# MINUTES OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS REGULAR MEETING OF THE TRAFFIC COMMISSION JULY 18, 2024

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Vice Chairperson, Miranda called the meeting to order at 6:01 PM.

Before roll call, Vice Chairperson Miranda welcomed Traffic Sergeant, Matthew J. Handlen. Former Traffic Sargent, Paul Segura introduced the newly appointed Sargent Handlen to the commission.

#### STAFF COMMUNICATIONS ON ITEMS OF COMMUNITY INTEREST

Traffic Commissioner Roy Kim provided a brief update to the in-ground lights for Davenrich / Orr & Day Road, indicating that the project is scheduled for completion next week.

Public Works Director, James Enriquez provided brief information for the City's November 2024 Election, noting the consolidation of the municipal general election with the Los Angeles County, and the dedicated parcel tax earmarked for commercial street repair. The tax would be in effect for 25 years with a 2% annual escalation rate, adding that public education for this tax will roll out soon.

Vice Chair Miranda inquired about the project on Orr & Day Rd and Pioneer Bl. Mr. Enriquez indicated that this is part of the Omega Plume pipeline project, an EPA Superfund project aimed at treating groundwater to remove contaminants, and pipeline installation to deliver the treated water.

#### TRAFFIC COMMISSION COMMENTS

Vice-chair Miranda is pleased with the resurfaced alleys. Mr. Enriquez indicated that the project was divided into three phases, the final phase under construction, with project completion in the coming week.

Commissioner Hayes requested training and inquired about the opening date for the Aquatic Center. Mr. Enriquez noted that the LA Health Department signed off on the pool inspection today, and that the pool will open to the public on Monday, July 22, 2024. The ribbon-cutting ceremony will take place at a later to accommodate council schedules. The second phase of this project will begin in the winter of 2024.

Commissioner Hayes welcomed and congratulated Sergeant Handlen to the commission.

Commissioner Gaitan inquired about the sign on Alburtis and Telegraph. Mr. Roy indicated that per MUTC criteria, fluorescent color signage is allowed for placement near schools only. However, there is new signage for northbound traffic on Alburtis. Mr. Enriquez indicated that staff is looking into splitting the signal phase on Alburtis to alleviate traffic/pedestrian incidents.
