# 4. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES JANUARY 24, 2018</u> – JOSEPH SAIZA A motion was made by Charlotte Zevallos, and seconded by Doris Yarwood, to

approve the Minutes of January 24, 2018. The motion was carried unanimously.

- 5. <u>COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT</u> Councilmember Richard Moore reported on the following items:
  - The City is running at a five million dollar deficit due to a decrease in sales tax revenue and an increase in expenditures in retirement and health insurance benefits. The City will be asking the residents to approve a 1% sales tax hike on the November ballot. The Chamber of Commerce will be asked to assist since it will mainly affect the businesses.
  - City Child Care has been outsourced to Options for Learning. Options for Learning has 70 locations in the state and over 1,000 employees. They have offered employment to most of our teachers. The company will begin with the 2018 school year. They will run our program and use our locations for two years. At that time they will take over the program and bring in their own modules. This will allow the City will to relinquish the modules we have been

- renting. The major impact will be felt by the families that do not receive subsidies from the State since the City will no longer be subsidizing the program. However, the fee is much lower than other child care centers. Parents and staff have been met with and are happy with changes.
- Mayor's Prayer Breakfast Thursday, March 15<sup>th</sup> at Town Center Hall, 11740

- Raymond Cruz has been hired as the new City Manager and will begin on March 1, 2018. Mr. Cruz is the former City Manager of Rolling Hills and prior to that he worked in the Parks and Recreation/Community Services Department in the City of Carson.
- Fire Department has been constructing a memorial to their fallen firefighters at Headquarters on Greenstone. This will take place on Saturday, April 28.
   More information to follow.
- Council has approved a city wide yard sale to be held on Saturday, June 23.
  There will be no fee or permit needed. Trash haulers and non-profits will pick
  up curbside the following day. Staff will prepare advertisements for the event
  in the City's summer quarterly and billboards.
- Councilmember Moore, City Manager Ray Cruz, and Laurie Rios have an appointment with an art consultant regarding the condition of the City's artwork.
