, at no cost to City, provide all necessary design drawings, estimates and other Consultant professional services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of City and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.
- 6.16. <u>Prohibited Employment</u>. Consultant will not employ any regular employee of City while this Agreement is in effect.
- 6.17. Order of Precedence. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement and any of the attached Exhibits, the terms set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. If, and to the extent this Agreement incorporates by reference any provision of any document, such provision shall be deemed a part of this Agreement. Nevertheless, if there is any conflict among the terms and conditions of this Agreement and those of any such provision or provisions so incorporated by reference, this Agreement shall govern over the document referenced.
- 6.18. <u>Costs</u>. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.
- 6.19. <u>No Third Party Beneficiary Rights</u>. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of City and Consultant and no other parties are intended to be direct or incidental beneficiaries of this Agreement and no third party shall have any right in, under or to this Agreement.
- 6.20. <u>Headings</u>. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 6.21. <u>Construction</u>. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. In the event an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises with respect to this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties

and in accordance with its fair meaning. There shall be no presumption or burden of proof favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

- 6.22. <u>Amendments</u>. Only a writing executed by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.
- 6.23. <u>Waiver</u>. The delay or failure of either party at any time to require performance or compliance by the other of any of its obligations or agreements shall in no way be deemed a waiver of those rights to require such performance or compliance. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of the party against whom enforcement of a waiver is sought. The waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any occurrence or event shall not be deemed a waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any other occurrence or event, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.
- 6.24. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable in any circumstance, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the value of this Agreement, based upon the substantial benefit of the bargain for any party, is materially impaired, which determination made by the presiding court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction shall be binding, then both parties agree to substitute such provision(s) through good faith negotiations.
- 6.25. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one agreement.
- 6.26. <u>Corporate Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said parties and that by doing so the parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

Pre-contractual expenses are defined as expenses incurred by Consultants and the selected Consultant, if any, in:

8. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

By responding to this RFP, each Consultant represents to the best of its knowledge that:

- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, and associated staff, have communicated with any member of the City since the release of this RFP on any matter related to this RFP except to the extent specified in this RFP;
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants and associated staff, has obtained or used any information regarding this RFP and the proposed services that has not been generally available to all Consultants, and
- No conflict of interest exists under any applicable statute or regulation or as a result of any past or current contractual relationship with the City.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have any financial interest in any property that will be affected by any of the referenced projects.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have a personal relationship with any member of the governing body, officer or employee of the City who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the referenced projects.

9. KEY PERSONNEL

It is imperative that key personnel proposed to provide services have the background, experience and qualifications to properly undertake all necessary services for the successful completion of the referenced projects. The Consultant must identify all proposed key personnel in its Proposal. The Team must be well qualified and have sufficient experience in the areas described in the Scope of Services.

The City reserves the right to approve all key personnel individually for any and all projects authorized by the City as a result of this solicitation. After an agreement has been executed, the selected consultant may not replace any key staff without written approval from the City. The City must approve replacement staff before a substitute person is assigned to a project. The City reserves the right to require the Consultant to replace a staff person assigned to the contract should the City consider replacement to be for the good of the project. Replacement staff will be subject to the City's approval prior to assignment by Consultant.

10. BASIS FOR AWARD OF CONTRACT

SFS intends to select the Consultant on the basis of demonstrated competence and professional qualifications in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations. To that end, the contract is to be awarded to the Consultant whose proposal best meets the technical requirements of the RFP as determined by the City. Should an award be made, the proposal submitted by Consultant shall be incorporated as part of the final contract accordingly.

11. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of the Professional Services Agreement with the selected Consultant is forty eight (48) months, effective the date of executing the Agreement.

The City will compensate the Consultant for actual hours worked by assigned personnel on a monthly basis. Compensation will be based on the fee schedule in the proposal. The consultant will provide an invoice clearly documenting the services performed each day and the number of hours worked.

12. REQUIRED FORMAT FOR PROPOSALS

The City is requiring all proposals submitted in response to this RFP to follow a specific format. The Proposal, including the Appendices, shall not exceed thirty (30) pages in length, utilizing 8.5" x 11" pages with one-inch margins. As an exception, 11" x 17" pages may be used to display organizational charts. Font size shall not be smaller than 12 point for text or eight (8) point for graphics. Dividers used to separate sections will not be counted. Creative use of dividers to portray team qualifications, etc. is discouraged.

Consultants are required to prepare their written proposals in accordance with the instructions outlined below. Deviations from these instructions may be construed as non-responsive and may be cause for disqualification. Emphasis should be placed on accuracy, completeness, and clarity of content.

The written proposal should be organized as described below. Each section of the written proposal should contain the title of that section, with the response following the title. The following are the required titles with a brief statement as to that section's desired content:

A. Letter of Offer

- Acknowledgement that Consultant is obligated by all addenda to this RFP.
- A statement that the Proposal submitted shall remain valid for forty five (45) calendar days from the submittal deadline.
- Signature of a person authorized to bind Consultant to the terms of the Proposal.
- Signed statement attesting that all information submitted with the Proposal is true and correct.

B. Qualifications of the Firm

This section of the Proposal shall explain the ability of the Consultant to satisfactorily perform the required work. More specifically, in this section, the Consultant shall:

- Provide a profile of the Consultant including the types of services offered; the year founded; form of organization (corporate, partnership, sole proprietorship); number, size and location of offices; number of employees.
- Provide a detailed description of Consultant's financial condition, including any conditions (e.g., bankruptcy, pending litigation, outstanding claims in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for or against the firm; planned office closures or mergers that may impede Consultant's ability to provide On-Call Land Development and Plan Checking Services.)

13. PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

A. GENERAL

All proposals will be evaluated based on the technical information and qualifications presented in the proposal, reference checks, and other information, which may be gathered independently. Requests for clarification and/or additional information from any proposer may be requested at any point in the evaluation process. Pricing (Consultant fees) will be an important criterion; however, the City reserves the right to select a firm that presents the best qualifications, but not necessarily the lowest price.

B. EVALUATION CRITERIA

- Completeness of proposal.
- Consultant and key project team member's experience in performing similar work.
- Consultant and key project team member's record in accomplishing work assignments for projects.
- Consultant's demonstrated understanding of the scope of work.
- Quality of work previously performed by the firm as verified by reference checks.
- Relevant project experience.
- Fee proposal.

C. EVALUATION AND RANKING

After evaluating all proposals received, the City will rank the firms and the three (3) most qualified firms will be invited to an interview with the City Evaluation Committee, if necessary.

D. INTERVIEW

The Consultant should have available the project manager and key project personnel to discuss the following:

- The major elements of the proposal and be prepared to answer questions clarifying the proposal.
- A description of previously related experience for key project team member(s). Work sample exhibits may also be used.

E. FINAL SELECTION

The final selection will be the consultant which, in the City's opinion, is the most responsive and responsible, meets the City's requirements in providing this service, and is in the City's best interest. The City maintains the sole and exclusive right to evaluate the merits of the proposals received.

14. EXCEPTIONS OR ADDITIONS

The Proposal shall include a detailed description of all of the exceptions to the provisions and conditions of this RFP upon which the Consultant's submittal is contingent and which shall take precedence over this RFP.

15. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to the start of contract negotiations, the highest qualified Consultant will be required to submit to the City the required insurance certificates for the Consultant and its team. Insurance certificates will also be required, in advance, for any Consultant subsequently identified for negotiations with the City.

The successful Consultant shall indemnify and hold City and its officers, agents, employees, and assigns harmless from any liability imposed for injury whether arising before or after completion of work hereunder or in any manner directly or indirectly caused, occasioned, or contributed to, or claims to be caused, occasioned, or contributed to, in whole or in part, by reason of any act or omission, including strict liability or negligence of Consultant, or of anyone acting under Consultant's direction or control or on its behalf, in connection with, or incident to, or arising out of the performance of this contract.

The Consultant selected will be required to maintain the following levels of insurance coverage for the duration of the services provided, as well as any sub-consultants hired by the Consultant:

- Worker's Compensation insurance with statutory limits, and employer's liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per accident
- Commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence
- Business automobile liability insurance, or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles.
- Professional liability (errors and omissions) insurance, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

16. RIGHTS OF THE CITY

The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion and without prior notice, to terminate this RFP; to issue subsequent RFPs; to procure any project-related service by other means; to modify the scope of the Project; to modify the City's obligations or selection criteria; or take other actions needed to meet the City's goals. In addition, the City reserves the following rights:

- The right to accept or reject any and all proposals, or any item or part thereof, or to waive any informalities or irregularities in any proposal.
- The right to amend, withdraw or cancel this RFP at any time without prior notice.
- The right to postpone proposal openings for its own convenience.
- The right to request or obtain additional information about any and all proposals.
- The right to conduct a back ground check of any Consultant. This may include, but is not limited to, contacting individuals and organizations regarding capabilities and experience of the potential candidate.
- The right to waive minor discrepancies, informalities and/or irregularities in the RFP or in the requirements for submission of a Proposal.

- The right to modify the response requirements for this RFP. This may include a requirement to submit additional information; an extension of the due date for submittals; and modification of any part of this RFP, including timing of RFP decisions and the schedule for presentations.
- The right to disqualify any potential candidate on the basis of real or perceived conflict of interest that is disclosed or revealed by information available to the City.
- The right at any time, subject only to restrictions imposed by a written contractual agreement, to terminate negotiations with any potential candidate and to negotiate with other potential candidates who are deemed qualified.
- Although cost is an important factor in deciding which proposal will be selected, it is only one of the criteria used to evaluate consultants. City reserves the absolute right, in its sole discretion, to award a contract, if any, which under all the circumstances will best serve the public interest.
- City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or to make no award at all, to determine whether any alternate proposals are equal to the specifications and general requirements, and to accept proposals with minor variations from the Request for Proposals and/or conditions. The City reserves the right to negotiate for a higher level, lower level or additional services.

This RFP is not a contract or commitment of any kind by the City. This RFP does not commit the City to enter into negotiations with any consultant and the City makes no representations that any contract will be awarded to any consultant that responds to this RFP. Proposals received by the City are public information and will be made available to any person upon request after the City has completed the proposal evaluation. Submitted proposals are not to be copyrighted.

Should a contract be subsequently entered into between the City and Consultant, it shall be duly noted that entering into such an agreement shall be interpreted, construed, and given effect in all respects according to the laws of the State of California. The successful Consultant shall secure a City of Santa Fe Springs business license through the City's Finance and Administrative Services Department at the time the contract is awarded.

Waiver of Proposals

Proposals may be withdrawn by submitting written notice to the City's Contact Person at any time prior to the submittal deadline. Upon submission, the Proposal and all collateral material shall become the property of the City.

17. CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT DISCLOSURES

The Consultant acknowledges that all information submitted in response to this RFP is subject to public inspection under the California Public Records Act unless exempted by law. If the Consultant believes any information submitted should be protected from such disclosure due to its confidential, proprietary nature or other reasons, it must identify such information and the basis for the belief in its disclosure. Any proposal submitted with a blanket statement or limitation that would prohibit or limit such public inspection shall be considered non-responsive and shall be rejected. Notwithstanding that disclaimer, it is the intention of the City to keep all submittals confidential until such time as negotiations are successfully concluded.

ON-CALL LAND DEVELOPMENT AND PLAN CHECKING SERVICES

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Consultant's services will generally include topographic, design, and construction surveys of Capital Improvements projects (roadway, water lines, sewer, storm drain, etc.). The work to be done by the Consultant shall be as specified in a Work Order, to be issued by the City to the Consultant prior to starting any work.

- <u>Parcel Map Review/Approval</u> Review and approval of parcel maps, legal descriptions, lot line adjustments and other development-related survey work, as required by the Subdivision Map Act under California Government Code section 66442.
- <u>Topographic Survey</u> A survey locating topographic features, natural and man-made, such as buildings, improvements, fences, elevations, trees, streams, contours of the land, etc. The products of topographic surveys and topographic maps are the basis for planning studies and engineering designs.
- <u>Pavement Elevation Survey.</u> This is required for projects consisting of improvements of existing facilities, in order to develop accurate plans, specifications, and estimates.
- <u>Boundary Survey.</u> A survey for the express purpose of locating the corners and boundary lines of a given parcel of land. This involves record and field research, measurements, and computations to establish boundary lines in conformance with the Professional Land Surveyors Act. Easement lines may also be located and/or established with this type of survey.
- <u>Site Planning Survey.</u> A combination of boundary and topographic surveys for preparation of a site plan to be used for designing improvements or developments.
- <u>Utility Survey</u>. This survey is undertaken to locate existing utilities for (a) consideration in engineering design, (b) purposes of utility relocation, and (c) right-of-way acquisition and negotiation. Survey limits and types of utilities to be located should be shown on the Survey Report. It is important to locate all significant utility facilities.
- Construction Survey. Construction staking of improvements shown on improvement plans for control of construction on developments for roads, buildings, pipelines, etc. Construction surveys establish basic line and grade for project construction. From these "control" stakes the contractor sets supplemental "working stakes." The control stakes are used also by the Project Engineer in checking the work for contract compliance. This shall also include markings of improvements, facilities, etc. to be removed during construction.
- <u>Development Plan Check</u>: Assist staff with land development plan checking of drainage, hydrology, hydraulics, storm water pollution prevention plan, erosion control.

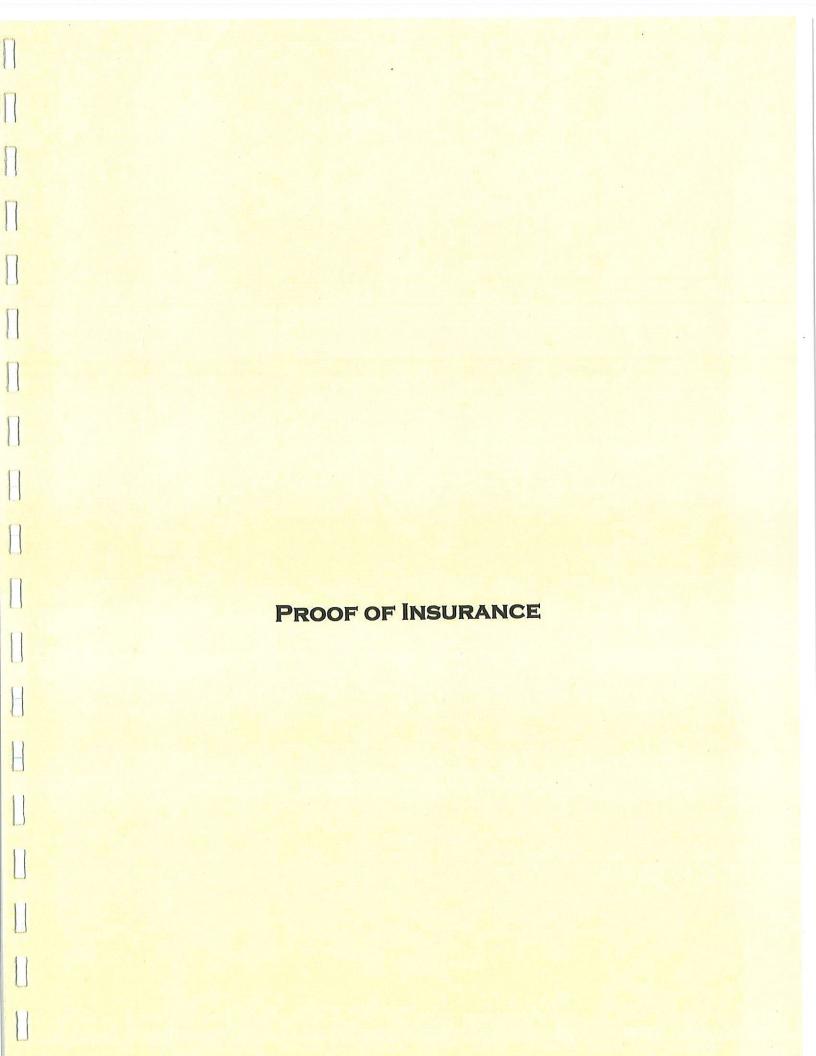

CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH HUITT-ZOLLARS, INC.

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this <u>8TH</u> day of <u>November, 2018</u> ("Effective Date"), by and between the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, a municipal corporation ("City"), and <u>Huitt-Zollars, Inc.</u> a ("Consultant").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City proposes to utilize the services of Consultant as an independent contractor to provide On-Call Land Development Plan Checking Services as more fully described herein; and

WHEREAS, Consultant represents that it has that degree of specialized expertise contemplated within California Government Code section 37103, and holds all necessary licenses to practice and perform the services herein contemplated; and

WHEREAS, City and Consultant desire to contract for the specific services described in Exhibit "A" (the "Project") and desire to set forth their rights, duties and liabilities in connection with the services to be performed; and

WHEREAS, no official or employee of City has a financial interest, within the provisions of sections 1090-1092 of the California Government Code, in the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0. SERVICES PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

- 1.1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the professional services described in the City's Request for Proposals ("RFP"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and Consultant's Response to City's RFP ("Consultant's Proposal"), attached hereto as Exhibit "B," both incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.2. <u>Professional Practices</u>. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel experienced in their respective fields and in a manner consistent with the standards of care, diligence and skill ordinarily exercised by professional consultants in similar fields and circumstances in accordance with sound professional practices. Consultant also warrants that it is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise City of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement.
- 1.3. <u>Performance to Satisfaction of City</u>. Consultant agrees to perform all the work to the complete satisfaction of the City and within the hereinafter specified. Evaluations of the work will be done by the City Manager or his or her designee. If the quality of work is not satisfactory, City in its discretion has the right to:
 - (a) Meet with Consultant to review the quality of the work and resolve the matters of concern;

- (b) Require Consultant to repeat the work at no additional fee until it is satisfactory; and/or
- (c) Terminate the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.
- 1.4. Warranty. Consultant warrants that it shall perform the services required by this Agreement in compliance with all applicable Federal and California employment laws, including, but not limited to, those laws related to minimum hours and wages; occupational health and safety; fair employment and employment practices; workers' compensation insurance and safety in employment; and all other Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the services required under this Agreement. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless City from and against all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, proceedings, and judgments of every nature and description including attorneys' fees and costs, presented, brought, or recovered against City for, or on account of any liability under any of the above-mentioned laws, which may be incurred by reason of Consultant's performance under this Agreement.
- 1.5. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. In performing this Agreement, Consultant shall not engage in, nor permit its agents to engage in, discrimination in employment of persons because of their race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military or veteran status, except as permitted pursuant to section 12940 of the Government Code.
- 1.6. <u>Non-Exclusive Agreement</u>. Consultant acknowledges that City may enter into agreements with other consultants for services similar to the services that are subject to this Agreement or may have its own employees perform services similar to those services contemplated by this Agreement.
- 1.7. <u>Delegation and Assignment</u>. This is a personal service contract, and the duties set forth herein shall not be delegated or assigned to any person or entity without the prior written consent of City. Consultant may engage a subcontractor(s) as permitted by law and may employ other personnel to perform services contemplated by this Agreement at Consultant's sole cost and expense.
- 1.8. Confidentiality. Employees of Consultant in the course of their duties may have access to financial, accounting, statistical, and personnel data of private individuals and employees of City. Consultant covenants that all data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by City. City shall grant such authorization if disclosure is required by law. All City data shall be returned to City upon the termination of this Agreement. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

2.0. COMPENSATION AND BILLING

- 2.1. <u>Compensation</u>. Consultant shall be paid in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in Exhibit "C," attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement by this reference (the "Fee Schedule"). Consultant will be paid on a Time and Material basis as work is requested by the City.
 - 2.2. Additional Services. Consultant shall not receive compensation for any services

provided outside the scope of services specified in the Consultant's Proposal unless the City or the Project Manager for this Project, prior to Consultant performing the additional services, approves such additional services in writing. It is specifically understood that oral requests and/or approvals of such additional services or additional compensation shall be barred and are unenforceable.

- 2.3. Method of Billing. Consultant may submit invoices to the City for approval on a progress basis, but no more often than two times a month. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to City's sole satisfaction. City shall pay Consultant's invoice within forty-five (45) days from the date City receives said invoice. Each invoice shall describe in detail, the services performed, the date of performance, and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.
- 2.4. <u>Records and Audits</u>. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to City or its Project Manager for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times from the Effective Date until three (3) years after termination of this Agreement.

3.0. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

- 3.1. <u>Commencement and Completion of Work</u>. The professional services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall commence within five (5) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Failure to commence work in a timely manner and/or diligently pursue work to completion may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- 3.2. Excusable Delays. Neither party shall be responsible for delays or lack of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of the party or parties. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire, strikes, material shortages, compliance with laws or regulations, riots, acts of war, or any other conditions beyond the reasonable control of a party.

4.0. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 4.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue for a period of <u>48</u> months, ending on <u>November 8, 2022</u>, unless previously terminated as provided herein or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties.
- 4.2. <u>Notice of Termination</u>. The City reserves and has the right and privilege of canceling, suspending or abandoning the execution of all or any part of the work contemplated by this Agreement, with or without cause, at any time, by providing written notice to Consultant. The termination of this Agreement shall be deemed effective upon receipt of the notice of termination. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall immediately stop rendering services under this Agreement unless directed otherwise by the City.
- 4.3. <u>Compensation</u>. In the event of termination, City shall pay Consultant for reasonable costs incurred and professional services satisfactorily performed up to and including the date of City's written notice of termination. Compensation for work in progress shall be prorated based on the percentage of work completed as of the effective date of termination in accordance with the fees set forth herein. In ascertaining the professional services actually

rendered hereunder up to the effective date of termination of this Agreement, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in progress, to complete and incomplete drawings, and to other documents pertaining to the services contemplated herein whether delivered to the City or in the possession of the Consultant.

4.4. <u>Documents</u>. In the event of termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by Consultant in its performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, finished or unfinished design, development and construction documents, data studies, drawings, maps and reports, shall be delivered to the City within ten (10) days of delivery of termination notice to Consultant, at no cost to City. Any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from Consultant shall be at City's sole risk and without liability or legal expense to Consultant.

5.0. INSURANCE

- 5.1. <u>Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall obtain, maintain, and keep in full force and effect during the life of this Agreement all of the following minimum scope of insurance coverages with an insurance company admitted to do business in California, rated "A," Class X, or better in the most recent Best's Key Insurance Rating Guide, and approved by City:
 - (a) Commercial general liability, including premises-operations, products/completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual liability, independent contractors, personal injury or bodily injury with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - (b) Business automobile liability for owned vehicles, hired, and non-owned vehicles, with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - (c) Workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California. Consultant agrees to waive, and to obtain endorsements from its workers' compensation insurer waiving subrogation rights under its workers' compensation insurance policy against the City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers arising from work performed by Consultant for the City and to require each of its subcontractors, if any, to do likewise under their workers' compensation insurance policies.
 - (d) Professional errors and omissions ("E&O") liability insurance with policy limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence and aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage shall be endorsed to include contractual liability. If the policy is written as a "claims made" policy, the retro date shall be prior to the start of the contract work. Consultant shall obtain and maintain, said E&O liability insurance during the life of this Agreement and for three years after completion of the work hereunder.

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- 5.2. <u>Endorsements</u>. The commercial general liability insurance policy and business automobile liability policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:
 - (a) Additional insureds: "The City of Santa Fe Springs and its elected and appointed boards, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers are additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant pursuant to its contract with the City; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the Consultant."
 - (b) Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, be suspended, or voided, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage or limits reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to City."
 - (c) Other insurance: "The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. Any other insurance maintained by the City of Santa Fe Springs shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
 - (d) Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.
 - (e) The Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 5.3. <u>Deductible or Self Insured Retention</u>. If any of such policies provide for a deductible or self-insured retention to provide such coverage, the amount of such deductible or self-insured retention shall be approved in advance by City. No policy of insurance issued as to which the City is an additional insured shall contain a provision which requires that no insured except the named insured can satisfy any such deductible or self-insured retention.
- 5.4. <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall provide to City certificates of insurance showing the insurance coverages and required endorsements described above, in a form and content approved by City, prior to performing any services under this Agreement. The certificates of insurance shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "E" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 5.5. <u>Non-Limiting</u>. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as limiting in any way, the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement, or the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for payments of damages to persons or property.

6.0. GENERAL PROVISIONS

6.1. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to any matter referenced herein and supersedes any and all other prior writings and oral negotiations. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, and signed by the parties in interest at the time of such modification. The terms of this Agreement shall prevail over any inconsistent provision in any other contract document appurtenant hereto, including

exhibits to this Agreement.

6.2. <u>Representatives</u>. The City Manager or his or her designee shall be the representative of City for purposes of this Agreement and may issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of the City, called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a representative for purposes of this Agreement who shall be authorized to issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Consultant called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

6.3. <u>Project Managers</u>. City shall designate a Project Manager to work directly with Consultant in the performance of this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a Project Manager who shall represent it and be its agent in all consultations with City during the term of this Agreement. Consultant or its Project Manager shall attend and assist in all coordination meetings called by City.

6.4. <u>Notices</u>. Any notices, documents, correspondence or other communications concerning this Agreement or the work hereunder may be provided by personal delivery or mail and shall be addressed as set forth below. Such communication shall be deemed served or delivered: (a) at the time of delivery if such communication is sent by personal delivery, and (b) 48 hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail as reflected by the official U.S. postmark if such communication is sent through regular United States mail.

- 6.5. Attorneys' Fees. In the event that litigation is brought by any party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof.
- 6.6. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California without giving effect to that body of laws pertaining to conflict of laws. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this Agreement, the parties hereto

agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a court of competent jurisdiction located in Los Angeles, California.

- 6.7. <u>Assignment</u>. Consultant shall not voluntarily or by operation of law assign, transfer, sublet or encumber all or any part of Consultant's interest in this Agreement without City's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment, transfer, subletting or encumbrance shall be void and shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and cause for termination of this Agreement. Regardless of City's consent, no subletting or assignment shall release Consultant of Consultant's obligation to perform all other obligations to be performed by Consultant hereunder for the term of this Agreement.
- Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, 6.8. hold free and harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees, at Consultant's sole expense, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits or other legal proceedings brought against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees arising out of the performance of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, of the work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. The defense obligation provided for hereunder shall apply without any advance showing of negligence or wrongdoing by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, but shall be required whenever any claim, action, complaint, or suit asserts as its basis the negligence, errors, omissions or misconduct of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, and/or whenever any claim, action, complaint or suit asserts liability against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees based upon the work performed by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors under this Agreement, whether or not the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors are specifically named or otherwise asserted to be liable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultant shall not be liable for the defense or indemnification of the City for claims, actions, complaints or suits arising out of the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. This provision shall supersede and replace all other indemnity provisions contained either in the City's specifications or Consultant's Proposal, which shall be of no force and effect.
- Independent Contractor. Consultant is and shall be acting at all times as an 6.9. independent contractor and not as an employee of City. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not, at any time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of City. Consultant shall secure, at its sole expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Tax, Social Security, State Disability Insurance Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for Consultant and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, if any are required, in connection with the services to be performed hereunder. Consultant shall indemnify and hold City harmless from any and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against City by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Agreement. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold City harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with the applicable worker's compensation laws. City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Agreement any amount due to City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to promptly pay to City any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this paragraph.

6.10. PERS Eligibility Indemnification. In the event that Consultant or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Consultant providing services under this Agreement claims or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) to be eligible for enrollment in PERS as an employee of the City, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City for the payment of any employee and/or employer contributions for PERS benefits on behalf of Consultant or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the responsibility of City.

Notwithstanding any other agency, state or federal policy, rule, regulation, law or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing service under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including but not limited to eligibility to enroll in PERS as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contribution and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

- 6.11. <u>Cooperation</u>. In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance or services rendered under this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which City might require.
- 6.12. Ownership of Documents. All findings, reports, documents, information and data including, but not limited to, computer tapes or discs, files and tapes furnished or prepared by Consultant or any of its subcontractors in the course of performance of this Agreement, shall be and remain the sole property of City. Consultant agrees that any such documents or information shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior consent of City. Any use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement, and any use of incomplete documents, shall be at the sole risk of City and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. City shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from City's use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement or use of incomplete documents furnished by Consultant. Consultant shall deliver to City any findings, reports, documents, information, data, in any form, including but not limited to, computer tapes, discs, files audio tapes or any other Project related items as requested by City or its authorized representative, at no additional cost to the City.
- 6.13. Public Records Act Disclosure. Consultant has been advised and is aware that this Agreement and all reports, documents, information and data, including, but not limited to, computer tapes, discs or files furnished or prepared by Consultant, or any of its subcontractors, pursuant to this Agreement and provided to City may be subject to public disclosure as required by the California Public Records Act (California Government Code section 6250 *et seq.*). Exceptions to public disclosure may be those documents or information that qualify as trade secrets, as that term is defined in the California Government Code section 6254.7, and of which Consultant informs City of such trade secret. The City will endeavor to maintain as confidential all information obtained by it that is designated as a trade secret. The City shall not, in any way, be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any trade secret including, without limitation, those records so marked if disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by order of the Court.
- 6.14. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants, if any, will comply with all conflict of interest statutes of the State of California applicable to Consultant's services under this agreement, including, but not limited to, the Political

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Reform Act (Government Code sections 81000, *et seq.*) and Government Code section 1090. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants shall not, without the prior written approval of the City Representative, perform work for another person or entity for whom Consultant is not currently performing work that would require Consultant or one of its officers, employees, associates or subconsultants to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute.

- 6.15. Responsibility for Errors. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the City's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to City. In the event that an error or omission attributable to Consultant occurs, then Consultant shall, at no cost to City, provide all necessary design drawings, estimates and other Consultant professional services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of City and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.
- 6.16. <u>Prohibited Employment</u>. Consultant will not employ any regular employee of City while this Agreement is in effect.
- 6.17. Order of Precedence. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement and any of the attached Exhibits, the terms set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. If, and to the extent this Agreement incorporates by reference any provision of any document, such provision shall be deemed a part of this Agreement. Nevertheless, if there is any conflict among the terms and conditions of this Agreement and those of any such provision or provisions so incorporated by reference, this Agreement shall govern over the document referenced.
- 6.18. <u>Costs</u>. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.
- 6.19. <u>No Third Party Beneficiary Rights</u>. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of City and Consultant and no other parties are intended to be direct or incidental beneficiaries of this Agreement and no third party shall have any right in, under or to this Agreement.
- 6.20. <u>Headings</u>. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 6.21. <u>Construction</u>. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. In the event an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises with respect to this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties and in accordance with its fair meaning. There shall be no presumption or burden of proof favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 6.22. <u>Amendments</u>. Only a writing executed by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.
- 6.23. <u>Waiver</u>. The delay or failure of either party at any time to require performance or compliance by the other of any of its obligations or agreements shall in no way be deemed a

waiver of those rights to require such performance or compliance. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of the party against whom enforcement of a waiver is sought. The waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any occurrence or event shall not be deemed a waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any other occurrence or event, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.

- 6.24. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable in any circumstance, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the value of this Agreement, based upon the substantial benefit of the bargain for any party, is materially impaired, which determination made by the presiding court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction shall be binding, then both parties agree to substitute such provision(s) through good faith negotiations.
- 6.25. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one agreement.
- 6.26. <u>Corporate Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said parties and that by doing so the parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

Pre-contractual expenses are defined as expenses incurred by Consultants and the selected Consultant, if any, in:

- Costs associated with interviews, meetings, travel or presentations; or
- Any and all other expenses incurred by a Consultant prior to the date of award, if any, of an agreement, and formal notice to proceed.

8. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

By responding to this RFP, each Consultant represents to the best of its knowledge that:

- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, and associated staff, have communicated with any member of the City since the release of this RFP on any matter related to this RFP except to the extent specified in this RFP;
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants and associated staff, has obtained or used any information regarding this RFP and the proposed services that has not been generally available to all Consultants, and
- No conflict of interest exists under any applicable statute or regulation or as a result of any past or current contractual relationship with the City.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have any financial interest in any property that will be affected by any of the referenced projects.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have a personal relationship with any member of the governing body, officer or employee of the City who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the referenced projects.

9. KEY PERSONNEL

It is imperative that key personnel proposed to provide services have the background, experience and qualifications to properly undertake all necessary services for the successful completion of the referenced projects. The Consultant must identify all proposed key personnel in its Proposal. The Team must be well qualified and have sufficient experience in the areas described in the Scope of Services.

The City reserves the right to approve all key personnel individually for any and all projects authorized by the City as a result of this solicitation. After an agreement has been executed, the selected consultant may not replace any key staff without written approval from the City. The City must approve replacement staff before a substitute person is assigned to a project. The City reserves the right to require the Consultant to replace a staff person assigned to the contract should the City consider replacement to be for the good of the project. Replacement staff will be subject to the City's approval prior to assignment by Consultant.

10. BASIS FOR AWARD OF CONTRACT

SFS intends to select the Consultant on the basis of demonstrated competence and professional qualifications in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations. To that end, the contract is to be awarded to the Consultant whose proposal best meets the technical requirements of the RFP as determined by the City. Should an award be made, the proposal submitted by Consultant shall be incorporated as part of the final contract accordingly.

11. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of the Professional Services Agreement with the selected Consultant is forty eight (48) months, effective the date of executing the Agreement.

The City will compensate the Consultant for actual hours worked by assigned personnel on a monthly basis. Compensation will be based on the fee schedule in the proposal. The consultant will provide an invoice clearly documenting the services performed each day and the number of hours worked.

12. REQUIRED FORMAT FOR PROPOSALS

The City is requiring all proposals submitted in response to this RFP to follow a specific format. The Proposal, including the Appendices, shall not exceed thirty (30) pages in length, utilizing 8.5" x 11" pages with one-inch margins. As an exception, 11" x 17" pages may be used to display organizational charts. Font size shall not be smaller than 12 point for text or eight (8) point for graphics. Dividers used to separate sections will not be counted. Creative use of dividers to portray team qualifications, etc. is discouraged.

Consultants are required to prepare their written proposals in accordance with the instructions outlined below. Deviations from these instructions may be construed as non-responsive and may be cause for disqualification. Emphasis should be placed on accuracy, completeness, and clarity of content.

The written proposal should be organized as described below. Each section of the written proposal should contain the title of that section, with the response following the title. The following are the required titles with a brief statement as to that section's desired content:

A. Letter of Offer

The Letter of Offer shall be addressed to Noe Negrete, Director of Public Works, City of Santa Fe Springs, and at a minimum, must contain the following:

- Identification of Consultant, including name, address and telephone number.
- Name, title, address, and telephone number of contact person.
- A statement to the effect that the Proposal shall remain valid for a period of not less than 90 calendar days from the date of submittal.
- Identification of all proposed sub-consultants or subcontractors, including legal name of the company, address and contact person.

- Acknowledgement that Consultant is obligated by all addenda to this RFP.
- A statement that the Proposal submitted shall remain valid for forty five (45) calendar days from the submittal deadline.
- Signature of a person authorized to bind Consultant to the terms of the Proposal.
- Signed statement attesting that all information submitted with the Proposal is true and correct.

B. Qualifications of the Firm

This section of the Proposal shall explain the ability of the Consultant to satisfactorily perform the required work. More specifically, in this section, the Consultant shall:

- Provide a profile of the Consultant including the types of services offered; the year founded; form of organization (corporate, partnership, sole proprietorship); number, size and location of offices; number of employees.
- Provide a detailed description of Consultant's financial condition, including any conditions (e.g., bankruptcy, pending litigation, outstanding claims in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for or against the firm; planned office closures or mergers that may impede Consultant's ability to provide On-Call Land Development and Plan Checking Services.)
- Provide a list of previous projects in which the Consultant and subconsultants have worked together. The list should clearly identify the previous projects and include a summary of the roles and responsibilities of each party.
- Provide information on the strength and stability of the Consultant; current staffing capability and availability; current work load; and proven record of meeting schedules on similar types of projects.

C. Proposed Staffing and Project Organization

D. Consultants and/or Sub-consultants

The City desires to enter into a contract with one Consultant that will be responsible for all work, products, and services. There is to be no assignment of any aspect of this project without the prior written authorization of the City. If the Consultant plans on using consultants and/or subcontractors as part of its implementation plan, then company profile, name, address, and telephone for all consultants and/or subcontractors providing support during the term of this project is required. Define the responsibilities and give a description of services to be provided by consultants and/or subcontractors. Describe the Firm's business and reporting relationship with any consultants and/or subcontractors. Include references and resumes for all third party Firms in your proposal. The City has the right to accept or reject any changes made to the proposed project team members, including the use of consultants and/or subcontractors.

E. Work Approach

This section of the Proposal shall include a narrative that addresses the Scope of Services and demonstrates that Consultant understands the scope of this project. More specifically, the Proposal should include the Consultant's general approach for completing the activities specified in the Scope of Services. The work approach shall be of sufficient detail to demonstrate Consultant's ability to accomplish the project tasks.

F. Client References

G. Appendices

This part shall include brief resumes of proposed staff. Consultant information and general marketing materials will not be considered in the ranking of the Proposals.

H. Rights to Materials

All responses, inquiries, and correspondence relating to this RFP and all reports, charts, displays, schedules, exhibits, and other documentation produced by the Consultant that are submitted as part of the proposal and not withdrawn shall, upon receipt by City, become property of City.

13. PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

A. GENERAL

All proposals will be evaluated based on the technical information and qualifications presented in the proposal, reference checks, and other information, which may be gathered independently. Requests for clarification and/or additional information from any proposer may be requested at any point in the evaluation process. Pricing (Consultant fees) will be an important criterion; however, the City reserves the right to select a firm that presents the best qualifications, but not necessarily the lowest price.

B. EVALUATION CRITERIA

- Completeness of proposal.
- Consultant and key project team member's experience in performing similar work.
- Consultant and key project team member's record in accomplishing work assignments for projects.
- Consultant's demonstrated understanding of the scope of work.
- Quality of work previously performed by the firm as verified by reference checks.
- Relevant project experience.
- Fee proposal.

C. EVALUATION AND RANKING

After evaluating all proposals received, the City will rank the firms and the three (3) most qualified firms will be invited to an interview with the City Evaluation Committee, if necessary.

D. INTERVIEW

The Consultant should have available the project manager and key project personnel to discuss the following:

- The major elements of the proposal and be prepared to answer questions clarifying the proposal.
- A description of previously related experience for key project team member(s).
 Work sample exhibits may also be used.

E. FINAL SELECTION

The final selection will be the consultant which, in the City's opinion, is the most responsive and responsible, meets the City's requirements in providing this service, and is in the City's best interest. The City maintains the sole and exclusive right to evaluate the merits of the proposals received.

14. EXCEPTIONS OR ADDITIONS

The Proposal shall include a detailed description of all of the exceptions to the provisions and conditions of this RFP upon which the Consultant's submittal is contingent and which shall take precedence over this RFP.

15. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to the start of contract negotiations, the highest qualified Consultant will be required to submit to the City the required insurance certificates for the Consultant and its team. Insurance certificates will also be required, in advance, for any Consultant subsequently identified for negotiations with the City.

The successful Consultant shall indemnify and hold City and its officers, agents, employees, and assigns harmless from any liability imposed for injury whether arising before or after completion of work hereunder or in any manner directly or indirectly caused, occasioned, or contributed to, or claims to be caused, occasioned, or contributed to, in whole or in part, by reason of any act or omission, including strict liability or negligence of Consultant, or of anyone acting under Consultant's direction or control or on its behalf, in connection with, or incident to, or arising out of the performance of this contract.

The Consultant selected will be required to maintain the following levels of insurance coverage for the duration of the services provided, as well as any sub-consultants hired by the Consultant:

- Worker's Compensation insurance with statutory limits, and employer's liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per accident
- Commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence
- Business automobile liability insurance, or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles.
- Professional liability (errors and omissions) insurance, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

16. RIGHTS OF THE CITY

The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion and without prior notice, to terminate this RFP; to issue subsequent RFPs; to procure any project-related service by other means; to modify the scope of the Project; to modify the City's obligations or selection criteria; or take other actions needed to meet the City's goals. In addition, the City reserves the following rights:

- The right to accept or reject any and all proposals, or any item or part thereof, or to waive any informalities or irregularities in any proposal.
- The right to amend, withdraw or cancel this RFP at any time without prior notice.
- The right to postpone proposal openings for its own convenience.
- The right to request or obtain additional information about any and all proposals.
- The right to conduct a back ground check of any Consultant. This may include, but is not limited to, contacting individuals and organizations regarding capabilities and experience of the potential candidate.
- The right to waive minor discrepancies, informalities and/or irregularities in the RFP or in the requirements for submission of a Proposal.

- The right to modify the response requirements for this RFP. This may include a requirement to submit additional information; an extension of the due date for submittals; and modification of any part of this RFP, including timing of RFP decisions and the schedule for presentations.
- The right to disqualify any potential candidate on the basis of real or perceived conflict of interest that is disclosed or revealed by information available to the City.
- The right at any time, subject only to restrictions imposed by a written contractual agreement, to terminate negotiations with any potential candidate and to negotiate with other potential candidates who are deemed qualified.
- Although cost is an important factor in deciding which proposal will be selected, it is only one of the criteria used to evaluate consultants. City reserves the absolute right, in its sole discretion, to award a contract, if any, which under all the circumstances will best serve the public interest.
- City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or to make no award at all, to determine whether any alternate proposals are equal to the specifications and general requirements, and to accept proposals with minor variations from the Request for Proposals and/or conditions. The City reserves the right to negotiate for a higher level, lower level or additional services.

This RFP is not a contract or commitment of any kind by the City. This RFP does not commit the City to enter into negotiations with any consultant and the City makes no representations that any contract will be awarded to any consultant that responds to this RFP. Proposals received by the City are public information and will be made available to any person upon request after the City has completed the proposal evaluation. Submitted proposals are not to be copyrighted.

Should a contract be subsequently entered into between the City and Consultant, it shall be duly noted that entering into such an agreement shall be interpreted, construed, and given effect in all respects according to the laws of the State of California. The successful Consultant shall secure a City of Santa Fe Springs business license through the City's Finance and Administrative Services Department at the time the contract is awarded.

Waiver of Proposals

Proposals may be withdrawn by submitting written notice to the City's Contact Person at any time prior to the submittal deadline. Upon submission, the Proposal and all collateral material shall become the property of the City.

17. CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT DISCLOSURES

The Consultant acknowledges that all information submitted in response to this RFP is subject to public inspection under the California Public Records Act unless exempted by law. If the Consultant believes any information submitted should be protected from such disclosure due to its confidential, proprietary nature or other reasons, it must identify such information and the basis for the belief in its disclosure. Any proposal submitted with a blanket statement or limitation that would prohibit or limit such public inspection shall be considered non-responsive and shall be rejected. Notwithstanding that disclaimer, it is the intention of the City to keep all submittals confidential until such time as negotiations are successfully concluded.

ON-CALL LAND DEVELOPMENT AND PLAN CHECKING SERVICES

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Consultant's services will generally include topographic, design, and construction surveys of Capital Improvements projects (roadway, water lines, sewer, storm drain, etc.). The work to be done by the Consultant shall be as specified in a Work Order, to be issued by the City to the Consultant prior to starting any work.

- <u>Parcel Map Review/Approval</u> Review and approval of parcel maps, legal descriptions, lot line adjustments and other development-related survey work, as required by the Subdivision Map Act under California Government Code section 66442.
- <u>Topographic Survey</u> A survey locating topographic features, natural and man-made, such as buildings, improvements, fences, elevations, trees, streams, contours of the land, etc. The products of topographic surveys and topographic maps are the basis for planning studies and engineering designs.
- <u>Pavement Elevation Survey.</u> This is required for projects consisting of improvements of existing facilities, in order to develop accurate plans, specifications, and estimates.
- <u>Boundary Survey.</u> A survey for the express purpose of locating the corners and boundary lines of a given parcel of land. This involves record and field research, measurements, and computations to establish boundary lines in conformance with the Professional Land Surveyors Act. Easement lines may also be located and/or established with this type of survey.
- <u>Site Planning Survey.</u> A combination of boundary and topographic surveys for preparation of a site plan to be used for designing improvements or developments.
- <u>Utility Survey</u>. This survey is undertaken to locate existing utilities for (a) consideration in engineering design, (b) purposes of utility relocation, and (c) right-of-way acquisition and negotiation. Survey limits and types of utilities to be located should be shown on the Survey Report. It is important to locate all significant utility facilities.
- Construction Survey. - <u>Development Plan Check</u>: Assist staff with land development plan checking of drainage, hydrology, hydraulics, storm water pollution prevention plan, erosion control.

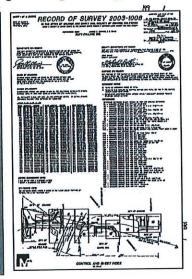

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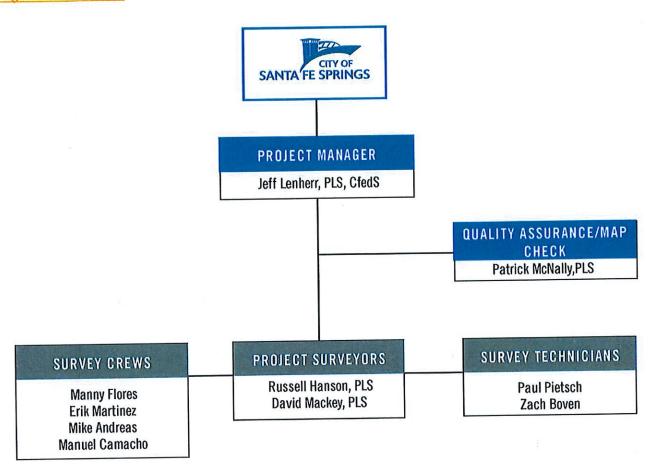

Topographic Survey / Typical Work Plan for a Street Rehabilitation Project

1. After receiving a request for a specific Topographic Survey project from the City, HZ will meet with the appropriate City staff to discuss the detailed project scope and timing. Specific limits of the survey and requested features to be located are discussed. The Basis of Bearings should be discussed. Possible options are State Plane Coordinates (Epoch to be determined) and found monuments and recorded Subdivision Mapping (Tract Maps, Parcel Maps, Records of Survey). The Vertical Datum for the project should also be discussed. This can be done on either NGVD29 or NAVD88 Datum.

2. If the project is for a Street Rehabilitation project, then HZ would request a specific basis of stationing to be

used to match previous Improvement Plans.

3. If the project consists of Aerial Topographic Mapping as a base plan, then HZ would set and control the aerial targets as configured by our sub-consultant Digital Mapping Inc. (DMI) using the horizontal and vertical control options described above. Typically we provide 1"=40' scale mapping with a one foot contour interval.

4. We would then begin our ground topographic survey and cross-section survey at 25 or 50 foot stations depending on grade or future design requirements with shots at R/W (or join location if beyond R/W), Back of Walk, Top of Curb, Flow Line, Lip of Gutter, Edge of Paving, grade breaks, and median Top of Curb, Flow Line and Lip of Gutter and centerline.

5. All above ground utilities will be located in the project area and identified as to type.

6. If requested, trees and other landscape features can be located with drip lines, and trunk diameters.

7. 18. Provide construction staking at the appropriate offset and alignment as specified for the individual project. Mark the lath witnessing the stakes as appropriate.

19. Provide completed Cut Sheets to the City and the General Contractor for their use in construction.

20. Typically, Curb and Gutter staking will be provided at 25 foot intervals with cut or fill to Top of Curb including all angle points, BC's EC's and points of vertical curve.

21. Typically, wet utility staking will be provided at 25 foot intervals (Sewer, and Storm Drain) or at 50 foot intervals (Water) with cut or fill to Flow Line including all angle points, BC's EC's and points of vertical curve.

WHEREAS, Consultant represents that it has that degree of specialized expertise contemplated within California Government Code section 37103, and holds all necessary licenses to practice and perform the services herein contemplated; and

WHEREAS, City and Consultant desire to contract for the specific services described in Exhibit "A" (the "Project") and desire to set forth their rights, duties and liabilities in connection with the services to be performed; and

WHEREAS, no official or employee of City has a financial interest, within the provisions of sections 1090-1092 of the California Government Code, in the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0. SERVICES PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

- 1.1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the professional services described in the City's Request for Proposals ("RFP"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and Consultant's Response to City's RFP ("Consultant's Proposal"), attached hereto as Exhibit "B," both incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.2. <u>Professional Practices</u>. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel experienced in their respective fields and in a manner consistent with the standards of care, diligence and skill ordinarily exercised by professional consultants in similar fields and circumstances in accordance with sound professional practices. Consultant also warrants that it is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise City of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement.
- 1.3. <u>Performance to Satisfaction of City</u>. Consultant agrees to perform all the work to the complete satisfaction of the City and within the hereinafter specified. Evaluations of the work will be done by the City Manager or his or her designee. If the quality of work is not satisfactory, City in its discretion has the right to:

- (a) Meet with Consultant to review the quality of the work and resolve the matters of concern;
- (b) Require Consultant to repeat the work at no additional fee until it is satisfactory; and/or
- (c) Terminate the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.
- Agreement in compliance with all applicable Federal and California employment laws, including, but not limited to, those laws related to minimum hours and wages; occupational health and safety; fair employment and employment practices; workers' compensation insurance and safety in employment; and all other Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the services required under this Agreement. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless City from and against all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, proceedings, and judgments of every nature and description including attorneys' fees and costs, presented, brought, or recovered against City for, or on account of any liability under any of the above-mentioned laws, which may be incurred by reason of Consultant's performance under this Agreement.
- 1.5. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. In performing this Agreement, Consultant shall not engage in, nor permit its agents to engage in, discrimination in employment of persons because of their race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military or veteran status, except as permitted pursuant to section 12940 of the Government Code.
- 1.6. <u>Non-Exclusive Agreement</u>. Consultant acknowledges that City may enter into agreements with other consultants for services similar to the services that are subject to this Agreement or may have its own employees perform services similar to those services contemplated by this Agreement.
- 1.7. <u>Delegation and Assignment</u>. This is a personal service contract, and the duties set forth herein shall not be delegated or assigned to any person or entity without the prior written consent of City. Consultant may engage a subcontractor(s) as permitted by law and may employ other personnel to perform services contemplated by this Agreement at Consultant's sole cost and expense.
- 1.8. Confidentiality. Employees of Consultant in the course of their duties may have access to financial, accounting, statistical, and personnel data of private individuals and employees of City. Consultant covenants that all data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by City. City shall grant such authorization if disclosure is required by law. All City data shall be returned to City upon the termination of this Agreement. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

2.0. COMPENSATION AND BILLING

2.1. <u>Compensation</u>. Consultant shall be paid in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in Exhibit "C," attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement by this reference (the "Fee Schedule"). Consultant will be paid on a Time and Material basis as work is requested by the City.

- 2.2. <u>Additional Services</u>. Consultant shall not receive compensation for any services provided outside the scope of services specified in the Consultant's Proposal unless the City or the Project Manager for this Project, prior to Consultant performing the additional services, approves such additional services in writing. It is specifically understood that oral requests and/or approvals of such additional services or additional compensation shall be barred and are unenforceable.
- 2.3. <u>Method of Billing</u>. Consultant may submit invoices to the City for approval on a progress basis, but no more often than two times a month. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to City's sole satisfaction. City shall pay Consultant's invoice within forty-five (45) days from the date City receives said invoice. Each invoice shall describe in detail, the services performed, the date of performance, and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.
- 2.4. <u>Records and Audits</u>. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to City or its Project Manager for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times from the Effective Date until three (3) years after termination of this Agreement.

3.0. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

- 3.1. <u>Commencement and Completion of Work</u>. The professional services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall commence within five (5) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Failure to commence work in a timely manner and/or diligently pursue work to completion may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- 3.2. <u>Excusable Delays</u>. Neither party shall be responsible for delays or lack of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of the party or parties. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire, strikes, material shortages, compliance with laws or regulations, riots, acts of war, or any other conditions beyond the reasonable control of a party.

4.0. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 4.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue for a period of <u>48</u> months, ending on <u>November 8, 2022</u>, unless previously terminated as provided herein or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties.
- 4.2. <u>Notice of Termination</u>. The City reserves and has the right and privilege of canceling, suspending or abandoning the execution of all or any part of the work contemplated by this Agreement, with or without cause, at any time, by providing written notice to Consultant. The termination of this Agreement shall be deemed effective upon receipt of the notice of termination. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall immediately stop rendering services under this Agreement unless directed otherwise by the City.
- 4.3. <u>Compensation</u>. In the event of termination, City shall pay Consultant for reasonable costs incurred and professional services satisfactorily performed up to and including the date of City's written notice of termination. Compensation for work in progress shall be

prorated based on the percentage of work completed as of the effective date of termination in accordance with the fees set forth herein. In ascertaining the professional services actually rendered hereunder up to the effective date of termination of this Agreement, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in progress, to complete and incomplete drawings, and to other documents pertaining to the services contemplated herein whether delivered to the City or in the possession of the Consultant.

4.4. <u>Documents</u>. In the event of termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by Consultant in its performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, finished or unfinished design, development and construction documents, data studies, drawings, maps and reports, shall be delivered to the City within ten (10) days of delivery of termination notice to Consultant, at no cost to City. Any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from Consultant shall be at City's sole risk and without liability or legal expense to Consultant.

5.0. INSURANCE

- 5.1. <u>Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall obtain, maintain, and keep in full force and effect during the life of this Agreement all of the following minimum scope of insurance coverages with an insurance company admitted to do business in California, rated "A," Class X, or better in the most recent Best's Key Insurance Rating Guide, and approved by City:
 - (a) Commercial general liability, including premises-operations, products/completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual liability, independent contractors, personal injury or bodily injury with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - (b) Business automobile liability for owned vehicles, hired, and non-owned vehicles, with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - (c) Workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California. Consultant agrees to waive, and to obtain endorsements from its workers' compensation insurer waiving subrogation rights under its workers' compensation insurance policy against the City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers arising from work performed by Consultant for the City and to require each of its subcontractors, if any, to do likewise under their workers' compensation insurance policies.
 - (d) Professional errors and omissions ("E&O") liability insurance with policy limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence and aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage shall be endorsed to include contractual liability. If the policy is written as a "claims made" policy, the retro date shall be prior to the start of the contract work. Consultant shall obtain and maintain, said E&O liability insurance

during the life of this Agreement and for three years after completion of the work hereunder.

- 5.2. <u>Endorsements</u>. The commercial general liability insurance policy and business automobile liability policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:
 - (a) Additional insureds: "The City of Santa Fe Springs and its elected and appointed boards, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers are additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant pursuant to its contract with the City; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the Consultant."
 - (b) Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, be suspended, or voided, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage or limits reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to City."
 - (c) Other insurance: "The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. Any other insurance maintained by the City of Santa Fe Springs shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
 - (d) Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.
 - (e) The Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 5.3. <u>Deductible or Self Insured Retention</u>. If any of such policies provide for a deductible or self-insured retention to provide such coverage, the amount of such deductible or self-insured retention shall be approved in advance by City. No policy of insurance issued as to which the City is an additional insured shall contain a provision which requires that no insured except the named insured can satisfy any such deductible or self-insured retention.
- 5.4. <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall provide to City certificates of insurance showing the insurance coverages and required endorsements described above, in a form and content approved by City, prior to performing any services under this Agreement. The certificates of insurance shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "E" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 5.5. <u>Non-Limiting</u>. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as limiting in any way, the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement, or the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for payments of damages to persons or property.

6.0. GENERAL PROVISIONS

6.1. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to any matter referenced herein and supersedes any and all other prior

writings and oral negotiations. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, and signed by the parties in interest at the time of such modification. The terms of this Agreement shall prevail over any inconsistent provision in any other contract document appurtenant hereto, including exhibits to this Agreement.

6.2. <u>Representatives</u>. The City Manager or his or her designee shall be the representative of City for purposes of this Agreement and may issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of the City, called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a representative for purposes of this Agreement who shall be authorized to issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Consultant called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

6.3. <u>Project Managers</u>. City shall designate a Project Manager to work directly with Consultant in the performance of this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a Project Manager who shall represent it and be its agent in all consultations with City during the term of this Agreement. Consultant or its Project Manager shall attend and assist in all coordination meetings called by City.

6.4. <u>Notices</u>. Any notices, documents, correspondence or other communications concerning this Agreement or the work hereunder may be provided by personal delivery or mail and shall be addressed as set forth below. Such communication shall be deemed served or delivered: (a) at the time of delivery if such communication is sent by personal delivery, and (b) 48 hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail as reflected by the official U.S. postmark if such communication is sent through regular United States mail.

6.5. Attorneys' Fees. In the event that litigation is brought by any party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof.

- 6.6. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California without giving effect to that body of laws pertaining to conflict of laws. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this Agreement, the parties hereto agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a court of competent jurisdiction located in Los Angeles, California.
- 6.7. <u>Assignment</u>. Consultant shall not voluntarily or by operation of law assign, transfer, sublet or encumber all or any part of Consultant's interest in this Agreement without City's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment, transfer, subletting or encumbrance shall be void and shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and cause for termination of this Agreement. Regardless of City's consent, no subletting or assignment shall release Consultant of Consultant's obligation to perform all other obligations to be performed by Consultant hereunder for the term of this Agreement.
- Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, 6.8. hold free and harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees, at Consultant's sole expense, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits or other legal proceedings brought against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees arising out of the performance of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, of the work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. The defense obligation provided for hereunder shall apply without any advance showing of negligence or wrongdoing by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, but shall be required whenever any claim, action, complaint, or suit asserts as its basis the negligence, errors, omissions or misconduct of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, and/or whenever any claim, action, complaint or suit asserts liability against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees based upon the work performed by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors under this Agreement, whether or not the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors are specifically named or otherwise asserted to be liable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultant shall not be liable for the defense or indemnification of the City for claims, actions, complaints or suits arising out of the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. This provision shall supersede and replace all other indemnity provisions contained either in the City's specifications or Consultant's Proposal, which shall be of no force and effect.
- Independent Contractor. Consultant is and shall be acting at all times as an independent contractor and not as an employee of City. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not, at any time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of City. Consultant shall secure, at its sole expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Tax, Social Security, State Disability Insurance Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for Consultant and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, if any are required, in connection with the services to be performed hereunder. Consultant shall indemnify and hold City harmless from any and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against City by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Agreement. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold City harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with the applicable worker's compensation laws. City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Agreement any amount due to City from Consultant as a result of

Consultant's failure to promptly pay to City any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this paragraph.

6.10. PERS Eligibility Indemnification. In the event that Consultant or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Consultant providing services under this Agreement claims or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) to be eligible for enrollment in PERS as an employee of the City, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City for the payment of any employee and/or employer contributions for PERS benefits on behalf of Consultant or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the responsibility of City.

Notwithstanding any other agency, state or federal policy, rule, regulation, law or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing service under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including but not limited to eligibility to enroll in PERS as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contribution and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

- 6.11. <u>Cooperation</u>. In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance or services rendered under this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which City might require.
- 6.12. Ownership of Documents. All findings, reports, documents, information and data including, but not limited to, computer tapes or discs, files and tapes furnished or prepared by Consultant or any of its subcontractors in the course of performance of this Agreement, shall be and remain the sole property of City. Consultant agrees that any such documents or information shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior consent of City. Any use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement, and any use of incomplete documents, shall be at the sole risk of City and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. City shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from City's use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement or use of incomplete documents furnished by Consultant. Consultant shall deliver to City any findings, reports, documents, information, data, in any form, including but not limited to, computer tapes, discs, files audio tapes or any other Project related items as requested by City or its authorized representative, at no additional cost to the City.
- 6.13. Public Records Act Disclosure. Consultant has been advised and is aware that this Agreement and all reports, documents, information and data, including, but not limited to, computer tapes, discs or files furnished or prepared by Consultant, or any of its subcontractors, pursuant to this Agreement and provided to City may be subject to public disclosure as required by the California Public Records Act (California Government Code section 6250 *et seq.*). Exceptions to public disclosure may be those documents or information that qualify as trade secrets, as that term is defined in the California Government Code section 6254.7, and of which Consultant informs City of such trade secret. The City will endeavor to maintain as confidential all information obtained by it that is designated as a trade secret. The City shall not, in any way, be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any trade secret including, without limitation, those records so marked if disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by order of the Court.

- 6.14. Conflict of Interest. Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants, if any, will comply with all conflict of interest statutes of the State of California applicable to Consultant's services under this agreement, including, but not limited to, the Political Reform Act (Government Code sections 81000, et seq.) and Government Code section 1090. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants shall not, without the prior written approval of the City Representative, perform work for another person or entity for whom Consultant is not currently performing work that would require Consultant or one of its officers, employees, associates or subconsultants to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute.
- 6.15. Responsibility for Errors. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the City's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to City. In the event that an error or omission attributable to Consultant occurs, then Consultant shall, at no cost to City, provide all necessary design drawings, estimates and other Consultant professional services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of City and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.
- 6.16. <u>Prohibited Employment</u>. Consultant will not employ any regular employee of City while this Agreement is in effect.
- 6.17. Order of Precedence. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement and any of the attached Exhibits, the terms set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. If, and to the extent this Agreement incorporates by reference any provision of any document, such provision shall be deemed a part of this Agreement. Nevertheless, if there is any conflict among the terms and conditions of this Agreement and those of any such provision or provisions so incorporated by reference, this Agreement shall govern over the document referenced.
- 6.18. <u>Costs</u>. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.
- 6.19. <u>No Third Party Beneficiary Rights</u>. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of City and Consultant and no other parties are intended to be direct or incidental beneficiaries of this Agreement and no third party shall have any right in, under or to this Agreement.
- 6.20. <u>Headings</u>. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 6.21. <u>Construction</u>. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. In the event an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises with respect to this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties and in accordance with its fair meaning. There shall be no presumption or burden of proof favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 6.22. <u>Amendments</u>. Only a writing executed by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.

- 6.23. <u>Waiver</u>. The delay or failure of either party at any time to require performance or compliance by the other of any of its obligations or agreements shall in no way be deemed a waiver of those rights to require such performance or compliance. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of the party against whom enforcement of a waiver is sought. The waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any occurrence or event shall not be deemed a waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any other occurrence or event, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.
- 6.24. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable in any circumstance, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the value of this Agreement, based upon the substantial benefit of the bargain for any party, is materially impaired, which determination made by the presiding court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction shall be binding, then both parties agree to substitute such provision(s) through good faith negotiations.
- 6.25. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one agreement.
- 6.26. <u>Corporate Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said parties and that by doing so the parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

Pre-contractual expenses are defined as expenses incurred by Consultants and the selected Consultant, if any, in:

- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants and associated staff, has obtained or used any information regarding this RFP and the proposed services that has not been generally available to all Consultants, and
- No conflict of interest exists under any applicable statute or regulation or as a result of any past or current contractual relationship with the City.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have any financial interest in any property that will be affected by any of the referenced projects.
- Neither Consultant, nor any of its affiliates, proposed subconsultants, or associated staff, have a personal relationship with any member of the governing body, officer or employee of the City who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the referenced projects.

9. KEY PERSONNEL

It is imperative that key personnel proposed to provide services have the background, experience and qualifications to properly undertake all necessary services for the successful completion of the referenced projects. The Consultant must identify all proposed key personnel in its Proposal. The Team must be well qualified and have sufficient experience in the areas described in the Scope of Services.

The City reserves the right to approve all key personnel individually for any and all projects authorized by the City as a result of this solicitation. After an agreement has been executed, the selected consultant may not replace any key staff without written approval from the City. The City must approve replacement staff before a substitute person is assigned to a project. The City reserves the right to require the Consultant to replace a staff person assigned to the contract should the City consider replacement to be for the good of the project. Replacement staff will be subject to the City's approval prior to assignment by Consultant.

10. BASIS FOR AWARD OF CONTRACT

SFS intends to select the Consultant on the basis of demonstrated competence and professional qualifications in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations. To that end, the contract is to be awarded to the Consultant whose proposal best meets the technical requirements of the RFP as determined by the City. Should an award be made, the proposal submitted by Consultant shall be incorporated as part of the final contract accordingly.

11. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of the Professional Services Agreement with the selected Consultant is forty eight (48) months, effective the date of executing the Agreement.

The City will compensate the Consultant for actual hours worked by assigned personnel on a monthly basis. Compensation will be based on the fee schedule in the proposal. The consultant will provide an invoice clearly documenting the services performed each day and the number of hours worked.

12. REQUIRED FORMAT FOR PROPOSALS

The City is requiring all proposals submitted in response to this RFP to follow a specific format. The Proposal, including the Appendices, shall not exceed thirty (30) pages in length, utilizing 8.5" x 11" pages with one-inch margins. As an exception, 11" x 17" pages may be used to display organizational charts. Font size shall not be smaller than 12 point for text or eight (8) point for graphics. Dividers used to separate sections will not be counted. Creative use of dividers to portray team qualifications, etc. is discouraged.

Consultants are required to prepare their written proposals in accordance with the instructions outlined below. Deviations from these instructions may be construed as non-responsive and may be cause for disqualification. Emphasis should be placed on accuracy, completeness, and clarity of content.

The written proposal should be organized as described below. Each section of the written proposal should contain the title of that section, with the response following the title. The following are the required titles with a brief statement as to that section's desired content:

A. Letter of Offer

The Letter of Offer shall be addressed to Noe Negrete, Director of Public Works, City of Santa Fe Springs, and at a minimum, must contain the following:

- Identification of Consultant, including name, address and telephone number.
- Name, title, address, and telephone number of contact person.
- A statement to the effect that the Proposal shall remain valid for a period of not less than 90 calendar days from the date of submittal.
- Identification of all proposed sub-consultants or subcontractors, including legal name of the company, address and contact person.

- Acknowledgement that Consultant is obligated by all addenda to this RFP.
- A statement that the Proposal submitted shall remain valid for forty five (45) calendar days from the submittal deadline.
- Signature of a person authorized to bind Consultant to the terms of the Proposal.
- Signed statement attesting that all information submitted with the Proposal is true and correct.

B. Qualifications of the Firm

This section of the Proposal shall explain the ability of the Consultant to satisfactorily perform the required work. More specifically, in this section, the Consultant shall:

- Provide a profile of the Consultant including the types of services offered; the year founded; form of organization (corporate, partnership, sole proprietorship); number, size and location of offices; number of employees.
- Provide a detailed description of Consultant's financial condition, including any conditions (e.g., bankruptcy, pending litigation, outstanding claims in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for or against the firm; planned office closures or mergers that may impede Consultant's ability to provide On-Call Land Development and Plan Checking Services.)
- Provide a list of previous projects in which the Consultant and subconsultants have worked together. The list should clearly identify the previous projects and include a summary of the roles and responsibilities of each party.

C. Proposed Staffing and Project Organization

• A statement that key personnel will be available to the extent proposed for the duration of the On-Call Land Development and Plan Checking Services and an acknowledgement that no person designated as key personnel shall be removed or replaced without the prior written concurrence of the City. Identify any constraints, conflicts or situations that would prevent the Consultant from being able to begin work on this assignment.

D. Consultants and/or Sub-consultants

The City desires to enter into a contract with one Consultant that will be responsible for all work, products, and services. There is to be no assignment of any aspect of this project without the prior written authorization of the City. If the Consultant plans on using consultants and/or subcontractors as part of its implementation plan, then company profile, name, address, and telephone for all consultants and/or subcontractors providing support during the term of this project is required. Define the responsibilities and give a description of services to be provided by consultants and/or subcontractors. Describe the Firm's business and reporting relationship with any consultants and/or subcontractors. Include references and resumes for all third party Firms in your proposal. The City has the right to accept or reject any changes made to the proposed project team members, including the use of consultants and/or subcontractors.

E. Work Approach

This section of the Proposal shall include a narrative that addresses the Scope of Services and demonstrates that Consultant understands the scope of this project. More specifically, the Proposal should include the Consultant's general approach for completing the activities specified in the Scope of Services. The work approach shall be of sufficient detail to demonstrate Consultant's ability to accomplish the project tasks.

F. Client References

List your five (5) most recent similar clients (including name, address, contact person, and phone number). The City is most interested in government and California clients and may randomly select agencies to contact from your list as part of the evaluation process.

G. Appendices

This part shall include brief resumes of proposed staff. Consultant information and general marketing materials will not be considered in the ranking of the Proposals.

H. Rights to Materials

All responses, inquiries, and correspondence relating to this RFP and all reports, charts, displays, schedules, exhibits, and other documentation produced by the Consultant that are submitted as part of the proposal and not withdrawn shall, upon receipt by City, become property of City.

13. PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

A. GENERAL

All proposals will be evaluated based on the technical information and qualifications presented in the proposal, reference checks, and other information, which may be gathered independently. Requests for clarification and/or additional information from any proposer may be requested at any point in the evaluation process. Pricing (Consultant fees) will be an important criterion; however, the City reserves the right to select a firm that presents the best qualifications, but not necessarily the lowest price.

B. EVALUATION CRITERIA

- Completeness of proposal.
- Consultant and key project team member's experience in performing similar work.
- Consultant and key project team member's record in accomplishing work assignments for projects.
- Consultant's demonstrated understanding of the scope of work.
- Quality of work previously performed by the firm as verified by reference checks.
- Relevant project experience.
- Fee proposal.

C. EVALUATION AND RANKING

After evaluating all proposals received, the City will rank the firms and the three (3) most qualified firms will be invited to an interview with the City Evaluation Committee, if necessary.

D. INTERVIEW

The Consultant should have available the project manager and key project personnel to discuss the following:

- The major elements of the proposal and be prepared to answer questions clarifying the proposal.
- A description of previously related experience for key project team member(s). Work sample exhibits may also be used.

E. FINAL SELECTION

The final selection will be the consultant which, in the City's opinion, is the most responsive and responsible, meets the City's requirements in providing this service, and is in the City's best interest. The City maintains the sole and exclusive right to evaluate the merits of the proposals received.

14. EXCEPTIONS OR ADDITIONS

The Proposal shall include a detailed description of all of the exceptions to the provisions and conditions of this RFP upon which the Consultant's submittal is contingent and which shall take precedence over this RFP.

15. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to the start of contract negotiations, the highest qualified Consultant will be required to submit to the City the required insurance certificates for the Consultant and its team. Insurance certificates will also be required, in advance, for any Consultant subsequently identified for negotiations with the City.

The successful Consultant shall indemnify and hold City and its officers, agents, employees, and assigns harmless from any liability imposed for injury whether arising before or after completion of work hereunder or in any manner directly or indirectly caused, occasioned, or contributed to, or claims to be caused, occasioned, or contributed to, in whole or in part, by reason of any act or omission, including strict liability or negligence of Consultant, or of anyone acting under Consultant's direction or control or on its behalf, in connection with, or incident to, or arising out of the performance of this contract.

The Consultant selected will be required to maintain the following levels of insurance coverage for the duration of the services provided, as well as any sub-consultants hired by the Consultant:

- Worker's Compensation insurance with statutory limits, and employer's liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per accident
- Commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence
- Business automobile liability insurance, or equivalent form, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles.
- Professional liability (errors and omissions) insurance, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

16. RIGHTS OF THE CITY

- The right to waive minor discrepancies, informalities and/or irregularities in the RFP or in the requirements for submission of a Proposal.

Should a contract be subsequently entered into between the City and Consultant, it shall be duly noted that entering into such an agreement shall be interpreted, construed, and given effect in all respects according to the laws of the State of California. The successful Consultant shall secure a City of Santa Fe Springs business license through the City's Finance and Administrative Services Department at the time the contract is awarded.

Waiver of Proposals

Proposals may be withdrawn by submitting written notice to the City's Contact Person at any time prior to the submittal deadline. Upon submission, the Proposal and all collateral material shall become the property of the City.

17. CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT DISCLOSURES

The Consultant acknowledges that all information submitted in response to this RFP is subject to public inspection under the California Public Records Act unless exempted by law. If the Consultant believes any information submitted should be protected from such disclosure due to its confidential, proprietary nature or other reasons, it must identify such information and the basis for the belief in its disclosure. Any proposal submitted with a blanket statement or limitation that would prohibit or limit such public inspection shall be considered non-responsive and shall be rejected. Notwithstanding that disclaimer, it is the intention of the City to keep all submittals confidential until such time as negotiations are successfully concluded.

ON-CALL LAND DEVELOPMENT AND PLAN CHECKING SERVICES

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Consultant's services will generally include topographic, design, and construction surveys of Capital Improvements projects (roadway, water lines, sewer, storm drain, etc.). The work to be done by the Consultant shall be as specified in a Work Order, to be issued by the City to the Consultant prior to starting any work.

- <u>Parcel Map Review/Approval</u> Review and approval of parcel maps, legal descriptions, lot line adjustments and other development-related survey work, as required by the Subdivision Map Act under California Government Code section 66442.
- Topographic Survey A survey locating topographic features, natural and man-made, such as buildings, improvements, fences, elevations, trees, streams, contours of the land, etc. The products of topographic surveys and topographic maps are the basis for planning studies and engineering designs.
- <u>Pavement Elevation Survey.</u> This is required for projects consisting of improvements of existing facilities, in order to develop accurate plans, specifications, and estimates.
- <u>Boundary Survey.</u> A survey for the express purpose of locating the corners and boundary lines of a given parcel of land. This involves record and field research, measurements, and computations to establish boundary lines in conformance with the Professional Land Surveyors Act. Easement lines may also be located and/or established with this type of survey.
- <u>Site Planning Survey.</u> A combination of boundary and topographic surveys for preparation of a site plan to be used for designing improvements or developments.
- <u>Utility Survey</u>. This survey is undertaken to locate existing utilities for (a) consideration in engineering design, (b) purposes of utility relocation, and (c) right-of-way acquisition and negotiation. Survey limits and types of utilities to be located should be shown on the Survey Report. It is important to locate all significant utility facilities.
- Construction Survey. Construction staking of improvements shown on improvement plans for control of construction on developments for roads, buildings, pipelines, etc. Construction surveys establish basic line and grade for project construction. From these "control" stakes the contractor sets supplemental "working stakes." The control stakes are used also by the Project Engineer in checking the work for contract compliance. This shall also include markings of improvements, facilities, etc. to be removed during construction.
- <u>Development Plan Check</u>: Assist staff with land development plan checking of drainage, hydrology, hydraulics, storm water pollution prevention plan, erosion control.

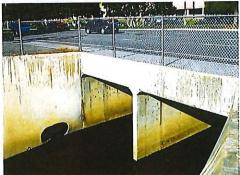

Building an excellent communications will allow us to more easily define problem areas, technical requirements and to facilitate a smoother acceptance and approval process.

Within our highly skilled staff of engineers, project managers, QA/QC team and constructability reviewers are personnel that take their chosen profession very seriously. This team strives for the highest quality of service in each project review. Because our plan check engineers are also experienced designers that utilize the local, regional and other applicable design standards on a day to day basis, we can assure the improvement plans and associated reports and documents will meet the current applicable codes and standards.

PENCO uses these very important project controls to deliver a project review that meets the City's financial goals, schedule and

ability to deliver to its citizens the level of professionally developed projects that are consistent with the values and goals of the City of Santa Fe Springs. We will succeed as a partner with the City of Santa Fe Springs in the projects we are selected to review now and in the future.

APPROACH

General plan checking review services include review of the conditions of approval, review of reference material, review of City standard plans and plan check requirements, accessibility, constructability/ clarity, maintenance and general design. We will perform grading, right-of-way, and site accessibility plan reviews for projects constructed in the City for conformance with City Codes and ordinances, including the "Greenbook" Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, County Standards and Design Manual, California Building Codes related to site accessibility.

If circumstances arise, we will review the WQMP along with grading review, or by itself in conformance with Regional Board NPDES permit, City Codes and ordinances and other City specific requirements.

Extensive coordination is required between the different City departments and engineer of record to ensure quick turnaround times. We, as the City's Plan Check Engineer, will do everything possible to expedite the services process. PENCO understands plan checking will follow a set schedule of turnaround time-frames as established by the City and shall not exceed three total plan check cycles. Should any occasion arise where a plan check is expected to exceed three cycles, PENCO will inform the City's engineering staff and a meeting will be coordinated by the City with PENCO and the developer to resolve outstanding issues.

PENCO will scan all plan checks for record keeping purposes until plans receive final approval by the City. A record of when plans



are received and returned to the City will also be kept.

PENCO understands that all improvement plan check services shall be performed by or under the responsible charge of a California Licensed Professional Engineer (and/or California Licensed Land Surveyor as applicable) eligible to prepare and sign such plans.

Civil Engineering Plan Checking Services

PENCO also understands that a minimum, plan check services shall be provided in conformance with the most current version of the following documents and standards:

- Conditions of Approval and Title Reports
- Master Plans
- Municipal Code
- Grading Ordinance and Grading Plan Check Requirements
- California Building Codes related to site accessibility
- Low Impact Development
- APWA Standard Plans and Standard Specifications (Greenbook) for improvements in Public R/W
- Approved Specific Plans, Site Plans, Environmental Documents, and/or Tentative and Final Maps
- Grants, easements, or vacations as applicable
- Traverse, Lot and Tract Boundary Closures for final or parcel maps Subdivision Map Act

PENCO understands that for land development projects, prior to completion of the first plan check, PENCO may research existing City engineering records including, but not limited to the documents described above for consistency with the proposed improvements. PENCO shall also visit the project site to verify the proposed improvements are consistent with the physical constraints in the field.

Facilitating the Plan Check Process

We understand the concern, need and desire to complete plan checks within three (3) plan checks or less. It has been our experience that when three (3) plan checks or more are required, there is potentially an issue or concern that has not been addressed up front or there has been a breakdown in communication. We have experienced success in the past by implementing the following approach.

- Timely and complete technical reviews of the submitted plans and associated reports.
- Sound record keeping and documentation of when plan reviews are submitted, and returned, correspondence files, meeting minutes (if necessary) plan check mark-ups and reference materials.
- 3. Communication between plan reviewer(s) and the Engineer/Architect of Record through phone calls, e-mails, faxes and plan check review meetings, as needed. Keeping our client and the project owners informed through CC's of Review Memo's, e-mails and Plan Check Logs.

Record Keeping and Reporting

Through years of experience, we have developed streamlined procedures that produce timely, accurate and consistent plan reviews. All Improvement Plans submitted will be logged into a plan check log. The plan check log tracks the engineer of record, types of improvement plans submitted, date submitted, due date to be completed, and any significant comments or submittal requirements outstanding for that plan review. PENCO will provide regular updates (typically on a weekly basis) of the status of plan reviews to report progress and anticipated return dates of projects that are in for plan check.

Turnaround Time

Although plan review turnaround time frames will vary with the complexity or extent of the project, the requirements outlined in the City's RFP are acceptable. From our experience, the plan check review periods are as follows:

 1st Submittal: PENCO will complete the initial plan check work, of drawings and of related documents, within three (3) weeks from the date that complete



drawings and related documents arrive in consultant's office. An exception shall be that, for projects of major size and/or complexity (as mutually agreed), the period of performance shall be negotiated with the City.

- When plan corrections shall be required, a written plan correction list shall be provided to the applicant, or the applicant's agent(s).
- 2nd Submittal: PENCO will complete the second plan check work, of drawings and of related documents, within two (2) weeks from the date the complete and revised drawings and related documents arrive in consultant's office. Plans and documents for re-checking shall be submitted (in response to correction lists) by the applicant, or by the applicant's agent(s).
- 3rd Submittal: PENCO will complete any subsequent re-checks, of drawings and of related documents, within two (2) weeks from the date the complete and revised drawings and related documents arrive in consultant's office. Plans and documents for subsequent re-checking shall be submitted (in response to correction lists) by the applicant, or by the applicant's agent(s).
- Approval: One (1) week

Expedited reviews although not typical, are anticipated and we are open to having discussions with the City and executing these types of reviews, if necessary.

Potential Scope of Services

The Scope of Services for potential tasks may include:

Mass, Rough and/or Precise Grading Plans:
PENCO will perform review of rough grading plans for substantial conformance to the approved documents from the entitlement process, including but not limited to tentative map, drainage concepts (hydrology and hydraulics), water quality BMPs, etc.
Review of precise grading plans consists of conformance with the City's grading ordinance and subdivision manual, including but not

limited to, verification of detailed finish grade elevations to show drainage patterns, flowlines for lot drainage, proposed paving, grading plans are signed and sealed by a Registered Civil Engineer, and may include identifying all previous preliminary grading permits issued for the project site.

Street Improvements Plans: PENCO will review subdivision street improvement plans, provide comments and recommend for approval. We will check for compliance with City adopted Standard Plans and applicable regulations using the checklist available on-line or as provided by staff. Services shall include initial and subsequent reviews, full or partial plan review services, interaction with the client and recommendations to City staff for final approval. To ensure adequate document preparation, we shall attend project status meetings with City staff and with others as required to discuss status and/or details of the project.

Wet Utility Plan Review (Sewer, Water, Storm Drain, Potable Water and/or Recycled Water): PENCO will perform review of wet utility plans, consisting of sewer, water and storm drain, including, but not limited to, verifying conformance to City's design standards, constructability of the proposed wet utility design improvements considering site constraints, design requirements, existing conditions, confirm labels and calculations of pipe slopes, pipe size, material and hydraulic data. Additional items for review include verification of basic separation standards for water mains and sanitary sewers/storm drains in compliance with the California Waterworks Standards and California Department of Public Health criteria to prevent contamination of the public water supplies, verification of pressure zone boundaries, if necessary, for water improvements, confirmation of existing storm drain and sewer structure capacities, identify potential utility conflicts, and compare manhole rim elevation versus pad elevations.

Hydrology Studies and Hydraulics Calculations: Services can include, but is not limited to:



- Provide preliminary design review of hydrology/hydraulics technical reports for proposed private development projects and attend City design review meetings as necessary. PENCO will be performing the duties to complete these task orders.
- Verify the new site won't put additional stress on the existing drainage system
- Verify post-development flow doesn't exceed existing conditions
- Verify all tributary areas that may increase the proposed development's runoff

Survey and Mapping (Easements and Right-Of-Way Dedications, Lot Line Adjustments, Tract and Parcel Maps, Title and Closure Reports): PENCO will provide review of subdivision improvement projects, which would include review of easements and rightof-way dedications; lot line adjustments; tract and parcel maps; title and closure reports; and all applicable plans and recommendations as well as any other related reports and recommendations to ensure constructability considering site constraints, design requirements, and existing conditions. Typically, tasks would include initial site assessments, review of all plans, and reports. PENCO has extensive project experience with all of these and has provided design, peer review, and plan check services for many public agencies, including the Cities of Santa Ana, Diamond Bar, Menifee and El Monte.

The following general approach describes PENCO's typical approach to define scopes and to execute Survey Map Checks for assigned projects. At this time, each task has been simplified; once we are provided with a specific project, a more detailed description of each task will be provided.

Our scope of the Final Map Plan Check program usually consists of the following phases:

- 1st Plan Check
- 2nd Plan Check
- 3rd Plan Check

SURVEY AND MAPPING APPROACH

Survey and Mapping Services

When PENCO is called to propose on a specific Project we will prepare detailed project scopes which are customized to meet the City's specific goals on a specific schedule. Upon receipt of the project RFP, PENCO will prepare a specific list of deliverables and permits or approvals required by other agencies. PENCO will provide required services within 48 hours' notice from the City or City's representative upon award of construction staking projects.

PENCO is aware that As-Needed/On-Call surveying services can involve any one, or any combination of, the following noted types of services, depending on the project requirements:

- Development map review and determination of easement requirements;
- Prior rights review and analysis/utility conflicts;
- Preparation of legal descriptions, plats and maps required to annex, appraise, acquire or dispose of property rights;
- Preparation of conveyance documents on approved City templates and secure property owners' signatures;
- Interact with City staff and outside engineering firms, developers and consultants;
- Review developer requests and issue Non-Interference Letters;
- Prepare Record of Surveys;
- Perform boundary line adjustments;
- Set boundary markers or property corners;
- Investigate boundary discrepancies and other tasks as assigned.
- Map Checks

Working in conjunction with the City's staff, PENCO will be dedicated to the successful delivery of projects that may arise under this On-Call agreement within the established time and budget. The following is a general outline of a survey Scope of Work that may be requested. Once the City identifies the specific project(s), we will meet with City staff to



obtain the parameters of the project so we can prepare a project specific scope of work.

General Requirements

PENCO has determined that J Braley, PLS, will be your Survey Manager. Mr. Braley will maintain accessibility during all business hours for City inquiries relating to projects, project communications, and project performance. The single quality that differentiates PENCO from our competitors, since most consultants have strong technical skills, is our ability to communicate with our clients and maintain project budgets and deliverables.

Official Map Preparation

PENCO has two Professional Surveyors on staff, with an accumulative 90 years of experience in surveying and mapping. PENCO's experience with the preparation of Final Maps (Tract Maps and Parcel Maps), and Records of Survey allows us to prepare these maps in a manner that will provide for a minimum number of map checks.

Legal Descriptions

PENCO has experience with the Vacations of Public right-of-ways, preparation of legal descriptions, exhibit plats and traverse closure calculations each of which is an integral component of processing and recording easements. We are very familiar with simple one page easements along with the multi-segmented, many paged, easements that are often times prepared for public agencies, water districts or Southern California Edison Company. PENCO also is very adept at the plotting or interpreting of existing easements of record that is often times necessary in the verification of subsurface utilities being consistent with easements of record.

Topographic Survey Mapping

PENCO has experience providing topography to our public works, institutional, and general contracting clients in the local area. In accordance with appropriate agency standards and PENCO's standards, we incorporate horizontal control, based upon the California Coordinate System, NAD'83, Zone VI, 2007 Epoch, and vertical control based, upon

NAVD'88 datum. PENCO utilizes the latest GPS and total station technology to prepare detailed project topography. A topo survey, if there is such a thing, would typically be a combination of aerial topography and ground specific topography. Our electronic data and drawing files are created within AutoCAD Civil3d software and established to be consistent with the appropriate agency's mapping standards.

Right of Way Survey

The typical street right-of-way base map is compiled from record data available from a combination of resources. This mapping process should begin with a thorough investigation at the County Recorder's office to obtain copies of recorded final maps (i.e.: Tract Maps, Parcel Maps, Record of Surveys, Corner Records, Lot Line Adjustments, etc.) along with a preliminary title report for each of the abutting land parcels to the proposed street right-of-way. The base map process will also incorporate a collection, review and understanding of current centerline tie notes on file with the County of Orange. The Right-of-Way base map is the foundation of a successful design survey for the Engineer/ Surveyor and is a very critical component in the civil design phase and in the determination of public and private ownership.

Monument Preservation

Due to the number of ALTA Surveys, Public Works Strip Topographic Surveys, and Institutional Aerial Topographic Survey Maps prepared by PENCO, we often prepare Pre-Construction Corner Record Certificates and Post-Construction Corner Record Certificates in accordance with the California Land Surveyor's Act, Section 8771. This process allows for the verification of existing monuments and centerline ties, along with the replacement of centerline monuments and reference ties.

Construction Staking

PENCO has spent many years developing a very strong Construction Staking process that lends itself to a series of checks and balances on our in-house support calculations and field staking operations. PENCO's team of office and



field surveyors have been working together for approximately 15 years, and we take great pride in our workmanship and communication skills. Upon receipt of an NTP from the City, we would typically prepare a Survey Staking Plan, based upon project information provided by the City. This would include boundary data, easement information, and all proposed construction items (i.e.: utilities, buildings, curbs, gutters, walkways, etc.) that are to be constructed. The Survey Staking Plan would include specific staking items, per the daily work request, along with the stake numbers, point numbers, coordinate values, stake elevation, and stake offset. This plan will be utilized in conjunction with the daily grade sheets prepared by our field surveyors and two copies left at the site. The Survey Staking Plan is intended to, and has been proven to, minimize project restaking; and provides an excellent reference map for general contractors' subcontractors.

As-Built Surveys

As-Built Surveys are quickly becoming a more common request in the construction industry. This has much to do with the cost of materials and time loss on construction projects that are forced to remove curbs, gutters, utilities, and sometimes building footings and walls due to being constructed incorrectly. Upon receipt of an NTP from the City, we would request hard copy plans and electronic CAD files of the construction project and prepare a Staking Plot that depicts boundary, easements of record, along with the proposed construction features (i.e., utilities, public improvements, hardscaping, buildings, etc.). This Staking Plan is used by the field surveyors to complete their daily staking tasks and two copies are left at the site for the project superintendent. This plan will identify the current staking that was placed for the contractor's use, along with stake identifications being point numbers, coordinate values, point description, and stake offsets. The Staking Plan is to be utilized in conjunction with the daily grade sheets, and the plan standard is to have field survey verification, horizontal and vertical, of particular construction components

throughout the construction project. PENCO would respond to a City request, determine exact scope of "As-Built" limits needed, determine control that was utilized for construction of said facilities, collect field data, prepare field notes, obtain site photographs of pertinent objects, transmit to our office, prepare mapping exhibits, along with a summary explanation report of findings.

Benchmark Verifications/Establishment

PENCO maintains the most up to date survey equipment available and repeatedly is determining the relationship of one benchmark to another throughout the appropriate agency. Our standard field process is to incorporate a minimum of three record benchmarks in a project assessment. We will provide benchmark verification level notes, along with any adjustments that may be required. If necessary, a project specific secondary site benchmark will be established for project construction utilization. This benchmark could be set in a number of differing methods depending on the appropriate agency and the project requirements.

Horizontal and Vertical Control

PENCO's survey crews establish or verify horizontal and vertical control, on a daily basis, for the following types of projects: design topo; boundary mapping; public works; and land development. We utilize the California Coordinate System of 1983, Zone VI, 2007 Epoch for horizontal control network, and the North American Datum of 1988 for our vertical datum. All control establishments are documented with daily field notes, depicting specific equipment utilized, field measurements, staff, weather conditions, etc.

MAP CHECKING APPROACH

When PENCO is asked to propose on a specific Survey Map Checking Project, we will meet or exceed all scheduling expectations.

The following general approach describes our typical approach to define scopes and to execute Survey Map Checks for assigned projects. At this time, each task has been



simplified; once we are provided with a specific project, a more detailed description of each task will be provided.

Our scope or the final Map Check program for Subdivision Maps, Parcel Maps, and Records of Survey usually consists of the following phases:

1st Map Check - 3 week turnaround

During this phase, PENCO will review title reports, deeds, record maps, tie notes, and Corner Records for impact on boundary establishment. We will provide a thorough review on the first map check to ensure adherence to the Subdivision Map Act, The City of Santa Fe Springs Subdivision Ordinance, and the City map checking procedures. In addition, we will review our comments with City staff before issuing to the surveyor/engineer of record. We will utilize these standard procedures for each subsequent map check.

2nd Map Check - 2 week turnaround

During this phase, PENCO will check the revisions against comments made in the 1st Map Check and issue to the surveyor/engineer of record for re-submittal.

3rd Map Check - 1 week turnaround

During this phase, PENCO will check the revisions against comments made in 2nd map check and issue to the surveyor/ engineer of record for final mylar request.

Approval - 1 week turnaround

QA/QC Program for Survey Map Checking

PENCO project team is committed to providing the City of Santa Fe Springs with the best possible product, on schedule and within budget, and error-free. To accomplish this, the team has a Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) Program that is organized in a manner that will accommodate the specific needs and requirements of the project, and ensure that the project documents that are developed and delivered to the City are checked properly. Deliverables will include a thorough check of map plans.

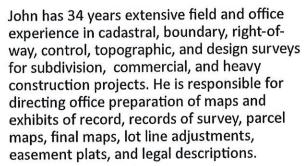

<u>Christmas Tree Sales Lot – Request for Approval</u>

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council:

 Approve the proposed Christmas Tree Sales Lot on property located at 13007 Telegraph Road, subject to the conditions of approval as contained within this staff report.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Section 155.620 of the City's Zoning Regulations, the sale of Christmas trees and wreaths must be authorized by the City Council prior to the commencement of such activities. The applicant, Ralph Edwards of Big Top Christmas Trees, is therefore requesting approval to use the vacant .82-acre lot at 13007 Telegraph Road, in the City of Santa Fe Springs, for the sale of Christmas trees and wreaths.

The sales activities will begin on December 1, 2018 and end on December 25, 2018. The hours of operation will be from 9:00am to 9:00pm, seven days a week. According to the site plan provided by the applicant (see provided attachment), sales activity will occur behind a fenced area along the southwest portion of the site. Parking will be provided along the northerly property line, with ingress and egress via two driveways: one driveway along Telegraph Road and another driveway along Greenleaf Avenue. According to the application (see provided attachment), there will be no office trailer, food or drinks, security personnel, and pre-recorded or live music associated with the subject tree lot.

Prior to bringing this matter before the City Council, staff forwarded the application and related materials to the City's Building, Fire, and Police Services departments for their review and comment. Any comments or suggested conditions by other city departments have been incorporated into the attached list of recommended conditions.

The Mayor may wish to call upon Wayne Morrell, Director of Planning, to answer any questions the Council may have regarding the proposed Christmas Tree Sales Lot.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of the proposed Christmas Tree Sales Lot has a positive financial impact on the City from both permit fees and from a portion of the sales tax generated from the sale of Christmas trees and wreaths.

RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. Sales of Christmas trees and wreaths shall begin on December 1, 2018 and end on December 25, 2018. Additionally, the premises shall be cleaned up and restored to a neat and orderly condition by December 31, 2018.
- 2. Sales of Christmas trees and wreaths shall occur within the fenced area as depicted on the site plan that was provided by the applicant. Additionally, both gates shall remain open during business hours.

3. The hours of operation shall be limited between the hours of 9:00am to 9:00pm, Monday through Sunday.

- 4. A Business Operations Tax Certificate (BOTC) shall be obtained from the City's Finance Department unless applicant already has a valid BOTC.
- Applicant shall obtain all necessary permits related to the proposed Christmas
 Tree Sales lot from the City's Building and Safety Department, including but
 not limited to the proposed tent, temporary fence/gates, temporary power pole
 and all electrical wiring.
- 6. No food or beverages shall be served.
- 7. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on-site at all times.
- 8. That night lighting shall be provided at a minimum of 1-foot-candle (1-lumen) per square foot during business hours. Additional lighting may be required if an ATM is used on the premises.
- That a contact phone number shall be provided to the Police Services Center for the person or persons staying inside any trailer or recreational vehicle (RV) for emergency contact.
- Applicant shall monitor and ensure that the subject Christmas Tree Sales lot operates within the noise limitations established within Section 155.424 of the City's Zoning Regulations.
- 11. Temporary signage (if used) shall conform to the City's sign guidelines.
- 12. "No Smoking" signs shall be posted at all entrances.
- 13. Balloons, pennants, and flags (if used) shall not hang or float over the street or adjacent properties.
- 14. All signage or advertisement shall be reviewed and approved by the Planning Department and maintained within the lot. Off-site signs are not permitted.
- 15. That the Applicant shall not allow sign holders and/or sign twirlers on or off the property.
- 16. That the Applicant shall not allow signs or character signs that whirl, wave, float, fly or move mechanically or in the breeze.
- 17. Written permission from property owner and/or property management shall be provided to the Department of Planning and Development as part of the approval process.

- 18. Applicant shall obtain a permits from the City's Department of Fire Rescue for any proposed tent(s) in excess of 700 square feet. Additionally, proposed tent shall remain open on all four sides. Applicant shall also monitor and ensure that there will be no parking, smoking, or generators located within 20' of the proposed tent.
- 19. Applicant shall monitor and ensure that an unobstructed 6' center aisle is continually maintained. Exit paths and aisles must be a minimum of 36" wide.
- 20. An adequate number of appropriate 2A-10BC portable fire extinguishers shall be provided and maintained in working condition at all times. 1 for every 1,000 square feet and 1 additional for every 2,000 square feet.
- 21. Signage showing the location of the fire extinguishers shall be provided pursuant to the Fire Code.
- 22. Extension cords and power-strips are subject to the review and approval by the Building Department and the Department of Fire Rescue.
- 23. That all trees, wreaths, bows and other similar decorations shall not be stored within 15' of an exit.
- 24. The fenced-in lot shall be provide a minimum of 2 exits, adequately remote.
- 25. The exit signs shall be posted at all exits.
- 26. Exits shall remain unobstructed at all times, and locked in the open position during business hours.
- 27. Fire lanes shall not be used as loading zones.
- 28. That all Christmas tree related trash and debris shall be stored in noncombustible receptacles at least 30' from tent.
- 29. Trees sold as Fire Resistant shall include the following:
 - Names of material used and State Marshal ID number.
 - b. Date of material application.
 - The location where the material was applied.
 - d. Signature of applicator.
- 30. If fire-retardant materials are to be applied to trees on site, the applicator must have a Limited Application Certification from the California State Fire Marshal.
- 31. That the on-site flocking shall be contained and applied in a separate area.
- 32. There shall not be any open flames and burning.
- 33. Wood chips or straw used as bedding shall be kept moist at all times.
- 34. Devices emitting flame, fire or heat or any flammable or combustible liquids, gas, charcoal or other cooking device shall not be permitted inside the tent or be located within 20 feet of the tent or trees.

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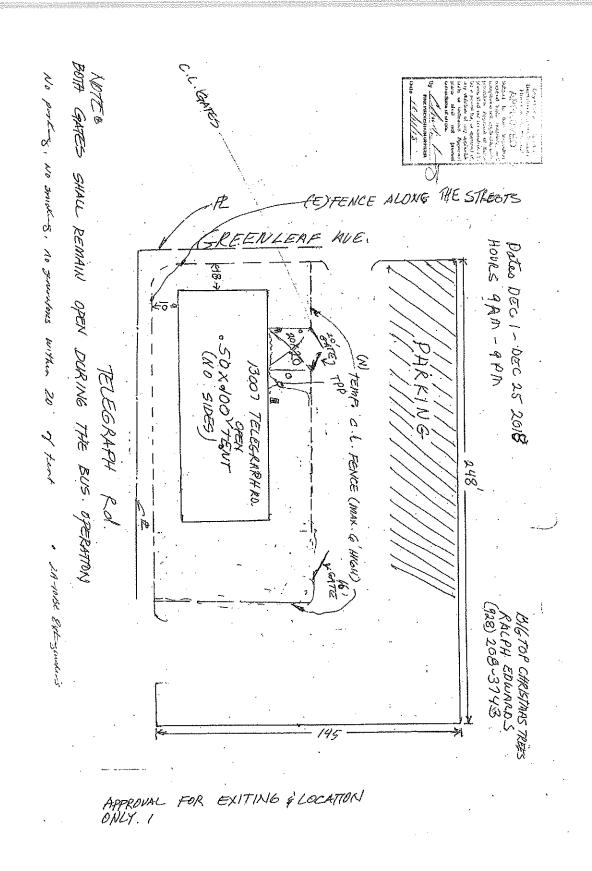

Approval of 2019 Art Fest Event Professional Services Agreement

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the Director of Community Services to execute a revised Professional Services Agreement with Crepes and Grapes Café, LLC. Sandra Hahn, for consulting services of the 2019 Art Fest event.

BACKGROUND

Through the guidance and direction of the Heritage Arts Advisory Committee (HAAC), the City will once again host its annual Art Fest on May 3, 2019 at the Clarke Estate. The event continues to successfully grow year after year. Participation of artists has increased to over 300 who showcase their art in a variety of mediums, and approximately 3,000 guests attend this festival annually.

At the September 14, 2017 City Council meeting, Council approved a two-year Art Fest Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with Crepes and Grapes Café, LLC. Sandra Hanh. The PSA was approved in the amount of \$49,000 and implemented for the 2018 Art Fest. However, the HAAC is recommending that the booking and scheduling of all 2019 Art Fest entertainment be done by the City. This change in responsibility will reduce the PSA to \$46,500.00, a \$2,500 savings.

The 2019 Art Fest will follow the same format as in previous years and will continue to include educational workshops, local artists and art vendors, art for purchase, and enhanced entertainment, food and beverages. The film component, Trompe l'oeil art competition, and Paint & Sip Art Sessions will also continue in 2019.

The following are the anticipated services to be performed by the consultant for the 2019 Art Fest. These services have not changed from the 2018 event.

Pre-Art Fest Preparation:

Artist commissioning/recruitment - "Calling All Artists" - Commission professional artists, recruit youth artists in the local middle schools, high schools, colleges and non-profit organizations. Also to include city employees and their family members. Recruitment of Pop-up Artist Vendors – Recruit and secure pop-up artist vendors to include cultural jewelry, handcrafted items, textiles, etc.

Donations/Sponsorships/Silent Auction - Solicit potential sponsorships, and donations for the silent auction component.

SFS ARTFEST Logo, design ad for electronic billboards, with City's approval and specifications. Design and market "Silent Auction" materials, "Paint & Wine" programs, "Looking Glass Garden" Trompe I'oeil Live installation competition, and Film Installation Screening. Consult with the City's Social Media Administrator for cross promotions and marketing materials using the City's logo and/or approved designs involving 2019 SFS ARTFEST through each party's social media forums (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) which identifies the partnership under the consultant's website name marketing "Uptowncrawlers.com."

Art Fest Event Implementation:

Collectors Night- Promote Santa Fe Spring Chamber members to network among the artists, help engagement through cross-marketing efforts, Create a second night event for Community, Artist and Vendors

Drop off / Installation / Pick up of art work - Plan and coordinate with City staff for check-in, artwork drop-off, installation and return of all unsold artwork.

Sales of Art - Work collaboratively with City staff to conduct all sales of art at the Art Fest event.

Post Art Fest and Evaluation Report:

Final Report - Provide the City with a written summary and analysis report of all participating artists.

Meetings with City Staff:

Consultant will participate in all of the 2019 Art Fest Planning Committee meetings (meeting scheduled once a month, time and date to be determined). Meeting dates may be changed at the mutual consent of both parties.

CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH CREPES & GRAPES CAFÉ, LLC. 2019 SFS ARTFEST

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 8th day of November, 2018 ("Effective Date"), by and between the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, a municipal corporation ("CITY"), and Crepes & Grapes, LLC. Sandra Hahn, a California Art Festival Consultant ("Consultant").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City proposes to utilize the services of Consultant as an independent contractor to provide Consulting services for the 2019 Art Fest event, as more fully described herein; and

WHEREAS, Consultant represents that it has that degree of specialized expertise contemplated within California Government Code section 37103, and holds all necessary requirements to practice and perform the services herein contemplated; and

WHEREAS, City and Consultant desire to contract for the specific services described in Exhibit "A" (the "Project") and desire to set forth their rights, duties and liabilities in connection with the services to be performed; and

WHEREAS, no official or employee of City has a financial interest, within the provisions of sections 1090-1092 of the California Government Code, in the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1.0. SERVICES PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

- 1.1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the professional services described and attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and Consultant's Response to City's scope of services ("Consultant's Proposal"), attached hereto as Exhibit "B," both incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.2. <u>Professional Practices</u>. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel experienced in their respective fields and in a manner consistent with the standards of care, diligence and skill ordinarily exercised by professional Consultants in similar fields and circumstances in accordance with sound professional practices. Consultant also warrants that it is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise City of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement.
- 1.3. Performance to Satisfaction of City. Consultant agrees to perform all the work to the complete satisfaction of the City and within the hereinafter specified. Evaluations of the work will be done by the City Manager or his or her designee. If the quality of work is not satisfactory, City in its discretion has the right to:

- (a) Meet with Consultant to review the quality of the work and resolve the matters of concern:
- (b) Require Consultant to repeat the work at no additional fee until it is satisfactory; and/or
- (c) Terminate the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.
- 1.4. Warranty. Consultant warrants that it shall perform the services required by this Agreement in compliance with all applicable Federal and California employment laws, including, but not limited to, those laws related to minimum hours and wages; occupational health and safety; fair employment and employment practices; workers' compensation insurance and safety in employment; and all other Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the services required under this Agreement. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless City from and against all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, proceedings, and judgments of every nature and description including attorneys' fees and costs, presented, brought, or recovered against City for, or on account of any liability under any of the above-mentioned laws, which may be incurred by reason of Consultant's performance under this Agreement.
- 1.5. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. In performing this Agreement, Consultant shall not engage in, nor permit its agents to engage in, discrimination in employment of persons because of their race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military or veteran status, except as permitted pursuant to section 12940 of the Government Code.
- 1.6. <u>Non-Exclusive Agreement</u>. Consultant acknowledges that City may enter into agreements with other Consultants for services similar to the services that are subject to this Agreement or may have its own employees perform services similar to those services contemplated by this Agreement.
- 1.7. <u>Delegation and Assignment</u>. This is a personal service contract, and the duties set forth herein shall not be delegated or assigned to any person or entity without the prior written consent of City. Consultant may engage a subcontractor(s) as permitted by law and may employ other personnel to perform services contemplated by this Agreement at Consultant's sole cost and expense.
- 1.8. Confidentiality. Employees of Consultant in the course of their duties may have access to financial, accounting, statistical, and personnel data of private individuals and employees of City. Consultant covenants that all data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by City. City shall grant such authorization if disclosure is required by law. All City data shall be returned to City upon the termination of this Agreement. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

2.0. COMPENSATION AND BILLING

2.1. <u>Compensation</u>. Consultant shall be paid in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in Exhibit "C," attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement by this reference (the "Fee Schedule"). Consultant's total compensation shall not exceed \$46,500.00 (dollars).

- 2.2. <u>Additional Services</u>. Consultant shall not receive compensation for any services provided outside the scope of services specified in the Consultant's Proposal unless the City or the Project Manager for this Project, prior to Consultant performing the additional services, approves such additional services in writing. It is specifically understood that oral requests and/or approvals of such additional services or additional compensation shall be barred and are unenforceable.
- 2.3. Method of Billing. Consultant may submit invoices to the City for approval on a progress basis, but no more often than two times a month. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to City's sole satisfaction. City shall pay Consultant's invoice within twenty-five (25) days from the date City receives said invoice. Each invoice shall describe in detail, the services performed, the date of performance, and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.
- 2.4. Records and Audits. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to City or its Project Manager for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times from the Effective Date until two (2) years after termination of this Agreement.

3.0. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

- 3.1. <u>Commencement and Completion of Work</u>. The professional services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall commence within five (5) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Said services shall be performed in strict compliance with the Project Schedule approved by City as set forth in Exhibit "D," attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The Project Schedule may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties. Failure to commence work in a timely manner and/or diligently pursue work to completion may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- 3.2. <u>Excusable Delays</u>. Except for rain neither party shall be responsible for delays or lack of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of the party or parties. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire, strikes, material shortages, compliance with laws or regulations, riots, acts of war, or any other conditions beyond the reasonable control of a party.

4.0. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 4.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue for a period of seven months, ending on May 30, 2019, unless previously terminated as provided herein or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties. This Agreement may be extended by additional 1 year period upon mutual written agreement of both parties.
- 4.2. <u>Notice of Termination</u>. The City reserves and has the right and privilege of canceling, suspending or abandoning the execution of all or any part of the work contemplated by this Agreement, with or without cause, at any time, by providing written notice to Consultant. The termination of this Agreement shall be deemed effective upon receipt of the notice of termination. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall immediately stop rendering services under this Agreement unless directed otherwise by the City.
 - 4.3. Compensation. In the event of termination, City shall pay Consultant for

reasonable costs incurred and professional services satisfactorily performed up to and including the date of City's written notice of termination. Compensation for work in progress shall be prorated based on the percentage of work completed as of the effective date of termination in accordance with the fees set forth herein. In ascertaining the professional services actually rendered hereunder up to the effective date of termination of this Agreement, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in progress, to complete and incomplete drawings, and to other documents pertaining to the services contemplated herein whether delivered to the City or in the possession of the Consultant.

4.4. <u>Documents</u>. In the event of termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by Consultant in its performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, finished or unfinished design, development and construction documents, data studies, drawings, maps and reports, shall be delivered to the City within ten (10) days of delivery of termination notice to Consultant, at no cost to City. Any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from Consultant shall be at City's sole risk and without liability or legal expense to Consultant.

5.0. INSURANCE

- 5.1. <u>Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall obtain, maintain, and keep in full force and effect during the life of this Agreement all of the following minimum scope of insurance coverages with an insurance company admitted to do business in California, rated "A," Class X, or better in the most recent Best's Key Insurance Rating Guide, and approved by City:
 - (a) Commercial general liability, including premises-operations, products/completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual liability, independent contractors, personal injury or bodily injury with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - (b) Business automobile liability for owned vehicles, hired, and non-owned vehicles, with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - (c) Workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California. Consultant agrees to waive, and to obtain endorsements from its workers' compensation insurer waiving subrogation rights under its workers' compensation insurance policy against the City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers arising from work performed by Consultant for the City and to require each of its subcontractors, if any, to do likewise under their workers' compensation insurance policies.
 - (d) Professional errors and omissions ("E&O") liability insurance with policy limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence and aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage shall be endorsed to include contractual liability. If the policy is written as a "claims made" policy, the retro date shall be prior to the start of the contract work. Consultant shall obtain and maintain, said E&O liability insurance

during the life of this Agreement and for three years after completion of the work hereunder.

- 5.2. <u>Endorsements</u>. The commercial general liability insurance policy and business automobile liability policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:
 - (a) Additional insureds: "The City of Santa Fe Springs and its elected and appointed boards, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers are additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant pursuant to its contract with the City; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the Consultant."
 - (b) Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, be suspended, or voided, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage or limits reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to City."
 - (c) Other insurance: "The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. Any other insurance maintained by the City of Santa Fe Springs shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
 - (d) Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the City of Santa Fe Springs, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.
 - (e) The Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 5.3. <u>Deductible or Self Insured Rétention</u>. If any of such policies provide for a deductible or self-insured retention to provide such coverage, the amount of such deductible or self-insured retention shall be approved in advance by City. No policy of insurance issued as to which the City is an additional insured shall contain a provision which requires that no insured except the named insured can satisfy any such deductible or self-insured retention.
- 5.4. <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Consultant shall provide to City certificates of insurance showing the insurance coverages and required endorsements described above, in a form and content approved by City, prior to performing any services under this Agreement. The certificates of insurance shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "E" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 5.5. <u>Non-Limiting</u>. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as limiting in any way, the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement, or the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for payments of damages to persons or property.

6.0. GENERAL PROVISIONS

6.1. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to any matter referenced herein and supersedes any and all other prior writings and oral negotiations. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, and signed by

the parties in interest at the time of such modification. The terms of this Agreement shall prevail over any inconsistent provision in any other contract document appurtenant hereto, including exhibits to this Agreement.

6.2. <u>Representatives</u>. The City Manager or his or her designee shall be the representative of City for purposes of this Agreement and may issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of the City, called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a representative for purposes of this Agreement who shall be authorized to issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Consultant called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

6.3. <u>Project Managers</u>. City shall designate a Project Manager to work directly with Consultant in the performance of this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a Project Manager who shall represent it and be its agent in all consultations with City during the term of this Agreement. Consultant or its Project Manager shall attend and assist in all coordination meetings called by City.

6.4. <u>Notices</u>. Any notices, documents, correspondence or other communications concerning this Agreement or the work hereunder may be provided by personal delivery or mail and shall be addressed as set forth below. Such communication shall be deemed served or delivered: (a) at the time of delivery if such communication is sent by personal delivery, and (b) 48 hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail as reflected by the official U.S. postmark if such communication is sent through regular United States mail.

- 6.5. Attorneys' Fees. In the event that litigation is brought by any party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof.
- 6.6. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California without giving effect to that body of laws pertaining to conflict of laws. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this Agreement, the parties hereto agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a court of competent jurisdiction located in Los Angeles, California.
- 6.7. <u>Assignment</u>. Consultant shall not voluntarily or by operation of law assign, transfer, sublet or encumber all or any part of Consultant's interest in this Agreement without City's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment, transfer, subletting or encumbrance shall be void and shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and cause for termination of this Agreement. Regardless of City's consent, no subletting or assignment shall release Consultant of Consultant's obligation to perform all other obligations to be performed by Consultant hereunder for the term of this Agreement.
- Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, hold free and harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees, at Consultant's sole expense, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits or other legal proceedings brought against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees arising out of the performance of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, of the work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. The defense obligation provided for hereunder shall apply without any advance showing of negligence or wrongdoing by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, but shall be required whenever any claim, action, complaint, or suit asserts as its basis the negligence, errors, omissions or misconduct of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, and/or whenever any claim, action, complaint or suit asserts liability against the City, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees based upon the work performed by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors under this Agreement, whether or not the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors are specifically named or otherwise asserted to be liable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultant shall not be liable for the defense or indemnification of the City for claims, actions, complaints or suits arising out of the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. This provision shall supersede and replace all other indemnity provisions contained either in the City's specifications or Consultant's Proposal, which shall be of no force and effect.
- 6.9. Independent Contractor. Consultant is and shall be acting at all times as an independent contractor and not as an employee of City. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not, at any time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of City. Consultant shall secure, at its sole expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Tax, Social Security, State Disability Insurance Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for Consultant and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, if any are required, in connection with the services to be performed hereunder. Consultant shall indemnify and hold City harmless from any

and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against City by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Agreement. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold City harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with the applicable worker's compensation laws. City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Agreement any amount due to City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to promptly pay to City any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this paragraph.

6.10. PERS Eligibility Indemnification. In the event that Consultant or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Consultant providing services under this Agreement claims or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) to be eligible for enrollment in PERS as an employee of the City, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless City for the payment of any employee and/or employer contributions for PERS benefits on behalf of Consultant or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the responsibility of City.

Notwithstanding any other agency, state or federal policy, rule, regulation, law or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing service under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including but not limited to eligibility to enroll in PERS as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contribution and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

- 6.11. <u>Cooperation</u>. In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance or services rendered under this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which City might require.
- 6.12. Ownership of Documents. All findings, reports, documents, information and data including, but not limited to, computer tapes or discs, files and tapes furnished or prepared by Consultant or any of its subcontractors in the course of performance of this Agreement, shall be and remain the sole property of City. Consultant agrees that any such documents or information shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior consent of City. Any use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement, and any use of incomplete documents, shall be at the sole risk of City and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. City shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from City's use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement or use of incomplete documents furnished by Consultant. Consultant shall deliver to City any findings, reports, documents, information, data, in any form, including but not limited to, computer tapes, discs, files audio tapes or any other Project related items as requested by City or its authorized representative, at no additional cost to the City.
- 6.13. Public Records Act Disclosure. Consultant has been advised and is aware that this Agreement and all reports, documents, information and data, including, but not limited to, computer tapes, discs or files furnished or prepared by Consultant, or any of its subcontractors, pursuant to this Agreement and provided to City may be subject to public disclosure as required by the California Public Records Act (California Government Code section 6250 *et seq.*). Exceptions to public disclosure may be those documents or information that qualify as trade secrets, as that term is defined in the California Government Code section 6254.7, and of which Consultant informs City of such trade secret. The City will endeavor to maintain as confidential all

information obtained by it that is designated as a trade secret. The City shall not, in any way, be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any trade secret including, without limitation, those records so marked if disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by order of the Court.

- 6.14. Conflict of Interest. Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and sub Consultants, if any, will comply with all conflict of interest statutes of the State of California applicable to Consultant's services under this agreement, including, but not limited to, the Political Reform Act (Government Code sections 81000, et seq.) and Government Code section 1090. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and sub Consultants shall not, without the prior written approval of the City Representative, perform work for another person or entity for whom Consultant is not currently performing work that would require Consultant or one of its officers, employees, associates or sub Consultants to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute.
- 6.15. Responsibility for Errors. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the City's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to City. In the event that an error or omission attributable to Consultant occurs, then Consultant shall, at no cost to City, provide all necessary design drawings, estimates and other Consultant professional services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of City and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.
- 6.16. <u>Prohibited Employment</u>. Consultant will not employ any regular employee of City while this Agreement is in effect.
- 6.17. Order of Precedence. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement and any of the attached Exhibits, the terms set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. If, and to the extent this Agreement incorporates by reference any provision of any document, such provision shall be deemed a part of this Agreement. Nevertheless, if there is any conflict among the terms and conditions of this Agreement and those of any such provision or provisions so incorporated by reference, this Agreement shall govern over the document referenced.
- 6.18. <u>Costs</u>. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.
- 6.19. No Third Party Beneficiary Rights. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of City and Consultant and no other parties are intended to be direct or incidental beneficiaries of this Agreement and no third party shall have any right in, under or to this Agreement.
- 6.20. <u>Headings</u>. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 6.21. <u>Construction</u>. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. In the event an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises with respect to this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties and in accordance with its fair meaning. There shall be no presumption or burden of proof favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

- 6.22. <u>Amendments</u>. Only a writing executed by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.
- 6.23. <u>Waiver</u>. The delay or failure of either party at any time to require performance or compliance by the other of any of its obligations or agreements shall in no way be deemed a waiver of those rights to require such performance or compliance. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of the party against whom enforcement of a waiver is sought. The waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any occurrence or event shall not be deemed a waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any other occurrence or event, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.
- 6.24. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable in any circumstance, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the value of this Agreement, based upon the substantial benefit of the bargain for any party, is materially impaired, which determination made by the presiding court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction shall be binding, then both parties agree to substitute such provision(s) through good faith negotiations.
- 6.25. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one agreement.
- 6.26. <u>Corporate Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said parties and that by doing so the parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Artist Recruitment

- "Calling All Artists"—Commission professional artist, and recruit youth artists in local middle schools, high schools, colleges and non-profit organizations. Recruit and secure no more than 200 Artists with no more than two or three pieces of art per artist, Medium of art should include but not limited to:
 - fine arts
 - Chalk artists (to provide live artwork in the making
 - Glass blowing artistry
 - Face painting and balloon artists
 - Street Art
 - Educational workshops/crafts
 - Finger painters
 - Food art
 - Floral art
 - Sand Art
 - Caricature artist
 - Trompe-l'œi
 - Poetry
 - Performing artist/Live Installations
- Recruit and coordinate selection of one featured and one or two guest artists. Consultant shall provide a proposal of recommended Artist to be featured and/or be guests. The proposal shall include a biography and pictures of the artist's work which will be presented to the Heritage Arts Advisory Committee (HAAC). The HAAC will then select and vote on the featured or guest artist.
- Coordinate an informational artist recruitment orientation with local school administrators and organizations to communicate all requirements of artists and art fest application submittals.
- Help recruit and secure no more than thirty (30) pop-up artist vendors to include cultural jewelry, handcrafted items, textiles, etc.

Donations/Sponsorships/Silent Auction

- Solicit potential sponsorships, and donations for to support Art Fest event. Consultant will receive a 10% finders fees for any secured sponsorships.
- Obtain artist artwork or other donations for silent auction component.

Curation of art

Receive, review and approve artist applications, oversee cataloguing and documentation
of all artwork, work with Artists on providing proper packaging of art for transportation.
Cataloging Protocols should include a database file that possesses the following
information: Artist Name, Name of Art Piece, Sale Price, Medium, Size, Photo and
Location of Art / Artist.

- Collect, secure and store all submitted art work. City to provided location.
- Coordinate with Art Fest planning committee (City Staff) event layout and art components. Identify medium categories and display locations.

Marketing

- Collaborate and consult the CITY's Social Media Administrator to promote and market ARTFEST 2019 through each Parties social media forums (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram) which identifies marketing partnership under the Consultants name or business name.
- Attend various art events/shows (number & locations negotiable) representing the City throughout Southern California to promote and recruit participation in the 2019 SFS Art Fest.

Art Fest Event Implementation:

- Coordinate artist check-in and artwork drop to include completion of all necessary waivers.
- Plan and coordinate with City staff hanging of all artwork. Consultant shall solely be responsible for the handling of all artworks. This includes the following: 1) the hanging of all art as well as the transportation of all art; 2) All tools and equipment necessary to execute this directive. Consultant may use the City owned art displays, equipment, materials, such as ladders, display panels, hanging grids, hooks and easels.
- Responsible for labeling and tagging of all artwork, once hung. Consultant to provide art labeling and tags (SFS logo provided by City staff).
- Work collaboratively with CITY staff to conduct all sales of art at the Art Fest event. City
 will provide receipt to purchaser(s) of art sold; Consultant shall tag displayed items as
 sold; City staff will conduct all reporting of items sold and money collected; Report will
 include: Artist Info, Buyers Name and Contact Information including email, Sale Price,
 Artwork Name
- Consultant will be responsible for the take down and proper storage of artwork. Consultant will schedule pick up dates of Artwork at the Clarke Estate following the Art Fest event. Dates and times are to be negotiated with Consultant for the return of artwork. All uncollected artwork and silent auction items will be forfeited to the CITY and will be used as raffle items for future Art Fest events.

Post Art Fest and Evaluation

Consultant will provide the City with a written evaluation report of all participating artists.
 Report will include an analysis of the marketing effort, the preparation process, the Art Fest event, the total of artists and Catalogue, pop –up artist and vendors, and total sales from Art Fest (City staff will provide financial).

EXHIBIT B

CONSULTANT'S PROPOSAL

CONSULTANT RESPONSIBILITIES

The following responsibilities shall be managed by the Consultant and/or Consultants Staff. Consultant shall be available and provide professional services for the CITY's SFS ARTFEST 2019 as described below. All reports shall be delivered electronically (as PDF(s)) to the Director of the Community Services Department and/or their designee.

- A. Advertising, Designing, Marketing Materials: Consultant shall design and print the visual marketing materials (i.e. "Call to Artist" postcards, fliers, posters, map program, sponsorship brochure and paint & wine tickets). In addition, Consultant shall design ad for the electronic CITY billboards, with CITY's approval and specifications. Consultant shall design and market "Silent Auction" materials, "Paint & Sip" programs, "Artifact" Trompe I'oei Live installation competition, and Film "Absorption" Installation Screening.
- B. **Social Media Marketing:** Consultant shall collaborate and consult the CITY's Social Media Administrator for cross promotions and marketing material using CITY's logo and/or approved designs involving SFS ARTFEST 2019 through each Parties social media forums (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram) which identifies the marketing partnership under the Consultant's website name "Artcrawlfest.com". Social media marketing involving the CITY's logo and/or designs shall be approved by the CITY Administrator.
- C. Featured and Guest Artists: Consultant shall provide a proposal of recommended Artists to be featured and/or be guests to the SFS Art Fest 2019. The proposal shall include a biography and pictures of the artist's work which will be presented to the Heritage Arts Advisory Committee (HAAC) at the November HAAC meeting. The HAAC will then select and vote on the featured and/or guest artist(s). The Featured Artist would receive a stipend and Two or three Guest Artists would also receive a stipend provided by the CITY. Consultant shall be solely responsible for the handling of all artworks, art transportation and payment to artist from CITY. Consultant to provide ground staff (2-4) and working with assign CITY staff
- D. Art Handling: Consultant shall be solely responsible for the handling of all artworks. This includes the following: 1) the hanging of all art as well as the transportation of all art; 2) All tools and equipment necessary to execute this directive is the sole responsibility of the Consultant. CITY will provide metal grids for hanging artworks, outdoor and indoor moveable walls, as well as ladders for installation of art during the SFS Art Fest event set-up. CITY will provide CITY Staff to assist in hanging artwork inside the historic Clarke Estate home. Consultant may use the CITY owned art displays, equipment, easels, etc. CONSULTANT to provide staff week of, during and post (8-10) and working with assign CITY staff for sales and payment of artwork.
- E. Paint & Sip: Consultant shall provide a layout and proposal of the site with a list of recommended Artist instructors to be featured in the Paint & Sip venue. The proposal shall include a biography and pictures of the artist's work. The Artist instructors would receive a stipend per session from Consultant. All materials such as paint, brushes, canvases, tickets, and some collateral materials to produce a Paint & Sip component that will be provided by Consultant. The Consultant to provide layout to CITY rental vendor. CITY well provide (rentals) tents, tables, chairs and any city collateral material. Consultant to provide staff during and post (2-3) and working with assign CITY staff for sales and payment of artwork and or tickets.

- F. Silent Auction: Consultant shall provide staffing before, during open auction and closing of auction. Consultant is to ensure that the Silent Auctions run smoothly, on time, and handled thoroughly from start to finish including the database and final close-out with auction winners. Consultant will ensure that all communication is maintained with CITY staff regarding all monetary closing tasks. All materials such as easels, tags, special Silent Auction art related items, tickets, and some collateral materials to produce a Silent Auction event that will be provided by Consultant. CITY well provide easels, tables, and black table cloths. CITY will be responsible to collect all sales at closing of Silent Auction and must meet prior with CITY logistics and staff to plan a collaborative customer services payment plan.
 - Coordinate donations delivery and pick-up with artist and donors.
 - Maintain the Silent Auction database.
 - Input and update donations received in database.
 - Input all contact information from donor into database.
 - Keep track of all items received.
 - Determine starting values for each Silent Auction item.
 - Create bid sheets for each Silent Auction item.
 - Setup Silent Auction display tables and ensure all Silent Auction areas are ready by May 2nd, 2019. Tend to Silent Auctions throughout the evening.
 - Be in regular communication with two of Consultant's staff during Silent Auction.
 - Remove unclaimed items and return to respective artist(s).
 - Consultant to provide staff week of, during and post (2-4) and working with assigned CITY staff for sales and payment of auction sales
- G. **Sponsorships:** Consultant will receive a 10% finders fees for any secured sponsorships. Consultant will notify CITY immediately of any secured sponsors and will submit documentation of all tenable sponsors for payment by May 15th, 2019. Consultant will update solicitation promo cards, promote sponsorships for the SFS Art Fest 2019.

EXHIBIT C

FEE SCHEDULE

In full consideration for the rendering of the services hereunder, and for any rights granted or relinquished by the Consultant under this Agreement, the CITY shall compensate the Consultant in accordance with the following payment schedule.

- 1. Upon execution of the agreement, the Consultant shall be paid \$15,000
- 2. In accordance with the completion of the informational artist recruitment orientation meeting in <u>January 2019</u> (date and time to be determined by CITY and (Consultant) the Consultant shall be paid \$15,000

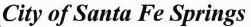

BACKGROUND

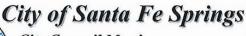
