Request for a Modification of Property Development Standards to allow the reduction of 18 required parking stalls related to the recent re-configuration of the lot that was required for the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass on property located at 13360 Molette Street*, in the M-2 FOZ, Heavy Manufacturing – Freeway Overlay, Zone. (Ore International Inc.)

*Previous Address: 15319 Carmenita Road

RECOMMENDATION: That the Planning Commission:

- Find that the proposed project, if conducted in strict compliance with the conditions of approval, will be harmonious with adjoining properties and surrounding uses in the area and will be in conformance with the overall purposes and objectives of the Zoning Regulations and consistent with the goals, policies and programs of the City's General Plan.
- Find that the applicant's Modification Permit request meets the criteria set forth in Section 155.695 of the City's Zoning Regulation for the granting of a Modification in nonresidential zones.
- Find that pursuant to Section 15301, Class 1 (Existing facilities), of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), this project is, therefore, considered to be Categorically Exempt.
- Approve Modification Permit Case No. 1276, subject to the conditions of approval as contained within this staff report.

BACKGROUND

The subject property is located along the south side of Molette Street, just west of Carmenita Road, at 13360 Molette Street. The subject property is zoned M-2 FOZ (Heavy Manufacturing - Freeway Overlay Zone) with a General Plan land use designation of Industrial. The property is comprised of a single parcel (APN: 7005-004-050) that measures approximately 80,824 sq. ft. (1.88-acres) and is currently developed with a 38,042 sq. ft. industrial building occupied by Ore International, Inc.

DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

Approximately 3 years ago, Caltrans acquired the east portion of the subject parcel for construction related to the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass. Prior to the acquisition by Caltrans, the primary access to the site was on Carmenita Road.

With the new Carmenita overpass, however, access from Carmenita Road is no longer possible. As such, the property is now accessed from Molette Street.

Although, parking stalls may exist on the east side of the building, there is currently no access to them. Until Caltrans has finalized their plans for the east portion of Molette Street, the applicant cannot physically drive to the east side of the building. The applicant has re-configured the parking area on the west side of the building to maximize the parking capacity. However, without the ability to access and otherwise utilize the stalls along the east side of the building, the subject property is deficient 18 parking stalls. Ore International Inc. is, therefore, seeking approval of the subject Modification Permit to allow the reduction of 18 required parking stalls related to the recent re-configuration of the lot that was required for the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass.

The Planning Commission should note that staff has added a condition to ensure that the easterly parking area is reserved for parking purposes. This will help ensure that once Caltrans has finalized their plans, necessary improvements related to said parking and related driveways could then be provided and the need for the subject Modification Permit would then go away.

ZONING REGULATION REQUIREMENTS

Parking Requirements

City of Santa Fe Springs - Zoning Regulations

Section 155.481 - REQUIRED PARKING - INDUSTRIAL USES

Section 155.481 REQUIRED PARKING

- (D) Industrial Uses
 - (1) Industrial uses, including incidental office uses.
 - (a) 0 20,000: one parking space per 500 square feet.
 - (b) 20,001 100,000: one parking space per 750 square feet.
 - (c) 100,001 200,000: one parking space per 1,000 square feet.
 - (d) 200,001 and above: one parking space per 2,000 square feet.
 - (e) Truck parking shall be required as per § 155.487(F).
 - (2) Notwithstanding the above, multi-tenant industrial units or buildings shall provide one space for each 500 square feet of gross floor area for the first 40,000 square feet of gross building area. Additionally, incidental office area exceeding 15% of the gross building area shall require one parking space for each 300 square feet of floor area and one parking space shall be provided for each vehicle used in connection with the use.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject property is located along the south side of Molette Street, just west of Carmenita Road. Carmenita Road is designated as a "Major" arterial within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan while Molette Street is a local industrial street.

ZONING AND LAND USE

The subject property is zoned M-2 FOZ (Heavy Manufacturing - Freeway Overlay Zone) with a General Plan land use designation of Industrial. The Zoning, General Plan and Land Use of the surrounding properties are as follows:

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

Upon review of the proposed project, staff finds the project would qualify for a categorical exemption pursuant to Section 15301, Class 1 (Operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alterations of existing structures or facilities not expanding existing uses), of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) since it simply involves re-configuring the parking lot to maximize the potential for parking along the westerly parking lot and various interior tenant improvements (shipping office, restrooms, electrical room, and re-inforce the temporary building wall on the east side of the building). Staff finds that additional environmental analysis is, therefore, not necessary to meet the requirements of the CEQA. If the Commission agrees, Staff will file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk within 5 days of approval of the project by the Planning Commission.

NOTICE TO ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS

The Planning Commission should note that, as with similar requests, staff mailed notices to the adjacent property owners (north, south, east and west) to advise them of the Modification Permit request and of the date and time when this matter would be considered by the Planning Commission. A total of 5 notices were mailed out to said property owners on Monday, March 27, 2017. To date, staff has not received any correspondence from the surrounding property owners that received the notice.

REQUIRED SHOWING

In accordance with Section 155.695 of the City's Zoning Regulations, a Modification Permit request by an applicant in non-residential zones may be granted by the Planning Commission if the applicant shows the following conditions apply:

(A) That the granting of the modification would not grant special privileges to the applicant not enjoyed by other property owners in the area.

Granting a parking modification for the subject property would not be considered a special privilege not enjoyed by other property owners in the area. Other Modification Permits have been granted when freeway improvements have had a direct impact on such properties. Further, the Freeway Overlay Zone recognizes that, on a case-by-case basis, reduction of specific development standards may be necessary to help retain existing businesses in their current locations as future freeway improvements were expected. Moreover, the re-orientation of the building from Carmenita Road to Molette Street was not at the property owner's request. Rather, it was a circumstance that was imposed upon the owner as a result of the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass.

(B) That the subject property cannot be used in a reasonable manner under the existing regulations.

Until Caltrans finalizes their plans for the east portion of Molette Street, there is no vehicle access to the east side of the property. As such, only parking along the west side of the building is available. Although the applicant's architect had re-designed the westerly parking lot to help maximize the number of parking stalls, the area was only able to accommodate a maximum of 47 stalls. This would mean the existing building must be further reduced to 25,250 sq. ft. to be in compliance with the City's Zoning Regulations.

It should be noted that as part of the acquisition by Caltrans, the subject building, which was previously 76,256 sq. ft. has already been reduced by more than half of its original size. A further reduction of 12,792 sq. ft. from its current size of 38,042 sq. ft. would be a significant impact to the usability of the building as a warehouse use.

(C) That the hardship involved is due to unusual or unique circumstances.

Approximately 3 years ago, Caltrans acquired the east portion of the subject parcel for construction related to the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass. Prior to the acquisition by Caltrans, the primary access to the site was on Carmenita Road. With the new Carmenita overpass, however, access from Carmenita Road is no longer possible. As such, the property is now accessed from Molette Street.

Although, parking stalls may exist on the east side of the building, there is currently no access to them. Until Caltrans finalize their plans for the east portion of Molette Street, the applicant cannot physically drive to the east side of the building. The fact Report Submitted By: Cuong Nguyen

that the entire easterly parking lot is currently unusable is due to Caltrans' plans for the I-5 freeway expansion and Carmenita overpass and is not a condition that was requested, or otherwise, created by the applicant.

(D) That the modification, if granted, would not be detrimental to other persons or properties in the area nor be detrimental to the community in general.

As proposed, a 38,042 square foot building with 47 parking stalls will remain on the subject property. Although the property would be deficient 18 parking stalls, the deficiency is only expected to be temporary. Once Caltrans finalize their plans for the east portion of Molette Street, there is a very high likelihood that access to the easterly parking area would become available once again. To preserve the easterly parking area for future parking, staff has placed a condition (#2) to ensure that the area is not developed unless alternative parking is provided.

In addition, as evident from the attached floor plan, the subject building will be mainly utilized for a warehouse distribution operation with very limited office space (220 sq. ft. or .57% of the overall square footage). The applicant, Ore International only anticipates having 4-5 employees on the largest shift. Given the employee to available parking ratio (5 employees: 47 parking stalls), staff therefore finds that approval of Modification Permit Case No. 1276 would not be detrimental to other persons or properties.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

For the aforementioned reasons and findings, staff finds that approval of Modification Permit Case No. 1276 will not be detrimental to the property of others or to the community as a whole and is, therefore, recommending approval of the Modification Permit request subject to the conditions of approval as contained in this report.

1. The applicant shall submit plans and obtain approval for the design of the future driveway and associated ingress/egress to the easterly parking area prior to construction.

2. That the applicant understands and agrees that the lack of an attractive front façade is simply to allow the current business to occupy the building while Caltrans finalize plans for the east portion of Molette Street as well as the adjacent remnant parcel to the north. The applicant further understands and agrees that within 1 year from the date that a formal resolution from Caltrans

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has been made, the applicant shall obtain approval for a new front façade with enhancement features to include items such as: entry augmentations, horizontal offsets, change in roofline, unique corner treatment, building and façade pop-outs, window frames, etc.

- 3. That the applicant understand and agrees that, unless alternative parking is provided elsewhere, the easterly parking area shall be reserved for parking purposes. The applicant further understands and agrees that within 1 year from the date that a formal resolution from Caltrans has been made on the future of Molette Street, necessary improvements related to said parking and related driveway access shall be provided.
- 4. That the project shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the plans submitted by the applicant and on file with the case.
- 5. That the applicant shall obtain all necessary permits and approvals prior to the commencement of any construction work.
- 6. That all other applicable requirements of the City's Zoning Regulation, Property Maintenance Ordinance, Los Angeles County Building Code, Fire Code and all other applicable regulations shall be complied with.
- 7. That the applicant, Ore International Inc., agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject Modification Permit, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the owner/developer of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 8. That it is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

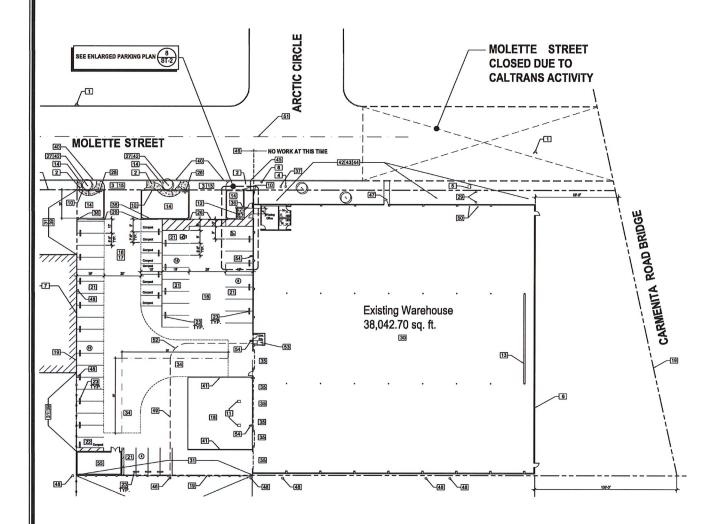

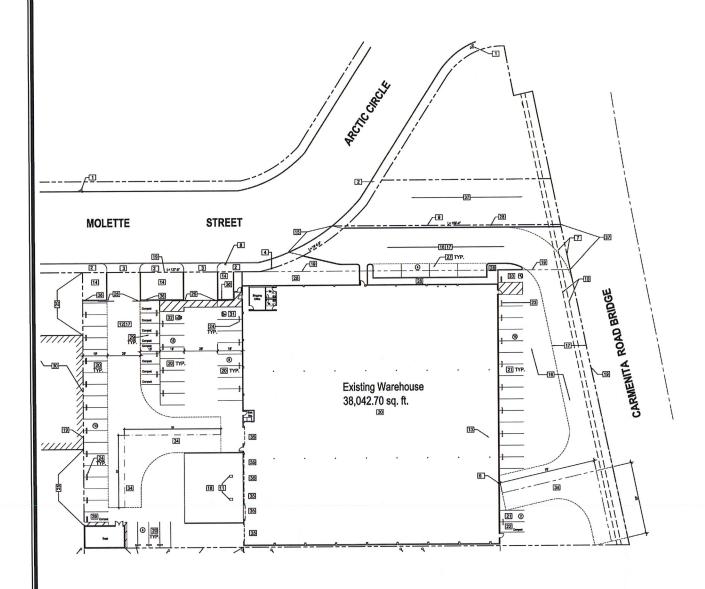

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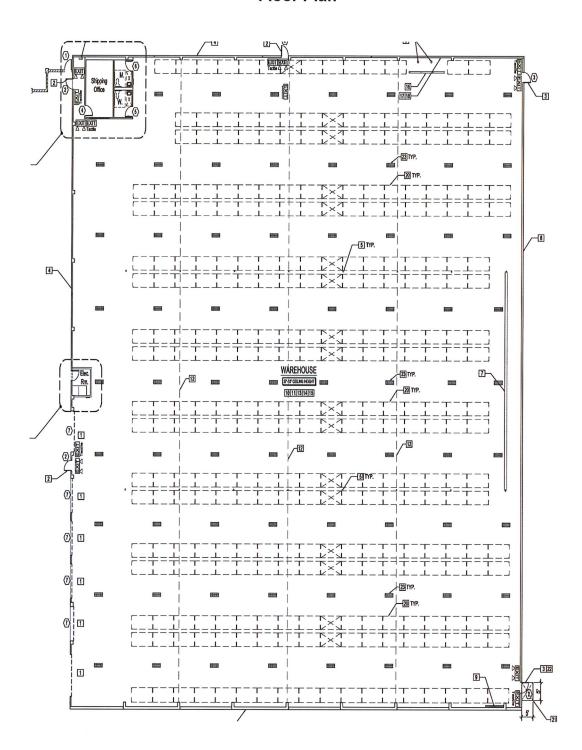
Site Plan A (without access to easterly parking area)



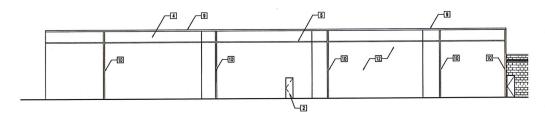
Site Plan B (with access to easterly parking area)



Floor Plan

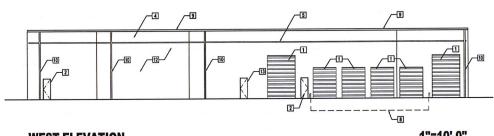

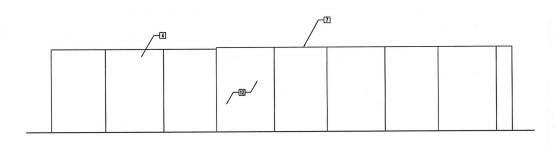

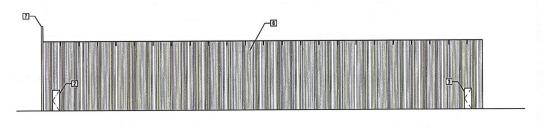

BACKGROUND

At their respective meetings of December 14 and December 22, 1992, the Planning Commission and the Community Development Commission initially approved Conditional Use Permit Case No. 495, a request to establish, operate and maintain a dance studio and theatrical arts school in a 6,840 sq ft unit located within a four-acre office and light manufacturing multi-tenant complex at 9730 Alburtis Avenue. The original approval was for a period of two years. The Planning Commission has since granted five time extensions, each for a five-year period, with the last five-year period ending in October of 2011.

The dance studio and theatrical arts school conducts classes in tap, jazz, ballet, acrobatics, voice, piano, and musical theater. The dance studio has approximately 150 students enrolled. Although, no more than approximately 30 students are present at one time. Hours of operation are $3:00~\rm pm-10:00~\rm pm$ Monday-Friday, with Saturday hours of $8:00~\rm am-10:00~\rm pm$. The dance studio has scaled back their hours of operation since the original approval; Condition of Approval No. 2 allows for hours of operation beyond what the dance studio is currently utilizing. It should be noted that, if desired, the dance studio may still operate within the time frames outlined in Condition of Approval No. 2.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

As standard practice for all compliance reviews, an inspection of the property was conducted by staff to ensure continued compliance with the conditions of approval prior to bringing the matter back to the Planning Commission. In fact, the use remains unchanged from its original approval and has not been a detriment to persons and/or property in the immediate vicinity. - 3. The operation for the dance studio and theatrical school shall be established and conducted in accordance with all of the applicant requirements of the Building Code, Fire Code, Zoning Regulations, Property Maintenance Ordinance, and all other applicable regulations. *Condition is ongoing.*
- 4. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 495 shall be subject to a compliance review in five years to ensure the dance studio is still operating in strict compliance with the **on or before April 10, 2022**, conditions of approval. *Condition is ongoing.*
- 5. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 495 shall not be effective for any purpose until the applicant has filed with the City of Santa Fe Springs, an affidavit stating that he is aware of all conditions of approval. Condition has been satisfied.

BACKGROUND

In July of 2005, the Planning Commission initially approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 642, a request by Sprint PCS to establish, operate and maintain a Wireless Telecommunication Facility (WTF) stealth as a 50'-high monopalm and related equipment for Sprint PCS on the property located at 13808 Imperial Highway, in the M-1-PD, Light Manufacturing — Planned Development Overlay, Zone. The Permit was granted for an initial one-year, until July 25, 2006. In compliance with Government Code Sections 65960-65964, a ten year duration, until April 9, 2017, was granted in April 9, 2007.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

As standard practice for all CUP compliance reviews, an inspection of the subject property was performed by City staff to ensure continued compliance with the conditions of approval prior to bringing the matter back to the Planning Commission.

An initial inspection of the property, conducted on February 23, 2017, revealed that the business was in violation of conditions of approval #4, #9 and #12. During our inspection, Staff explained the violations to the applicant and requested that the violations be corrected immediately. Specifically, the applicant was directed to comply with the following:

- Remove all trash from inside of the electrical area.
- Repair damaged area of monopalm.
- Maintain live palms.
- Repaint electrical box and conduits on the exterior of the block wall.

A follow-up inspection, conducted on April 3, 2017, revealed that the violations have been corrected.

With the business now in full compliance with the existing conditions of approval, staff finds that if the indoor café with drive-thru continues to operate in strict compliance with the required conditions of approval, the use will continue to be compatible with the surrounding developments and will not pose a nuisance risk to the public or environment. Staff is, therefore, recommending that CUP 642 be subject to a compliance review in ten (10) years, on or before, April 10, 2027, to ensure the use is still operating in compliance with the conditions of approval as contained in this staff report.

- 12. That all other requirements of the City's Zoning Ordinance, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with. **(ongoing)**
- 13. That the applicant, Sprint PCS, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards concerning Reconsideration of Conditional Uses Permit Case No. 642- 2 3, when action is brought within the time period provided for in the City's Zoning Ordinance, Section 155.865. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the owner/developer of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof. (revised ongoing)
- 14. That Reconsideration of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 642 shall be valid for a period of ten (10) years, until April 9, 2017 April 10, 2027, Approximately, three (3) months before April 9, 2017 April 10, 2027, the applicant shall request in writing that the City review the circumstances of the case for an extension of the privileges granted. (revised ongoing)

15. It is hereby declare to be the intent that if any provision of this Permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, the Permit shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse. (ongoing)

A compliance review of an auto parts recycling (tires, rims, radiators, etc.) facility within the existing structures on property located at 13039 Los Nietos Road, within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and within the Consolidated Redevelopment Project Area. (RC Metals)

RECOMMENDATION: That the Planning Commission:

- Find that the continued operation and maintenance of auto parts recycling facility, if conducted in strict compliance with the conditions of approval, will be harmonious with adjoining properties and surrounding uses in the area and will be in conformance with the overall purposes and objectives of the Zoning Regulations and consistent with the goals, policies, and programs of the City's General Plan.
- Approve extension of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 718-1, subject to a compliance review in five (5) years, on or before, April 10, 2022, to ensure that the auto parts recycling facility is still operating in strict compliance with the conditions of approval as contained within this staff report.

BACKGROUND

The subject property is located at 13039 Los Nietos Road (APN: 8167-005-003), in the M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) zoning district and within the Consolidated Redevelopment Project Area. The site is developed with two existing structures: a 310 sq. ft. office building along the front portion of the site and a 1,131 sq. ft. industrial building along the rear.

On February 28 2011, the Planning Commission originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 718, to allow the applicant (RC Metals) to establish, operate, and maintain of an auto parts recycling (tires, rims, radiators, etc.) facility on the subject property. The auto parts recycling facility, therefore, has operated on the subject property since 2011 (approximately 6 years). The operation remains unchanged. The hours of operation is still Monday through Sunday from 6am to 5pm.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

As standard practice for all compliance reviews, an inspection of the subject property was conducted by City staff to ensure continued compliance with the conditions of

approval prior to the bringing the matter back to the Planning Commission. The recent inspection confirmed that the subject use is operating in full compliance with all conditions of approval.

The Planning Commission should note that, as required by condition #18, the applicant completed numerous deferred maintenance items. The new paint, stone veneer, and drought tolerant landscaping has all contributed to significantly improving the property's curb appeal. Staff is therefore recommending that the Planning Commission approve an extension of the entitlement, subject to a compliance review in five years.

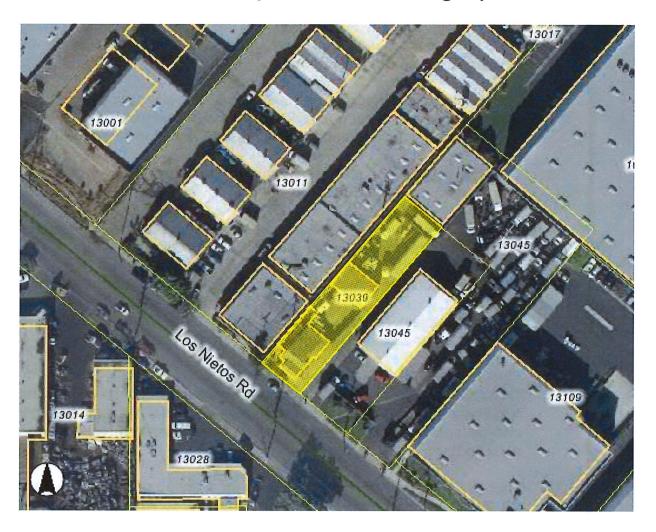
