1. **CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m.

3. INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBERS/GUESTS:

- Rio Hondo College is sponsoring classes geared towards older adults at the Gus Velasco Neighborhood Center. These classes include Yoga, Older Adult Physical Fitness, Tai Chi, and Painting.
- The Interfaith Food Center that was once announced to possibly relocate into the old Spicy's site, is looking for a new location.

- Beginning today, The Family Center has been relocated into the temporary units at the Gus Velasco Neighborhood Center. The staff reported a smooth transition.
- The First Friday Event at the Library featuring Tommy Greenwald was enjoyed by all who attended.
- Friday, February 1st was the ten year anniversary of the Shuttle Columbia crumbling to Earth. The City of Downey held a special ceremony at the Columbia Space Center commemorating this anniversary. Laurie found the ceremony interesting and memorable.
- Little Lake School District will be hosting their 3rd Annual Leaf Golf Tournament on Friday, March 15th.
- Parks and Recreation will be hosting a Penny Carnival on President's Day, Monday, February 18th at Lakeview Park. Games are 1 penny to participate.

6. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Charlotte motioned to approve the January 7, 2013 minutes. Andrea seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

7. FINANCIAL REPORT:

A. Financial Report - The Finance Report for January was distributed and reviewed. Peggy motioned to accept and file the report as submitted. The motion was carried unanimously.

10. OLD BUSINESS:

A. Pancake Breakfast

Each member of the committee needs to purchase at least two tickets to the Pancake Breakfast.

Francis informed the committee that unless the grill was donated for the Pancake Breakfast the committee would have to pay for rental of the grill. Depending on the size of the grill, the rental cost is as follows: 3 foot by 2 foot grill = \$80, 6 feet by 2 feet grill= \$125, batter dispenser = \$15. Kim announced that she may be able to borrow the grill from her church. She said she would ask the church and report back to the committee at the next meeting.

Peggy motioned to budget \$125 for the grill that would be needed for the Pancake Breakfast. Charlotte seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Francis recommended that each member should work 4 hours at the breakfast or donate \$20.

Charlotte expressed the committee members should donate food items towards the breakfast. Andreas thought that perhaps this was too much for those who sit on more than one committee and donate elsewhere.

During the meeting, Kim texted her church to request the grill, the church replied back willing to donate their grill for the Pancake Breakfast. There will be no need to rent the grill.

B. Fundraisers

Susie announced that Kim would be in charge of a Sentsy fundraiser beginning the night of the meeting. Kim passed out fundraising packets. She requested all orders and monies to be turned into her.

11. **NEW BUSINESS:**

A. Navajoa

Peggy announced that the City met with the Mayor of Navajoa. He is interested in re-establishing his relationship with the City of Santa Fe Springs. Peggy elaborated on some of our history with Navajoa. The City will be celebrating its 50 year anniversary as a Sister City to Navajoa, Mexico in 2014.
