4. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Oral communications item was opened by the Chairperson. There was no one from the public to speak. Chairperson Casillas then closed oral communications.

- 6. <u>EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT</u> EXECUTIVE SECRETARY WAYNE B. BERGERON Executive Secretary Wayne Bergeron gave a brief report on the following items.
 - a. Recap of the 5K Family Fun Run/Walk Event
 - i. Held on March 9 at Town Center Plaza. Attended by a record-breaking 1,400 participants. Thanks to all of the sponsors and volunteers for their work. Also, thanks to the City of Santa Fe Springs Employees Association for the Beer Garden.
 - b. Annual Easter Eggstravaganza:
 - i. Held on March 30 at the Activity Center. Location was changed due to rain. Thanked the Legarreta Family for the annual cake walk, the Majestics Car Club and the Undesirables Car Club for their donation of Easter baskets, and the Sister Cities Organization for the delicious pancake breakfast. Close to 1,500 people attended the event.
 - c. Request for Bids for Aquatic Center and Wading Pool Maintenance Services
 - i. The YLC was informed that a contractor had been selected and work was now underway at the Aquatic Center. The work is scheduled to be complete in mid-July.
 - d. Reservation Report FY 22-23 and FY 23-24
 - i. The Executive Secretary provided information to the YLC on the number of reservations made for use of Departmental covered picnic areas and indoor facilities.

7. OLD BUSINESS - EXECUTIVE SECRETARY WAYNE B. BERGERON

a. Establish Work Teams for upcoming events & activities

i. A Subcommittee for Events Planning was established. This was an item that was initially brought before the YLC in its meeting of February 5th, but had been tabled due to not having all members present.  - i. Jaleen Casillas, Valerie Gamboa, and Sophie Pantoja will attend the City Council meeting to lead the Pledge of Allegiance at the May 21st meeting.
- b. Executive Secretary Mr. Bergeron informed the members of the YLC that the meeting of April 1st would be postponed to April 8th as the City would be closed in observance of Cesar Chavez Day.

9. PRS DIVISION PROGRAM UPDATES

Executive Secretary Wayne Bergeron provided a brief overview of the following:

- Onboarding 38 new staff members beginning on Monday, April 8th; they'll be placed in different program areas to assist in the delivery of summer programming
- Spring Camp was held on March 25-29 at Little Lake Park (78% fill rate, 31 participants)
- Summer Camp registration begins in May
- Youth basketball season is winding down; the last day of games is April 12th.
- Youth soccer season registration is currently open; looking for ways to add more kids to the program as some divisions are already at max capacity.
- Pee Wee Soccer registration currently ongoing.
- Pee Wee baseball program is in full swing (played on Sunday mornings at Lakeview Park)
- Adult Softball leagues are back in season starting this week playing on Friday nights at Little Lake Park and Los Nietos Park
- Wading Pools are going to open on May 4
 - o Monday through Friday, 3:30-5:30 p.m.
 - o Saturday-Sunday, 12:30-5:30 p.m.
 - o 12:30-5:30 daily beginning in June
- Movies in the Park are returning to Parks and Recreation beginning in June

10. LIBRARY SERVICES DIVISION PROGRAM UPDATES – JESSICA MAGALLANES, LIBRIRIAN I

- a. April is National Poetry Month and the Library has purchased 15 new books in that genre, with a display that will be up in the Library through the month. Also materials were provided for "black out poetry."
- b. Circus Escape Room is now accepting registration.
- c. Tween Minecraft program set for May 17, 2024 (ages 9-12). It is being coordinated by an contracted company who will run child safe programs via their servers.
- d. Summer Reading Program for Teens June 8th July 27, 2024 (Theme: Adventure Begins at Your Library) Anyone can join, no library card needed
 - i. All Ages Kick-off Party on June 8, 2024
 - ii. Teen DIY Nights in June & July
- e. Ms. Magallanes also informed the Committee that if it needed a place to meet for subcommittees, the Study Room in the Library in available for use in hour blocks
