## **PUBLIC HEARING**

Conditional Use Permit Case No. 778

A request to allow the retail sale of firearms and ammunition at 12150 Bloomfield Avenue, Unit A (APN: 8026-019-023) in conformance with Sections 155.243 and 155.648 of the Zoning Code, which limits the retail sale of firearms to public safety and first responder personnel in the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, zone. (S Browne Supply, LLC)

## **RECOMMENDATION:** That the Planning Commission:

- Open the public hearing and receive any comments from the public regarding Conditional Use Permit Case No. 778, and thereafter, close the public hearing; and
- Find that the proposed retail sale of firearms and ammunition, if conducted in strict compliance with the conditions of approval, will be harmonious with adjoining properties and surrounding uses in the area and, therefore, will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity and will not adversely affect the city in general; and
- Find that the applicant's request meets the criteria set forth in §155.716 of the Zoning Regulations, for the granting of a Conditional Use Permit; and
- Find that CUP Case No. 778 meets the criteria for "Existing Facilities" pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); therefore, the proposed project is determined to be a categorically-exempt project pursuant to Section 15301-Class 1 of CEQA; consequently, no other environmental documents are required by law; and
- Approve CUP Case No. 778, subject to a compliance review in one (1) year, on or before May 8, 2018, to ensure that the business is operating in strict compliance with the conditions of approval as stated within the staff report.

## **BACKGROUND**

The applicant, S Browne Supply, LLC, was established in 2014 as a minority and woman-owned small business specializing in the sale of law enforcement products to qualified first responders. The business consists of sales to individual officers and to local, state and federal agencies. Products include clothing, belts, holsters, flashlights, weapon sites, gloves, and body armor.

The applicant has been located at 12150 Bloomfield Avenue, Unit A (APN: 8026-019-023) since October 2014. This location provides S Browne Supply with easy access to the 5 and 605 freeways and the law enforcement training academies of Rio Hondo Police Academy, Cerritos College, Golden West Police Academy and Long Beach Academy, as well as several local police departments. The subject parcel measures 3.05-acres and is currently developed with a 40,626 sq. ft. multi-tenant industrial building constructed in 1983. S Browne Supply leases a unit measuring approximately 1,320 sq. ft. located at the southwest corner of the building.

## **REQUEST**

S Browne Supply is seeking approval to expand their business operations to include the retail sale of firearms and ammunition.

## **ZONING CODE REQUIREMENT**

Several sections of the City's Zoning Regulations require S Browne Supply to obtain a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) prior to initiating the retail sale of firearms and ammunition in the M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) Zone:

- §155.243(B)(6) Storage of firearms of any type, including rifles, hand guns and similar weapons totaling five or more in any combination, including wholesale transfer, retail as specified in §155.243(N), storage, distribution or delivery of any firearm(s).
- §155.243(B)(7) Storage of ammunition, munitions, bullets, including smokeless gunpowder in amounts totaling 20 pounds or more.
- §155.243(N) Retail sale, lease or transfer of any firearm(s) to the following upon presentation of proper government-issued identification:
  - 1. Active and retired sworn law enforcement personnel.
  - 2. Law enforcement agencies.
  - 3. Fire Fighters, Volunteer Fire Fighters, and Paramedics.
  - 4. Military personnel including Reservists and National Guard, including Military personnel with "retired" credentials.
  - 5. Corrections Officers, including Parole and Probation Officers.
  - 6. Individuals with a valid Security Guard License issued by the California Bureau of Security & Investigative Services.
  - 7. Security companies with a valid certification by the California Bureau of Security & Investigative Services.
  - 8. Court Judges, District Attorneys, Deputy District Attorneys, and District Attorney Investigators.
  - 9. Law Enforcement Academy Cadets with enrollment documentation from the Academy.
- §155.648(A) A conditional use permit shall be required for the establishment of a storage use involving explosives, firearms or ammunition pursuant to §155.243 of this chapter.

Therefore, the applicant is seeking approval of a CUP to allow the retail sale of firearms and ammunition.

## STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject property is located on the east side of Bloomfield Avenue at 12150 Bloomfield Avenue, Unit A, approximately 500 feet south of Allard Street and 1,250 feet north of Imperial Highway. Bloomfield Avenue is classified as a Major Arterial within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan.

## **ZONING AND LAND USE**

The subject property is zoned M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) and the property also has a General Plan Land Use designation of Industrial. The properties to the north and south are also zoned M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) with a General Plan Land Use designation of Industrial. The Metropolitan State Hospital (in the City of Norwalk) is located west of the site, and the BNSF railroad runs along the east property line. The properties east of the railroad are zoned M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) with a General Plan Land Use designation of Industrial.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS**

Staff finds that the proposed project meets the criteria for a categorical exemption pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Section 15301-Class 1 (Existing Facilities). Class 1 consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination. S Browne Supply has occupied the subject property since October 2014 and does not plan to expand the footprint of their business in conjunction with this permit. S Browne Supply will continue to occupy 1,320 sq. ft. within Unit A at 12150 Bloomfield Avenue.

Consequently, staff finds that no further environmental documents are required for CEQA purposes. If the Planning Commission agrees, Staff intends to file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the County Clerk within five (5) days following the Planning Commission action.

## LEGAL NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Conditional Use Permit (CUP) was set for Public Hearing in accordance with the requirements of Sections 65090 and 65091 of the State Planning, Zoning and Development Laws and the requirements of Sections 155.860 through 155.864 of the City's Municipal Code.

Legal notice of the Public Hearing for the CUP was sent by first class mail to all property owners whose names and addresses appear on the latest County Assessor's Roll within 500 feet of the exterior boundaries of the subject property on April 27, 2017. The legal notice was also posted in Santa Fe Springs City Hall, the

City Library and the City's Town Center on April 27, 2017, and published in a newspaper of general circulation (Whittier Daily News) on April 27, 2017, as required by the State Zoning and Development Laws and by the City's Zoning Regulations.

As of date of this report, staff has not received comments and/or inquiries regarding the proposal.

## **COMMISSION'S CONSIDERATIONS**

The Commission should note that in accordance with Section 155.716 of the City's Zoning Regulations, before granting a Conditional Use Permit, the Commission shall:

- 1) <u>Satisfy itself that the proposed use will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity and will not adversely affect the city in general; and</u>
- 2) Give due consideration to the appearance of any proposed structure and may require revised architectural treatment if deemed necessary to preserve the general appearance and welfare of the community.

Staff believes that the applicant's request meets the criteria required by Section 155.716 of the City's Zoning Regulations for the granting of a Conditional Use Permit. The reasons for the findings are as follows:

- That the proposed use will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity, nor the welfare of the community for the following reasons:
  - S Browne Supply specializes in outfitting law enforcement and first responder personnel. Their business attracts law enforcement personnel from around the region, which helps provide a greater law enforcement presence to the city.
  - S Browne Supply is not open to the public, as it is only accessible to law enforcement and first responder personnel after they've provided proper identification. Only authorized personnel will be able to view firearms and ammunition for sale.
  - S Browne Supply strives to create a secure and discrete shopping environment for their customers. The business is located in an industrial area with little foot traffic and their unit has minimal signage to avoid attracting unwanted attention. Two conditions of approval will prohibit the applicant from displaying firearms or ammunition or advertising the sale of firearms or ammunition in areas that are visible from outside the store. These steps will ensure the sale of firearms and ammunition is handled in a discrete manner.
  - A condition of approval requires all firearms and ammunition to be stored in a locked fireproof safe or vault after hours, which shall be kept in an area of the store not accessible to patrons.

 In addition to approval of a Conditional Use Permit from the City of Santa Fe Springs, several State and Federal agency approvals are required prior to beginning the sale of firearms. These agencies will inspect the business on a regular basis to ensure it is operating in compliance with all State and Federal laws pertaining to firearms sales. The City will also monitor the use via the CUP.

Therefore, if conducted in strict compliance with the conditions of approval and the City's municipal code, staff finds that the proposed use will be harmonious with adjoining properties and surrounding uses in the area and therefore will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity.

2. That the use has been designed to preserve the general appearance and welfare of the community for the following reasons:

The subject property is improved with an existing 40,626 sq. ft. multi-tenant industrial building on a 3.05-acre parcel. The proposed use will occur inside the applicant's existing 1,320 sq. ft. unit and no exterior modifications are proposed. Therefore, the project will have no aesthetic impact on the surrounding properties.

## STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

For the reasons stated within the report, staff finds that if the proposed retail sale of firearms and ammunition use operates in strict compliance with the required conditions of approval, it will be compatible with the surrounding properties and will not be detrimental or pose a nuisance risk to persons or property in the immediate vicinity. Therefore, staff recommends approval of the applicant's request for CUP Case No. 778, subject to a compliance review in one year to ensure the use is still operating in strict compliance with the conditions of approval as contained within this staff report.

## **AUTHORITY OF PLANNING COMMISSION**

The Planning Commission has the authority, subject to the procedures set forth in §155.710 though §155.724, to grant a Conditional Use Permit whenever it finds that the granting of said permit is consistent with the requirements, intent and purpose of the Zoning Code. The Commission may grant a Conditional Use Permit subject to such conditions as the Commission finds are warranted by the circumstances involved. This may include the dedication and development of streets adjoining the property and other improvements. All such conditions shall be binding upon the applicants, their successors and assigns; shall run with the land; shall limit and control the issuance and validity of certificates of occupancy; and shall restrict and limit the construction, location, use and maintenance of land and structures within the development.

 The Applicant shall not individually store or use materials used in the manufacture of ammunition such as smokeless propellants, black powder, or primers and that only the storage of finished small arms ammunition is allowed.

# <u>DEPARTMENT OF FIRE - RESCUE (ENVIRONMENTAL DIVISION)</u> (Contact: Tom Hall 562.906.3815)

2. The applicant shall comply with all Federal, State and local requirements and regulations included, but not limited to, the Santa Fe Springs City Municipal Code, California Fire Code, Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) programs, the Air Quality Management District's Rules and Regulations and all other applicable codes and regulations.

- 3. The Applicant shall install and maintain a video recording surveillance system with the following minimum configuration: Cameras capable of recording in HD at 5Mbs to capture 1080P video at 30 FPS, and a Network Video Recorder (NVR) which can record at 1080P video per channel.
- 4. The Applicant shall submit and obtain approval of a proposed lighting (photometric) plan for the property from the City's Department of Police Services. The photometric plan shall be designed to provide adequate lighting (minimum of 1 foot candle power) throughout the subject property. Further, all exterior lighting shall be designed/installed in such a manner that light and glare not transmitted onto adioining properties in such concentration/quantity as to create a hardship to adjoining property owners or a public nuisance. The photometric plans shall be submitted to the Director of Police Services no later than sixty (60) days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission.
- 5. In order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the Applicant shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. The sign shall prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles and indicate that unauthorized vehicles will be removed at the owner's expense and also contain the California Vehicle Code that permits this action. The sign shall also contain the telephone number of the local law enforcement agency (Police Services Center (562) 409-1850). The lettering within the sign shall not be less than one inch in

- height. The Applicant shall contact the Police Services Center for an inspection no later than thirty (30) days after the project has been completed and prior to the occupancy permit being issued.
- 6. The proposed buildings, including any lighting, fences, walls, cabinets, and poles shall be maintained in good repair, free from trash, debris, litter and graffiti and other forms of vandalism. Any damage from any cause shall be repaired within 72 hours of occurrence, weather permitting, to minimize occurrences of dangerous conditions or visual blight. Paint utilized in covering graffiti shall be a color that matches, as closely possible, the color of the existing and/or adjacent surfaces.
- 7. The Applicant shall comply with Section 155.648(B)(1) of the Santa Fe Springs Zoning Code in reference to establishing and submitting a security and safety plan. While Section 155.648(B)(1) requires the submittal of the security and safety plan prior to the Applicant's occupancy of the location, and because the Applicant has already taken occupancy, the said plan shall be submitted to the Department of Police Services no later than thirty (30) days from the approval of this Permit by the Planning Commission.
- 8. The Applicant shall fully comply with Chapter 110 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code as it pertains to Secondhand Dealers.

## **WASTE MANAGEMENT:**

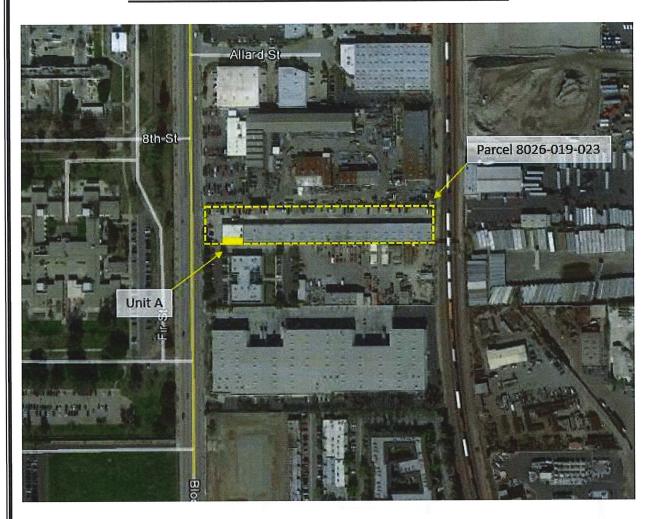

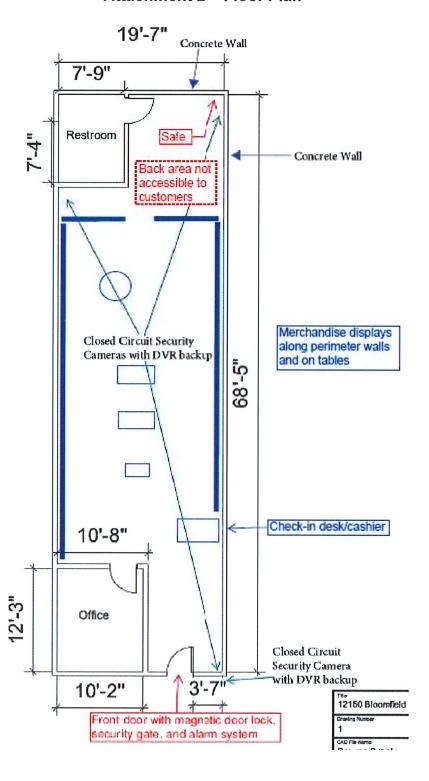

As a result, Overton Moore Properties, on the behalf of Le Chef Bakery, is requesting that the original entitlement (DPA 911), be amended (ADPA 911) to

include, but not limited to, increasing the size of the building from  $\pm 41,197$  to  $\pm 43,293$  sq. ft., (an increase of  $\pm 522$  sq. ft.), reconfiguring the interior floor space; reconfiguring the shape of the building from "T" shaped to "L" shaped, and accordingly revising the elevations, landscaping, parking, etc., to match the new configuration of the building.

A flour silo is essential to the operation of Le Chef Bakery. Pursuant to Section 155.742 of the City's Zoning Regulations, Development Plan Approval (DPA) is required prior to the installation of a metal storage tank to ensure consideration is given regarding proper siting and design necessary to conceal the storage tank from view from public right-of-way(s). As a result, Overton Moore is development plan approval (DPA 924) to construct the metal flour silo (height of 28 feet (to eave) and diameter of 12 feet) on the 2.03-acre property at 10488 Painter Avenue. Concurrent with DPA 924 is ADPA 911.

**Zone Change Case No. 136:** A request for approval to change the zoning designation on 2.00-acres (Net)) of a 3.94-acre (Net) property, from C-4, Community Commercial to M-2, Heavy Manufacturing. The acreage encompassed by the zone change will mimic the area of Parcel 2 of Tentative Parcel Map No. 73846; and

<u>General Plan Amendment Case No. 26:</u> A request for approval to change the general plan land use on 2.00 acres (Net) of a 3.94-acre property from C-4, Community Commercial to M-2, Heavy Manufacturing. The acreage encompassed by general plan amendment will mimic the area of Parcel 2 of Tentative Parcel Map No. 73846.

Staff has already requested a continuance of ADPA 911 and DPA 924 is related to ADA 911. Moreover, the applicant has requested that both items be heard at the same Planning Commission meeting; therefore, Staff is requesting that DPA 924 be also continued to the Planning Commission meeting of June 12, 2017

Compliance review report for Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 8 to allow the continued operation and maintenance of an alcohol beverage sales use for off-site consumption involving JR Liquor Store located at 13418 Imperial Highway in the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing Zone, within the Consolidated Redevelopment Project Area. (Mr. Janak Joshi, Owner)

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Planning Commission, based on Staff's compliance review report, find that the subject use is in compliance with all of the conditions of approval and request that this matter be brought back before May 8, 2022, for another compliance review report. The Planning Commission shall note that this matter may be brought back to the Commission at any time should the Applicant violate any conditions of approval or any City Codes, or should there be a need to modify, add, or remove a condition of approval.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The subject liquor store has existed at its current location before the City incorporated. Since its opening, the liquor store business has gone through several ownership changes. The present owner and applicant, Mr. Janak Joshi, purchased the store in 2000 and has operated it ever since.

During the last transfer of the business, and in compliance with Section 155.628 of the City Zoning Code, the Applicant requested and was granted Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit (ASCUP) Case No. 8 to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-site consumption.

This matter is before the Planning Commission because the initial approval required a review of this matter to determine if the business, along with the beverage use, is being conducted in compliance with the conditions of approval and all applicable laws.

## **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

Records indicate that the liquor store has not had any calls for service as a direct result of the alcohol sales or the storage of alcoholic beverages.

### **COMPLIANCE REVIEW REPORT**

As it is customary on all compliance reviews, staff conducted an on-site inspection of the Applicant's operation and the site to ensure compliance with the conditions of approval as set forth in the initial approval of this Permit.

After conducting said inspection, Staff found that the establishment has not had a negative impact on the any of the neighboring uses. Furthermore, the use is currently being maintained and operated in full compliance with all of the City's Zoning Regulations, and with the Conditions of Approval. Staff also checked with the Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) and found that the establishment is in full compliance with all of the ABC regulations as they pertain to a Type 21 License (Off-Sale General).

Considering this favorable track record, and the fact that the Applicant has complied with all of the initial conditions of approval, Staff believes that changes to the conditions of approval are not warranted at this time. Based on their findings, Staff recommends another compliance review within five years, no later than May 8, 2022.

## **CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

Staff did not see a reason to modify or add any conditions to the existing list of conditions; Condition No. 22 has been modified to reflect the new compliance date.

- 1. That "Customer Parking Only, Unauthorized Vehicles will be Towed Away" signs shall continue to be maintained along the on-site parking area.
- 2. That the Applicant shall continue to comply with the Zoning Regulations in respect to not exceeding 25% coverage of the window area of the premises.
- 3. That the Applicant shall continue to provide and maintain adequate on-site parking as required by Zoning Regulations.
- 5. That the sale of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only during business hours or as indicated by the Alcoholic Beverage Control.
- 6. That the Type 21 Alcoholic Beverage Control license allowing offsite sale of general sales of beer, wine and liquor shall be restricted to the sale for consumption of alcoholic beverages off the subject site only.
- 7. That it shall be the responsibility of the ownership and/or its employees to assure that no alcoholic beverages purchased on the subject site shall be consumed on the subject site or any adjacent property within the applicant's control.
- 8. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall be responsible for maintaining control of litter on the subject property.

- 9. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person who is obviously intoxicated or under the influence of any drug to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 10. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not sell, furnish or give any alcohol to any habitual drunkard or to any obviously-intoxicated person, as set forth in Section 25602 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 11. That the Applicant shall not have upon the subject premises any alcoholic beverage(s) other than the alcoholic beverage(s) which the licensee is authorized to sell under the licensee's license as set forth in Section 25607 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 12. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not sell, furnish or give any alcoholic beverage to any person under 21 years of age as set forth in Section 25658 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 13. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not permit any person under 18 years of age to sell alcoholic beverages.
- 14. That there will be a corporate officer or manager on the licensed premises during all public business hours that will be responsible for alcohol sales activities.
- 15. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person to loiter on the subject premises, shall report all such instances to the City's Police Services Center and shall post signs, approved by the Department of Police Services, prohibiting loitering.
- 18. That the owner, corporate officers and managers shall cooperate fully with all city officials, law enforcement personnel, and code enforcement personnel and shall not obstruct or impede their entrance into the licensed premises while in the course of their official duties.
- 19. That vending machines, water machines, soda machines and other similar equipment shall not be placed outdoors visible from the street, parking lot or adjacent properties.
- 20. That a copy of these conditions be maintained with a copy of the City Business License and Fire Department Permits in a place conspicuous to all employees of the location.
- 21. That in the event the owner(s) intend to sell, lease or sublease the subject business operation or transfer the subject Permit to another owner/applicant or

licensee, the Director of Police Services shall be notified in writing of said intention not less than (60) days prior to signing of the agreement to sell lease or sublease.

- 22. That this Permit shall be subject to a compliance review in five years, no later than May 8, 2022, to determine if the alcoholic beverage activity is still operating in strict compliance with the original conditions of approval. At which time the Applicant may request an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval.
- 23. That all other applicable requirements of the City Zoning Ordinance, Uniform Building Code, Uniform Fire Code, the determinations of the City and State Fire Marshall, and all other applicable regulations shall be strictly complied with.
- 24. That failure to comply with the foregoing conditions shall be cause for suspension and/or revocation of this Permit.
- 25. It is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, the Permit shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Planning Commission and City Council initially approved Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit (ASCUP) Case No. 16 at their respective meetings of July 24 and 27, 2006.

In 2012 Ms. Nancy Olvera took ownership of El Unico Restaurant and changed the name to La Rubia Restaurant. Accordingly, the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) transferred the Type 41 ABC license to Ms. Olvera. The restaurant still provides a full service, sit down dining experience including a full food menu, and the sale of bottled beer for on-site consumption.

This matter is before the Planning Commission because the initial approval required a review of this matter to determine if the business, along with the beverage use, is being conducted in compliance with the conditions of approval and all applicable laws.

Records indicated that the restaurant has not had any calls for service as a direct result of the alcohol sales or the storage of alcoholic beverages.

As it is customary on all compliance reviews, staff conducted an on-site inspection of the Applicant's operation and the site to ensure compliance with the conditions of approval as set forth in the initial approval of this Permit.

After conducting said inspection, Staff found that the establishment has not had a negative impact on any of the neighboring uses. Moreover, the restaurant has been successful because there are no other eating establishments in the area and within walking distance.

The restaurant use, along with the alcohol sales activity, is currently being maintained and operated in full compliance with all of the City's Zoning Regulations, and with the Conditions of Approval. Staff also checked with the Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) and found that the establishment is in full compliance with all of the ABC regulations as they pertain to the issued Type 41 License (On-Sale Beer and Wine – Eating Place).

Considering this favorable track record, and the fact that the Applicant has complied with all of the initial conditions of approval, Staff believes that changes to the conditions of approval are not warranted at this time. Based on their findings, Staff recommends another compliance review within five years, no later than May 8, 2022.

#### **CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

Staff did not see a reason to modify or add any conditions to the existing list of conditions; Condition No. 17 has been modified to reflect the new compliance date.

- 1. That the sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between the business hours of 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., each day of the week or as permitted by the Alcohol Beverage Control.
- 2. That the Type 41 Alcoholic Beverage Control license allowing onsite consumption of beer and wine in connection with a bonafide eating establishment shall be restricted to the sale for consumption of alcoholic beverages on the subject site only; the use shall not sell alcoholic beverages for transport and\or consumption off the subject premises.
- 3. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person who is intoxicated or under the influence of any drug, to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises, as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the Business and Professions Code.
- 4. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not sell, furnish or give any alcoholic beverage to any person under 21 years of age, as set forth in Section 25658 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 5. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not permit any person under 18 years of age to sell alcoholic beverages.

- 6. That solicitation of drinks is prohibited; that is, an employee of the licensed premises shall not solicit alcoholic drinks from customers. Refer to Section 303 of the California Penal Code and Section 25657 of the Business and Professions Code.
- 7. That it shall be the responsibility of the owner and/or his employees to ensure that all alcoholic beverages purchased on the subject site shall be consumed within the business establishment.
- 8. That the Applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person to loiter on the subject premises, shall report all such instances to the City's Police Services Center and shall post signs, as approved by the Department of Police Services, prohibiting loitering.
- 9. That a maximum occupancy placard shall be maintained posted over each doorway. This occupancy limitation shall not be violated at anytime.
- 10. That streamers, banners, pennants, whirling devices or similar objects that wave, float, fly, rotate or move in the breeze shall be prohibited unless approved by the Director of Planning and Development.
- 11. That there shall be no live entertainment, amplified music or dancing permitted on the premises at any time.
- 12. That there shall be no pool tables or coin-operated games maintained upon the premises at any time.
- 13. That there shall be no bar or lounge area upon the licensed premises maintained for the primary purpose of alcohol sales or consumption of alcoholic beverages directly to patrons for consumption.
- 14. That in the event the owner(s) intends to sell, lease or sublease the subject business operation or transfer the subject permit to another owner/applicant or licensee, the Director of Police Services shall be notified in writing of said intention not less than 60 (sixty) days prior to signing of the agreement to sell, lease or sublease.
- 15. That a copy of these conditions be posted and maintained with a copy of the City Business License and Fire Department permits, in a place conspicuous to all employees of the location.
- 16. That failure to comply with the foregoing conditions of approval shall be cause for procedures to suspend and/or revoke this permit.

- 17. That this Permit shall be subject to a compliance review in five years, no later than May 8, 2022, to determine if the alcoholic beverage activity is still operating in strict compliance with the original conditions of approval. At which time the Applicant may request an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval.
- 18. That all other applicable requirements of the City Zoning Ordinance, Uniform Fire Code, Uniform Building Code, and the determinations of the City and State Fire Marshall, and all other applicable regulations shall be strictly complied with.
- 19. It is hereby declared to the intent that if any provision of this permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute, or ordinance is violated the permit shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

## **BACKGROUND/ DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST**

The subject property is located on the west side of Cornet, between Alondra Boulevard and Molette Street at 15605 Cornet Street (APN: 7005-003-061), in the M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) Zone. The property measures approximately 99,563 sq. ft. (2.29-acres) and is currently developed with an approximately 21,250 sq. ft. industrial building. The applicant, Lakin Tire Company, recently purchased the property with the intent to establish, operate and maintain a tire recycling facility and open storage of trailers on the subject site.

On April 11, 2016, the Planning Commission originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 771 to allow the applicant, Lakin Tire Company, to establish operate and maintain a tire recycling facility. In accordance with Section 155.721 of the City's Zoning Regulations (see Code Section below), a conditional use permit, which has not been utilized within 12 months, shall become null and void. The Code, however, provides that an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

Section 155.721 – Expiration

Unless otherwise specified in the action granting a conditional use permit, said conditional use permit which has not been utilized within 12 months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also the abandonment or nonuse of a conditional use permit for a period of 12 consecutive months shall terminate said conditional use permit and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

Since the applicant is still completing various tenant improvements to the building in preparation of the tire recycling use, the applicant has requested that a further extension of the original CUP be granted.

Items that are still outstanding are as follows:

- 1. The fencing and gates around the subject property are still under construction including the required slat screening and vines.
- 2. The paving at the front portion of the parking areas and driveway apron approaches to the rear of the building still need to be constructed.
- 3. The parking fire lanes and accessible path of travel stripping need to be painted.
- 4. The front of the building needs to be painted.
- 5. The landscape and irrigation needs to be installed.
- 6. The fire suppression system needs final review by the fire inspector.

#### STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

The Commission should note that plans have been plan checked and the building permits have been issued by the City. Staff believes the applicant has diligently worked to keep this project moving forward. Staff is confident that the project will continue to move forward and all remaining items will be completed in the upcoming year. Staff, therefore, is recommending that the subject CUP be extended for an additional year, until March 8, 2018. At which time, staff will conduct a compliance review of the tire recycling facility.

- 5. That the applicant shall submit and obtain approval of a proposed lighting (photometric) and security plan for the property from the City's Department of Police Services. The photometric plan shall be designed to provide adequate lighting (minimum of 1 foot candle power) throughout the subject property. Further, all exterior lighting shall be designed/installed in such a manner that light and glare are not transmitted onto adjoining properties in such concentration/quantity as to create a hardship to adjoining property owners or a public nuisance. The photometric and security plans shall be submitted to the Director of Police Services no later than sixty (60) days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission.
- 6. That the applicant shall provide an emergency phone number and a contact person to the Department of Police Services and the Fire Department. The name, telephone number, fax number and e-mail address of that person shall be provided to the Director of Police Services and the Fire Chief no later than sixty

- (60) days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission. Emergency information shall allow emergency service to reach the applicant or their representative any time, 24 hours a day.
- 7. That in order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the applicant shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. - 22. That the applicant shall not knowingly transport loads containing more than 10% residue.

- 23. That the applicant shall comply with Section 50.51 of the Municipal Code which prohibits any business or residents from contracting any solid waste disposal company that does not hold a current permit from the City.
- 24. That all projects over \$50,000 are subject to the requirements of Ordinance No. 914 to reuse or recycle 75% of the project waste. Contact the Recycling Coordinator, Teresa Cavallo at (562) 868-0511 x7309.

- 25. That this approval shall allow the applicant, Lakin Tire Company, to establish, operate, and maintain a tire recycling facility and open storage of trailers on the subject site located at 15605 Cornet Street.
- 26. That approval of the subject Conditional Use Permit (CUP 771) is still contingent upon approval of a Modification Permit (MOD 1264) to allow the applicant to install and maintain a 14' high fence within the front setback area along Cornet Street and also to provide and maintain a total of 19 of 42 required parking stalls.
- 27. That the privileges granted under Modification Permit Case No. 1264 are for the sole use by Lakin Tire Company. Should Lakin Tire Company transfer, sell, or vacate the premises, the applicant understands that the truck yard area shall be re-striped to provide a minimum of 42 parking stalls as required by the City Zoning Regulations. Additionally, the 14' high fence shall be removed or otherwise setback a minimum of 20' as required by the City Zoning Regulations.
- 28. That the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP), which was prepared for the proposed project and an essentially component of the Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND), shall be made part of the conditions of approval for Conditional Use Permit Case No. 771 and Modification Permit Case No. 1264. Both the IS/MND and MMRP are listed as an attachment to this staff report.
- 29. That subject recycling facility operations shall be limited to the following hours of operation: Monday through Friday from 5:30am and 12:00pm. Saturday and Sunday Closed; on several occasions throughout the year, the facility may open on a Saturday to accommodate seasonal fluctuations in volume.
- 30. That the applicant understands that there shall be a total maximum of 16 employees per shift (at peak period) working at the subject recycling facility.

- 31. That subject recycling facility operations shall be limited to a daily volume of 24,000 tires (12,000 tires inbound and 12,000 tires outbound).
- 32. That all parking areas shall be re-striped in accordance with the proposed site plan (sheet B SITE PLAN), as submitted by the applicant and on file with this case.
- 33. That all areas of the existing parking and driveway areas presently in a state of disrepair shall be repaired and resurfaced with appropriate surface material.
- 34. That all recycling activities (i.e. receiving, sorting, and shipping), except the transferring of tires into the building, shall occur inside the building. No materials, scrap, or pallets shall be located or otherwise stored outside the building.
- 35. That the subject property and areas immediately adjacent to the property be permanently maintained free of trash, junk, debris, etc. and in an otherwise neat and attractive manner.
- 36. That the applicant shall ensure the trash bins are stored inside their designated enclosure and that the door to the enclosure remains closed and locked at all times.
- 37. That the subject recycling operations shall operate within the noise limitations established within Section 155.424 of the City's Zoning Regulations.
- 38. That the subject tire recycling activities shall not involve any material grinding or otherwise manufacturing on the subject site. Additionally, activities shall not involve any melting or odorous processes.
- 39. That all vehicles associated with the business shall be parked on the subject site at all times. Off-site parking is not permitted and would result in the restriction or revocation of privileges granted under this Permit. In addition, any vehicles associated with the property shall not obstruct or impede any traffic.
- 40. That the applicant shall not allow commercial vehicles, trucks, and/or truck tractors to queue on Cornet Street, use said streets as staging, or to back up onto the street from the subject property.
- 41. That the site shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the site plan and floor plan submitted by the applicant and on file with the case.

- 42. That the applicant shall submit for approval a detailed landscape and automatic irrigation plan pursuant to the Landscaping Guidelines of the City. Said plans shall detail any upgrades to existing landscape area as well as all new landscape areas.
- 43. That the landscaped areas shall all be provided with a suitable, fixed, permanent and automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants. This operating sprinkler system shall consist of an electrical time clock, control valves, and piped water lines terminating in an appropriate number of sprinklers to insure proper watering periods and to provide water for all plants within the landscaped area. Sprinklers used to satisfy the requirements of this section shall be spaced to assure complete coverage of all landscaped areas. Said plan shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 44. That upon completion of the new landscaping and landscape upgrade, all landscaped areas thereafter shall be maintained in a neat, clean, orderly and healthful condition. This is meant to include proper pruning, mowing of lawns, weeding, removal of litter, fertilizing, and replacement of plants when necessary and the regular watering of all plantings.
- 45. That the Department of Planning and Development shall first review and approve all sign proposals for the development. The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on 24" x 36" maximum-size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Ordinance and the Sign Guidelines of the City.
- 46. That the applicant shall not accept materials from the general public, individuals or peddlers.
- 47. That the applicant shall obtain all the necessary Building Permits and approvals from the Building, Planning, Engineering and Fire Department.
- 48. That prior to occupancy of the building, the applicant shall obtain a valid business license (AKA Business Operation Tax Certificate), and submit a Statement of Intended Use. Both forms, and other required accompanying forms, may be obtained at City Hall by contacting Cecilia Martinez at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527, or through the City's web site (www.santafesprings.org).
- 49. That the applicant shall understand, and accept, that this Permit is solely for a land use entitlement to operate and maintain a recycling facility. The granting of this Permit does not circumvent any Federal, State or regulatory local laws as they apply to the recycling activities.

- 50. That all other requirements of the City's Zoning Ordinance, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with.
- 51. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 771 shall be subject to a compliance review in one (1) year, no later than **May 8, 2018**, to ensure the subject recycling use is still operating in strict compliance with the conditions of approval as stated in the staff report.
- 52. That the applicant, Lakin Tire Company, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject Conditional Use Permit (CUP Case No. 771) or Modification Permit (MOD Case No. 1264), or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 53. That if there is evidence that conditions of approval have not been fulfilled or the use has or have resulted in a substantial adverse effect on the health, and/or general welfare of users of adjacent or proximate property, or have a substantial adverse impact on public facilities or services, the Director of Planning may refer the conditional use permit to the Planning Commission for review. If upon such review, the Commission finds that any of the results above have occurred, the Commission may modify or revoke the subject conditional use permit.
- 54. That it is hereby declare to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse

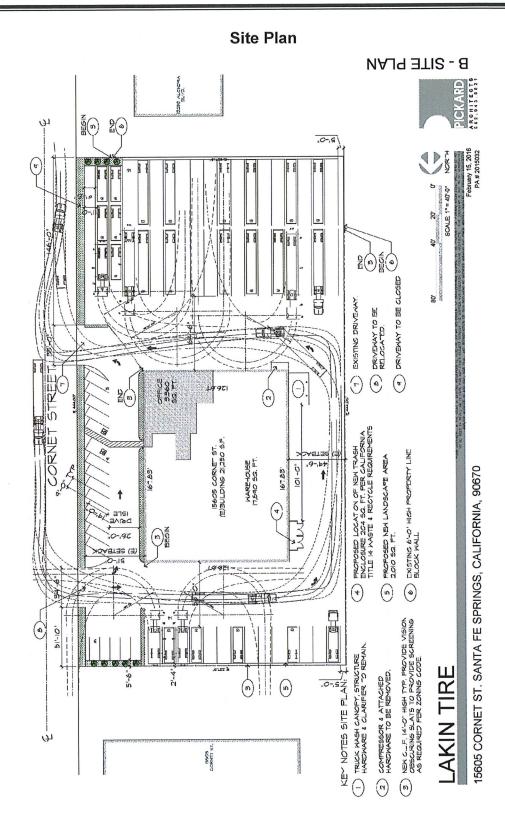

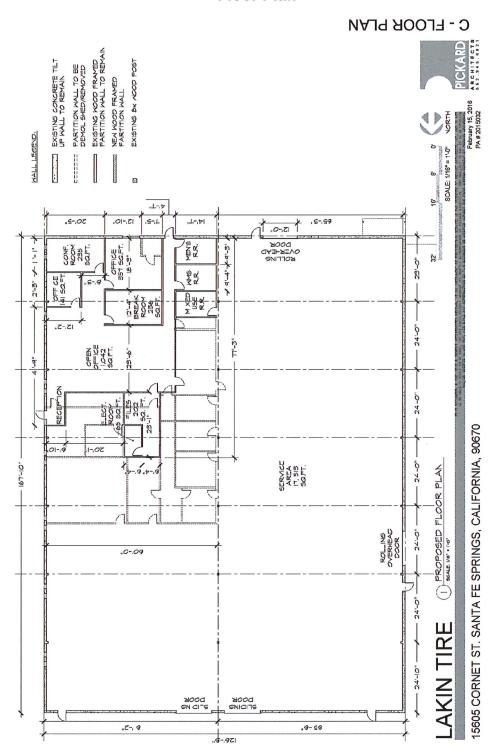

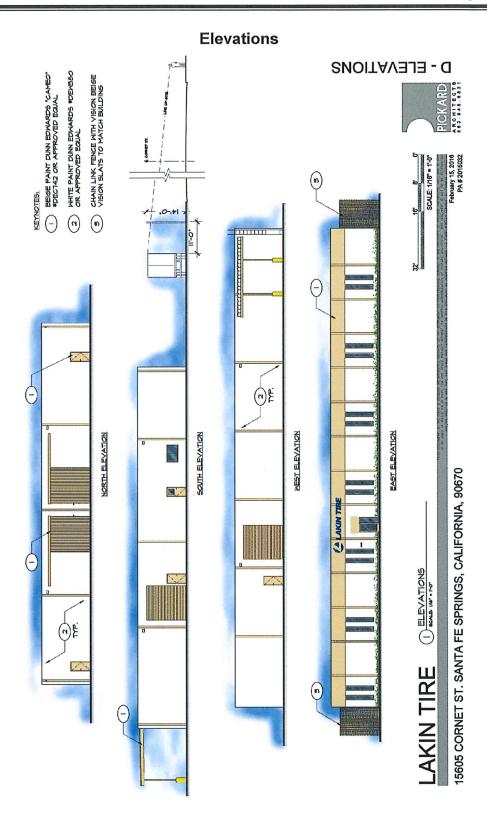
