- There are various areas a senior volunteer can assist in. Some areas include: automotive service and maintenance, clerical support, receptionist, ride alongs, school safety patrols, and more.
- Senior volunteers become certified to drive the CHP vehicles.
- There are currently 13 volunteers and the max capacity is 25 volunteers for this program.

- Volunteers are required to volunteer for a minimum of 4 hours a week, Monday through Friday.
- A volunteer cannot have any felony convictions.
- A volunteer must have a valid drivers license.
- Volunteers do not take enforcement action, they only observe and report.
- The CHP office in the City also has the Age Well, Drive Smart program and the El Protector program.
