5. PRESENTATION

Sales Tax Initiative by City Manager Ray Cruz

City Manager Ray Cruz presented before the Planning Commission a Sales Tax Initiative that will be voted upon in the November election. The key points outlined in the

presentation were as follows:

- Preserve current firefighter and paramedic staffing levels
- Retain current number of police officers patrolling neighborhoods, parks and schools
- Maintain 911 emergency response times
- Maintain local city streets and intersections to improve traffic flow
- Continue anti-gang and anti-drug prevention programs
- Improve water quality and water supply systems
- Local control and independent annual audits to ensure all funds are used in Santa Fe Springs
- No money could be taken by the State or County
- Would not apply to groceries or prescription medicine
- Ensures out-of-town visitors pay for their share of police, fire, street repair and other services

The City is facing a \$5.8 million dollar deficit and the Sales Tax Initiative would provide stable, local funding needed to maintain our quality of life and essential city services.

Parkway Tree Removal Appeal Decision

Resident Request for Removal of Parkway Tree at Gridley

Recommendation: That the Planning Commission:

- Reaffirm the decision of the Director of Public Works to deny the request by the property owner to have the City remove the parkway tree in front of the 10408 Gridley Road; and
- Deny the property owner at the 10408 Gridley Road a permit to remove the parkway tree at their own expense.

Chair Aranda called upon the City's Streets and Grounds Supervisor Eric Borunda to present Item No. 10 before the Planning Commission.

Chair Aranda called upon the Commissioners for questions and/or comments.

Commissioner Jimenez inquired if the rest of the street is lined with Oak trees. Streets and Grounds Supervisor Eric Borunda replied that Gridley Road is lined with Oak trees. Mr. Borunda further stated that this particular Oak tree located in front of 10408 Gridley Road had been pruned in November 2017.

Commissioner Ybarra inquired about the root structure of the Oak tree and if it bore any type of fruit. Mr. Borunda replied that the tree roots will grow normally and it has grown very well in the parkway. Mr. Borunda further stated that the City never received a claim for plumbing problems, although the application stated the resident had plumbing issues and that the Oak tree does bear an acorn type fruit. Commissioner Ybarra further inquired if the beautiful Oak tree could be transplanted if necessary. Mr. Borunda indicated that

the cost to transplant the Oak tree would exceed the cost to remove it and the cost to replace the tree is priceless.

Vice Chair Mora inquired about the sidewalk panels. Eric Borunda replied that 4-5 sidewalks panels were required to be replaced and/or repaired due to the tree roots uplifting them. Vice Chair Mora further inquired about how the City would maintain the sidewalk panels in that area. Mr. Borunda replied that area is labeled District 4 and the City completes sidewalk repairs as needed and District 4 or that entire street was completely repaired at the time.

Commissioner Arnold inquired about the sidewalk regulations regarding the roll/slope on each side of the sidewalk panels. Streets and Grounds Supervisor Eric Borunda replied that there is no regulations unless there is a hazard to the pedestrians using the sidewalk. The sidewalk along with the soil underneath, due to extreme heat, has a tendency to rise. Commissioner Arnold also inquired about the lack of grass growth under the tree. Mr. Borunda replied that there were no visible sprinklers in the parkway and also compaction of the soil can be an issue.

Chair Aranda called upon the appellant Eduardo Perry to address the Planning Commission.

The Appellant Eduardo "Eddie" Perry addressed the following points why the tree should be removed:

- Tree is too large for the parkway.
- 2. Tree trunk takes up almost the entire width of the parkway.
- 3. Tree roots are a tripping hazard.
- 4. Tree's root have invaded the sewer system.
- 5. Grass will not grow under the tree within the parkway.
- 6. Water pools at the curb and gutter.

Commissioner Arnold inquired about the type sewer and the location of the sewer lateral at the Perry residence. Mr. Perry explained and described the location of the clay sewer lateral by utilizing the laser pointer on the large screen.

Ms. Reimer replied that the applicant has not been successful with finding a parking solution nor receiving a reply. LOCATION & BACKGROUND

Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 and Development Plan Approval Case Nos. 930, 931, 932 and 933 were originally scheduled to be heard at the July 9, 2018 Planning Commission meeting. The applicant requested a continuance to allow for additional time to review and confirm the conditions of approval, so the project was continued to the August 13, 2018 Planning Commission meeting. Prior to the August meeting, the applicant hired a new attorney who requested additional time to review the project as a whole. As such, the project was continued again to the September 10, 2018 Planning Commission meeting.

The subject site is located at the northwest corner of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road. It is comprised of seven parcels and measures 44.67 acres in size. The site has been utilized for oil extraction operations since the 1920s, and Breitburn Operating L.P. has owned and operated the oil field since the 1990s. Today, the site is occupied by oil pumping jacks, pipes, construction materials, utility poles, electrical equipment, and six palm trees. Ground cover consists of dirt and gravel.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road are both designated as Major Highways within the Circulation Element of the General Plan. Access to the site is currently provided by one driveway located along the north side of Telegraph Road and one driveway along the west side of Santa Fe Springs Road. New driveways will replace the existing driveways once the property is developed.

ZONING & GENERAL PLAN LAND USE DESIGNATION

The subject site is within the Telegraph Road Corridor and zoned M-2, Heavy Manufacturing. It is used for oil extraction operations. Properties to the west, north and east are zoned M-2 and utilized for various industrial purposes. The subject site and properties to the west, north and east have a General Plan Land Use designation of Industrial. The Villages at Heritage Springs residential development is located south of Telegraph Road and is zoned R-3-PD and R-1-PD (Multi-Family Residential – Planned Development and Single Family Residential – Planned Development). Properties to the south have a General Plan Land Use designation

of Multiple Family Residential and Single Family Residential.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant, Breitburn Operating L.P., is proposing to subdivide the 44.67-acre site into five parcels. The largest parcel, measuring 26.77 acres and located in the western half of the overall site, will be reserved for oil extraction operations. The remaining four parcels, with a combined area of 17.90 acres and situated on the southern and eastern portions of the site, will be developed as an industrial business park. Nine producing oil and gas wells and water injection wells located within the proposed development will continue to operate undisturbed by the project. The proposed project requires approval of the following entitlements:

<u>Tentative Parcel Map (TPM) 78232</u> – to allow the subdivision of an approximately 44.67-acre site into five (5) parcels measuring 186,493 sq. ft. (Proposed Parcel 1), 153,827 sq. ft. (Proposed Parcel 2), 298,474 sq. ft. (Proposed Parcel 3), 140,791 sq. ft. (Proposed Parcel 4), and 1,166,135 sq. ft. (Proposed Parcel 5). The intent is to create independent parcels for each of the four proposed buildings and retain one parcel for oil extraction operations.

Development Plan Approval (DPA) Case Nos. 930 - 933 - to allow the construction of four Class A speculation buildings with a total gross floor area of 318,121 sq. ft. DPA Case No. 930 is to allow the construction of a 78,417 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 1); DPA Case No. 931 is to allow the construction of a 58,463 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 2); DPA Case No. 932 is to allow the construction of a 121,124 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 3); and DPA Case No. 933 is to allow the construction of a 60,117 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 4).

DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL CASE NOs. 930 - 933

Site Plan

The applicant is proposing to develop an industrial business park consisting of four concrete tilt-up buildings on an active oil field site. Specific site plan details associated with each DPA are below:

- DPA 930 (Building 1) Total site area of 4.28 acres (186,493 sq. ft.). The building will be set back 38'-9" from Telegraph Road.
- DPA 931 (Building 2) Total site area of 3.53 acres (153,827 sq. ft.). After two street dedications to add right turn lanes (2,575 sq. ft. and 2,993 sq. ft.) the parcel will measure 3.40 acres (148,259 sq. ft.). The building will be set back 40' from Telegraph Road prior to street dedications, and set back 117' from Santa Fe Springs Road. This parcel contains an easement for the placement of artwork at the corner of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road. This artwork easement will remain in place.
- DPA 932 (Building 3) Total site area of 6.85 acres (298,474 sq. ft.). The

- building will be set back 72'-6" from Santa Fe Springs Road.
- DPA 933 (Building 4) Total site area of 3.23 acres (140,791 sq. ft.). The property is oriented so that 75' of frontage is provided along Santa Fe Springs Road to allow access to the site, but the majority of the parcel is located behind a neighboring triangular-shaped parcel. The odd shape of the neighboring parcel means that a majority of the parcel does not technically adjoin a street and therefore does not have a side yard setback requirement. Because of this, the building itself is located approximately 25' from Santa Fe Springs Road at its nearest point.

All four of the site plans will meet the development standards for properties within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing zone. No Modification Permits or Zone Variances are required for the proposed development.

Floor Plan

The applicant is proposing to construct four speculation buildings with a combined gross floor area of 318,121 sq. ft. Each building is proposed to include a mezzanine above a main office area, but specific floor layouts and size of office areas will be dictated by the future tenants of these buildings.

- DPA 930 (Building 1) 73,796 sq. ft. building with a 4,621 sq. ft. mezzanine for a gross floor area of 78,417 sq. ft.
- DPA 931 (Building 2) 54,463 sq. ft. building with a 4,000 sq. ft. mezzanine for a gross floor area of 58,463 sq. ft.
- DPA 932 (Building 3) 117,124 sq. ft. building with a 4,000 sq. ft. mezzanine for a gross floor area of 121,124 sq. ft.
- DPA 933 (Building 4) 56,117 sq. ft. building with a 4,000 sq. ft. mezzanine for a gross floor area of 60,117 sq. ft.

Elevations

Architecture will be consistent throughout the development to create a distinctive and contemporary industrial business park. All four buildings will have a minimum height of 34' and a maximum height of 38'-6". The buildings will include many enhanced architectural elements including glass features, high image office corners, and facade and parapet movements throughout the elevations. The two buildings along Telegraph Road will have flexible design features to allow for future non-industrial users, such as wall openings for patios, eating areas and trellises. The buildings have been designed with multiple entries to allow future flexibility with the size of spaces.

Landscaping Requirements

The project will include 100,686 sq. ft. of new landscaping. Trees, plants, shrubs and meandering sidewalks will continue the urban forest theme along Telegraph Road.

- DPA 930 (Building 1) 22,143 sq. ft. of landscaping will be provided (exceeds requirement). The entire setback area along Telegraph Road will be landscaped, as well as five-foot wide planters along the western property line and adjacent to the building.
- DPA 931 (Building 2) 27,432 sq. ft. of landscaping will be provided (exceeds requirement). The entire setback area along Telegraph Road will be landscaped, as well as a majority of the setback area along Santa Fe Springs Road. The property will also include a landscaped strip along the west elevation.
- DPA 932 (Building 3) 36,251 sq. ft. of landscaping will be provided (exceeds requirement). A 31' wide landscaped area will be provided between Santa Fe Springs Road and the parking area, as well as a 5' to 8' wide landscaped strip around the building.
- DPA 933 (Building 4) 14,860 sq. ft. of landscaping will be provided (exceeds requirement). Given this parcel's limited street frontage, a majority of the landscaping is provided along the southern elevation.

Parking Requirements

The project will provide a total of 491 parking stalls and 4 truck parking stalls. Assuming single-tenant occupancy for each building, each parcel will provide sufficient parking to meet code standards. Overall, the site will have 20 stalls more than required by code:

- DPA 930 (Building 1) 127 stalls (118 required)
- DPA 931 (Building 2) 91 stalls (91 required)
- DPA 932 (Building 3) 177 stalls (168 required); 4 truck parking stalls (4 required)
- DPA 933 (Building 4) 96 stalls (94 required)

Should any of the buildings be occupied by more than one tenant in the future, the property owner will need to provide additional parking stalls or obtain a Modification Permit before subleasing the building.

Loading / Roll Up Doors

All four of the proposed buildings will have dock high doors and grade level doors to facilitate truck delivery and loading. All loading doors will be strategically placed so that they will not be visible from the public rights-of-way. In total, the development will have 44 loading doors:

- DPA 930 (Building 1) 9 dock high doors and 1 grade level door will be installed on the building's north-facing elevation.
- DPA 931 (Building 2) 9 dock high doors and 1 grade level door will be

- installed on the building's north-facing elevation.
- DPA 932 (Building 3) 13 dock high doors and 2 grade level doors will be installed on the building's west-facing elevation.
- DPA 933 (Building 4) 8 dock high doors and 1 grade level door will be installed on the building's west-facing elevation.

Trash Enclosures

Each building will be provided with a sufficiently-sized trash enclosure:

- DPA 930 (Building 1) one provided at the rear of the building measuring 492 sq. ft. (492 sq. ft. required)
- DPA 931 (Building 2) one provided at the rear of the building measuring 392 sq. ft. (392 sq. ft. required)
- DPA 932 (Building 3) two provided along the rear property line measuring 350 sq. ft. and 356 sq. ft. (706 sq. ft. required)
- DPA 933 (Building 4) one provided at the rear of the building measuring 400 sq. ft. (400 sq. ft. required)

Driveways

Public access to the project site will be made possible by two driveways located along the west side of Santa Fe Springs Road and a third driveway located on the north side of Telegraph Road. A street dedication will be required to provide a new deceleration lane along Telegraph Road, which will help facilitate safe maneuvering into the development. A fourth driveway located on the north side of Telegraph Road just west of Building 1 will be reserved for emergency access only. All four buildings will participate in a reciprocal access agreement for shared use of the driveways.

It should be noted that access to parcel 5 (the remaining active oil field) will be provided through gates located at the rear property line of parcel 1 and parcel 3. If and when parcel 5 is developed in the future, access will be provided via Hawkins Street.

Oil Wells

The subject site has been operating as an oil field for nearly a century, therefore extensive fieldwork will need to occur before any development can begin. Such work will include well abandonment, well reabandonment, oilfield infrastructure removal, and oilfield infrastructure relocation. There are 19 non-abandoned wells within the project area. Ten of these wells will be abandoned and nine will remain active after the site is developed. Of the nine wells that will remain active, four are injection wells, where brine water produced with the oil is reinjected back into the formation it originated from. Oil produced from the active wells is currently and will continue to be transported via underground pipelines to the Breitburn Tank Farm located south of Telegraph Road and east of Santa Fe Springs Road. The site also

has 20 previously-abandoned wells. The applicant will be working with the Division of Oil, Gas, & Geothermal Resources (DOGGR) and the City to determine if the previously-abandoned wells will need to be re-abandoned. Details regarding the wells associated with each DPA are below:

- DPA 930 (Building 1) Site has 7 previously-abandoned wells, 4 wells to be abandoned, and 1 active well to remain.
- DPA 931 (Building 2) Site has 5 previously-abandoned wells, 3 wells to be abandoned, and 1 active well to remain.
- DPA 932 (Building 3) Site has 8 previously-abandoned wells, 3 wells to be abandoned, and 7 active wells to remain.
- DPA 933 (Building 4) There are no wells present on this site.

LEGAL NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

This matter was set for Public Hearing in accordance with the requirements of Sections 65090 and 65091 of the State Planning, Zoning and Development Laws and the requirements of Sections 155.860 through 155.864 of the City's Municipal Code.

Legal notice of the Public Hearing for the proposed project was sent by first class mail on June 27, 2018 to all property owners whose names and addresses appear on the latest County Assessor's Roll within 500 feet of the exterior boundaries of the subject property. The legal notice was also posted in Santa Fe Springs City Hall, the City Library and the City's Town Center on June 27, 2018, and published in a newspaper of general circulation (Whittier Daily News) on June 27, 2018, as required by the State Zoning and Development Laws and by the City's Zoning Regulations.

As of the date of this report, staff has not received any comments and/or inquiries regarding the proposed project. The project was originally scheduled to be heard at the July 9, 2018 Planning Commission meeting, but the applicant requested two continuances. Since the case was set for public hearing, the Planning Commission opened the public hearing to receive comments at both the July 9, 2018 and August 13, 2018 Planning Commission meetings before taking action to continue the project to the next meeting date. No comments were received at either meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

The environmental analysis provided in the Initial Study indicates that the proposed project will not result in any significant adverse immitigable impacts on the environment; therefore, the City caused to be prepared and proposes to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the proposed project. The MND reflects the independent judgment of the City of Santa Fe Springs and the environmental consultant, Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning, as to the potential environmental impacts of the proposed project on the environment.

The draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) identified several factors that may be potentially affected by the subject project, including Aesthetics, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, and Noise. These factors and their respective pertinent issues are discussed and analyzed within the IS/MND. Mitigations, where necessary, were implemented to help ensure the potential impacts are reduced to a less than significant level. A detailed analysis can be found in the IS/MND. The monitoring and reporting on the implementation of mitigation measures, including the monitoring action, monitoring agency, and the period for implementation, are identified in the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (attachment #11).

The draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration was circulated for the required 20-day public review period from June 11, 2018 to July 2, 2018. A Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration was posted with the Los Angeles County Clerk and a copy of the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration was also mailed to surrounding cities for their review and comment.

Staff received one response to the IS/MND from the South Coast Air Quality Management District, who recommended that a mobile source air quality health risk assessment be performed. The environmental consultant had considered mobile sources of pollution when drafting the IS/MND, and a response letter describing their findings was sent to the South Coast Air Quality Management District on July 5, 2018. A copy of the comment letter and subsequent response are attached to this report (attachment #12). Staff finds that all concerns raised by the correspondent have been properly reviewed and addressed.

STAFF REMARKS

Based on the findings set forth in attached Resolution 82-2018, staff finds that Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 is consistent with the policies and goals set forth in the General Plan, Subdivision Map Act and California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirement. Staff also finds that the applicant's request meets the criteria set forth in §155.739 of the City's Zoning Regulations for the granting of Development Plan Approval. Therefore, staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt Resolution 82-2018, which incorporates said findings as well as the conditions of approval related the subject proposal.

AUTHORITY OF PLANNING COMMISSION:

Tentative Parcel Map

The Planning Commission, after receiving and hearing the results of investigations and reports on the design and improvements of any proposed division of real property for which a tentative map is filed, shall have the authority to impose requirements and conditions upon such division of land and to approve, conditionally approve or disapprove such map and division of land.

The Commission may grant, conditionally grant or deny approval of a proposed development plan based on the evidence submitted and upon its own study and knowledge of the circumstances involved, or it may require submission of a revised development plan.

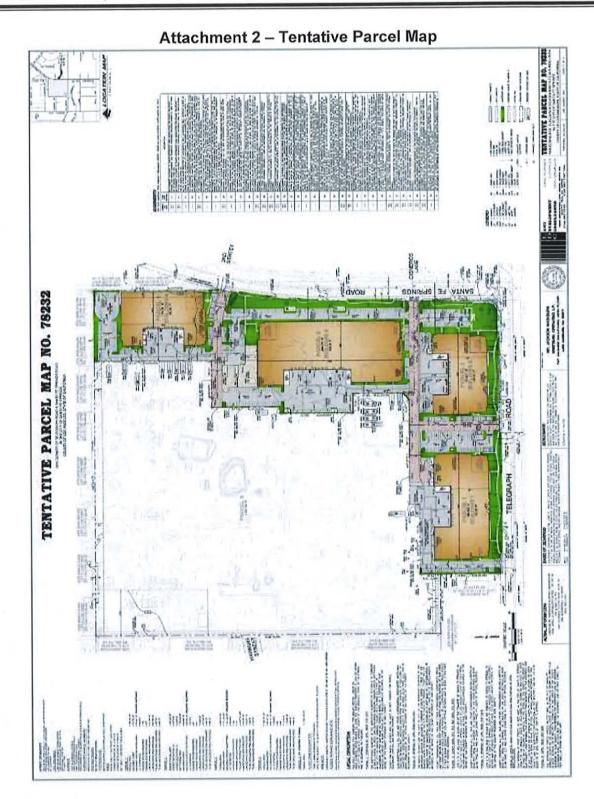

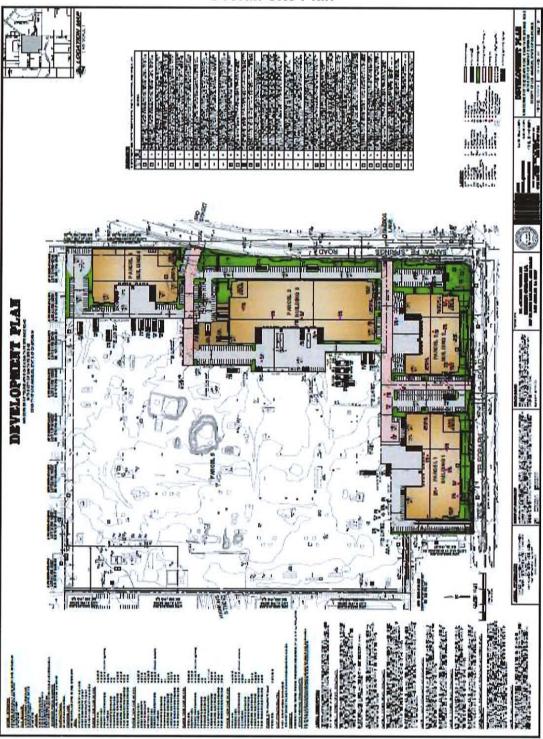

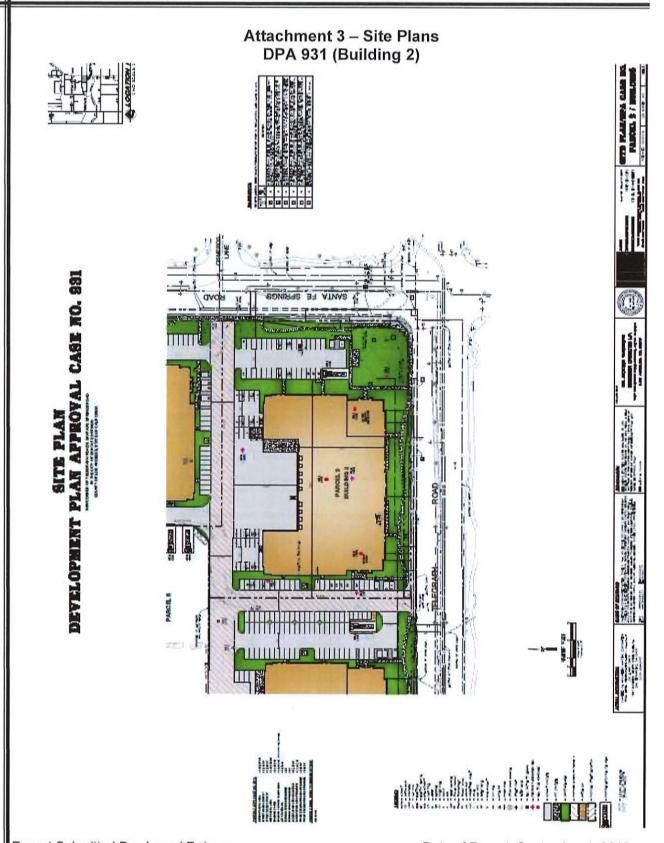


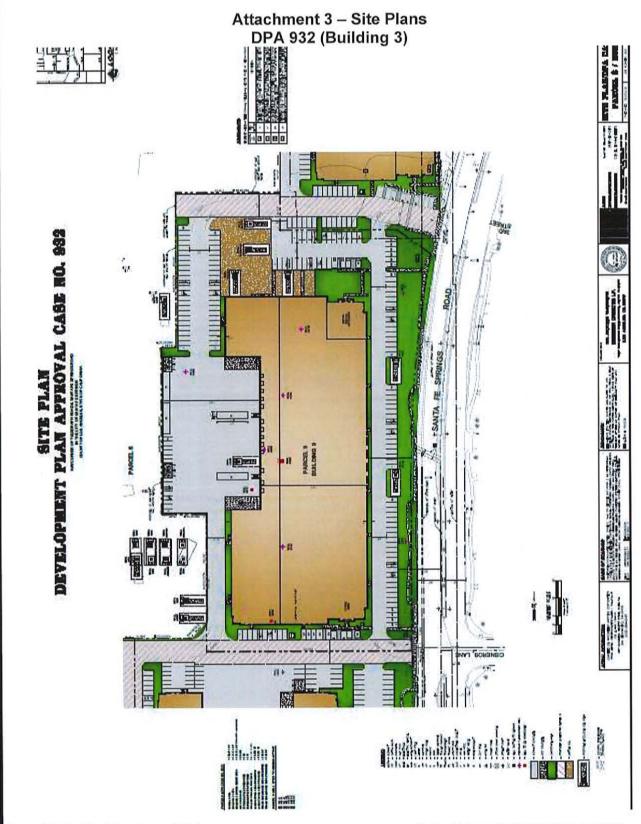
Attachment 3 – Site Plans Overall Site Plan

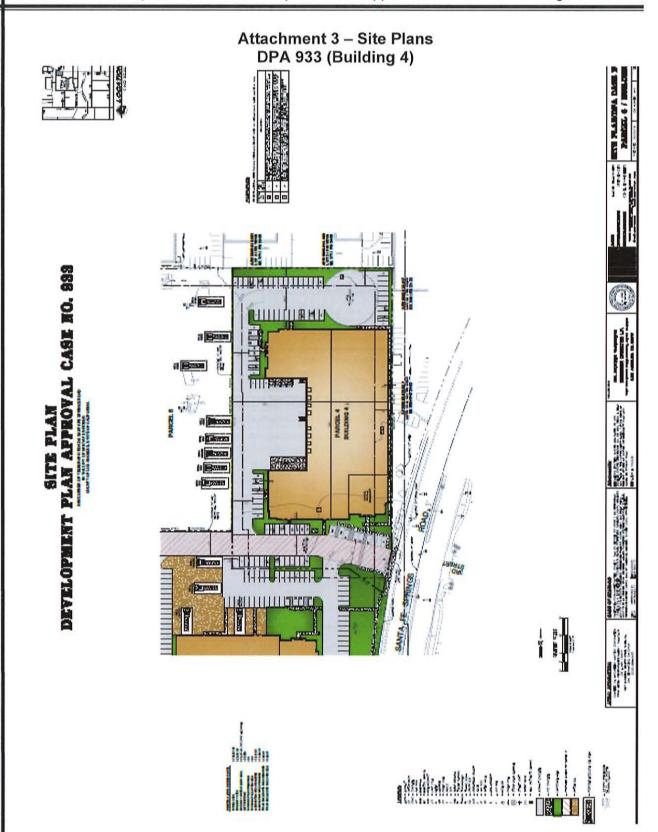


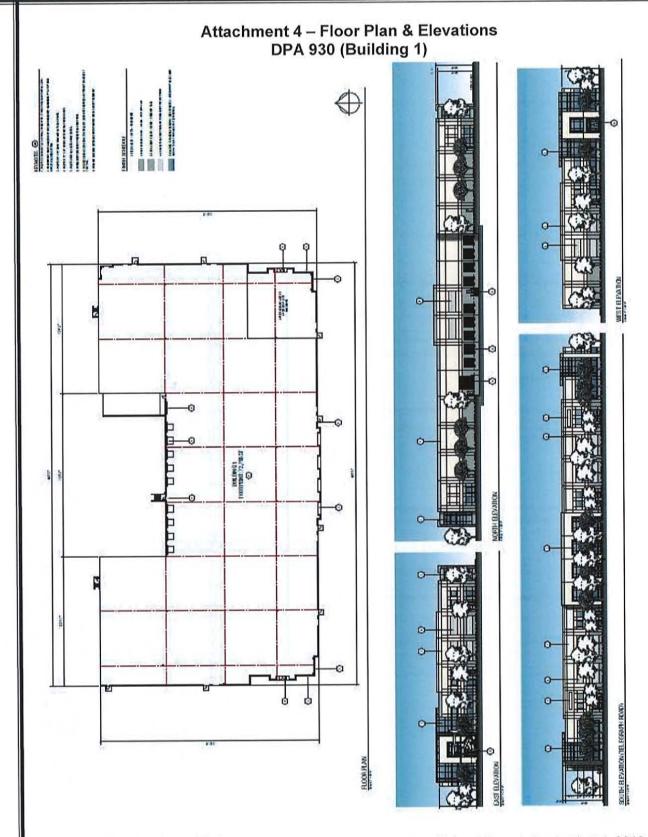

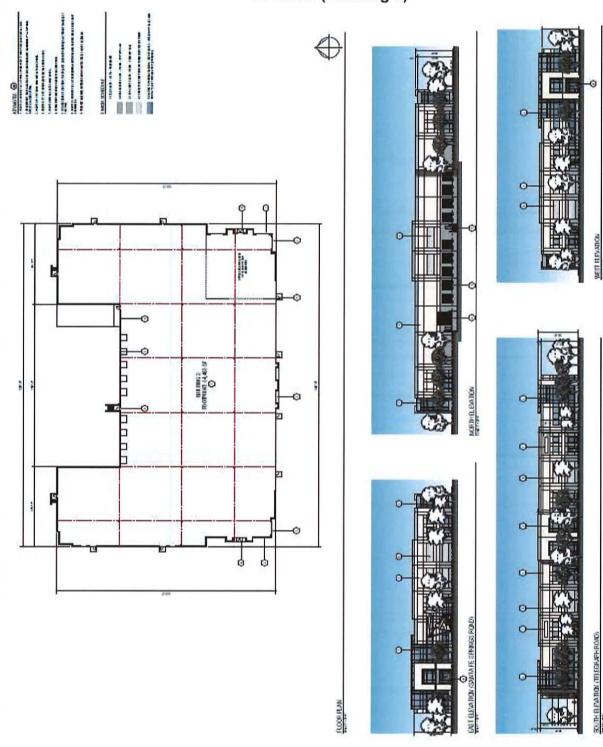






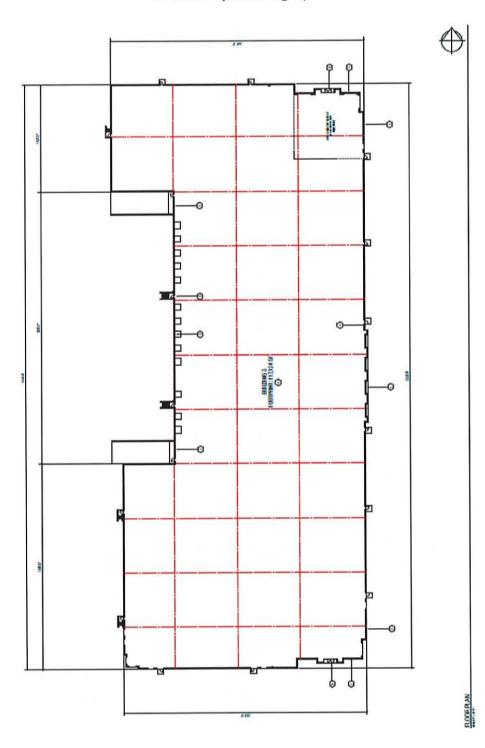






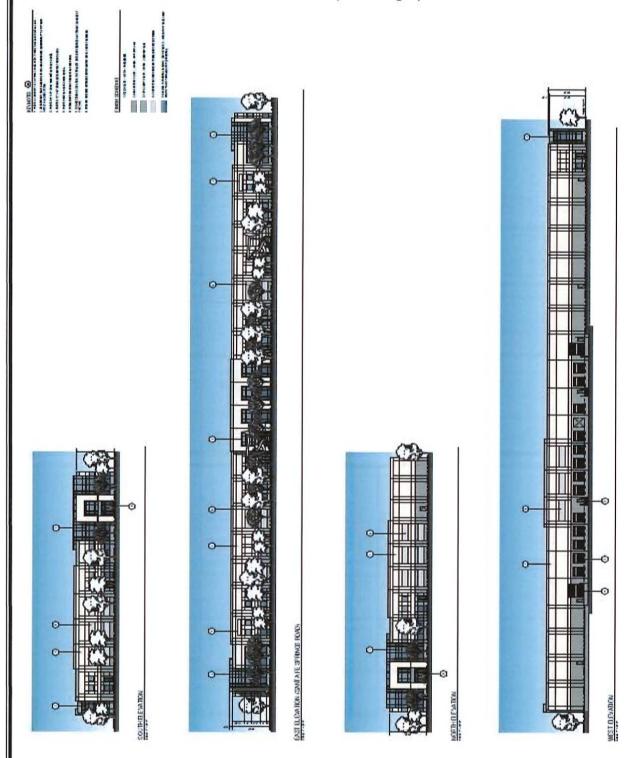
Attachment 4 - Floor Plan & Elevations DPA 932 (Building 3)





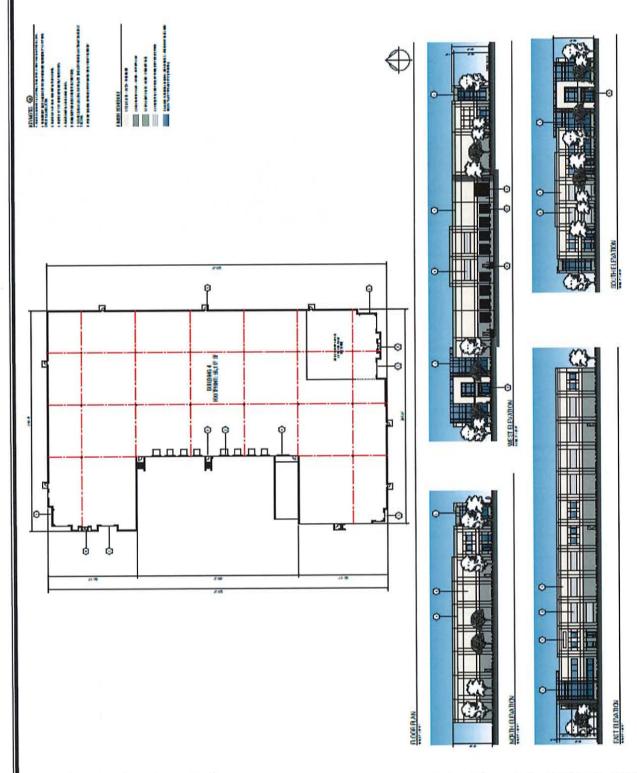

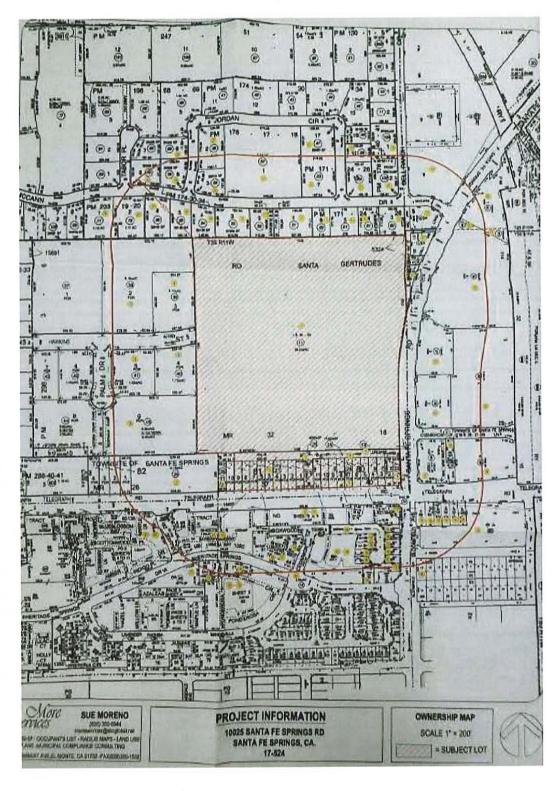

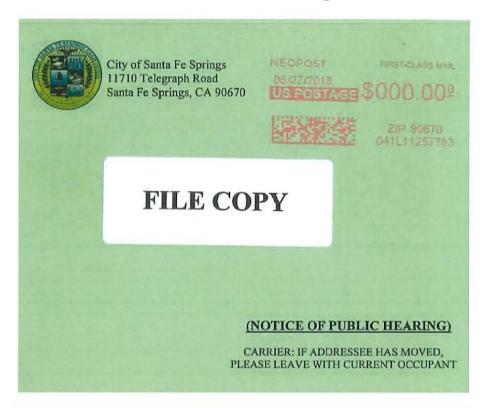

1. OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT

The City of Santa Fe Springs, in its capacity as the Lead Agency, is considering an application that will permit the subdivision of a 779,581 square-foot (17.90-acre) portion of a larger 44.67-acre site located at the northwest corner of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road. The 44.67-acre project site will be subdivided into five new parcels. The four new buildings will occupy a 17.90-acre portion (Parcels 1 through 4). Parcel 5 will have a total land area of 26.77 acres and will include the existing oil extraction operations. Parcel 1 will have a total land area of 186,493 square feet (4.28 acres) and will be occupied by a 78,417 square -foot warehouse. Parcel 2 will consist of 148,259 square feet (3.40 acres) and will be occupied by a 58,463 square-foot warehouse. Parcel 3 will total 298,474 square feet (6.85 acres) and will be occupied by a 121,124 square-foot warehouse. Parcel 4 will have a total land area of 140,791 square feet (3.23 acres) and will be occupied by a 60,117 square-foot warehouse. The new development for parcels 1 through 4 will also include oil extraction operations, these operations will be modernized with new equipment.

A total of 491 parking spaces will be provided. Public access to the project site will be made possible by two driveways located along the west side of Santa Fe Springs Road and a third driveway located on north side of Telegraph Road. A fourth drive located on the north side of Telegraph Road will be reserved for emergency access only. In addition, 100,686 square feet of new landscaping will be provided. The project Applicant is Jackson Washburn, Breitburn Operating L.P., 707 Wilshire Boulevard, 46th Floor, Los Angeles, California 90017. Discretionary approvals required as part of the proposed project's implementation include the following:

- Development Plan Approval (DPA 930, 931, 932, and 933) to construct four industrial buildings on land currently used as an oil field. Nine wells will remain active and several wells will be abandoned or re-abandoned;
- Tentative Parcel Map (TPM 78232) to create five parcels. Four parcels will be developed with
 industrial buildings and one parcel will continue to be used as an oil field; and,
- Approval of the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP).

Comment 1.

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) staff appreciates the opportunity to comment on the above-mentioned document. The following comments are meant as guidance for the Lead Agency and should be incorporated into the Final MND.

SCAQMD Staff's Summary of Project Description

The Lead Agency proposes to build four warehouses totaling 318,121 square feet on 17.9 acres (Proposed Project). Based on a review of Exhibit 2, Aerial Photographs, and Exhibit 3, Sensitive Receptors Map, in the MND, SCAQMD staff found that existing residential uses are located in a close proximity to the Proposed Project across Telegraph Road. Construction is expected to take approximately 20 month.

This comment has been noted for the record.

Comment 2.

In the Air Quality Analysis Section, the Lead Agency quantified the Proposed Project's construction and operational emissions and compared them to SCAQMD's regional and localized air quality CEQA significance thresholds. The Lead Agency found that the Proposed Project's air quality impacts from construction would be less than significant. Additionally, the Lead Agency conducted a Human Health Risk Assessment (HHRA) to evaluate the potential health risks associated with soil contact. However, the Lead Agency did not conduct a mobile source health risk assessment for the Proposed Project. Since the Proposed Project would involve operation of four warehouses that are capable of generating or attracting vehicular trips, especially heavy-duty diesel-fueled vehicles, it is recommended that the Lead Agency perform a mobile source health risk assessment to quantify and disclose potential health risk impacts from operation of the Proposed Project to nearby residents. Response 2.

An analysis of diesel particulate matter (DPM) generated by idling trucks was prepared for the proposed project. A discussion of DPM and truck idling was provided on Page 49 of the IS/MND. The use of certified clean idle trucks will lead to further reductions in DPM emissions. In addition, all trucks are currently prohibited from idling longer than five minutes pursuant to the California Code of Regulations. Computer molding was used to ascertain the project's DPM emissions. The modeling indicated that approximately 528 trucks travelling on-site will result in 0.22 pounds per day of DPM. Trucks idling on-site will generate 0.83 grams per hour of DPM, while trucks travelling to and from the site will result in 0.35 pounds per day of DPM. Trucks travelling along Telegraph Road will generate 0.09 pounds of DPM per day, while trucks travelling along Santa Fe Springs Road will generate 0.05 pounds per day of DPM. The table below summarizes the calculations cited above and in the IS/MND.

Comment 3.

SCAQMD staff recommends the use of truck trip rates from the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) for high cube warehouse projects located in SCAQMD (i.e. 1.68 average daily vehicle trips per 1,000 square feet and 0.64 average daily truck trips per 1,000 square feet). Consistent with CEQA Guidelines, the CEQA document for the Proposed Project may use a non-default trip rate if there is substantial evidence indicating another rate is more appropriate for the air quality analysis.

The line-of-sight between these loading doors and the sensitive receptors located along the south side of Telegraph Road will be obstructed by the two warehouse buildings. Furthermore, the trucks will be prohibited from idling longer than five minutes and will consist of certified clean air idle trucks. Since most of these trucks will travel to and from the ports, they will be required to comply with the port's increasing emissions standards.

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS REGARDING TENTATIVE PARCEL MAP NO. 78232 & DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL CASE NO. 930 & DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL CASE NO. 931 & DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL CASE NO. 932 & DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL CASE NO. 933

WHEREAS, a request was filed for Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 to allow an approximately 44.67-acre site to be subdivided into five (5) parcels measuring 186,493 sq. ft. (Parcel 1), 153,827 sq. ft. (Parcel 2), 298,474 sq. ft. (Parcel 3), 140,791 sq. ft. (Parcel 4), and 1,166,135 sq. ft. (Parcel 5) in the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and Telegraph Road Corridor; and

WHEREAS, a request was filed for Development Plan Approval Case No. 930 to allow the construction of a 78,417 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 1) on property located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and Telegraph Road Corridor; and

WHEREAS, a request was filed for Development Plan Approval Case No. 931 to allow the construction of a 58,463 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 2) on property located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and Telegraph Road Corridor; and

WHEREAS, a request was filed for Development Plan Approval Case No. 932 to allow the construction of a 121,124 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 3) on property located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and Telegraph Road Corridor; and

WHEREAS, a request was filed for Development Plan Approval Case No. 933 to allow the construction of a 60,117 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 4) on property located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone and Telegraph Road Corridor; and

WHEREAS, the subject property is located at the northwest corner of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road, with Accessor's Parcel Numbers of 8005-015-011, 8005-015-013, 8005-015-023, 8005-015-024, 8005-015-025, 8005-015-026, and 8005-015-027, as shown in the latest rolls of the Los Angeles County Office of the Assessor; and

WHEREAS, the property owner is Breitburn Operating L.P., 7087 Wilshire Boulevard, 46ths Floor, Los Angeles, CA 90017; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 and Development Plan Approval Case Numbers 930 – 933 are considered a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Article 20, Section 15378(a); and

WHEREAS, based on the information received from the applicant and staff's assessment, it was found and determined that the proposed project will not have a significant adverse effect on the environmental following mitigation, therefore, the City caused to be prepared and proposed to adopt an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) for the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning and Development Department on June 27, 2018 published a legal notice in the *Whitter Daily News*, a local paper of general circulation, indicating the date and time of the public hearing, and also mailed said public hearing notice on June 27, 2018 to each property owner within a 500 foot radius of the project site in accordance with state law; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission has considered the application, the written and oral staff report, the General Plan and zoning of the subject property, the testimony, written comments, or other materials presented at the Planning Commission Meeting on July 9, 2018 concerning Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 and Development Plan Approval Case Nos. 930 - 933.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that the PLANNING COMMISSION of the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE and ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION I</u>. ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION

The proposed development is considered a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and as a result, the project is subject to the City's environmental review process. The environmental analysis provided in the Initial Study indicated that the proposed project will not result in any significant adverse immitigable impacts to the environment, therefore, the City required the preparation and adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the proposed Project. The MND reflects the independent judgment of the City of Santa Fe Springs, and the environmental consultant, Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning.

The Initial Study determined that the proposed project is not expected to have any significant adverse environmental impacts. The following findings can be made regarding the Mandatory Findings of Significance set forth in Section 15065 of the CEQA Guidelines based on the results of this Initial Study:

- The proposed project will not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment.
- The proposed project *will not* have the potential to achieve short-term goals to the disadvantage of long-term environmental goals.
- The proposed project will not have impacts that are individually limited, but cumulatively considerable, when considering planned or proposed development in the immediate vicinity.
- The proposed project will not have environmental effects that will adversely affect humans, either directly or indirectly.

In addition, pursuant to Section 21081(a) of the Public Resources Code, findings must be adopted by the decision-maker coincidental to the approval of a Mitigated Negative Declaration, which relates to the Mitigation Monitoring Program. These findings shall be incorporated as part of the decision-maker's findings of fact, in response to AB-3180 and in compliance with the requirements of the Public Resources Code. In accordance with the requirements of Section 21081(a) and 21081.6 of the Public Resources Code, the City of Santa Fe Springs can make the following additional findings:

- · A mitigation reporting or monitoring program will be required; and,
- An accountable enforcement agency or monitoring agency shall be identified for the mitigation measures adopted as part of the decision-maker's final determination.

A number of mitigation measures have been recommended as a means to reduce or eliminate potential adverse environmental impacts to insignificant levels. AB-3180 requires that a monitoring and reporting program be adopted for the recommended mitigation measures.

SECTION II. TENTATIVE PARCEL MAP FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 154.07 of the Municipal Code, a tentative map shall not be approved unless the Planning Commission finds that the proposed subdivision, together with the provisions for its design and improvements, is consistent with the general plan as required by Section 66473.5 of the Subdivision Map Act. Additionally, the Planning Commission shall deny a tentative map if it makes any of the findings set forth in Sections 66474 and 66474.6 of the Subdivision Map Act.

A) Section 66473.5 and Sections 66474(a) and (b) of the Subdivision Map Act require tentative maps to be consistent with the general plan and specific plans. The proposed Tentative Parcel Map, subject to the attached conditions, is in accordance with the Subdivision Map Act in that:

Approval of the proposed Parcel Map would promote a number of specific General Plan Goals and Policies as described in the table below:

The proposed parcel map, subject to the attached conditions, is compatible with the goals and objectives of the various elements of the City of Santa Fe Springs General Plan, and therefore, is in compliance with Government Code Sections 66473.5, and 66474(a) and (b).

B) Sections 66474(c) and (d) of the Subdivision Map Act require the site to be physically suitable for the type of development and proposed density of development.

In addition to the proposed parcel map, the applicant is concurrently seeking approval to allow for the construction of four Class A industrial buildings on parcels 1, 2, 3, and 4. Parcel 5 will continue to be utilized for oil extraction operations. The existing zoning permits warehouse uses and oil and gas drilling for properties within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, zone. All public streets and utility services necessary and sufficient for the full use, occupancy, and operation of the future industrial business park, including water, storm drain(s), sanitary sewer, gas, electric, cable and telephone facilities, are readably available.

C) Sections 66474(e) and (f) of the Subdivision Map Act require that the design of the subdivision or the proposed improvements are not likely to cause substantial environmental damage or substantially and avoidably injure fish or wildlife or their habitat or is likely to cause serious public health concerns.

The project site is not located in a sensitive environment, but rather in a fully urbanized area surrounded by various land uses. None of the parcels, pre and

post subdivision, contain any riparian habitats, wetland habitats, and are not utilized for movement of any known native wildlife species of migratory fish or wildlife species; consequently, the design of the subdivision is unlikely to cause substantial environmental damage or substantially and avoidably injure fish or wildlife or their habitat. Additionally, as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an Initial Study (IS)/Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) was prepared for the proposed apartment project. According to the IS/MND, the project is not expected to have any impacts on biological resources or cause serious public health problems.

D) Section 66474(g) of the Subdivision Map Act requires that the design of the subdivision or the type of improvements will not conflict with easements, acquired by the public at large, for access through or use of, property within the proposed subdivision.

New easements for utility or roadways, if necessary, will be provided prior to final map approval. Two right-turn lanes are anticipated to be recorded on the final map.

E) In accordance with Government Code Section 66474.6, it has been determined that the discharge of waste from the proposed subdivision, subject to the attached conditions, into the existing sewer system will not result in a violation of the requirements prescribed by the Regional Water Quality Control Board in that the developer is required to comply with the IS/MND Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, submit an erosion control plan and comply with the NPDES Best Management Practices during the grading and construction phases of the project.

The project will meet all state and local ordinances and requirements including the California Regional Water Quality Control Board.

F) That the proposed subdivision shall be in accordance with Government Code Section 66473.1, entitled "Design of Subdivisions to provide for Future Passive or Natural Heating and Cooling Opportunities."

Future Passive or Natural Heating and Cooling Opportunities will be incorporated with the proposed developments. To the extent feasible, staff will review the proposed developments to ensure that energy-saving devices or materials, including, but not limited to, insulation, double-pane windows, and high efficiency central heating and cooling systems will be incorporated.

SECTION III. DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 155.739 of the City of Santa Fe Springs Zoning Regulations, the Planning Commission shall consider the following findings in their review and

determination of the subject Development Plan Approval. Based on the available information, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission hereby make the following findings:

(A) That the proposed development is in conformance with the overall objectives of this chapter.

The proposed project is located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone. Pursuant to Section 155.240 of the Zoning Regulations, "The purpose of the M-2 Zone is to preserve the lands of the city appropriate for heavy industrial uses, to protect these lands from intrusion by dwellings and inharmonious commercial uses, to promote uniform and orderly industrial development, to create and protect property values, to foster an efficient, wholesome and aesthetically pleasant industrial district, to attract and encourage the location of desirable industrial plants, to provide an industrial environment which will be conducive to good employee relations and pride on the part of all citizens of the community and to provide proper safeguards and appropriate transition for surrounding land uses."

The proposed project is consistent with the purpose of the M-2 Zone in the following manner:

- 1. The land is appropriate for industrial uses based on its zoning, M-2, Heavy Manufacturing and its General Plan Land Use designation of Industrial.
- 2. The proposed project is and industrial business park, therefore the land is being maintained for industrial uses.
- 3. The project involves the construction of a new and attractive industrial business park on a site that is currently utilized for oil extraction operations. The assessed value of the property will significantly improve after the project, thus leading to an increase in property values for both the subject property and neighboring properties.
- 4. The proposed project complies with all development standards set forth in the M-2 Zone.
- (B) That the architectural design of the proposed structures is such that it will enhance the general appearance of the area and be in harmony with the intent of this chapter.

The subject parcel has been utilized for oil extraction operations for many decades. The proposed project will be a significant improvement to the subject site. The architect used multiple variations in height, setback, materials and color. The result is an attractive project with contemporary buildings that is comparable to other high quality office/industrial projects here in Santa Fe Springs. In addition, the project meets or exceeds all requirements of the City's Zoning Regulations. The project's overall compliance validates that it is in harmony with the overall intent of the City's Zoning Regulations.

(C) That the proposed structures be considered on the basis of their suitability for their intended purpose and on the appropriate use of materials and on the principles of proportion and harmony of the various elements of the buildings or structures.

The proposed buildings are well-designed and should be highly suitable for a variety of office, manufacturing or warehouse-type users. The design of the industrial business park provides quality architectural design, as demonstrated by glazing, pop-outs, and variations in height, materials, and color. These architectural design elements break up the mass of the buildings, and present an attractive, distinctive façade to visitors. As designed, the new buildings are suitable for their intended users, and the distinctive design of the buildings represents the architectural principles of proportion and harmony. In addition, the buildings are designed with similar architectural features in order to create harmony and consistency throughout the development.

(D) That consideration be given to landscaping, fencing and other elements of the proposed development to ensure that the entire development is in harmony with the objectives of this chapter.

Extensive consideration has been given to numerous elements of the proposed project to achieve harmony with the City's Zoning Regulations. As proposed, the project meets or exceeds all development standards set for in the City's zoning regulations and the project does not require any modification permits and/or zone variances. Landscaping helps to soften building mass and parking areas, loading doors and potential trucking activities are screened by the orientation of buildings, and meandering sidewalks throughout the site frontage provide a safe and attractive pedestrian pathway.

(E) That it is not the intent of this subchapter to require any particular style or type of architecture other than that necessary to harmonize with the general area.

As stated previously, the proposed buildings are contemporary in design. The architect used variations in the provide setback, materials and color. The style and architecture of the proposed building is consistent with other high quality buildings in the general area.

(F) That it is not the intent of this subchapter to interfere with architectural design except to the extent necessary to achieve the overall objectives of this chapter.

Pursuant to Section 155.736 of the Zoning Regulations "The purpose of the development plan approval is to assure compliance with the provisions of this chapter and to give proper attention to the sitting of new structures or additions or alterations to existing structures, particularly in regard to unsightly and undesirable appearance, which would have an adverse effect on surrounding properties and

the community in general." The Planning Commission finds that the new buildings will be an enhancement to the overall area. The Planning Commission believes that proper attention has been given to the location, size, and design of the proposed buildings.

SECTION IV. PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

The Planning Commission hereby adopts Resolution No. 82-2018 to approve Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 to allow an approximately 44.67-acre site to be subdivided into five (5) parcels measuring 186,493 sq. ft. (Parcel 1), 153,827 sq. ft. (Parcel 2), 298,474 sq. ft. (Parcel 3), 140,791 sq. ft. (Parcel 4), and 1,166,135 sq. ft. (Parcel 5); to approve Development Plan Approval Case No. 930 to allow the construction of a 78,417 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 1); to approve Development Plan Approval Case No. 931 to allow the construction of a 58,463 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 2); to approve Development Plan Approval Case No. 932 to allow the construction of a 121,124 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 3); to approve Development Plan Approval Case No. 933 to allow the construction of a 60,117 sq. ft. concrete tilt-up building (Building 4); and to approve and adopt the proposed Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration, and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (IS/MND/MMRP), subject to conditions attached hereto as Exhibit A and Exhibit B.

- Final parcel map checking of \$4,824 plus \$285 per parcel shall be paid to the City.
 Developer shall comply with Los Angeles County's Digital Subdivision Ordinance
 (DSO) and submit final maps to the City and County in digital format.
- 2. The applicant shall provide at no cost to the City, one mylar print of the recorded parcel map from the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, P.O. Box 1460, Alhambra, CA 91802-1460, Attention: Bill Slenniken (626) 458-5131.
- A reciprocal access easement Agreement covering each parcel of the subject map shall be prepared, executed and recorded in the Office of the Los Angeles County Recorder. Such Agreement and any CC&R's shall be subject to the approval of the City Attorney.

- 4. Provisions shall be made for appropriate television systems and for communication systems, including, but not limited to, telephone and internet services. Appropriate cable television systems, as used, means those franchised or licensed to serve the geographical area in which the subdivision is located.
- The Final Map to be recorded with the Los Angeles County Recorder shall substantially conform to the Tentative Parcel Map submitted by the applicant and on file with the case.
- 6. Currently, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works is utilizing a computerized system to update and digitize the countywide land use base. If the parcel map is prepared using a computerized drafting system, the applicant or their civil engineer shall submit a map in digital graphic format with the final Mylar map to the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works for recordation and to the City of Santa Fe Springs Department of Public Works for incorporation into its GIS land use map. The City of Santa Fe Springs GIS Coordinate System shall be used for the digital file.
- 7. Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 shall expire 24 months after Planning Commission approval, on September 10, 2020, except as provided under the provisions of California Government Code Section 66452.6. During this time period the final map shall be presented to the City of Santa Fe Springs for approval. The subdivision proposed by Tentative Parcel Map No. 78232 shall not be effective until such time that a final map is recorded.

- 8. The "Subdivider," Breitburn Operating L.P., agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards concerning the subdivision when action is brought within the time period provided for in Government Code, Section 66499.37. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify subdivider of such claim, action or proceeding and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 9. This approval is not effective until the applicant has completed and signed the signature element appearing at the bottom of the last page of these conditions, and returned the original completed and signed document to the City, confirming the applicant's understanding of these conditions and its willingness to accept and comply with them.

ENGINEERING / PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

STREETS

- 1. Prior to the issuance of building permits, the applicant and/or developer shall pay a flat fee of \$203,715 to reconstruct/resurface the existing street frontage to centerline for Telegraph Road & Santa Fe Springs Road.
- 2. Prior to the issuance of building permits, the applicant and/or developer shall pay a flat fee of \$5,000 for the upgrade and installation of an Emergency Vehicle Preemption System (OPTICOM) at the intersection of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road as determined by the City Engineer and Fire Chief.
- 3. The applicant/or developer shall design and construct a 5-foot wide meandering sidewalk per City standards and dedicate an easement along the Telegraph Road & Santa Fe Springs Road street frontage. The dedicated easement shall be shown on the Parcel Map. Furthermore, said meandering sidewalk shall be shown on both the civil and landscape plans.
- The applicant and/or developer shall design and construct/modify one (1) existing raised Median Island on Santa Fe Springs Road to accommodate left turns into the northernmost proposed driveway.
- 5. Prior to the issuance of building permits, the applicant and/or developer shall pay the costs associated with the furnishing and installation of traffic signal modifications; including protected Northbound/Southbound left turn traffic signal phasing at the intersection of Telegraph Road and Santa Fe Springs Road. The cost estimate for the modifications (add left turn phasing) at the Telegraph/Bloomfield signal is \$191,000.
- 6. Full street improvements shall be constructed to the City standards in accordance with plans prepared by the applicant and/or developer and approved by the City Engineer. Street to be improved shall include Telegraph Road & Santa Fe Springs Road for the purpose of installing Right turn pockets. A soils report shall be prepared and submitted as directed by the City Engineer to determine proposed street structural section.
- 7. Street right-of-way easements shall be dedicated as follows:
 - a) Along the north side of Telegraph Road for the construction of a right turn pocket.
 - b) Along the west side of Santa Fe Springs Road for the construction of a right turn pocket.

- 8. All above ground oil wells, pipelines, tanks, and related lines within the public right-of-way shall be removed from the right-of-way unless otherwise approved by the City Engineer.
- 9. Adequate "on-site" parking shall be provided per City requirements, and all streets abutting the development shall be posted "No Stopping Any Time." The City will install the offsite signs and the applicant and/or developer shall pay \$ 3,000.00 to install (15) new signs.
- 10. The applicant and/or developer shall be responsible for the installation, replacement or modification of street name signs, traffic control signs, striping and pavement markings required in conjunction with the development. The applicant and/or developer shall be responsible for coordination of said work, as well as all associated fees, permits, materials, etc.
- Proposed driveways shall be located to clear existing fire hydrants, street lights, water meters, etc.

CITY UTILITIES

- 12. Storm drains, catch basins, connector pipes, retention basin and appurtenances built for this project shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications in Telegraph Road & Santa Fe Springs Road. Storm drain plans shall be approved by the City Engineer.
- 13. Fire hydrants shall be installed as required by the Fire Department. Existing public fire hydrants adjacent to the site, if any, shall be upgraded if required by the City Engineer. The applicant and/or developer shall pay to the City the entire cost of design, engineering, installation and inspection of Fire hydrants.
- 14. Sanitary sewers shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications to serve the subject development. The plans for the sanitary sewers shall be approved by the City Engineer. A sewer study (including a sewer flow test) shall be submitted along with the sanitary sewer plans.
- 15. All buildings shall be connected to the sanitary sewers.
- 16. The fire sprinkler plans, which show the proposed double-check valve detector assembly location, shall have a stamp approval from the Planning Department and Public Works Department prior to the Fire Department's review for approval. Disinfection, pressure and bacteriological testing on the line between the street and detector assembly shall be performed in the presence of personnel from the City Water Department. The valve on the water main line shall be operated only by the City and only upon the City's approval of the test results.
- 17. The applicant and/or developer shall obtain a Storm Drain Connection Permit for any connection to the storm drain system.

18. The applicant and/or developer shall have an overall site utility master plan prepared by a Registered Civil Engineer showing the proposed location of all public water mains, reclaimed water mains, sanitary sewers and storm drains. This plan shall be approved by the City Engineer prior to the preparation of any construction plans for the aforementioned improvements.

TRAFFIC

19. All points of access to the proposed development have been reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. Left turns will only be allowed into the proposed development from the most northerly driveway on Santa Fe Springs Road. Left turns out of the proposed development will be allowed from both northerly and southerly driveways on Santa Fe Springs Road.

FEES

- 20. The applicant and/or developer shall comply with Congestion Management Program (CMP) requirements and provide mitigation of trips generated by the development. The applicant and/or developer will receive credit for the demolition of any buildings that formerly occupied the site. For new developments, if the applicant and/or developer cannot meet the mitigation requirements, the applicant and/or developer shall pay a mitigation fee to be determined by the City Engineer for off-site transportation improvements. This mitigation fee shall be paid prior to issuance of building permits.
- 21. The applicant and/or developer shall comply with all requirements of the County Sanitation District, make application for and pay the sewer maintenance fee.
- 22. The applicant and/or developer shall pay the water trunkline connection fee of \$3,700 per acre upon application for water service connection or if utilizing any existing water service.

MISCELLANEOUS

- 23. A grading plan shall be submitted for drainage approval to the City Engineer. The applicant and/or developer shall pay drainage review fees in conjunction with this submittal. A professional civil engineer registered in the State of California shall prepare the grading plan.
- 24. A hydrology study shall be submitted to the City if requested by the City Engineer. The study shall be prepared by a Professional Civil Engineer.
- 25. Upon completion of public improvements constructed by developers, the developer's civil engineer shall submit mylar record drawings and an electronic file (AutoCAD Version 2004 or higher) to the office of the City Engineer.

26. The applicant and/or developer shall comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program and shall require the general contractor to implement storm water/urban runoff pollution prevention controls and Best Management Practices (BMPs) on all construction sites in accordance with the current MS4 Permit. The applicant and/ or developer will also be required to submit a Certification for the project and will be required to prepare a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and Low Impact Development Plan (LID).

POLICE SERVICES DEPARTMENT:

- 27. The applicant and/or developer shall submit and obtain approval of a proposed lighting (photometric) plan for the property from the City's Department of Police Services. The photometric plan shall be designed to provide adequate lighting (minimum of 1 foot candle power) throughout the subject property. Further, all exterior lighting shall be designed/installed in such a manner that light and glare are not transmitted onto adjoining properties in such concentration/quantity as to create a hardship to adjoining property owners or a public nuisance. The photometric plans shall be submitted to the Director of Police Services prior to building permit issuance.
- 28. The developer shall provide an emergency phone number and a contact person of the person or persons involved in the supervision of the construction to the Department of Police Services. The name, telephone number, fax number and e-mail address of that person shall be provided to the Director of Police Services no later than 60 days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission. Emergency information shall allow emergency service to reach the developer or their representative any time, 24 hours a day.
- 29. In order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the developer shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. The sign shall prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles and indicate that unauthorized vehicles will be removed at the owner's expense and also contain the California Vehicle Code that permits this action. The sign shall also contain the telephone number of the local law enforcement agency (Police Services Center (562) 409-1850). The lettering within the sign shall not be less than one inch in height. The developer shall contact the Police Services Center for an inspection no later than 30 days after the project has been completed and prior to the occupancy permit being issued.
- 30. All work shall be conducted inside at all times including, but not limited to, all loading and unloading of trailers. Items shall not be left out awaiting loading.
- 31. Off-street parking areas shall not be reduced or encroached upon by outdoor storage and/or for the placement of merchandize.
- 32. All new businesses fronting on Telegraph Road shall be aware that they are subject strict noise levels pursuant to Section 155.424 (E).

- 33. The proposed buildings, including any lighting, fences, walls, cabinets, and poles shall be maintained in good repair, free from trash, debris, litter and graffiti and other forms of vandalism. Any damage from any cause shall be repaired within 72 hours of occurrence, weather permitting, to minimize occurrences of dangerous conditions or visual blight. Paint utilized in covering graffiti shall be a color that matches, as closely possible, the color of the existing and/or adjacent surfaces.
- 34. During the construction phase of the proposed project, the contractor shall provide an identification number (i.e. address number) at each building and/or entry gate to direct emergency vehicles in case of an emergency. The identification numbers may be painted on boards and fastened to the temporary construction fence. The boards may be removed after each building has been identified with their individual permanent number address.
- 35. It shall be the responsibility of the job-supervisor to maintain the job site in a clean and orderly manner. Dirt and debris that has migrated to the street or neighboring properties shall be immediately cleaned.
- 36. During construction, out-houses, porta potties, or the like, shall not be visible from the public street and shall be maintained on a regular basis.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF FIRE - RESCUE (FIRE PREVENTION DIVISION):</u> (Contact: Richard Kallman 562.868-0511 x3710)

- 37. All buildings over 5,000 sq. ft. shall be protected by an approved automatic sprinkler system per Section 93.11 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code.
- 38. The applicant and/or developer shall comply with the requirements of Section 117.131 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code, Requirement for a Soil Gas Study, in accordance with Ordinance No. 955, prior to issuance of building permits.
- 39. When applicable, abandoned oil wells must be exposed and inspected under the oversight of a registered engineer or geologist. The wells must be monitored for methane leaks and the precise location of each abandoned well shall be surveyed. A report of findings along with a description of any recommended remedial actions needed to comply with the Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources, signed by a registered engineer or geologist, must be provided to the Fire Department.
- 40. A methane gas protection system designed in accordance with the standards established by the County of Los Angeles shall be required for all habitable structures. Plans for the proposed methane gas protection system shall be submitted to the Department of Fire-Rescue prior to construction. An alternative to the County of Los Angeles standards may be acceptable if approved by the Department of Fire-Rescue.
- 41. Interior gates or fences are not permitted across required Fire Department access roadways unless otherwise granted prior approval by the City Fire Department.

- 42. If on-site fire hydrants are required by the Fire Department, a minimum flow must be in accordance with Appendix B from the current Fire Code flowing from the most remote hydrant. In addition, on-site hydrants must have current testing, inspection and maintenance per California Title 19 and NFPA 25.
- 43. The standard aisle width for onsite emergency vehicle maneuvering shall be 26 feet with a minimum clear height of 13 feet 6 inches. Internal driveways shall have a turning radius of not less than 52 feet. The final location and design of this 26 feet shall be subject to the approval of the City's Fire Chief as established by the Uniform Fire Code. A request to provide emergency vehicle aisle width less than 26 feet shall be considered upon the installation/provision of mitigation improvements approved by the City's Fire Chief.
- 44. Prior to submitting plans to the Building Department, a preliminary site plan shall be approved by the Fire Department for required access roadways and on-site fire hydrant locations. The site plan shall be drawn at a scale between 20 to 40 feet per inch. Include on plan all entrance gates that will be installed.
- 45. Knox boxes are required on all new construction. All entry gates shall also be equipped with Knox boxes or Knox key switches for power-activated gates.
- 46. Signs and markings required by the Fire Department shall be installed along the required Fire Department access roadways.
- 47. The applicant and/or developer shall apply for a permit with the Department of Fire-Rescue and comply with the requirements of Section 117.127 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code, Criteria for Abandonment, prior to abandoning or re-abandoning any oil wells on-site.
- 48. A system for venting of abandoned oil wells over which there will be construction, in accordance with Section 117.130 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code, shall be required. Plans for the venting system shall be submitted to the Department of Fire-Rescue prior to construction.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF FIRE - RESCUE (ENVIRONMENTAL DIVISION):</u> (Contact: Tom Hall 562.868-0511 x3715)

- 49. <u>Permits and approvals</u>. The applicant and/or developer shall, at its own expense, secure or cause to be secured any and all permits or other approvals which may be required by the City and any other governmental agency prior to conducting environmental assessment or remediation on the property. Permits shall be secured prior to beginning work related to the permitted activity.
- 50. The applicant and/or developer shall submit plumbing plans to the Santa Fe Springs Department of Fire-Rescue Environmental Protection Division (EPD) and, if necessary, obtain an Industrial Wastewater Discharge Permit Application for generating, storing, treating or discharging any industrial wastewater to the sanitary sewer.

51. The applicant and/or developer shall provide a sampling plan to the Department of Fire-Rescue for active oil wells that will be abandoned prior to site development.

WASTE MANAGEMENT:

- 52. The developer shall comply with Section 50.51 of the Municipal Code which prohibits any business or residents from contracting any solid waste disposal company that does not hold a current permit from the City.
- 53. All projects over \$50,000 are subject to the requirements of Ordinance No. 914 to reuse or recycle 75% of the project waste. Contact the Environmental Consultant, Morgan McCarthy at (562) 432-3700 or (805) 815-2492.
- 54. The developer shall comply with Public Resource Code, Section 42900 et seq. (California Solid Waste Reuse and Recycling Access Act of 1991) as amended, which requires each development project to provide adequate storage area for the collection/storage and removal of recyclable and green waste materials.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT:

- 55. Approval of Development Plan Approval Case Numbers 930, 931, 932 and 933 is contingent upon approval of Tentative Parcel Map Case No. 78232.
- 56. The owner/developer shall comply with the City's "Heritage Artwork in Public Places Program" in conformance with City Ordinance No. 1054.
- 57. The owner/developer shall be responsible for reviewing and/or providing copies of the required conditions of approval to his/her architect, engineer, contractor, tenants, etc. Additionally, the conditions of approval contained herein shall be made part of the construction drawings for the proposed development. Construction drawings shall not be accepted for Plan Check without the conditions of approval incorporated into the construction drawings.
- 58. The owner/developer shall indicated on the first page of the construction drawings that the subject property is located within the methane zone. Said indication shall be clearly printed with a minimum 12 point font size.
- 59. The owner/developer shall apply for a Well Review Report (report) through the Department of Conservation, Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR). A copy of this report shall be provide to the Planning Department. If historic oil wells are identified on-site, well abandoned to current DOGGR standards may be required before a building permit can be issued.
- 60. The owner/developer shall apply for an Oilfield Site Plan Review through the Planning Department prior to issuance of a building permit.

- 61. To prevent the travel of combustible methane gas into any structure, all slab or foundation penetrations, including plumbing, communication and electrical penetrations, must be sealed with an appropriate material. In addition, underground electrical conduits penetrating the slab or foundation of the structure, shall comply with the National Electrical Code (NEC), replete with a seal-off device normally required for classified electrical installations, so as to prevent the travel of combustible methane gas into the structure through conduit runs. Refer to California Electrical Code, Chapter 5, Sections 500 and 501.
- 62. The owner/developer shall submit Mechanical plans that include a roof plan that shows the location of all roof mounted equipment. All roof-mounted mechanical equipment and/or duct work which projects above the roof or roof parapet of the proposed development and is visible from adjacent property or a public street shall be screened by an enclosure which is consistent with the architecture of the building and approved by the Director of Planning or designee.
 - a. To illustrate the visibility of equipment and/or duct work, the following shall be submitted along with the Mechanical Plans:
 - A roof plan showing the location of all roof-mounted equipment;
 - Elevations of all existing and proposed mechanical equipment; and
 - iii. A line-of-sight drawing or a building cross-section drawing which shows the roof-mounted equipment and its relation to the roof and parapet lines.

NOTE: line-of sight drawing and/or building cross section must be scaled.

- 63. The owner/developer shall submit a lighting program that is integrated into the overall site, landscape design and building design. Lighting shall be used to highlight prominent building features such as entries and other focal points. Up-lighting can also be used as a way to enhance the texture of plants and structures, to create a sense of height in a landscape design.
- 64. The owner/developer agrees and understands that any existing overhead utilities within the development shall be placed underground.
- 65. All fences, walls, gates and similar improvements for the proposed development shall be subject to the prior approval of the Fire Department and the Department of Planning and Development.
- 66. All approved outdoor trash enclosures shall be provided for the development subject to the approval of the Director of Planning or designee. The calculation to determine the required storage area shall be determine by the City Building Department.
- 67. All outdoor trash enclosures shall provide a solid roof cover.
- 68. All street-facing roof drains shall be provided along the interior walls and not along the exterior of the building.

- 69. The proposed development shall be constructed of quality material and any material shall be replaced when and if the material becomes deteriorated, warped, discolored or rusted.
- 70. Approved suite numbers/letters or address numbers shall be placed on the proposed building in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street fronting the property. Said numbers shall contrast with their background. The size recommendation shall be 12" minimum.
- 71. The owner/developer shall submit a mailbox plan (locations and sizes) for all parcels prior to the issuance of building permits. The plan shall be approved by the Santa Fe Springs Post Office. The owner/developer shall submit to the City a written confirmation from the Santa Fe Springs Post Office that the mailbox locations are approved. The City shall review and approve the location plan to ensure adequate site distance and traffic safety measures are incorporated.
- 72. The Department of Planning and Development requires that the double-check detector assembly be placed as far back from the property line as practical, screened by shrubs or other materials, and painted forest green. All shrubs shall be planted a minimum distance of two (2) feet surrounding the detector assembly; however, the area in front of the OS and Y valves shall not be screened. The screening shall also only be applicable to the double-check detector assembly and <a href="https://shall.not.include.the.given:shall.not.include.the.given:shall.not.
- 73. Owner/developer shall submit for approval a detailed landscape and automatic irrigation plan pursuant to the Landscaping Guidelines of the City. Said landscape plan shall indicate the location and type of all plant materials, existing and proposed, and shall include 2 to 3 foot high berms (as measured from the parking lot grade elevation), shrubs designed to fully screen the interior yard and parking areas from public view, and minimum 24" box trees along the street frontage. Said plans shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).

NOTE: Staff shall not approve the landscaping and irrigation plan without first reviewing and approving the civil drawings, specifically as it pertains to the landscaping and irrigation plan (i.e., location and size of riprap, bio-swales, areas of infiltration trenches, etc.)

74. The landscaped areas shall be provided with a suitable, fixed, permanent and automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants. This operating sprinkler system shall consist of an electrical time clock, control valves, and piped water lines terminating in an appropriate number of sprinklers to insure proper watering periods and to provide water for all plants within the landscaped area. Sprinklers used to satisfy the requirements of this section shall be spaced to assure complete coverage of all landscaped areas. Said plan shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).

- 75. Upon completion of the landscaping improvements, said landscaped areas shall be maintained in a neat, clean, orderly and healthful condition. This is meant to include proper pruning, mowing of lawns, weeding, removal of litter, fertilizing, and replacement of plants when necessary and the regular watering of all plantings.
- 76. The electrical plans, which show the location of electrical transformer(s), shall be subject to the approval of the Planning Department. Transformers shall not be located within the front yard setback area. The location of the transformer(s) shall be subject to the prior approval of the Director of Planning or designee. The electrical transformer shall be screened with shrubs consistent with Southern California Edison's Guidelines which requires three foot clearance on sides and back of the equipment, and eight foot clearance in front of the equipment. Additionally, the landscaping irrigation system shall be installed so that they do not spray on equipment. (A copy of the Guideline is available at the Planning Department.)
- 77. The applicant and/or developer shall not allow commercial vehicles, trucks and/or truck tractors to queue on Telegraph Road or Santa Fe Springs Road, use Telegraph Road or Santa Fe Springs Road as a staging area, or to back-up onto the street from the subject property.
- 78. All activities shall occur inside the buildings. No portion of the required off-street parking and driveway areas shall be used for outdoor storage of any type or for special-event activities, unless prior written approval is obtained from the Director of Planning, Director of Police Services and the Fire Marshall.
- 79. All parking stalls shall be legibly marked on the pavement. Additionally, all compact spaces shall be further identified by having the words "Compact" or comparable wording legibly written on the pavement, wheel stop or on a clearly visible sign.
- 80. The owner/developer shall provide a bulletin board, display case, or kiosk to display transportation information where the greatest number of employees are likely to see it. Information shall include, but is not limited to:
 - Current maps, routes and schedules for public transit routes serving the site; and
 - Telephone numbers for referrals on transportation information including numbers for the regional ridesharing agency and local transit operators; and
 - Ridesharing promotional material supplied by commuter-oriented organizations; and
 - 4. Bicycle route and facility information, including regional/local bicycle maps and bicycle safety information; and
 - 5. A listing of facilities available for carpoolers, vanpoolers, bicyclists, transit riders and pedestrians at the site. This is required to both meet the requirements of Section 155.502 (D) of the Zoning Regulations and also a goal identified within the City's General Plan Circulation Element.
- 81. Preferential parking spaces shall be reserved for potential carpool/vanpool vehicles without displacing handicapped and customer parking needs. Vanpool space(s) shall

be legibly marked on the pavement or identified by a sign and also conveyed to employees through the required transportation information board. The preferential carpool/vanpool parking shall be identified on the site plan at the time of plan check submittal. This is required to both meet the requirements of Section 155.502 (D) of the Zoning Regulations and also a goal identified within the City's General Plan Circulation Element.

- 82. An area shall be designate for bicycle parking and bicycle racks shall be provided. Bike racks shall be provided to accommodate bicycles at a ratio of 4 bicycles for first 50,000 square feet and 1 bicycle for each additional 50,000 square feet. This is required to both meet the requirements of Section 155.502 (D) of the Zoning Regulations and also a goal identified within the City's General Plan Circulation Element.
- 83. There shall be a safe and convenient zone in which carpool/vanpool vehicles may deliver or board their passengers. Additionally, there shall be sidewalks or other designated pathways following direct and safe routes from external pedestrian circulation system to each building in the development and safe and convenience access from the external circulation system to bicycle parking facilities on-site. This is required to both meet the requirements of Section 155.502 (D) of the Zoning Regulations and also a goal identified within the City's General Plan Circulation Element.
- Pursuant to the sign standards of the Zoning Regulations and related sign guidelines of the City of Santa Fe Springs, a comprehensive sign program for the development shall be prepared and submitted to the Director of Planning or designee for approval prior to obtaining a building permit for any signs related to the subject development. All signs throughout the subject site shall be installed in accordance with the approved comprehensive sign program for the subject development.
- 85. The Department of Planning and Development shall first review and approve all sign proposals for the development. The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on 11" x 17" maximum-size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Ordinance and the Sign Guidelines of the City.
- 86. Prior to issuance of building permits, the owner/developer shall comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the City of Santa Fe Springs:
 - Covenants.
 - Owner/developer shall provide a written covenant to the Planning Department that, except as owner/developer may have otherwise disclosed to the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, in writing, owner/developer has investigated the environmental condition of the property and does not know, or have reasonable cause to believe, that (a) any crude oil, hazardous substances or hazardous wastes, as defined in state and federal law, have been released, as that term is defined in 42 U.S.C. Section

- 9601 (22), on, under or about the Property, or that (b) any material has been discharged on, under or about the Property that could affect the quality of ground or surface water on the Property within the meaning of the California Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act, as amended, Water Code Section 13000, et seg
- 2. Owner/developer shall provide a written covenant to the City that, based on reasonable investigation and inquiry, to the best of owner/developer knowledge, it does not know or have reasonable cause to believe that it is in violation of any notification, remediation or other requirements of any federal, state or local agency having jurisdiction concerning the environmental conditions of the Property.
- b. Owner/developer understands and agrees that it is the responsibility of the owner/developer to investigate and remedy, pursuant to applicable federal, state and local law, any and all contamination on or under any land or structure affected by this approval and issuance of related building permits. The City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, by this approval and by issuing related building permits, in no way warrants that said land or structures are free from contamination or health hazards.
- c. Owner/developer understands and agrees that any representations, actions or approvals by the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not indicate any representation that regulatory permits, approvals or requirements of any other federal, state or local agency have been obtained or satisfied by the owner/developer and, therefore, the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not release or waive any obligations the owner/developer may have to obtain all necessary regulatory permits and comply with all other federal, state or other local agency regulatory requirements. Owner/developer, not the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees will be responsible for any and all penalties, liabilities, response costs and expenses arising from any failure of the owner/developer to comply with such regulatory requirements.
- 87. The owner/developer shall require and verify that all contractors and sub-contractors have successfully obtained a Business License with the City of Santa Fe Springs prior to beginning any work associated with the subject project. A late fee and penalty will be accessed to any contractor or sub-contractor that fails to obtain a Business License and a Building Permit final or Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued until all fees and penalties are paid in full. Please contact Cecilia Martinez, Business License Clerk, at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527 for additional information. A business license application can also be downloaded at www.santafesprings.org.
- 88. The Mitigation Monitoring Program, which was prepared for the proposed project and adopted by the Planning Commission upon completion of the Mitigated Negative Declaration, shall be made part of the conditions of approval for Development Plan Approval Case No. 930, 931, 932 and 933. The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program is listed as an attachment to the staff report.

- 89. The owner/developer shall implement a dust control program for air quality control. The program shall ensure that a water vehicle for dust control operations is kept readily available at all times during construction. The developer shall provide the City Engineer and Building Official with the name, telephone number and e-mail address of the person directly responsible for dust control and operation of the vehicle.
- 90. During construction, the following information shall be made available on a sign posted at the main entrance(s) to the site:
 - 1. Name of the development/project.
 - 2. Name of the development company.
 - Address or Address range for the subject site.
 - 4. 24-hour telephone number where someone can leave a message on a particular complaint (dust, noise, odor, etc.).
- 91. Prior to occupancy of the property/buildings, the owner/developer and/or his tenant(s), shall obtain a valid business license (AKA Business Operation Tax Certificate), and submit a Statement of Intended Use. Both forms, and other required accompanying forms, may be obtained at City Hall by contacting Cecilia Martinez at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527, or through the City's web site (www.santafesprings.org).
- 92. The development shall be built substantially in accordance with the plot plan, floor plan, and elevations submitted by the applicant and on file with the case. Any modification shall be subject to the review and approval of the Director of Planning or his/her designee.
- 93. The final site plan, floor plan and elevations of the proposed development and all other appurtenant improvements, textures and color schemes shall be subject to the final approval of the Director of Planning.
- 94. The owner/developer understands and agrees that if changes to the original plans (submitted and on file with the subject case) are required during construction, revised plans must be provided to the Planning Department for review and approval prior to the implementation of such changes. Please note that certain changes may also require approvals from other departments.
- 95. All other requirements of the City's Zoning Regulations, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with.
- 96. Unless otherwise specified in the action granting Development Plan Approval, said approval which has not been utilized within a period of 24 consecutive months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also the abandonment or nonuse of a development plan approval and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

- 97. The applicant and owner/developer agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the all entitlements and approvals issued by the City in connection with the Project and from any CEQA challenges relating to the environmental review and determination for the Project, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 98. This approval is not effective until the applicant has completed and signed the signature element appearing at the bottom of the last page of these conditions, and returned the original completed and signed document to the City, confirming the applicant's understanding of these conditions and its willingness to accept and comply with them.

establishment, operation and maintenance of 236 residential rental units at 9039 Pioneer Boulevard and 11031 Cultura Street.

On April 28, 1980, the Planning Commission approved a Reconsideration for Conditional Use Permit Case No. 109 to allow for the removal of certain carport for safety and security reason.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP 109-2)

Currently, the existing Conditional Use Permit allows for the establishment, operation and maintenance of 236 residential rental units. The applicant is requesting to amend the existing Conditional Use Permit to allow for the establishment, operation, and maintenance of a professional office and recreational use, in additional to the existing use.

As part of the amendment, the applicant is planning to construct a new 600 square feet building for the proposed new uses.

Site Plan

The proposed building will be located at the easterly portion of the subject property and set back a minimum of 80' from the Pioneer Blvd. The proposed structure will be complete screened from street view behind the existing apartment complexes.

Floor Plan

The proposed building will have an overall area of 600 sq. ft. with 260 sq. ft. of recreational area; 204 sq. ft. of office area; 72 sq. ft. of storage area; and 64 sq. ft. of bathroom area. Additionally, the proposed building will also include an 80 sq. ft. trellis attach to the north elevation.

Elevations

The proposed building will have a maximum height of 14'. The design of the building will consist architectural styles similar to the existing apartment complex.

<u>Parking</u>

The proposed recreational room will only be available to Pioneer Garden's residents, as a result, it will not increase parking demand.

Landscaping

All existing landscaping will remain and no additional area will be convert to landscaping.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject site has frontage on Pioneer Blvd. Pioneer Blvd. is designated as a major highway within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

Staff finds that the proposed amendment to Conditional Use Permit Case No. 109 meets the criteria for a Categorical Exemption pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Section 15303-Class 3 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures). Consequently, no further environmental documents are required for the proposed Conditional Use Permit. Additionally, the Project is not listed on the Hazardous Waste and Substance Site List (Cortese List) as set forth in Government Code Section 65962.5.

15303. New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures

Class 3 consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made in the exterior of the structure. The numbers of structures described in this section are the maximum allowable on any legal parcel. Examples of this exemption include, but are not limited to:

- (a) One single-family residence, or a second dwelling unit in a residential zone. In urbanized areas, up to three single-family residences may be constructed or converted under this exemption.
- (b) A duplex or similar multi-family residential structure, totaling no more than four dwelling units. In urbanized areas, this exemption applies to apartments, duplexes and similar structures designed for not more than six dwelling units.
- (c) A store, motel, office, restaurant or similar structure not involving the use of significant amounts of hazardous substances, and not exceeding 2500 square feet in floor area. In urbanized areas, the exemption also applies to up to four such commercial buildings not exceeding 10,000 square feet in floor area on sites zoned for such use if not involving the use of significant amounts of hazardous substances where all necessary public services and facilities are available and the surrounding area is not environmentally sensitive.

- (d) Water main, sewage, electrical, gas, and other utility extensions, including street improvements, of reasonable length to serve such construction.
- (e) Accessory (appurtenant) structures including garages, carports, patios, swimming pools, and fences.
- (f) An accessory steam sterilization unit for the treatment of medical waste at a facility occupied by a medical waste generator, provided that the unit is installed and operated in accordance with the Medical Waste Management Act (Section 117600, et seq., of the Health and Safety Code) and accepts no offsite waste.

STAFF REMARKS

Based on the findings set forth in the staff report and resolution, staff finds that the applicant's requests meet the criteria set forth in Section 155.716 of the City's Zoning Regulations, for the granting of an Amendment to an existing Conditional Use Permit, and California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements. Staff, therefore, recommends that the Planning Commission adopts Resolution 88-2018, which incorporates said findings as well as the condition of approval related the subject proposal (see Exhibit A of Resolution 88-2018).

AUTHORITY OF PLANNING COMMISSION:

Conditional Use Permit

The Planning Commission has the authority, subject to the procedures set forth in this subchapter, to grant a Conditional Use Permit whenever it finds that the granting of said permit is consistent with the requirements, intent and purpose of this chapter. The Commission may grant a Conditional Use Permit subject to such conditions as the Commission findings are warranted by the circumstances involved. All such conditions shall be binding upon the applicants, their successors and assigns; shall run with the land; shall limit and control the issuance and validity of certificates of occupancy; and shall restrict and limit the construction, location, use and maintenance of all land and structures within the development.

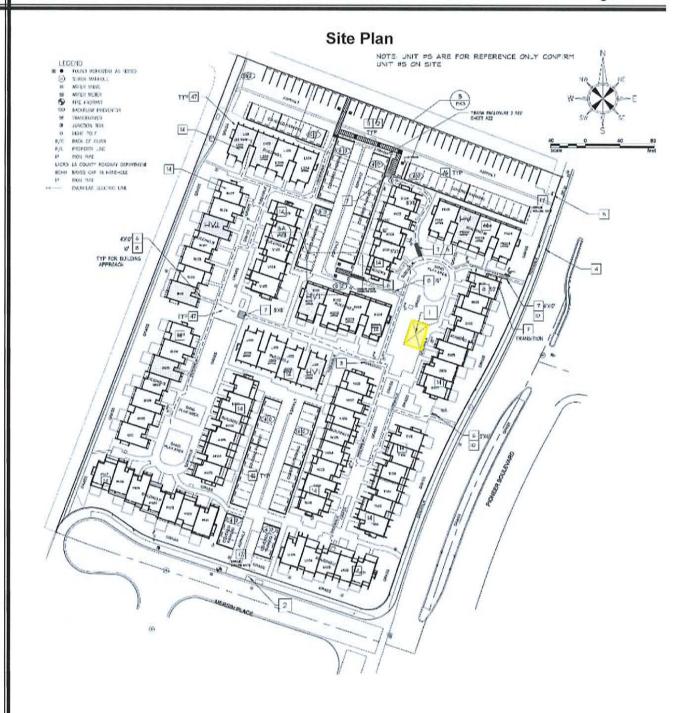

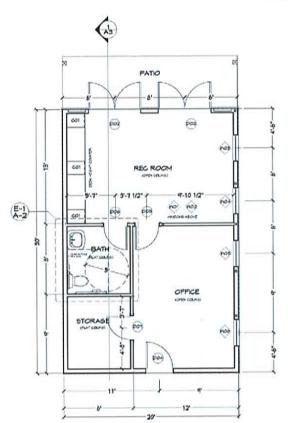




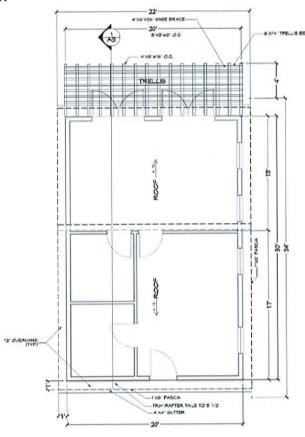

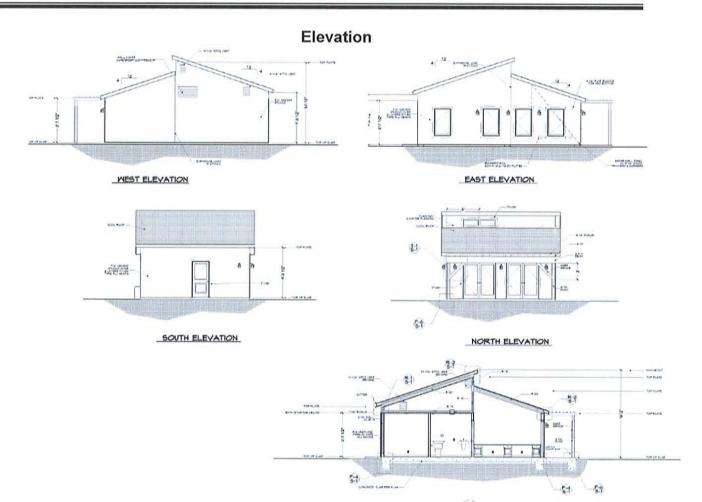
Floor Plan

 The residential buildings are being refurbished and the intent is to move the management office out of a single residential unit into a detached building within the courtyard between the existing residential buildings. The central access will directly serve the tenants now living within the complex, and provide guidance to prospective tenants through the managers office. The detached building is not visible from the street, but can be seen after access is granted through the existing security communications.
- 2. Explain why the proposed use will not be detrimental to persons and properties in the vicinity, nor to the welfare of the community in general.

 The residential complex consisting of the living units, parking carports and open air parking are surrounded by security fences and are self contained. The proposed central Community Building exists only to serve the needs of those living within the secured area. They have a separate secured property which matches the Subject Property, but the access and services are shared between the residential buildings.

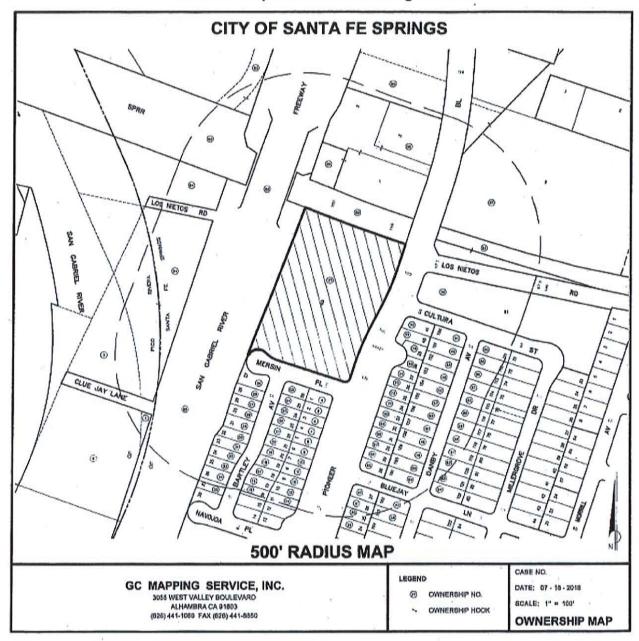

- 3. That a grading plan shall be submitted for drainage approval to the City Engineer. The applicant shall pay drainage review fees in conjunction with this submittal. A professional civil engineer registered in the State of California shall prepare the grading plan.
- 4. That the applicant shall comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program and shall require the general contractor to implement storm water/urban runoff pollution prevention controls and Best Management Practices (BMPs) on all construction sites in accordance with the current MS4 Permit. The applicant will also be required to submit a Certification for the project and will be required to prepare a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and Low Impact Development Plan (LID).

- 6. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 109-2 allow for the establishment, operation, and maintenance of office and recreational use within a 600 square feet building at 9039 Pioneer Boulevard.
- 7. All activities shall occur inside the building(s). No portion of the required off-street parking and driveway areas shall be used for outdoor storage of any type or for special-event activities, unless prior written approval is obtained from the Director of Planning, Director of Police Services and the Fire Marshall.

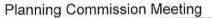
- 8. That there shall be no on-site kitchen facilities or preparation of food and drinks without prior approval from the Director of Planning or his/her designee.
- 9. That the applicant shall notify, in writing, of any change in ownership within 30 days. The conditions of approval shall be binding to any successors.

- 11. The Conditional Use Permit Case No. 109-2 shall be subject to a compliance review in one year, on or before September 10, 2019. Approximately three (3) months before September 10, 2019, the applicant shall request, in writing, an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval.
- 12. That the applicant, MRP Partner, agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officer or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject Conditional Use Permit, or any action or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 13. That if there is evidence that conditions of approval have not been fulfilled or the use has or have resulted in a substantial adverse effect on the health, and/or general welfare of users of adjacent or proximate property, or have a substantial adverse impact on public facilities or service, the Director of Planning may refer the use permit to the Planning Commission for review. If upon such review, the Commission finds that any of the results above have occurred, the Commission may modify or revoke the use permit.
- 14. That it is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.
- 15. That a masonry wall six feet (6') in height be constructed along the north boundary of Parcel #61; the exact location of the wall shall be determined by the Redevelopment Agency staff which shall take into consideration the need for ample space for the planting of the screening trees along Los Nietos Road. (Complete)
- 16. That a masonry wall six feet (6') in height be constructed along the east boundary of Parcel #61 in those areas where such a wall does not now exist, and along the

- south boundary of Parcel #61 east of Millergrove Drive (except that said wall shall not exceed the height limitations in the front yard setback area). (Complete)
- 17. That a wall or screening fence be installed along the easterly boundary of the easterly most parking area of Parcel #61 and that the parking area be provided with wheel stops to prevent contact of vehicles with said wall or fence. (Complete)
- 18. That the ends of the carports siding on Cultura Street shall be either partially or fully enclosed to provide screening and that a harmonious wall or fence extend along the ends of the two open parking bays siding on Cultura Street. (Complete)
- 19. That except for the high voltage line proposed for the north, west and south boundaries of the Project, no above ground utility lines shall be permitted either in the public right of way or on-site.
- 20. That the elevation of the units adjoining Pioneer Boulevard and Mersin Place be approximately at the same elevation as the street.
- 21. That provision be made for continuous access to the property west of the 605 Freeway from the northwest corner of Parcel #60; said access shall be provided in a manner satisfactory to the City Engineer and shall be open and clear at all time.
- 22. That the location and design of all signs visible from the street frontages shall be approved by the Director of Planning.
- 23. That it is strongly recommended that a minimum of two additional trash collection areas be provide on Parcel #60.
- 24. That the patio walls be not more than six feet (6') in height nor less than five feet (5') in height, with the final determination to be made by the Redevelopment Agency. The patio walls shall be of masonry or stucco except that the front may be of wood, provided that said wood is in architectural harmony with the buildings and maintained in good condition.
- 25. That the carports perpendicular to the access drive along the north boundary of Parcel #60 be moved south a distance of not less than then feet (twenty feet would be preferable), in order to increase visibility and ease of maneuvering. (Complete)
- 26. That a wall or screening fence be installed along the parking area at the northwest corner of Parcel #60 to separate it from the adjoining dwelling units and that the parking area be provided with wheel stops to prevent contact of vehicles with said wall or fence.
- 27. The dense planting be installed along the west boundary of Parcel #60 to help screen freeway noise and that any additional steps financially feasible be taken to reduce the effect of freeway noise on the adjoining dwelling units. (Complete)

- 28. That the ends of the carports siding on Pioneer Boulevard and Mersin Place shall be either partially or fully enclosed to provide screening. (Complete)
- 29. That the access and water easements along the north boundary of Parcel #60 be revised to coincide with the driveway for the parking area. (Complete)
- 30. That a detailed landscaping plan, including plant list, be submitted and shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Planning. (Complete)
- 31. That the plot plan, floor plans, elevations, and landscaping plans be approved by, and subject to, requirements of the Redevelopment Agency. (Complete)
- 32. That the property be developed substantially in accordance with the approved plot plans, floor plans, elevations and landscaping plans.
- 33. That the buildings, grounds and landscaping be continuously maintained at a high standard.
- 34. That this Permit shall not be effective for any purpose until the applicant has filed with the City of Santa Fe Springs an affidavit stating that he is aware of and accepts all the conditions of this Permit. (Complete)
- 35. The remaining carports may be modified by removing the north and south end walls and interior partitions to improve visibility' such modifications shall be subject to approval of the Director of Planning and Development.
- 36. That the applicant take any and all measures available to prevent further violence, vandalism, damage or defaceing of the buildings and facilities within the subject property.
- 37. That any further damage which occurs shall be promptly repaired and any graffiti or other defacement shall be promptly removed.
- 38. That the remaining perimeter walls left by the removal of the carports shall be maintained at a continuous running height of between 2' to 3' and capped; all work shall be accomplished to a high quality of workmanship. (Complete)
- 39. That all parking facilities shall be resurfaced/upgraded as necessary to comply with the requirement of the Zoning Ordinance; parking stalls shall be restriped, concrete bumper guards reinstalled, and all post holes filled. (Complete)

That a revised landscape/sprinkler plan shall be submitted showing the additional landscaping proposed by the applicant to screen the parking area from the units; said landscaping/sprinkler system shall be installed accordance with said plans to be approved by the Director of Planning and Development. RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Planning Commission take the following actions:

- Open the Public Hearing and receive any comments from the public regarding Development Plan Approval Case No. 928 and Conditional Use Permit Case No. 796 and, thereafter, close the Public Hearing; and
- Find and determine that the proposed project will not be detrimental to persons or properties in the surrounding area or to the City in general, and will be in conformance with the overall purpose and objective of the Zoning Regulations and consistent with the goals, policies and program of the City's General Plan; and
- Find that the applicant's request meets the criteria set forth in §155.739 of the Zoning Regulations, for the granting of Development Plan Approval; and
- Find that the applicant's request meets the criteria set forth in §155.716 of the Zoning Regulations, for the granting of a Conditional Use Permit; and
- Approve and adopt the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration with Traffic Study which, based on the findings of the Initial Study, indicates that there is no substantial evidence that the proposed project will have a significant adverse effect on the environment; and
- Approve the proposed Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) for the proposed project; and
- Approve Development Plan Approval Case No. 928, subject to the conditions of approval as contained with Resolution No. 87-2018; and
- Adopt Resolution No. 87-2018, which incorporates the Planning Commission's findings and actions regarding this matter.

LOCATION / BACKGROUND

The subject property is comprised of one (1) parcel (APN: 8178-004-065) measuring ±18,500 square feet, and located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, approximately 525 feet south of Washington Boulevard. The property is zoned C-4-PD (Community Commercial – Planned Development) and is currently an undeveloped lot. Commercial uses are located to the north and east, while residential uses are located to the south and west of the property.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed project requires approval of the following entitlements:

<u>Development Plan Approval (DPA 928)</u> – A request for approval to allow the construction of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development, containing 4,054 sq. ft. of residential uses, 3,355 sq. ft. of retail uses, 1,529 sq. ft. of limited industrial uses, and 1,187 sq. ft. of office uses on an ±18,500 sq. ft. (±.43-acres) flag-shaped lot, located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, approximately 525' south of Washington Boulevard.

<u>Conditional Use Permit (CUP 796)</u> – A request for approval to allow the operation and maintenance of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development on an ±18,500 sq. ft. (±.43-acres) flag-shaped lot, located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, within the C-4-PD, Community Commercial – Planned Development, Zone.

DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL (DPA 928):

As stated previously, the applicant is requesting approval to allow the construction of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development, containing 4,054 sq. ft. of residential uses, 3,355 sq. ft. of retail uses, 1,529 sq. ft. of limited industrial uses, and 1,187 sq. ft. of office uses on an $\pm 18,500$ sq. ft. ($\pm .43$ -acres) flag-shaped lot, located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, approximately 525' south of Washington Boulevard.

Site Plan

The applicant is proposing to construct a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use building on the subject property. The subject property is an ±18,500 sq. ft. "L" shape lot that is currently undeveloped. It is surrounded by both various commercial and residential uses. The mixture of uses will include residential in the northern portion of the property, commercial and office in the center of the property, and a storage/freezer area in the eastern portion of the property. The proposed mixed-use building will be setback a minimum 20 feet from the property line along Norwalk Boulevard. Ingress and egress for the proposed development will be provided by a 26-foot wide driveway along Norwalk Boulevard.

Floor Plan

The floor plan indicates that the proposed mixed-use development will measure 10,125 square feet, with 4,054 square feet designated towards four (4) two-story residential units and garages, 1,187 square feet designated as first floor office area, 3,355 square feet designated as second floor retail area, 401 square feet designated as second floor storage area, and remaining 1,128 square feet designated as storage/freezer area.

Elevations

The architecture incorporates various details of Spanish influenced styles. Wood trellises and stone veneer creates texture, as well as, adds to a rich collection of materials. Other materials include decorative metal sconce lights, composition shingle roofing and stucco in an earth tone color palette. The proposed development will be two-stories, with a height of twenty-seven (27) feet.

Landscaping

The provided tabulation for required and provided landscaping show a minimum requirement of 2,346 sq. ft. with the applicant providing 2,668 sq. ft., thus, exceeding the minimum requirements.

Parking

The plans show the property will be provided with twenty-eight (28) parking spaces, thirteen (13) of which are standard stalls, seven (7) are located within a garage, six (6) are compact stalls, and two (2) are ADA compliant stalls. As proposed, the project is required to have twenty-seven (27) parking stalls. The proposed project, therefore, exceeds the minimum parking requirement as set forth in the City's Zoning Regulations.

Trash Enclosures

According to the site plan, two (2) 8'-9" x 10'-0" (87.50 square feet) trash bins will be located within a 6' high enclosure located south of the residential and west of the office/retail. The proposed trash enclosure is strategically placed behind the proposed building and thus will not be visible or accessible to the public.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP 796):

As part of their request, the applicant is requesting approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to allow the operation and maintenance of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development on an ±18,500 sq. ft. (±.43-acres) flag-shaped lot, located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, within the C-4-PD, Community Commercial – Planned Development, Zone.

According to Section 155.329(A) of the City's Zoning Regulations, a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) is required for the establishment of any use, structure, improvement, or change of any use in a Planned Development Zone.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject site is located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard, between Washington Boulevard and Boer Avenue. Norwalk Boulevard and Washington Boulevard are designated as a "Major" arterials and Boer Avenue is designated as a "Local" arterial, within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan.

ZONING AND LAND USE

The subject property is zoned C-4-PD (Community Commercial – Planned Development). The property has a General Plan Land Use designation of Commercial. The zoning, General Plan and land use of the surrounding properties are as follows:

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

The environmental analysis provided in the Initial Study indicates that the proposed project will not result in any significant adverse immitigable impacts on the environment therefore, the City caused to be prepared and proposed to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the proposed project. The MND reflects the independent judgment of the City of Santa Fe Springs, and the environmental consultant, Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning.

Phases in the Environmental Review Process:

The implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) entails three separate phases:

- 1. The first phase consists of preliminary review of a project to determine whether it is subject to CEQA
- If the project is subject to CEQA, the second phase involves the preparation of an Initial Study to determine whether the project may have a significant environment effect.
- 3. The third phase involves the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) if the project may have a significant environmental effect of a Negative Declaration or Mitigated Declaration if no significant effects will occur.

<u>Phase 1</u>: The first phase is to determine if the proposed project is subject to CEQA. CEQA applies to an activity that (a) involves the exercise of an agency's discretionary powers, (b) has the potential to result in a direct or reasonable foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, and (c) falls within the definition of a "project" as defined in CEQA Guidelines Section 15378. City Staff and Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning the proposal and determined that the project is subject to CEQA

Phase 2: The second phase involves the preparation of an Initial Study. An Initial Study is a preliminary analysis to determine whether an EIR or a Negative Declaration or Mitigated Negative Declaration is needed. If the Initial Study concludes that the proposed project may have a significant effect on the environment that cannot be mitigated, an EIR should be prepared. If no potentially significant impacts are identified, then a Negative Declaration can be prepared. If potentially significant impacts are identified that can be mitigated, then a Mitigated Negative Declaration can be prepared with mitigated measures conditioned as part of the project's approval to reduce potentially significant impacts to levels of insignificance. To facilitate the Commission's determination whether "effects" are potentially significant, the Commission should focus on scientific and factual data. Unfortunately, CEQA does not provide a definitive definition of what constitutes a "significant effect" as a substantial or potentially substantial adverse change in the physical environment. City Staff and Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning determined, through the preparation of the Initial Study, that there were no potentially significant environmental effect that could not be mitigated to a level of insignificance and, therefore, a Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared.

<u>Phase 3:</u> A Mitigated Negative Declaration is a written statement, briefly explaining why a proposed project will not have a significant environmental effect and includes a copy of the Initial Study justifying this finding. Included within the Initial Study are mitigation measures to avoid potentially significant effects. City Staff and Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning determined that, although, the proposed project could have a significant effect on the environment, revisions in the project have been made by or agreed to by the project applicant or mitigation measures are being implemented to reduce all potentially significant effects to levels of insignificance. As a result, a Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared for the project.

Draft MND Review:

The Draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the City of Santa Fe Springs and the environmental consultant, Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning, as to the potential environmental impacts of the proposed project on the environment. The Draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration was circulated for the required 20-day public

review and comments from May 30, 2018 to June 19, 2018. The Notice of Intent to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration was posted with the Los Angeles County Clerk. A copy of the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration was also mailed to surrounding cities for their review and comment.

When reviewing the Mitigated Negative Declaration/Initial Study, the focus of the review should be on the project's potential environmental effects. If persons believe that the project may have a significant effect, they should, (a) Identify the specific effect; (b) Explain why they believe the effect would occur, and; (c) Explain why they believe the effect would be significant.

Individuals who believe there are significant effects as outlined above, should also explain the basis for their comments and submit data or reference offering facts, reasonable assumptions based on facts or expert opinion supported by facts in support of the comments. Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, an effect shall not be considered significant in the absence of substantial evidence.

Potentially Affected Environmental Factors:

The draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration has identified several factors that may be potentially affected by the subject project which include: *Air Quality, Cultural Resources, Hydrology & Water Quality, and Tribal Cultural Resources.* These factors and their respective pertinent issues are discussed and analyzed within the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration. Mitigations, where necessary, were implemented to help ensure potential impacts are reduced to a less than significant level. A detailed analysis can be found in the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration and corresponding Mitigated Monitoring and Reporting Program.

Mitigation Monitoring:

The monitoring and reporting on the implementation of these measures, including the monitoring action, monitoring agency, and the period for implementation, are identified in the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (attachment #10).

Responses to Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration:

On Thursday, June 7, 2018, staff received an email from Beth Chow, Senior Planner for the City of Norwalk, stating that they reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the proposed project and had no comments to offer. No other comments have been received to date.

STAFF REMARKS

Based on the findings set forth in the attached Resolution (87-2018), Staff finds that the applicant's request meets the criteria set forth in § 155.739 and § 155.716 of the City's Zoning Regulations, for the granting of a Development Plan Approval and

Conditional Use Permit, respectively.

AUTHORITY OF PLANNING COMMISSION

Development Plan Approval

The Planning Commission has the authority, subject to the procedures set forth in the City's Zoning Regulations, to grant a Development Plan Approval when it has been found that said approval is consistent with the requirements, intent and purpose of the City's Zoning Regulations. The Commission may grant, conditionally grant or deny approval of a proposed development plan based on the evidence submitted and upon its own study and knowledge of the circumstances involved, or it may require submission of a revised development plan.

Conditional Use Permit

The Planning Commission may grant, conditionally grant or deny approval of a conditional use permit plan and/or modification request based on the evidence submitted and upon its own study and knowledge of the circumstances involved and subject to such conditions as the Commission deems are warranted by the circumstances involved. These conditions may include the dedication and development of streets adjoining the property and other improvements. All conditions of approval shall be: binding upon the applicants, their successors and assigns; shall run with the land; shall limit and control the issuance and validity of certificates of occupancy; and shall restrict and limit the construction, location, use and maintenance of all land and structures within the development.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Conditions of approval for DPA 928 and CUP 796 is attached to Resolution 87-2018 as Exhibit A.

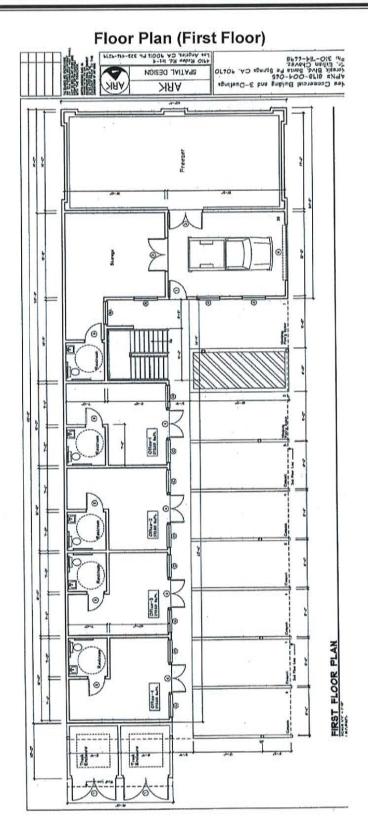

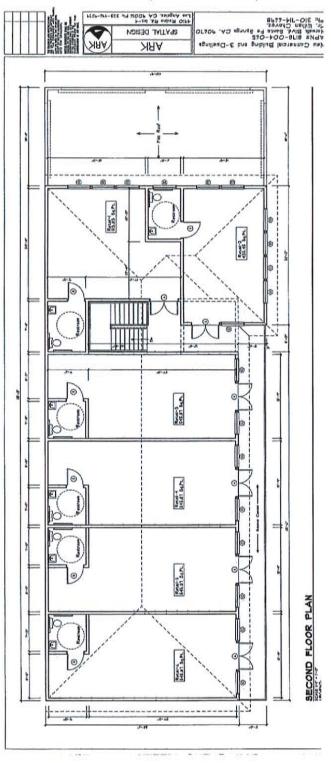

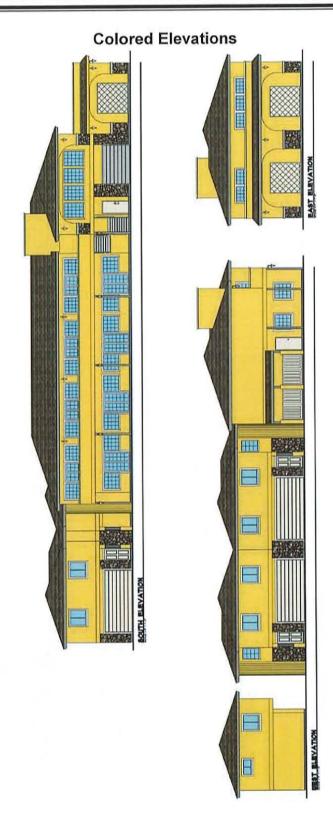

1. Overview of the Project

The attached Initial Study evaluates the environmental impacts associated with the construction and operation of a new mixed-use development within a 0.43-acre (18,736 square feet) site located near the southwestern corner of the Norwalk Boulevard and Washington Boulevard intersection, within the City of Santa Fe Springs. The mixed-use development, if approved, will contain 6,072 square feet of commercial uses and 4,054 square feet of residential uses. The commercial component of the mixed-use development will include a 1,128 square-foot warehouse with a freezer (which will be appurtenant to commercial uses), 401 square feet of storage uses, 1,188 square feet of office uses, and 3,355 square feet of retail uses. The residential component of the proposed project will consist of three units which will have a total floor area of 2,731 square feet. The proposed project will have a total of 28 parking spaces, including one enclosed garage parking stall for the storage and freezer area and six enclosed parking spaces for the residential units (two parking spaces per unit). Access to the proposed development will be provided by a single driveway located along Norwalk Boulevard. The proposed mixed-use development will reach a maximum height of 27 feet and 10 inches. Lastly, a total of 2,668 square feet will be dedicated for landscaping.

2. FINDINGS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The attached Initial Study prepared for the proposed project indicated that the proposed project will not result in significant environmental impacts upon implementation of the required mitigation measures. The following Mandatory Findings of Significance can be made as set forth in Section 15065 of the CEQA Guidelines, as amended, based on the results of this environmental assessment:

- The proposed project will not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment.
- The proposed project will not have the potential to achieve short-term goals to the disadvantage of long-term environmental goals.
- The proposed project will not have impacts that are individually limited, but cumulatively
 considerable, when considering planned or proposed development in the immediate vicinity.
- The proposed project will not have environmental effects that will adversely affect humans, either

4. MITIGATION MEASURES

The following mitigation is required as part of this project to ensure that potential air quality impacts are mitigated:

Mitigation Measure No. 1 (Air Quality). To ensure that odors from diesel equipment are kept to a minimum, the project contractors shall ensure that all diesel trucks and equipment are not left to idle for longer than five minutes.

In the event that intact paleontological resources are located within the project site, ground-disturbing activities such as grading and excavation have the potential for destroying a unique paleontological resource or site. Therefore, the following mitigation is required:

Mitigation Measure No. 2 (Cultural Resources). Prior to commencement of any grading activity on site, the Applicant shall retain a qualified paleontologist, subject to the review and approval of the City's Development Services Director, or designee. Although the project area has been subject to disturbance to accommodate the existing buildings, the project site is situated in an area of high archaeological significance. As a result, the following mitigation is required:

Mitigation Measure No. 7 (Tribal Cultural Resources). The project Applicant will be required to obtain the services of a qualified Native American Monitor(s) during construction-related ground disturbance activities. Ground disturbance is defined by the Tribal Representatives from the Gabrieleño Band of Mission Indians, Kizh Nation as activities that include, but are not limited to, pavement removal, potholing or auguring, boring, grading, excavation, and trenching, within the project area. The monitor(s) must be approved by the tribal representatives and will be present on-site during the construction phases that involve any ground-disturbing activities.

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning and Development Department on August 30, 2018 published a legal notice in the *Whitter Daily News*, a local paper of general circulation, indicating the date, time, and location of the public hearing, and also mailed said public hearing notice on August 30, 2018 to each property owner within a 500 foot radius of the project site in accordance with the City's Zoning Regulations and state law; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission has considered the application, the written and oral staff report, the General Plan and zoning of the subject property, the testimony, written comments, and other materials presented at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission conducted a duly noticed public hearing on September 10, 2018, at which time it received public testimony concerning Development Plan Approval Case No. 928 and Conditional Use Permit Case No. 796.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that the PLANNING COMMISSION of the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE and ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION

The project involves the construction, operation, and maintenance of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development. Said project, including the necessary entitlements, is considered to be a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and, as a result, the project is subject to the City's environmental review process. The environmental analysis provided in the Initial Study indicates that the proposed project will not result in any significant adverse immitigable impacts on the environment, therefore, the City has required the preparation of a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the proposed project. The MND reflects the independent judgment of the City of Santa Fe Springs, and the environmental consultant, Blodgett/Baylosis Environmental Planning.

The Initial Study determined that the proposed project is not expected to have any significant adverse environmental impacts. The following findings can be made regarding the Mandatory Findings of Significance set forth in Section 15065 of the CEQA Guidelines based on the results of this Initial Study:

- The proposed project will not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment.
- The proposed project *will not* have the potential to achieve short-term goals to the disadvantage of long-term environmental goals.
- The proposed project will not have impacts that are individually limited, but cumulatively considerable, when considering planned or proposed development in the immediate vicinity.
- The proposed project will not have environmental effects that will adversely affect humans, either directly or indirectly.

In addition, pursuant to Section 21081(a) of the Public Resources Code, findings must be adopted by the decision-maker coincidental to the approval of a Mitigated Negative Declaration, which relates to the Mitigation Monitoring Program. These findings shall be incorporated as part of the decision-maker's findings of fact, in response to AB-3180 and in compliance with the requirements of the Public Resources Code. In

accordance with the requirements of Section 21081(a) and 21081.6 of the Public Resources Code, the City of Santa Fe Springs has made the following additional findings:

- · A mitigation reporting or monitoring program will be required; and,
- Site plans and/or building plans, submitted for approval by the responsible monitoring agency, shall include the required standard conditions; and
- An accountable enforcement agency or monitoring agency shall be identified for the mitigation measures adopted as part of the decision-maker's final determination.

A number of mitigation measures have been recommended as a means to reduce or eliminate potential adverse environmental impacts to insignificant levels. AB-3180 requires that a monitoring and reporting program be adopted for the recommended mitigation measures.

SECTION II. DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 155.739 of the Zoning Regulations, in studying any application for Development Plan Approval, the Commission shall give consideration to the following:

A) That the proposed development is in conformance with the overall objectives if this chapter.

The proposed project will be located within the C-4-PD, Community Commercial, Zone. Pursuant to Section 155.150 of the City's Zoning Regulations, "The purpose of the C-4 Zone is to provide the proper areas for the development of sound commercial facilities to serve the community and to set up those standards of development necessary to insure that the commercial area will be wholesome, prosperous and harmonize with adjoining land uses." Although the project has the ability to deviate from the development standards in relation to the Planned Development Overlay, the proposed development will meet or exceed all property development standards within the C-4, Community Commercial, Zone.

B) That the architectural design of the proposed structures is such that it will enhance the general appearance of the area and be in harmony with the intent of this chapter.

The proposed development is currently undeveloped, not occupied by any use or structure and has remained undeveloped for over 35 years. The proposed development will be a significant improvement to the subject site. The proposed buildings have been designed with consideration to the placement of structures, height, materials, and color. The result is an attractive mixed-use project, not commonly seen within the Santa Fe Springs boundaries.

C) That the proposed structures be considered on the basis of their suitability for their intended purpose and on the appropriate use of materials and on the principles of proportion and harmony of the various elements of the buildings or structures.

Based on the proposed scale, consideration to the placement of buildings were made to ensure sufficient setbacks to the adjacent properties. Additionally, the design of the new buildings provide quality architectural design. These architectural design elements break up the mass of the building, and present an attractive and distinctive façade. Therefore, as designed, the proposed development is suitable for all of its intended users, and the distinctive design represents the architectural principles of proportion and harmony.

D) That consideration be given to landscaping, fencing, and other elements of the proposed development to ensure that the entire development is in harmony with the objectives of this chapter.

Extensive consideration has been given to numerous elements of the proposed project to achieve harmony with the City's Zoning Regulations. For instance, the entire frontage, along Norwalk Boulevard, will provide landscaping. Fencing will be provided in the rear of the property to separate the residential units from the remaining uses during off-business hours.

E) That it is not the intent of this subchapter to require any particular style or type of architecture other than that necessary to harmonize with the general area.

As stated previously, the proposed development is attractive. The architect used multiple variations in setback, materials and color. Although the style and architecture doesn't match the adjacent vicinity, this is largely due to the fact that the buildings to the north were built around the 1960's and the buildings to the south were built around the 1980's.

F) That it is not the intent of this subchapter to interfere with architectural design except to the extent necessary to achieve the overall objectives of this chapter.

The proposed mixed-use project will be constructed on a site that is currently underutilized. Upon review of the proposed plans for the mixed-use project, the Planning Commission finds that proper attention has been given to the placement, scale, and design of the proposed buildings. The Planning Commission, therefore, finds that the new mixed-use development will be an enhancement to the current site conditions.

SECTION III. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FINDINGS

Pursuant to section 155.329 of the Zoning Regulations, a Conditional Use Permit shall be required for any use, structure or improvement, or the change of any use in a Planned Development Zone. Additionally, the Commission should note that in accordance with Section 155.716 of the City's Zoning Regulations, before granting a Conditional Use Permit, the Commission shall give consideration to the following:

A) Satisfy itself that the proposed use will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity and will not adversely affect the city in general.

The subject site is surrounded by various residential and commercial uses, with residential uses directly to the west and south, and commercial uses directly to the east and north. Considerations regarding various design features, such as setbacks from the street and adjacent properties, fencing, and aesthetics have been made to ensure that minimal impacts occur to the surrounding properties. Therefore, the Planning Commission finds that the proposed development will not be detrimental to persons or property in the immediate vicinity.

B) Give due consideration to the appearance of any proposed structure and may require revised architectural treatment if deemed necessary to preserve the general appearance and welfare of the community.

The architect used multiple variations in materials and color. Although the style and architecture doesn't match the adjacent vicinity, the Spanish colonial architecture is relatively similar to the Spanish architecture of the Cefalia commercial center directly to the north. The proposed project will be a significant improvement to the existing site conditions and thus, will enhance the overall area.

SECTION IV. PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

The Planning Commission hereby adopts Resolution No. 87-2018 to approve a Development Plan Approval Case No. 928 to allow the construction of a new 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development, containing 4,054 sq. ft. of residential uses, 3,355 sq. ft. of retail uses, 1,529 sq. ft. of limited industrial uses, and 1,187 sq. ft. of office uses and Conditional Use Permit Case No. 796 to allow the operation and maintenance of said 10,125 sq. ft. mixed-use development on an ±18,500 sq. ft. (±.43-acres) flag-shaped lot located on the west side of Norwalk Boulevard approximately 525' south of Washington Blvd (APN: 8178-004-065), within the C-4-PD, Community Commercial — Planned Development, Zone, and approve and adopt the proposed Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration, and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (IS/MND/MMRP), subject to conditions attached hereto as Exhibit A.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

ENGINEERING / PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

(Contact: Robert Garcia 562.868-1511 x7545)

- 1. That the applicant shall pay a flat fee of \$ 7,488 to reconstruct/resurface the existing street frontage to centerline for Norwalk Boulevard.
- 2. That adequate "on-site" parking shall be provided per City requirements, and all streets abutting the development shall be posted "No Stopping Any Time." The City will install the offsite signs and the applicant shall pay \$ 400 to install (2) new signs.
- 3. That the applicant shall pay to the City \$ 15,000 for the entire cost of design, engineering, installation and inspection of (1) street light on Norwalk Boulevard. The City will design and cause construction of said street light.
- 4. That the Proposed driveway shall be located to clear existing fire hydrants, street lights, water meters, etc.
- Storm drains, catch basins, connector pipes, retention basin and appurtenances built for this project shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications in Norwalk Boulevard. Storm drain plans shall be approved by the City Engineer.
- 6. That sanitary sewers shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications to serve the subject development. The plans for the sanitary sewers shall be approved by the City Engineer. A sewer study (including a sewer flow test) shall be submitted along with the sanitary sewer plans.
- 7. All buildings shall be connected to the sanitary sewers.
- 8. That the fire sprinkler plans, which show the proposed double-check valve detector assembly location, shall have a stamp approval from the Planning Department and Local Water Purveyor prior to the Fire Department's review for approval. Assembly shall be performed in the presence of personnel from the City.
- 9. That the applicant shall obtain a Storm Drain Connection Permit for any connection to the storm drain system.
- 10. The applicant shall have an overall site utility master plan prepared by a Registered Civil Engineer showing proposed location of all public water mains, reclaimed

water mains, sanitary sewers and storm drains. This plan shall be approved by the City Engineer prior to the preparation of any construction plans for the aforementioned improvements.

- 11. The applicant shall submit a traffic study prepared by a Professional Engineer. The traffic study shall show the present traffic in the area and projected traffic after the development of the property. Any improvements or mitigation measures including installation of traffic signals and/or modifications, the installation of additional left turn lanes or deceleration lanes, the lengthening of left turn lanes or other median modifications, etc. that are warranted based on the study, the applicant and/or developer shall pay to the City the full cost of design engineering, installation and inspection of the improvements. The City will design and cause construction of the improvements.
- 12. That all point of access to the proposed development shall be reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. Left turns may be prohibited as designated by the City Engineer.
- 13. That the applicant shall comply with Congestion Management Program (CMP) requirements and provide mitigation of trips generated by the development. The applicant and/or developer will receive credit for the demolition of any buildings that formerly occupied the site. For new developments, the applicant and/or developer cannot meet the mitigation requirements, the applicant and/or developer shall pay a mitigation fee to be determined by the City Engineer for off-site transportation improvements.
- 14. That the applicant shall comply with all requirements of the County Sanitation District, make application for and pay the sewer maintenance fee.
- 15. That a grading plan shall be submitted for drainage approval to the City Engineer. The applicant shall pay drainage review fees in conjunction with this submittal. A professional civil engineer registered in the State of California shall prepare the grading plan.
- 16. That a hydrology study shall be submitted to the City Engineer. The study shall be prepared by a Professional Civil Engineer.
- 17. That upon completion of public improvements constructed by developers, the developer's civil engineer shall submit mylar record drawings and an electronic file (AutoCAD Version 2004 or higher) to the office of the City Engineer.
- 18. That the applicant shall comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program and shall require the general contractor to implement storm water/urban runoff pollution prevention controls and Best Management Practices (BMPs) on all construction sites in accordance with the current MS4 Permit. The applicant will also be required to submit a Certification for the project and will be required to prepare a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)

and Low Impact Development Plan (LID).

POLICE SERVICES DEPARTMENT:

- 19. That the applicant shall submit and obtain approval of a proposed lighting (photometric) plan for the property from the City's Department of Police Services. The photometric plan shall be designed to provide adequate lighting (minimum of 1 foot candle power) throughout the subject property. Further, all exterior lighting shall be designed/installed in such a manner that light and glare are not transmitted onto adjoining properties in such concentration/quantity as to create a hardship to adjoining property owners or a public nuisance. The photometric plans shall be submitted to the Director of Police Services no later than sixty (60) day from the date of approval by the Planning Commission.
- 20. That the applicant shall provide an emergency phone number and a contact person of the person or persons involved in the supervision of the construction to the Department of Police Services. The name, telephone number, fax number and email address of that person shall be provided to the Director of Police Services no later than 60 days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission. Emergency information shall allow emergency service to reach the applicant or their representative any time, 24 hours a day.
- 21. That in order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the applicant shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. The sign shall prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles and indicate that unauthorized vehicles will be removed at the owner's expense and also contain the California Vehicle Code that permits this action. The sign shall also contain the telephone number of the local law enforcement agency (Police Services Center (562) 409-1850). The lettering within the sign shall not be less than one inch in height. The applicant shall contact the Police Services Center for an inspection no later than 30 days after the project has been completed and prior to the occupancy permit being issued.
- 22. That the proposed buildings, including any lighting, fences, walls, cabinets, and poles shall be maintained in good repair, free from trash, debris, litter and graffiti and other forms of vandalism. Any damage from any cause shall be repaired within 72 hours of occurrence, weather permitting, to minimize occurrences of dangerous conditions or visual blight. Paint utilized in covering graffiti shall be a color that matches, as closely possible, the color of the existing and/or adjacent surfaces.
- 23. That during the construction phase of the proposed project, the contractor shall provide an identification number (i.e. address number) at each building and/or entry gate to direct emergency vehicles in case of an emergency. The identification numbers may be painted on boards and fastened to the temporary construction

- fence. The boards may be removed after each building has been identified with their individual permanent number address.
- 24. That it shall be the responsibility of the job-supervisor to maintain the job site in a clean and orderly manner. Dirt and debris that has migrated to the street or neighboring properties shall be immediately cleaned. Porta-potties, or equal, shall not be visible from the public street and maintained on a regular basis.
- 25. That tire stops shall be place at all parking stalls.
- 26. That any signage proposed by the prospective retail tenants shall be design so that the lighting of the signs shall not transmit glare or light to the adjoining residential properties.
- 27. That the prospective retail tenant shall not allow any audible noise to be heard by the adjoining residential properties at all times.
- 28. That the prospective retail tenants shall acknowledge before signing a lease that their respective location is not directly visible from the public street and, as a result, shall not use signage, advertisements or other display devices that are prohibited by the City's laws.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF FIRE - RESCUE (FIRE PREVENTION DIVISION)</u> (Contact: Richard Kallman 562.868-0511 x3710)

- 29. That all buildings over 5,000 sq. ft. shall be protected by an approved automatic sprinkler system per Section 93.11 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code.
- 30. That if on-site fire hydrants are required by the Fire Department, a minimum flow must be provided at 2,500 gpm with 1,500 gpm flowing from the most remote hydrant. In addition, on-site hydrants must have current testing, inspection and maintenance per California Title 19 and NFPA 25.
- 31. That the standard aisle width for onsite emergency vehicle maneuvering shall be 26 feet with a minimum clear height of 13 feet 6 inches. Internal driveways shall have a turning radius of not less than 52 feet. The final location and design of this 26 feet shall be subject to the approval of the City's Fire Chief as established by the Uniform Fire Code. A request to provide emergency vehicle aisle width less than 26 feet shall be considered upon the installation/provision of mitigation improvements approved by the City's Fire Chief.
- 32. That prior to submitting plans to the Building Department, a preliminary site plan shall be approved by the Fire Department for required access roadways and on-site fire hydrant locations. The site plan shall be drawn at a scale between 20 to 40 feet per inch. Include on plan all entrance gates that will be installed.

33. That Knox boxes are required on all new construction. All entry gates shall also be equipped with Knox boxes or Knox key switches for power-activated gates.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF FIRE - RESCUE (ENVIRONMENTAL DIVISION)</u> (Contact: Tom Hall 562.868-0511 x3715)

- 34. <u>Permits and approvals</u>. That the applicant shall, at its own expense, secure or cause to be secured any and all permits or other approvals which may be required by the City and any other governmental agency prior to conducting environmental assessment or remediation on the property. Permits shall be secured prior to beginning work related to the permitted activity.
- 35. That all abandoned pipelines, tanks and related facilities shall be removed unless approved by the City Engineer and Fire Chief. Appropriate permits for such work shall be secured before abandonment work begins.
- 36. That the applicant shall comply with all Federal, State and local requirements and regulations included, but not limited to, the Santa Fe Springs City Municipal Code, California Fire Code, Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) programs, the Air Quality Management District's Rules and Regulations and all other applicable codes and regulations.
- 37. That the applicant shall submit plumbing plans to the Santa Fe Springs Department of Fire-Rescue Environmental Protection Division (EPD) and, if necessary, obtain an Industrial Wastewater Discharge Permit Application for generating, storing, treating or discharging any industrial wastewater to the sanitary sewer.

WASTE MANAGEMENT:

- 38. The applicant shall comply with Section 50.51 of the Municipal Code which prohibits any business or residents from contracting any solid waste disposal company that does not hold a current permit from the City.
- 39. All projects over \$50,000 are subject to the requirements of Ordinance No. 914 to reuse or recycle 75% of the project waste. Contact the Environmental Consultant, Morgan McCarthy at (562) 432-3700 or (805) 815-2492.
- 40. The applicant shall comply with Public Resource Code, Section 42900 et seq. (California Solid Waste Reuse and Recycling Access Act of 1991) as amended, which requires each development project to provide adequate storage area for the collection/storage and removal of recyclable and green waste materials.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT:

- 41. The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, which was prepared for the proposed project and adopted by the Planning Commission along with the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration, shall be made part of the conditions of approval for Development Plan Approval Case No.928. The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program is listed as an attachment to this staff report.
- 42. The applicant, William Chavez, shall implement a dust control program for air quality control. The program shall ensure that a water vehicle for dust control operations is kept readily available at all times during construction. The developer shall provide the City Engineer and Building Official with the name, telephone number and e-mail address of the person directly responsible for dust control and operation of the vehicle.
- 43. Secure fencing around the construction site with locking gates and appropriate lighting shall be installed during construction to prevent trespassing and theft.
- 44. During construction, the following information shall be made available on a sign posted at the main entrance(s) to the site:
 - a. Name of the development/project.
 - b. Name of the development company.
 - c. Address or Address range for the subject site.
 - d. 24-hour telephone number where someone can leave a message on a particular complaint (dust, noise, odor, etc.)
- 45. Provisions shall be made for appropriate television systems and for communication systems, including, but not limited to, telephone and internet services. Appropriate cable television systems, as used, means those franchised or licensed to serve the geographical area in which the subdivision is located.
- 46. All utilities and utilities installation, within the boundaries of the property, shall be underground.
- 47. The applicant shall submit for approval a detailed landscape and automatic irrigation plan pursuant to the Landscaping Guidelines of the City. Said landscape plan shall indicate the location and type of all plant materials to be used and 24" box trees along the street frontage. Said plans shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 48. The landscaped areas shall be provided with a suitable, fixed, permanent and automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants. This operating sprinkler system shall consist of an electrical time clock, control valves, and piped water lines terminating in an appropriate number of sprinklers to insure proper watering periods and to provide water for all plants within the landscaped area.

- Sprinklers used to satisfy the requirements of this section shall be spaced to assure complete coverage of all landscaped areas. Said plan shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 49. The applicant, William Chavez, shall submit a lighting plan that is integrated into the overall site, landscape design and building design. Lighting shall be used to highlight prominent building features such as entries and other focal points. Up-lighting can also be used as a way to enhance the texture of plants and structures, to create a sense of height in a landscape design.
- 50. All landscaped areas shall be maintained in a neat, clean, orderly and healthful condition. This is meant to include proper pruning, mowing of lawns, weeding, removal of litter, fertilizing, and replacement of plants when necessary and the regular watering of all plantings.
- 51. The applicant shall submit a mailbox plan (locations and sizes) to the Director of Planning or his/her designee for review and approval, <u>prior</u> to issuance of building permits. Said plan shall also be approved by the local Postmaster at the Santa Fe Springs post office. The owner/developer shall submit written confirmation to the City proving that the mailbox locations were approved by the Postmaster.
- 52. Any on-site traffic calming devices and location shall be reviewed and approved by the City prior to installation, including, but not limited to, speed bumps.
- 53. All parking areas shall be legibly marked off on the pavement, showing the required parking spaces. All compact and guest spaces shall be further identified by having the words "compact"/"guest" or comparable wording legibly written on the pavement, wheel stop or on a clearly visible sign.
- 54. A minimum of 27 parking stalls shall be provided and maintained at all times. Of the 27 parking stalls, a minimum of 6 parking stalls shall be covered.
- 55. The proposed sliding iron gate shall remain open and accessible during the entire operating hours for all businesses on the subject site.
- 56. All fences, walls, gates and similar improvements for the proposed development shall be subject to the <u>prior</u> approval of the Department of Fire-Rescue and the Department of Planning and Development or his/her designee.
- 57. The proposed buildings shall be constructed of quality material and any material shall be replaced when and if the material becomes deteriorated, warped, discolored or rusted.
- 58. Approved address numbers shall be placed on the proposed buildings in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street fronting the property. Said numbers shall contrast with their background. The size recommendation shall be

12" minimum.

- 59. The development shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the plot plan, floor plan, and elevations submitted by the owner and on file with the case.
- 60. The applicant understands if changes to the original plans (submitted and on file with the subject case) are required during construction, revised plans must be provided to the planning department for review and approval prior to the implementation of such changes. It should be noted that certain changes may also require approvals from other departments.
- 61. Final plot plan, floor plan and elevations of the proposed development and all other appurtenant improvements, textures and color schemes shall be subject to the final approval of the Director of Planning.
- 62. There shall be no roof-mounted mechanical equipment and/or duct work which projects above the roof or roof parapet of the proposed development and visible from a public street. Prior to the installation of a satellite dish antennae or similar devices, the applicant shall submit plans to the Planning Department for review and approval.
- 63. The electrical plans, which show the location of electrical transformer(s), shall be subject to the approval of the Planning Department. Transformers shall not be located within the front yard setback area. The location of the transformer(s) shall be subject to the <u>prior approval</u> of the Director of Planning and Development or designee. The electrical transformer shall be screened with shrubs consistent with Southern California Edison's Guidelines which requires three foot clearance on sides and back of the equipment, and eight foot clearance in front of the equipment. Additionally, the landscaping irrigation system shall be installed so that they do not spray on equipment. A copy of the Guideline is available at the Planning Department.
- 64. The applicant shall clarify on the construction drawings that all roof drains (facing the street), shall be provided along the <u>interior</u> walls and not along the exterior of the building.
- 65. The Planning Department shall first review and approve all sign proposals for the development. The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on a minimum 11" x 17" size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Ordinance and the Sign Guidelines of the City.
- 66. That pursuant to the sign standards of the Zoning Regulations and related sign guidelines of the City of Santa Fe Springs, a comprehensive sign program for the development shall be prepared and submitted to the Director of Planning (or designee) for approval prior to obtaining a building permit for any signs related to

the subject development. All signs throughout the subject site shall be installed in accordance with the approved comprehensive sign program for the subject development. The goal of the sign program shall include, but is not limited to, consistent signage for the commercial component and proper identification of the residential component.

- 67. Sufficient number of approved outdoor trash enclosures shall be provided for the development subject to the approval of the Director of Planning or designee. The calculation to determine the required storage area is: 1% of the first 20,000 sq. ft. of floor area + ½% of floor area exceeding 20,000 sq. ft., but not less than 4 ½ feet in width nor than 6 feet in height. (Calculations are subject to change).
- 68. Trash enclosures shall be designed to architecturally integrate with the overall design theme of the development. Trash enclosures should be planted with vines if located adjacent to or within a landscapes area to help screen the enclosure. Trellises or other covered structures are recommended to minimize the visual impact of trash bins from dwelling units.
- 69. The fire sprinkler plans, which show the proposed double-check valve detector assembly location, shall have an approval stamp from the Planning Department and Public Works Department prior to the Fire Department's review for approval. Disinfection, pressure and bacteriological testing on the line between the street and detector assembly shall be performed in the presence of personnel from the City Water Department. The valve on the water main line shall be operated only by the City and only upon the City's approval of the test results.
- 70. The Department of Planning and Development requires that the double-check detector assembly be placed as far back as practical, screened by shrubs or other materials, and painted forest green. All shrubs shall be planted a minimum distance of two (2) feet surrounding the detector assembly; however, the area in front of the OS and Y valves shall not be screened. The screening shall also only be applicable to the double-check detector assembly and shall not include the fire department connector (FDC). Notwithstanding, the Fire Marshall shall have discretionary authority to require the FDC to be located a minimum distance from the double-check detector assembly. There must be a minimum distance of two (2) feet between the lowest part of the ground and the bottom of the valve shut off wheel.
- 71. The applicant shall comply with the City's "Heritage Artwork in Public Places Program" in conformance with City Ordinance No. 1054.
- 72. Prior to issuance of building permits, the applicant shall comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the City of Santa Fe Springs:

a. Covenants.

1. Applicant shall provide a written covenant to the Planning Department that, except as may be revealed by the environmental remediation

described above and except as applicant may have otherwise disclosed to the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, in writing, applicant has investigated the environmental condition of the property and does not know, or have reasonable cause to believe, that (a) any crude oil, hazardous substances or hazardous wastes, as defined in state and federal law, have been released, as that term is defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 9601 (22), on, under or about the Property, or that (b) any material has been discharged on, under or about the Property that could affect the quality of ground or surface water on the Property within the meaning of the California Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act, as amended, Water Code Section 13000, et seq.

- 2. Applicant shall provide a written covenant to the City that, based on reasonable investigation and inquiry, to the best of owner/developer knowledge, it does not know or have reasonable cause to believe that it is in violation of any notification, remediation or other requirements of any federal, state or local agency having jurisdiction concerning the environmental conditions of the Property.
- b. Applicant understands and agrees that it is the responsibility of the applicant to investigate and remedy, pursuant to applicable federal, state and local law, any and all contamination on or under any land or structure affected by this approval and issuance of related building permits. The City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, by this approval and by issuing related building permits, in no way warrants that said land or structures are free from contamination or health hazards.
- c. Applicant understands and agrees that any representations, actions or approvals by the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not indicate any representation that regulatory permits, approvals or requirements of any other federal, state or local agency have been obtained or satisfied by the applicant and, therefore, the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not release or waive any obligations the applicant may have to obtain all necessary regulatory permits and comply with all other federal, state or other local agency regulatory requirements. Applicant, not the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees will be responsible for any and all penalties, liabilities, response costs and expenses arising from any failure of the applicant to comply with such regulatory requirements.
- 73. The applicant, William Chavez, shall be responsible for reviewing and/or providing copies of the required conditions of approval to his/her architect, engineer, contractor, tenants, etc. Additionally, the conditions of approval contained herein, shall be made part of the construction drawings for the proposed development. Construction drawings shall not be accepted for Plan Check without the conditions of approval incorporated into the construction drawings.

- 74. The applicant, William Chavez, shall require and verify that all contractors and subcontractors have successfully obtained a Business License with the City of Santa Fe Springs prior to beginning any work associated with the subject project. A late fee and penalty will be accessed to any contractor or sub-contractor that fails to obtain a Business License and a Building Permit final or Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued until all fees and penalties are paid in full. Please contact Cecilia Martinez, Business License Clerk, at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527 for additional information. A business license application can also be downloaded at www.santafesprings.org.
- 75. The applicant, William Chavez, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to all entitlements and approvals issued by the City in connection with the Project and from any CEQA challenges relating to the environmental review and determination for the Project, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 76. All other requirements of the City's Zoning Regulations, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with.
- 77. It is hereby declare to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.
- 78. Unless otherwise specified in the action granting a Development Plan Approval, said approval which has not been utilized within a period of 12 consecutive months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also, the abandonment or nonuse of a Development Plan Approval for a period of 12 consecutive months shall terminate said Development Plan Approval and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.
- 79. Unless otherwise specified in the action granting a Conditional Use Permit, said approval which has not been utilized within a period of 12 consecutive months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also, the abandonment or nonuse of a Conditional Use Permit for a period of 12 consecutive months shall terminate said Conditional Use Permit and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

A request for a Modification of Property Development Standards to not provide eight (8) required parking stalls related to the subject zinc foundry, at 12209 Slauson Avenue (APN: 8168-014-019), within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone. (Star Die Casting)

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Planning Commission take the following actions:

- Find that the proposed project, if conducted in strict compliance with the conditions of approval, will be harmonious with adjoining properties and surrounding uses in the area and will be in conformance with the overall purposes and objectives of the Zoning Regulations and consistent with the goals, policies and programs of the City's General Plan; and
- Find that the applicant's Modification Permit request meets the criteria set forth in Section 155.697 of the City's Zoning Regulation for the granting of a Temporary Modification; and
- Find and determine that pursuant to Section 15305, Class 5 (Minor Alterations to Land Use Limitations), of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), this project is, therefore, considered to be Categorically Exempt; and
- Approve Modification Permit Case No. 739-2, subject to the conditions of approval as contained within Resolution No. 89-2018; and
- Adopt Resolution No. 89-2018, which incorporates the Planning Commission's findings and actions regarding this matter.

LOCATION / BACKGROUND

The subject property is located on 12209 Slauson Avenue. (APN: 8168-014-019), in the M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) Zone. The property measures approximately 24,389 sq. ft. (0.56-acres) and was developed with a concrete tilt-up industrial building measuring a total of 12,801 sf. ft.

On March 3, 1983, the Planning Commission originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 364 and Modification Permit (MOD) Case No. 739 to allow the establishment, operation, and maintenance of a zinc foundry and related facilities for a die casting use at 12209 Slauson Avenue and to allow a portion of the required off-street parking spaces to be in compact spaces at 12209 Slauson Avenue.

On March 2, 1984, the Planning Commission approved an amendment of MOD 739 to further reduce the required off-street parking. Star Die Casting has seen continual

growth and operational changes since 1984. With that said, they are now seeking approval to utilize 8 parking spaces in the rear parking lot as a staging area. It should be noted that, if approved, said staging area will occur behind a 10' high fence with privacy slats.

DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

Details of Proposed Use

The applicant, Star Die Casting, is utilizing the subject site for the operation of a zinc foundry. The applicant is now seeking approval to reconsider their Modification Permit to further reduce their off-street parking. Star Die Casting is proposing to replace 8 required parking stalls with a staging area. According to the applicant there will be a total of 15 employees on-site, at the highest shift.

<u>Site Plan</u> – The 12,801 sq. ft. building will remain the same. The reduction of (8) eight parking stalls in the back of the building will be replaced a staging area. Within in the same back area, the placement of cooling towers, air compressors, and a canopy are currently in the process of being permitted. The equipment and the outdoor storage activities will be completely screened from view with the installation of two new 10 foot tall fences with privacy slats. All of the stage area will be conditioned not to exceed the height of the fence.

Floor Plan

The 12,801 sq. ft. building contains 1,900 sq. ft. of office space and 10,901 sq. ft. of warehouse.

Parking

In accordance with the City's Zoning Regulations, the building requires twenty-six (26) parking stalls. The MOD request, if approved, will require the property to maintain a total of eighteen (18) stalls: one (1) accessible parking stall, four (4) compact parking stalls, and thirteen (13) standard parking stalls.

It should be noted that, similar to other temporary parking MOD's, once Star Die Casting leaves the subject site the parking stalls must be restriped to reflect the alternative site plan submitted and on file with this MOD. Said alternative site plan calls out for, one (1) accessible parking stall, (4) four compact parking stalls, and (21) twenty-one standard parking stalls.

Alternate Site Plan

Because there is a possibility that the subject applicant may relocate in the future, staff must know that parking may be restriped in accordance with the City's Zoning Regulations. Therefore, in addition to the proposed site plan, an alternate site plan was required to show how the subject property may be restriped. To meet the

minimum parking requirements. Then if the applicant leaves, the parking stalls will be restriped to reflect the alternative parking plan submitted through this MOD, or otherwise, future tenants must convey to staff that continued reduction in parking is warranted.

ZONING REGULATION REQUIREMENTS

Parking Requirements

City of Santa Fe Springs – Zoning Regulations Section 155.481 – REQUIRED PARKING – INDUSTRIAL USES

Section 155.481 REQUIRED PARKING

- (D) Industrial Uses
 - (1) Industrial uses, including incidental office uses.
 - (a) 0 20,000: one parking space per 500 square feet.
 - (b) 20,001 100,000: one parking space per 750 square feet.
 - (c) 100,001 200,000: one parking space per 1,000 square feet.
 - (d) 200,001 and above: one parking space per 2,000 square feet.
 - (e) Truck parking shall be required as per § 155.487(F).
 - (2) Notwithstanding the above, multi-tenant industrial units or buildings shall provide one space for each 500 square feet of gross floor area for the first 40,000 square feet of gross building area. Additionally, incidental office area exceeding 15% of the gross building area shall require one parking space for each 300 square feet of floor area and one parking space shall be provided for each vehicle used in connection with the use.

STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

The subject site has frontage on Slauson Avenue. Slauson Avenue is designated as a "Major Arterial" within the Circulation Element of the City's General Plan.

ZONING AND LAND USE

The subject property is zoned M-2, (Heavy Manufacturing, Zone) with a General Plan land use designation of Industrial. The adjacent properties to the south, east and west are zoned M-2, (Heavy Manufacturing, Zone), and the adjacent property to the north is zoned M-1, (Light Manufacturing).

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

Upon review of the proposed project, staff finds the project is categorically exempt pursuant to Section 15305, Class 5 (Minor Alterations to Land Use Limitations) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), in that, it only involves minor exterior changes to existing parking stalls to an existing industrial building. No additional square footage is proposed and the anticipated use will remain unchanged. Additional environmental analysis is, therefore, not necessary to meet the requirements of CEQA. If the Planning Commission agrees, staff will file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk within 5 days from the date the Planning Commission approves the proposed project.

A total of 4 notices were mailed out to said property owners on Thursday, August 30, 2018. To date, staff has not received any correspondence from the adjacent property owners that received the notice.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

Based on the reasons and findings set forth within Resolution 89-2018 (see attached), staff finds that approval of Modification Permit (MOD) Case No. 739-2 will not be detrimental to the property of others or to the community as a whole. Staff, therefore, is recommending approval of the subject MOD request, subject to the conditions of approval as provided within Exhibit A of Resolution 89-2018.

Authority of Planning Commission

The Planning Commission has the authority, subject to the procedures set forth in the City's Zoning Regulations, to grant a modification from requirements of property development standards set forth in the City's Zoning Regulations when it is found that the strict and literal interpretation of such provisions would cause undue difficulties and unnecessary hardships inconsistent with the intent and general purpose of the City's Zoning Regulations. The Commission may grant, conditionally grant or deny a modification based on the evidence submitted and upon its own study and knowledge of the circumstances.

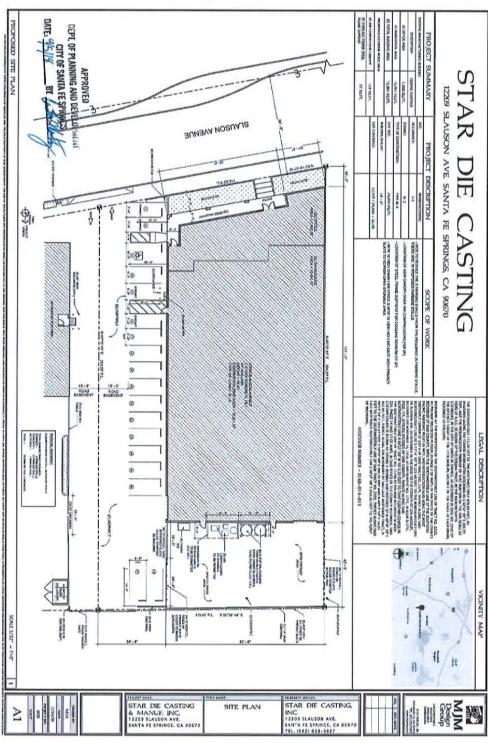

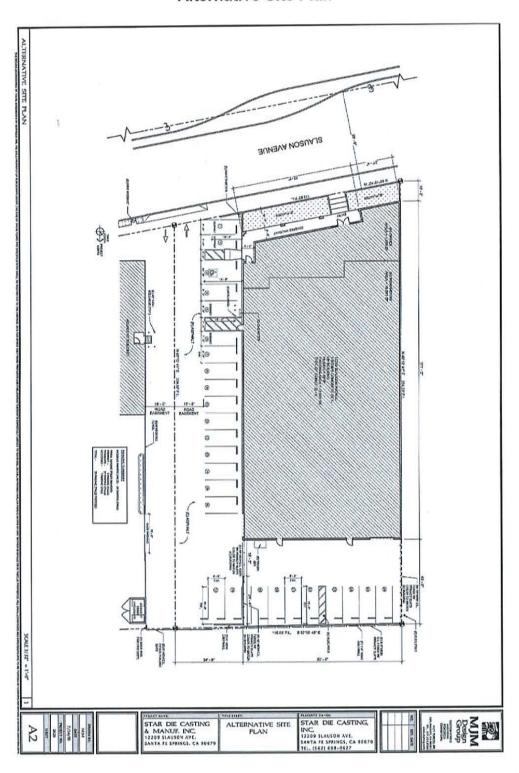

JUSTIFICATION STATEMENT

 Explain why the subject property cannot be used in a reasonable manner under the existing regulations.

Under our existing MOD, we are required to have 25 parking spaces. However, our existing parking and agreements with our neighbor's property we have secured a total of 21 parking spaces. We believe this is adequate as the maximum employee count at our busiest shift is 15 people making the 21 parking spaces more than adequate. We plan to use the area, which is currently designated for 5 parking spaces, as a staging area for our deliveries and shipments.

2. Explain the unusual or unique circumstances involved with the subject property which would cause hardship if compliance with the existing regulations is required.

The gated area behind the warehouse building can be much better utilized as a staging area for our shipments and our outgoing deliveries. This will help us run a more efficient and productive operation for our business. The inside our warehouse is occupied with many different machines. Using the proposed area for staging our deliveries and shipments will prevent inside the warehouse from being congested.

3. Explain how the approval of the requested modification would not grant special privileges which are not enjoyed by other property owners in the area.

This building is located with other surrounding industrial buildings. These businesses do not require additional parking as they typically require only enough parking spaces for their employees. It is rare for us to get walk-in customers, therefore, our 21 parking spaces will be more than enough to handle our busiest shift of 15 employees.

4. Describe how the requested modification would not be detrimental to other persons or properties in the area, nor to the public welfare in general.

Our day to day business operations occurs in three separate 8-hour shifts. Our busiest shift occurs between Monday-Friday between the hours of 7:30am – 4pm. The total amount of occupants during this time will be 15 occupants. This includes managers, supervisors, clerks and operators. We don't have an issues with outside walk-in business because our business occurs by email or by phone. Most of our business are from repeat customers so they don't have a need to come to our offices. Therefore, having 21 parking spaces for 15 people will be more than enough to not be disturbance or be detrimental to other persons or properties in the area nor to the public welfare.

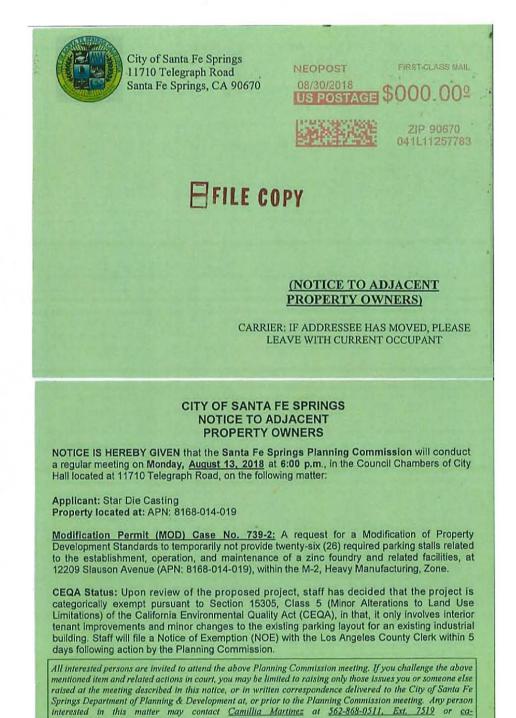

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS REGARDING MODIFICATION PERMIT CASE NO. 739-2.

WHEREAS, a request was filed for an Modification Permit Case No. 739-2 to allow the applicant to temporarily not provide eight (8) required parking stalls related to the subject zinc foundry on property located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone; and

WHEREAS, the subject property is located at 12209 Slauson Avenue, in the City of Santa Fe Springs, with an Accessor Parcel Number of 8168-014-019, as shown in the latest rolls of the County of Los Angeles Tax Assessor; and

WHEREAS, the property owner is Star Die Casting, Inc. – 12209 Slauson Avenue, Santa Fe Springs, CA 90670; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Modification Permit is considered a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Article 20, Section 15378(2); and

WHEREAS, based on the information received from the applicant and staff's assessment, it was found and determined that the proposed project qualifies for a categorical exemption pursuant to conditions described in Section 15305, Class 5 (Minor Alterations to Land Use Limitations) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); and

WHEREAS, on August 30, 2018, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning and Development Department mailed a notice to each property owner adjacent to the project site. To advise them of the Modification Permit request and of the date, time, and location of when this matter would be considered by the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission has considered the application, the written and oral staff report, the General Plan and zoning of the subject property, the testimony, written comments, or other materials presented at the Planning Commission Meeting on September 10, 2018 concerning Modification Permit Case No. 739-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that the PLANNING COMMISSION of the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE and ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION

Pursuant to Section 15305, Class 5 (Minor Alterations to Land Use Limitations), of

the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Planning Commission hereby finds and determines that the project is categorically exempt, in that, it only involves interior tenant improvements and minor changes to the existing parking layout for an existing industrial building. It, therefore, has been determined that additional environmental analysis is not necessary to meet the requirements of CEQA.

SECTION II. MODIFICATION PERMIT APPROVAL FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 155.697 of the City of Santa Fe Springs Zoning Regulations, the Planning Commission shall consider the following findings in their review and determination of the subject Modification Permit. Based on the available information, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission hereby make the following findings:

A) That there are hardships involved with immediate compliance with certain property development standards.

The subject parcel is currently developed with an industrial concrete tilt-up warehouse building. The current tenants' business, requires for a cooling tower and an air compressor to be placed outside the building where it would prevent the required backup space for a car. Therefore, Star Die Casting is seeking approval to not provide 8 of the 26 required parking stalls. Since the applicant only anticipates on having a maximum of 15 employees on the largest shift, a total of 26 automobile parking stalls would be unnecessary. Instead, the applicant would like to use the area for the electrical equipment and product staging. Star Die Casting will still provide and maintain a minimum of 18 parking stalls on-site which should be more than sufficient to accommodate the anticipated parking demands associated with their proposed operations.

B) That the modification, if granted, would not be detrimental to the public welfare or to the property of others in the area.

The day to day business operations occurs within three separate 8-hour shifts. The busiest shifts occurs between Monday-Friday between the hours of 7:30am – 4pm. The total amount of occupants during this time will be 15 occupants. This includes managers, supervisors, clerks and operators. They don't have an issue with customer parking because their business occurs by phone or email. Most of their business is from repeat customers so the clients don't have a need to come to their offices. Therefore, having 26 parking spaces for 15 people will be more than enough to not be a disturbance or be detrimental to other persons or properties in the area nor to the public welfare.

It should be noted that, similar to other Modification Permits granted for a temporary reduction in parking, should the applicant vacate the premises, they will need to restripe the parking area (as per the Alternative Site Plan submitted and on file with this case) to meet the City's Zoning Regulations.

SECTION III. PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

The Planning Commission hereby adopts Resolution No. 89-2018 to approve Modification Permit Case No. 739-2 to allow the applicant to temporarily not to provide eight (8) required parking stalls related to the subject building use at 12209 Slauson Avenue, subject to conditions attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Should Star Die Casting move, vacate, or otherwise abandon the premises, the subject staging area shall be removed and re-striped per the attached Alternative Site Plan submitted and on file with this case; Otherwise, all future tenants shall provide the planning staff with employment detail to review and determine if a continued reduction of 8 standard stalls is still warranted. All vehicles associated with the subject business shall continue to park on the subject site at all times. Off-site parking is not permitted and may result in the restriction or revocation of privileges granted under this Permit. In addition, any vehicles associated with the property shall not obstruct or impede any traffic.
- 4. The parking and access areas shall not be further reduced or encroached upon for any type of outdoor storage or similar uses at any time. No portion of the required access driveways, landscape areas, off-street parking and loading areas, shall be impacted or otherwise reduced at any time, without written approval by the Director of Planning and the City's Fire Department.
- 5. There shall be a maximum peak shift employee count of 15 recognized under this MOD approval for the tenant at 12209 Slauson Avenue. An employee count shall be provided by all future tenants to confirm compliance with the subject MOD prior to approval of a business operations tax certificate for the subject property. Additionally, the applicant shall provide annual updates on the staffing levels within 12209 Slauson Avenue to the Planning Department staff on or before September 10th of each calendar year. The applicant understands that the employee count shall not exceed 15 without prior approval by the Planning Commission.

- 6. In the event the need arises for the additional required off-street parking spaces as determined by the Director of Planning, the applicant shall work with the planning staff to come up with a solution to immediately mitigate the parking issues.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the Applicant to ensure that customer parking and employee parking be provided and maintained on the subject site at all times. Applicant and/or his employees shall not park on the public street or other properties at any time.
- 8. The owner shall not allow commercial vehicles, trucks and/or truck tractors to queue on Slauson Avenue, use street(s) as a staging area.
- That the applicant shall submit a \$75 check, made payable to "Los Angeles County Clerk", to the Planning Department to file a Notice of Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act within two (2) calendar days of Planning Commission approval.
- 10. That all other applicable requirements of the City's Zoning Regulation, Property Maintenance Ordinance, Los Angeles County Building Code, Fire Code and all other applicable regulations shall be complied with.
- 11. That the applicant, Star Die Casting, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject Modification Permit, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the owner/developer of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 12. That it is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

General Plan Conformity-GPC 2018-002: Consideration of a finding that the sale of a single-family dwelling at 9735 Bartley Avenue (APN: 8006-022-900) in the R-1, Single-Family Residential, Zone, conforms to the City of Santa Fe Springs General Plan, pursuant to Government Code Section 65402.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Find that the sale of the single-family dwelling at 9735 Bartley Avenue, conforms to the City of Santa Fe Springs General Plan; and

- Adopt Resolution No. 90-2018, which incorporates the Planning Commission's findings and actions regarding this matter, and recommend that the City Council concur with the findings of the Planning Commission.

BACKGROUND

The subject property, located at 9735 Bartley Avenue, is an 818 sq. ft., single-family dwelling, with two-bedrooms, a one-car garage, and an unenclosed patio. The Community Development Commission acquired the property, in an "As Is" condition, in May 2011, using funds from the Low and Moderate Income Housing Funds (LMIHF). The home was subsequently extensively rehabilitated, allowing it to be available for sale to an income-eligible low or moderate-income household under the City's Housing Acquisition and Rehabilitation Program (HARP) first-time homebuyer program.

An income-eligible homebuyer was selected to purchase the property in 2012, through the City's HARP Lottery. Said homebuyer, however, did not purchase the property. With the dissolution of redevelopment and the dissolution of the Community Development Commission in 2012, coupled with new regulations regarding how LMIHF could be used, the home remained unoccupied. The unoccupied home was extensively vandalized in March 2018.

A contractor was hired to make repairs and all repairs have been completed. The house is now available to be sold to an income-eligible household, selected through the City's HARP Lottery, held at City Hall within the Council Chambers on April 26, 2018.

However, before the house is sold, pursuant to Section 65402 of the Government Report Submitted By: Wayne M. Morrell, Director Date of Report: September 6, 2018 Planning Department ITEM NO. 10

Code, the Planning Commission must make a finding that the proposed sale of the house conforms to the provisions of the City's General Plan.

§5.7.100: CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65402 REQUIREMENT.

Pursuant to the requirement of California Government Code Section 65402, no real property shall be acquired by dedication or otherwise for street, square, park or other public purposes, and no real property shall be disposed of, no street shall be vacated or abandoned, and no public building or structure shall be constructed or authorized until the location, purpose and extent of such acquisition or disposition, such street vacation or abandonment, or such public building or structure have been submitted to and reported upon by the Planning Commission as to conformity with the City's adopted General Plan. The Planning Commission shall render its report as to conformity within forty (40) days after the matter is submitted to it, or such longer period of time as may be designated by the City Council.

WHEREAS, The subject property, located at 9735 Bartley Avenue, within the R-1, Single-Family Residential, Zone, was acquired by the Community Development Commission in an "As is" condition, in May 2011, using funds from the Low and Moderate Income Housing Funds (LMIHF); and

WHEREAS, the home was subsequently extensively rehabilitated, allowing it to be available for sale to an income-eligible low or moderate-income household under the City's Housing Acquisition and Rehabilitation Program (HARP) first-time homebuyer program.

WHEREAS, an income-eligible homebuyer was selected to purchase the property in 2012, through the City's HARP Lottery; however, said homeowner did not purchase the property and with the dissolution of redevelopment and the dissolution of the Community Development Commission in 2012, coupled with new regulations regarding how LMIHF could be used, the home remained unoccupied.

WHEREAS, the unoccupied home was extensively vandalized in March 2018, but has since been repaired and is now available to be sold to an income-eligible household, selected through the City's HARP Lottery, held at City Hall within the Council Chambers on April 26, 2018.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 65402 of the Government Code, before the house is sold, the Planning Commission must first make a finding that the proposed sale of the house conforms to the provisions of the City's General Plan.

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Springs Planning Commission, at a meeting on September 10, 2018, considered information provided by City staff and public testimony, regarding the proposed sale conforming to the City General Plan; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution, and its findings, are made based upon the evidence presented to the Planning Commission at its September 10, 2018, meeting including, without limitation, the staff report; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that the PLANNING COMMISSION of the CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE and ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION

The sale of the single-family dwelling at 9735 Bartley Avenue is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3)-Activities Covered by General Rule, in that the action constitutes a City administrative activity that will not result in significant changes to the environments; and

SECTION II. GENERAL PLAN CONFORMITY FINDINGS

The sale of the single-family dwelling at 9735 Bartley Avenue conforms to the City of Santa Fe Springs General Plan as follows:

Each and every one of the findings and determinations in this Resolution are based on the competent and substantial evidence, both oral and written, contained in the entire record relating to the project. The findings and determinations constitute the independent findings and determinations of the Planning Commission in all respects and are fully and completely supported by substantial evidence in the record as a whole.

SECTION VI. Limitations. The Planning Commissions' analysis and evaluation of the project is based on the best information currently available. It is inevitable that in evaluating a project that absolute and perfect knowledge of all possible aspects of the project will not exist. One of the major limitations on analysis of the project is the Planning Commissions' lack of knowledge of future events. In all instances, best efforts have been made to form accurate assumptions.

Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 31

Compliance review of Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 31 to allow the continued operation and maintenance of an internet-based alcoholic beverage sales activity, in conjunction with the wholesale distribution of distilled spirits, beer and wine at Fantis Foods California, Inc., located in the M-2-BP, Heavy Manufacturing-Buffer Parking, Zone at 13505 Marquardt Avenue within the Consolidated Redevelopment Project Area. (Fantis Foods California, Inc.)

RECOMMENDATION

That the Planning Commission, based on staff's compliance review report, find that the subject use is in compliance with all of the conditions of approval set forth in the initial approval of Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 31, and request that this matter be brought back before September 10, 2023, for another compliance review report. The Planning Commission shall note that this matter may be brought back to the Commission at any time should the applicant violate any conditions of approval or any City Codes, or should there be a need to modify, add, or remove a condition of approval.

BACKGROUND

Fantis is recognized for distributing premium quality Greek/Mediterranean products including dairy, olives, olive oils, and gourmet food to retail stores. In February 2001, Fantis Foods moved its food importing and distribution business to 13505 Marquardt Avenue. Initially Fantis Foods imported and distributed food only, but in March 2004, Fantis' management decided to venture into the sale of imported beer and wine..

In accordance with Section 155.628, Fantis Foods Inc. applied for and was granted Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit (ASCUP) Case No. 31 by the Planning Commission and the City Council at their respective meetings of March 8 and March 11, 2004, to allow the operation and maintenance of a warehouse distribution use for alcoholic beverage wholesale activity.

In addition to wholesale sales, Fantis has ventured into the internet for retail sales of food, wine and beer. Fantis has found that the internet has become a popular way of selling merchandise, including alcoholic beverages. Fantis maintains a Type 21 License (Off-Sale General) with the Alcohol Beverage Control Codes of California (ABC).

CALLS FOR SERVICE

As part of the review process, staff checked the calls for service and found that no calls were generated as a result of the alcohol beverage activities.

COMPLIANCE REVIEW REPORT

As part of the permit review process, Staff conducted a walk-through inspection of the subject site and found the premises in compliance with regulatory ordinances, conditions and codes. Furthermore, Staff has not received any complaints stemming from the use or from the sale of alcoholic beverages. Staff checked with (ABC) and found that the establishment is in full compliance with all of the ABC regulations and that there has not been any incident to require further investigation.

Based on Staff's findings, and the fact that the applicant has complied with all of the initial conditions of approval, Staff believes that changes to the conditions are not warranted at this time. Staff is recommending another compliance review of ASCUP Case No. 31 in five years, before September 10, 2023.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Based on the satisfactory compliance review, staff does not feel that any condition should be added or modified from the initial conditions of approval of this Permit. The only proposed modification occurs to Condition No. 13 pertaining to the next compliance review report (shown in bold font).

- 1. That the applicant shall be responsible for maintaining control of litter, debris, boxes, pallets and trash on the subject property.
- 2. That the required off-street parking areas shall not be encroached on, reduced or used for outdoor storage of trucks, equipment or any other related material.
- 3. That the applicant and/or his employees shall prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the subject property at all times.
- 4. That the alcoholic beverages shall <u>not</u> be sold to the general public from the subject site at any time.
- 5. That the alcoholic beverages shall be shipped to the applicant's customers by the applicant's commercial trucks and/or other licensed commercial transportation companies and not by passenger-type vehicles.
- 6. It shall be unlawful for any person who is intoxicated or under the influence of any drug to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the State Business and Professions Code.

- 7. It shall be unlawful to have upon the subject premises any alcoholic beverage other than the alcoholic beverages which the licensee is authorized to sell under the licensee's license, as set forth in Section 25607(a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 8. That the applicant shall at all times maintain in working order an alarm system that notifies the Whittier Police Department immediately if a breach occurs.
- 9. That the owner, corporate officers and managers shall cooperate fully with all City officials, and law enforcement personnel, and shall not obstruct or impede their entrance into the licensed premises while in the course of their official duties
- 10. That a copy of these conditions shall be posted and maintained with a copy of the City Business License and Fire Department Permits in a place conspicuous to all employees of the location.
- 11. That failure to comply with the foregoing conditions shall be cause for suspension and/or revocation of this Permit.
- 12. That in the event the owner(s) intend to sell, lease or sublease the subject business operation or transfer the subject Permit to another party or licensee, the Director of Police Services shall be notified in writing of said intention not less than (60) days prior to signing of the agreement, sale or sublease.
- 13. That ASCUP Case No. 31 shall be subject to a compliance review in five (5) years, no later than September 10, 2023, to ensure the premises is still operating in strict compliance with the original conditions of approval. At which time the applicant may request an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval.
- 14. That the applicant shall maintain digital cameras in good working order which will cover the exterior four sides of the building. The cameras shall be capable of recording the perimeter of the property and be able to record during the night and day.
- 15. That all other applicable requirements of the City Zoning Ordinance, Uniform Building Code, Uniform Fire Code, the determinations of the City and State Fire Marshall, and all other applicable regulations shall be strictly complied with.

16. It is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, the Permit shall be subject to the revocation process whereas, the permit shall become void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.

Compliance review report of Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 57 to allow an alcohol beverage sales use for on-site consumption in association with an existing family restaurant establishment doing business as El Chipotle Grill in the C-4-PD, Community Commercial-Planned Development, Zone at 10120 Carmenita Road. (Chipotle Grill)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Planning Commission, based on staff's compliance review report, find that the subject use is in compliance with all of the conditions of approval set forth in the initial approval of Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit Case No. 57, and request that this matter be brought back before September 10, 2023, for another compliance review report. The Planning Commission shall note that this matter may be brought back to the Commission at any time should the applicant violate any conditions of approval or any City Codes, or should there be a need to modify, add, or remove a condition of approval.

BACKGROUND

Chipotle Grill is one of the thirteen eating establishments (including coffee and juice cafés) operating out of the Santa Fe Springs Shopping Plaza (Plaza). The Plaza is located on the northeast corner of Telegraph Road and Carmenita Road. Chipotle Grill occupies approximately 1,200 sq ft of space on the westerly side of the Plaza; Chipotle Grill has been in operation since June 2012.

Chipotle Grill is known for its large burritos, assembly-line production, and use of natural ingredients. As part of its tasty menu, Chipotle Grill provides beer to its customers for on-site consumption. Chipotle Grill obtained a Type 41 License (On-Site Beer and Wine) with the Alcohol Beverage Control Codes of California (ABC).

In accordance with Section 155.628, Chipotle Grill applied for and was granted Alcohol Sales Conditional Use Permit (ASCUP) Case No. 57 by the Planning Commission and the City Council at their respective meetings of March 11 and March 14, 2013, to allow the operation and maintenance of an alcohol sales use for on-site consumption. This matter is before the Planning Commission because a compliance report is due.

Date of Report: August 27, 2018 ITEM NO. 11B

CALLS FOR SERVICE

As part of the review process, staff checked the calls for service and found that no calls were generated as a result of the alcohol beverage activities.

COMPLIANCE REVIEW REPORT

As part of the permit review process, staff conducted a walk-through of the premises to ensure compliance with the listed conditions of approval and other regulatory ordinances and codes. Staff also contacted ABC and found that they have not had any complaint calls regarding the subject use. Considering that other retail and restaurant uses within the Plaza, who also sell alcoholic beverages, Staff found that the combined alcohol activities do not pose a conflict considering that all of the establishments are also in compliance with their respective ABC regulations.

Based on staff's findings, and the fact that the applicant has complied with all of the conditions of approval, staff believes that changes to the conditions are not warranted at this time. Therefore, staff is recommending another compliance review of ASCUP Case No. 57 in five years and before September 10, 2023.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Based on the satisfactory compliance review, staff does not feel that any condition should be added or modified from the initial conditions of approval of this Permit. The only proposed modification occurs to Condition No. 22 pertaining to the next compliance review report (shown in bold font).

- 1. That the Applicant understands and accepts that this Permit is solely for the sale of alcoholic beverages in relationship with a bona-fide restaurant use and that this Permit shall become void and terminated if the restaurant use is terminated, closed, or modified to another type of use.
- 2. That it shall be the responsibility of the Applicant and/or his employees to monitor that outdoor consumption of alcoholic beverages is not conducted. Signs shall be placed in a conspicuous area to notify customers that consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.
- 3. That the sale of alcoholic beverages shall only be permitted during the normal business hours of the week, or as required by the Alcohol Beverage Code.
- 4. That the Type 47 Alcoholic Beverage License, allowing the on-site sale of alcoholic beverages in connection with a public eating place, shall be restricted to the sale for consumption of alcohol beverages on the subject site only; the use shall not sell alcoholic beverages for transport and/or for consumption off the subject premise.

- 5. That it shall be the responsibility of the ownership to ensure that all alcoholic beverages purchased on the subject site shall be consumed within the business establishment; all stored alcoholic beverages shall be kept in a locked and secured area that is not accessible to patrons.
- 6. That the applicant shall be responsible for maintaining control of their litter/trash on the subject property and any that may migrate onto adjacent properties as a result of the business. This may be controlled by installing trash receptacles within strategic areas.
- 7. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person who is intoxicated, or under the influence of any drug, to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises, as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the Business and Professions Code.
- 8. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not sell, furnish, or give any alcohol to any habitual drunkard or to any obviously intoxicated person, as set forth in Section 25602 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 9. That the applicant shall not have upon the subject premises any alcoholic beverage(s) other than the alcoholic beverage(s) which the licensee is authorized to sell under the licensee's license, as set forth in Section 25607 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 10. That the applicant and/or any of his employees shall not sell, furnish, or give any alcoholic beverage to any person under 21 years of age, as set forth in Section 25658 (a) of the State Business and Professions Code.
- 11. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not permit any person less than 18 years of age to sell alcoholic beverages.
- 12. That streamers, pennants, whirling devices or other similar objects that wave, float, fly, rotate or move in the breeze shall be prohibited. Banners may be displayed with prior approval and permits with approval by the Department of Planning.
- 13. That the façade windows shall be free of advertisements, marketing devices, beer logos, menus, signs, and/or any other displays. Upon approval by the Department of Planning.
- 14. That a copy of these conditions shall be posted and maintained with a copy of the City Business License, in a place conspicuous to all employees of the location.

- 15. That the applicant shall maintain digital video cameras and shall allow the Director of Police Services, Whittier Police Officers, and any of their representatives to view the security surveillance video footage immediately upon their request.
- 16. That the applicant and/or his employees shall not allow any person to loiter on the subject premises, shall report all such instances to the City's Police Services Center; and, shall post signs, as approved by the Department of Police Services, prohibiting loitering.
- 17. That security personnel, as well as the owner, corporate officers and managers, shall cooperate fully with all city officials, and law enforcement personnel, and, shall not obstruct or impede their entrance into the licensed premises while in the course of their official duties.
- 18. That in the event the applicant intends to sell, lease or sublease the subject business operation or transfer the subject Permit to another owner/applicant or licensee, the Director of Police Services shall be notified in writing of said intention within a reasonable time of the intent of signing an agreement to sell lease or sublease.
- 19. That, when requested by the Department of Police Services, an updated security plan shall be prepared and submitted to shall address methods to minimize risks to the public health, welfare, and safety. The Security Plan shall be submitted to the Department of Police Services within 60 days from the approval of this permit with the following information:
 - (A) A description of the storage and accessibility of alcoholic beverages on display, as well as surplus alcoholic beverages in storage;
 - (B) A description of crime prevention barriers in place at the subject premises, including, but not limited to: placement of signage, landscaping, ingress and egress controls, security systems, and site plan layouts;
 - (C) A description of how the applicant plans to educate employees on their responsibilities; actions required of them with respect to enforcement of laws dealing with the sale of alcohol to minors; and, the conditions of approval set forth herein;
 - (D) A business policy requiring employees to notify the Police Services Center of any potential violations of law or this Conditional Use Permit, occurring on the subject premises, and the procedures for such notifications.

- (E) The City's Director of Police Services may, at his discretion, require amendments to the Security Plan to assure the protection of the public's health, welfare, and safety.
- 20. That all other applicable requirements of the City Zoning Ordinance, Uniform Building Code, Uniform Fire Code, the determinations of the City and State Fire Marshall, the security plan and all other applicable regulations shall be strictly complied with.
- 21. It is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this permit is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute, or ordinance is violated, this Permit shall be subject to the revocation process at which time, the Permit may become terminated and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.
- 22. That this Permit shall be subject to a compliance review in five years, no later than August 10, 2023, to determine if the alcoholic beverage activity is still operating in strict compliance with the original conditions of approval. At which time the applicant may request an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval.

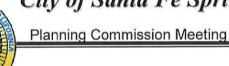

Conditional Use Permit Case No. 770-2

A request for a time extension of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 770: to allow the establishment, operation, and maintenance of an indoor banquet hall facility; on the subject property at 12215 Slauson Avenue (APN: 8168-014-025), in the M-1, Light Manufacturing, and the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zones. (Azar Event Center)

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Planning Commission take the following actions:

- Find and determine that granting a one (1) year time extension of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 770, will not be detrimental to persons or properties in the surrounding area or to the City in general, and will be in conformance with the overall purpose and objective of the Zoning Regulations and consistent with the goals, policies and program of the City's General Plan.
- Approve a one (1) year time extension of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 770 (until September 10, 2019), subject to the original conditions of approval as contained within this staff report.

BACKGROUND/ DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

The subject property is located between Chetle Avenue and Secura Way at 12215 Slauson Avenue (APN: 8168-014-025), in the M-1, Light Manufacturing, and the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zones. The property measures approximately 33,537 sq. ft. (1.02-acres) and is currently developed with an approximately 6,282 sq. ft. single-story building designed for a restaurant use. The applicant is proposing to make several improvements to the existing building and subject site, including an interior remodel, a new exterior façade treatment, and a 920 sq. ft. addition. The 920 sq. ft. addition will result in a total of 7,202 sq. ft. of building area. The applicant, Azar Event Center, purchased the property with the intent to utilize the subject site for a banquet hall facility. Specifically, the proposed use will accommodate full-service events for corporate meetings, school events, rehearsal dinners, weddings, and other similar affairs.

On March 14, 2016, the Planning Commission originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 770 to allow the applicant, Azar Event Center, to establish a banquet hall facility. In accordance with Section 155.721 of the City's Zoning Regulations (see Code Section on the following page), a conditional use permit, which has not been utilized within 12 months, shall become null and void. The Code, however, provides that an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

Section 155.721 - Expiration

Unless otherwise specified in the action granting a conditional use permit, said conditional use permit which has not been utilized within 12 months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also the abandonment or nonuse of a conditional use permit for a period of 12 consecutive months shall terminate said conditional use permit and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

On July 10, 2017, the Planning Commission approved a one (1) year time extension of CUP 770. Plan check related to various tenant improvements to the building, in preparation of the banquet hall use, has taken longer than anticipated; therefore, the applicant is now before you for another one year time extension.

Items that are still outstanding are as follows:

- 1. Complete installation of fire alarm system
- 2. Install proposed the water fountain
- 3. The 4" fire line service installation

ZONING CODE REQUIREMENT

The procedures set forth in Section 155.243 (K) of the Zoning Regulations, states that commercial and service type uses shall be allowed only after a valid conditional use permit has first been obtained.

Code Section:	Conditional Uses
155.243 (K)	Section 155.243 The following uses shall be permitted in the M-2 Zone only after a valid conditional use permit has first been issued:
	(K) Commercial and service type uses which the Commission, after study and deliberation, finds are needed to serve the M-2 District and which will not interfere with the orderly development of the industrial area and which will be compatible with industrial uses.

CONSIDERATIONS

The Commission should note that plans have been plan checked and the building permits are in the process of being issued by the City. Staff believes the applicant has diligently worked to keep this project moving forward. Staff is confident that the project will continue to move forward and all remaining items will be completed in the upcoming months. Staff, therefore, is recommending that the subject CUP be extended for an additional year, until August 13, 2019. At which time, staff will conduct a compliance review of the banquet hall use.

- 17. That the Applicant shall provide a uniformed and licensed security guard at all events which serve alcoholic beverages.
- 18. That event invitees shall not be permitted to bring in their own alcoholic beverages, or be allowed to consume alcoholic beverages within the parking lot or street.
- 19. That it shall be unlawful for any person who is intoxicated or under the influence of any drug, to enter, be at, or remain upon the licensed premises as set forth in Section 25602(a) of the Business and Professions Code.
- 20. That the preparation of food within the facility shall comply with the requirements set forth by the Los Angeles County Health Department. All food preparation and cooking shall be conducted indoors at all times.
- 21. That all events shall be private in nature. Open invite invents through flyers or the social networks is prohibited.
- 22. That the Applicant and/or his contracted users shall not charge a door fee or a voluntary contribution to enter an event on the premises.
- 23. That during closing time and 30 minutes after the establishment's closing time, the Applicant shall provide a security guard whose sole purpose is to patrol the parking lot, and around the premises, to maintain order therein, and to prevent any illicit or nuisance activity, including activity that could interfere with the quiet and calm of nearby residents or businesses.

- 26. That the applicant shall comply with Section 50.51 of the Municipal Code which prohibits any business or residents from contracting any solid waste disposal company that does not hold a current permit from the City.

- 28. That Conditional Use Permit No. 770 allows for an indoor banquet facility within a 7,202 sq. ft. building located at 12215 Slauson Avenue. Specifically, the use will offer accommodations for private events including birthday parties, corporate events, wedding receptions, and other social occasions. The public portion of the building shall not exceed 5,076 sq. ft., as shown on the submitted floor plan and on file with this case. Approval of Conditional Use Permit No. 770 is contingent upon approval of Modification Permit Case No. 1265.
- 29. That Modification Permit Case No. 1265 allows for a forty-two (42) parking stall reduction to the minimum parking requirements associated with the subject banquet facility use. Said parking reduction is specific to the subject indoor banquet facility use.
- 30. That the proposed indoor banquet facility use cannot be used for public assembly purposes until it has met the current requirements of the Los Angeles County Building Code and the Uniform Fire Code and an occupancy load has been determined by the Fire Department. The process requires plans to be submitted, reviewed, approved, permits to be obtained, and field inspected with a final approval granted by the City Fire Department and Building Department. The building shall not be occupied for such use until such time that this process has been completed.
- 31. That the maximum occupancy of the banquet facility shall not exceed 200 individuals, including guests, employees, security, and other personnel. If a lesser number is determined by either the Fire Department or Building Department, said number shall be enforced.

- 32. That the banquet facility shall only be available for use by private banquet events. A "private banquet event" shall mean a private party that is not open to or arranged for the general public to attend, nor arranged by a vendor for the general public, with food services as the primary use and alcohol service, dancing, and/or live entertainment being ancillary and subordinate uses. Promoters shall not be used to promote any event and cover charges shall not be established. Banquet contracts for private banquet events must be available on-site for presentation to law enforcement, Fire, or other City personnel upon request.
- 33. That live entertainment and/or dancing are allowed as ancillary uses, and under an approved Entertainment Conditional Use Permit, at any banquet event but shall not be the primary use at any time. Said dancing and live entertainment shall only occur inside the dining area shown on the proposed floor plan, out of the way of exits and paths of travel. The dance floor area shall consist of a removable interlocking dance floor to distinguish it as the dancing area. Live entertainment shall be limited to disc jockeys, karaoke, and live bands. No other form of live entertainment shall be permitted unless approved in writing by the Director of Planning.
- 34. That no fog machines, fireworks, pyrotechnics, open flames, or other similar devices shall be used on the premises.
- 35. That private, licensed security guards shall be provided at all banquet events offering alcoholic beverage service, music, or dancing. Such events include, but are not limited to corporate parties, wedding receptions, special events, and any other social gathering held at the facility. Security personal shall wear clothing/uniforms that is/are easily identifiable by law enforcement and City personnel.
- 36. That alcoholic beverages may only be served in accordance with the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) licensing requirements. No alcoholic beverages may be served or consumed outside of the facility. Employees who are responsible for alcohol sales or service shall complete the necessary ABC training and comply with all ABC rules and regulations. The applicant is also responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable state and federal laws and pertaining to the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages.

- 37. That a drink minimum shall not be established at any time or for any function. Additionally, staff and servers shall ensure that there are no sales or service of alcoholic beverages to obviously intoxicated persons.
- 38. That a strict identification policy shall be implemented to prevent consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors.
- 39. That the applicant shall comply with all applicable state and local laws and regulations pertaining to smoking and e-cigarettes.
- 40. That all activities related to the indoor banquet facility shall be conducted indoors at all times. No portion of the required off-street parking area shall be used for outdoor storage of any type or for special event activities, unless prior approval has been obtained by the Director of Planning, Director of Police Services, and the Fire Marshall or their designee(s).
- 41. That the exterior exit doors shall remain closed when not being used for ingress/egress purposes. Additionally, the applicant shall inform all staff members and guests not to loiter or make loud noises outside of the building before, during, or after events.
- 42. That noise emanating from the building shall not be audible beyond the area under control of the business or property owner, shall be within the limitations prescribed by the City's Noise Ordinance, and shall not create a nuisance to surrounding properties. In the event noise levels outside of the subject site are found to exceed permissible levels per Section 155.424 of the City's Zoning Regulations, the applicant shall work with planning staff to come up with a solution to immediately mitigate the noise issues.
- 43. That the applicant shall continually provide a seating/waiting area indoors to prevent and discourage customers from waiting outside.
- 44. That the days and hours of operation shall be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and Friday through Sunday from 10:00 am to 1:00 am. Any modification to the days and hours of operation shall be subject to prior review and approval by the Director of Planning.
- 45. That the applicant shall maintain the area surrounding the subject site in a clean and orderly manner at all times, free of debris, litter, and graffiti. The applicant shall be responsible for the removal of graffiti within 48 hours of its appearance and the removal of litter within 24 hours on the site and on

- adjacent rights-of-way. If surfaces are pressure-washed, debris must be trapped and collected to prevent entry into the storm drain system. No cleaning agents may be discharged to the storm drain.
- 46. That the indoor banquet facility shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the plot plan, floor plan, and operational narrative submitted by the applicant and on file with the case, date stamped February 22, 2016. Any modification shall be subject to the review by the Director of Planning to determine if administrative relief is available or if the conditional use permit must be amended.
- 47. That the applicant understands if changes to the original plans (submitted and on file with the subject case) are required during construction, revised plans must be provided to the planning department for review and approval prior to the implementation of such changes. Please note that certain changes may also require approvals from other departments and/or the Planning Commission.
- 48. That the applicant shall notify, in writing, of any change in ownership within 30 days. All conditions of approval shall be binding to any successors.
- 49. That the applicant shall submit for approval a detailed landscape and automatic irrigation plan pursuant to the Landscaping Guidelines of the City for the proposed landscape improvements. Said landscape plan shall indicate the location and type of all plant materials, existing and proposed, to be used. Said plans shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 50. That the landscaped areas shall be provided with a suitable, fixed, permanent and automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants. This operating sprinkler system shall consist of an electrical time clock, control valves, and piped water lines terminating in an appropriate number of sprinklers to insure proper watering periods and to provide water for all plants within the landscaped area. Sprinklers used to satisfy the requirements of this section shall be spaced to assure complete coverage of all landscaped areas. Said plan shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 51. That upon completion of the new landscaping and landscape upgrade, the required landscaped areas shall be maintained in a neat, clean, orderly and healthful condition. This is meant to include proper pruning, mowing of lawns,

- weeding, removal of litter, fertilizing, replacement of plants when necessary, and the regular watering of all plantings.
- 52. That all fences, walls, gates and similar improvements for the proposed development shall be subject to the *prior* approval of the Fire Department and the Department of Planning and Development.
- 53. That prior to occupancy of the tenant space, the applicant shall obtain a valid business license (AKA Business Operation Tax Certificate), and submit a Statement of Intended Use. Both forms, and other required accompanying forms, may be obtained at City Hall by contacting Cecilia Martinez at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527, or through the City's web site (www.santafesprings.org).
- 54. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 770 shall be subject to a compliance review in one year, on or before **September 10**, **2019** to ensure that the subject banquet facility use is still operating in strict compliance with the conditions of approval as stated within the staff report.
- 55. That the applicant understands and agrees that any future changes to the floor plan whereby the public portion of the subject building is increased beyond the approved 5,076 sq. ft., the subject Modification Permit would need to be approved and otherwise amended by the Planning Commission.
- 56. That the remaining 79 on-site parking stalls and driveway areas shall not be further reduced or encroached upon for any type of outdoor storage or similar uses at any time.
- 57. That the applicant shall be responsible for ensuring that parking occurs only in designated on-site parking stalls and on the two adjacent properties, within the parking stalls associated with the shared parking agreements the applicant has recently secured and executed. If parking issues or complaints arise due to the proposed use and it is found that the parking issues are disruptive to surrounding properties, the applicant shall work with planning staff to come up with a solution to immediately mitigate the parking issues. Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, modifying the hours of operation, reducing the maximum occupancy, reducing the floor area of the public portion of the building, exploring alternative parking options, or a combination thereof. Any disagreement between the applicant and staff on mitigation measures shall be presented to the Planning Commission for direction.

At that time, the applicant shall provide a copy of an extension of said parking agreement(s). - 59. That there shall be a maximum capacity of eleven (11) employees total at peak shift for the applicant or any future tenant. An employee roster shall be provided by all future tenants to confirm the employee count before Planning Department approval of any future business license applications relating to the subject property.
- 60. That the applicant shall submit a \$75 check, made payable to "Los Angeles County Clerk", to the Planning Department to file a Notice of Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act within two (2) calendar days of Planning Commission approval.
- 61. That the Department of Planning and Development shall first review and approve all sign proposals for the indoor recreational facility. The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on 11" x 17" size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Regulations and the Sign Guidelines of the City.
- 62. That all other requirements of the City's Zoning Regulations, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with.
- 63. That the applicant, Azar Event Center, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject Conditional Use Permit and Modification Permit, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding,

- the City shall promptly notify the applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 64. That if there is evidence that conditions of approval have not been fulfilled or the use has or have resulted in a substantial adverse effect on the health, and/or general welfare of users of adjacent or proximate property, or have a substantial adverse impact on public facilities or services, the Director of Planning may refer the use permit to the Planning Commission for review. If upon such review, the Commission finds that any of the results above have occurred, the Commission may modify or revoke the use permit.
- 65. That it is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and privileges granted hereunder shall lapse.
