A request to consider the revocation of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724, which granted approval to allow the establishment, operation and maintenance of an aluminum foundry located at 12711 Imperial Highway, within the M-2-BP, Heavy Manufacturing – Buffer Parking, Zone. (Pacific Cast Products)

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Find that the aluminum foundry facility, for which Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724 was granted, is being exercised contrary to the conditions of approval.
- Determine one (1) of the following actions:
 - a. Revoke and nullify Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724;
 - b. Revoke and nullify Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724, stay enforcement for a period of 60 days from the date of revocation;
 - c. Revoke and nullify Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724, stay enforcement for a period of ____ days from the date of revocation.
- Adopt Resolution No. 156-2020, which incorporates the Commission's findings and actions regarding this matter, should the Planning Commission decide to move forward with revoking the subject Conditional Use Permit.

BACKGROUND

At the August 12, 2019 Planning Commission meeting, the subject revocation was presented by staff for the commissioner's consideration. After opening the public hearing, the audience had an opportunity to express their concerns towards the subject revocation. At that time, the applicant, Peter Lake, explained to the commissioners his attempts at bringing the property into compliance and the financial challenges he faces with completing the remaining items. After closing the public hearing, each Commissioner had an opportunity to ask questions of staff and the applicant. Following said discussion between staff and the applicant, Commissioner Aranda made a motion to continue the item to the September 9, 2019 Planning Commission meeting and allow the applicant to work with staff on a detailed work schedule to clarify how he intends to bring the property into conformity.

ITEM NO. 6

Prior to the September 9, 2020 Planning Commission meeting, staff vetted the proposed work schedule (Attachment #4) to ensure realistic timing and procedure. To help reduce some of the financial burden, the applicant proposed to separate the two entitlements by processing a Lot Line Adjustment before the end of 2019 and submit a Development Plan Approval for the façade by March 2020. At their subsequent meeting of September 9, 2019, the Planning Commission reviewed the proposed work schedule and after deliberation, the Planning Commission continued the revocation matter to the March 9, 2020 meeting with the expectation of a six (6) month progress report to be presented.

On February 24, 2020, Mr. Lake provided staff with an update of his progress for the first time since the September 9, 2019 Planning Commission meeting. Mr. Lake mentioned that he was under the impression that his engineer had been communicating with staff to process the required Lot Line Adjustment (LLA). Staff can confirm that we have not had any contact regarding the LLA. In addition, Mr. Lake informed staff that the required façade treatment would not be financially beneficial for him and has decided to move from the subject property. Early discussions with a potential buyer have been made, but an agreement has not been finalized. Finally, Mr. Lake is requesting to remain in operation until the sale of the property up to a one (1) year period.

Based on a mutual decision between the City and the business owner, the process of revocation will be applied. However, the timing of how long the applicant will be allowed to remain will be made in the same motion by the Planning Commission. It has been approximately nine (9) years since the original approval in which the non-conforming structures were communicated to be re-cladded. The refusal of compliance has created a public nuisance through visual blight. Staff is recommending that the Planning Commission consider the facts of the case and select one of the three options recommended.

MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIREMENTS

City of Santa Fe Springs – Zoning Regulations Section 155.811 – GROUND FOR REVOCATION (B)

Any variance, modification, permit, or other approval may be revoked and nullified if it is found that any one of the following conditions apply:

As previously described herein, staff believes there is sufficient evidence to confirm that the above-mentioned condition exist and that there are adequate grounds to revoke the subject conditional use permit.

WHEREAS, the property owner is Dirtpad LLC, 12711 Imperial Highway, Santa Fe Springs, CA 90670-4711; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Revocation of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724 is considered a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Article 20, Section 15378(a); and

BACKGROUND

The Planning Commission, at their regularly scheduled meeting of July 11, 2011, originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 724 to allow the establishment, operation, and maintenance of an aluminum foundry with each furnace to exceed a capacity of 500 pounds and the combined capacity of furnaces to exceed 1,000 pounds. The subject property is located at 12711 Imperial Highway (APN's: 8026-042-014 & 017), within the M-2-BP, Heavy Manufacturing — Buffer Parking, Zone.

In 1993, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 822, requiring all non-conforming metal buildings and structures to be brought into conformity by means of demolishment or the application of a non-metallic façade treatment by the year 2013. Nevertheless, the Planning Commission should know that when it comes to addressing non-conforming metal buildings, the City understands the financial burden of bringing such buildings into compliance and thus have not been actively pursued compliance. Simply put, staff does not directly target or enforce immediate compliance. Instead, staff allows such buildings to remain non-conforming until improvements requiring a permit are proposed. Any improvements to a non-conforming metal building must not only

meet the requirements set forth in Ordinance No. 822 but all other city regulations.

Typically, a new CUP is approved with the requirement for a compliance review after one year. However, because the subject site contained two existing non-conforming metal buildings, the Planning Commission granted approval of the subject CUP, but provided the applicant with five years to allow sufficient time to meet all conditions of approval and bring said buildings into compliance with Ordinance No. 822.

Throughout the compliance review process, staff has tried to accommodate the applicant. On April 28, 2016, staff mailed the applicant a notice to inform him that the aforementioned CUP was subject to a review for compliance with the existing conditions of approval. Failing to respond to staff's initial notice, a second notice with sent to the applicant on June 30, 2016. A third and final notice was sent on December 12, 2016, via certified mail. On December 20, 2016, the applicant eventually provided staff with the required fee and materials needed to begin the compliance review process. After almost 8 months, staff received the necessary materials.

An initial walk-through inspection was conducted on January 12, 2017; however, due to poor weather conditions, staff had to schedule a follow-up visit. On February 14, 2017, staff conducted a second walk through inspection and provided the applicant with a written notice (Attachment #3) detailing the violations that were discovered during both inspection. Since then, the applicant has adequately addressed five (5) of the seven (7) violations that were identified. The two (2) remaining violations, which do have the largest financial impact to the applicant, include: 1) re-cladding of the existing metal buildings; and 2) consolidating the two (2) existing parcels into a single parcel.

Staff has continued to work with the applicant, Peter Lake, during the last twenty-nine (29) months by evaluating the progress and continually providing him with additional time to bring the subject use/property into full compliance. Until April of this year, staff had found previous actions by Mr. Lake to be a good-faith effort toward correcting the outstanding violations. Unfortunately, based on recent conversations and lack of effort by the applicant, staff now believes that Mr. Lake is no longer conveying that he has any intentions to satisfy the two remaining violations. Nevertheless, understanding the implications of a CUP revocation, staff met with Mr. Lake on April 12, 2019 to discuss the outstanding items. At the meeting, specific tasks and timelines where established to help ensure that continuous progress is made. It was concluded that the applicant would have 90-days to submit the materials required to move forward (Attachment #5). It was also agreed upon by both parties that, if at the end of those 90-days and the materials were not submitted, staff would move forward with the revocation of the subject CUP.

On July 10, 2019, Mr. Lake provided staff with a copy of a bid for a Tentative Parcel Map from one (1) engineering firm and a proposed idea for the façade. Mr. Lake Report Submitted By: Vince Velasco

proposed to grow vines up the building façade to cover the metallic material with vegetation, similar to an office building located along Katella Avenue within the City of Los Alamitos. It was explained to Mr. Lake that his proposal would not satisfy the requirements of the metal building ordinance as it would not be considered a contemporary building design.

It is evident by staff's actions to date, that it was never the intent to revoke the subject CUP or drive the subject business out of the city. Staff has patiently worked with the applicant for the last three years. In fact, staff has continued to provide the applicant with additional time as necessary, provided that progress toward full compliance was observed. Unfortunately, the lack of effort by the applicant during recent months has greatly diminished staff's confidence that full compliance will ever be met. At a minimum, staff's expectations after the 90-day period was for Mr. Lake to have signed an agreement to begin the process to merge the two parcels and to provide conceptual designs for the re-cladding; however, the applicant remains uncommitted to meeting the minimum requirements. After approximately 30 months, following the initial site inspection and multiple attempts to resolve the remaining items, the subject property continues to be in violation of the conditions without an adequate plan for resolution; and therefore, staff is requesting that the Planning Commission consider the revocation of CUP Case No. 724.

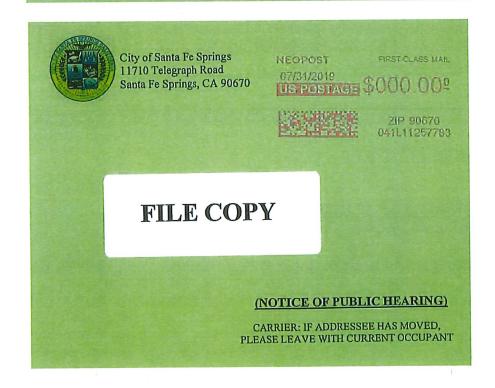

- 23. Final parcel map checking of \$4,757 plus \$285 per parcel shall be paid to the City. Applicant shall comply with Los Angeles County's Digital Subdivision Ordinance (DSO) and submit final maps to the City and County in digital format.
- 24. That the Applicant shall provide at no cost to the City, one mylar print of the recorded parcel map from the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, P.O. Box 1460, Alhambra, CA 91802-1460, Attention: Bill Slenniken (626) 458-5131.
- 25. A reciprocal access easement Agreement covering each parcel of the subject map shall be prepared, executed and recorded in the Office of the Los Angeles County

- Recorder. Such Agreement and any CC&R's shall be subject to the approval of the City Attorney.
- 26. That a grading plan shall be submitted for drainage approval to the City Engineer. The Applicant shall pay drainage review fees in conjunction with this submittal. A professional civil engineer registered in the State of California shall prepare the grading plan.
- 27. That a hydrology study shall be submitted to the City if requested by the City Engineer. The study shall be prepared by a Professional Civil Engineer.
- That the Applicant shall comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination 28. System (NPDES) program and shall require the general contractor to implement storm water/urban runoff pollution prevention controls and Best Management Practices (BMPs) on all construction sites in accordance with Chapter 52 of the City Code. The Applicant will also be required to submit a Certification for the project and is required to prepare a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). Projects over five acres in size will be required to file a Notice of Intent (NOI) with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB). The Applicant can obtain the current application packet by contacting the SWRCB, Division of Water Quality, at (916) 657-1977 or by downloading the forms from their website at http://www.swrcb.ca.gov/stormwtr/construction.html. The project shall also conform to Ordinance 915 regarding the requirements for the submittal of a Standard Urban Storm Water Mitigation Plan ("SUSMP"). The SUSMP includes a requirement to implement Post Construction BMPs to infiltrate the first 3/4" of runoff from all storm events and to control peak-flow discharges. Unless exempted by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board, a Covenant and Restriction ensuring the provisions of the approved SWPPP shall also be required.

- 29. That all projects over \$50,000 are subject to the requirements of Ordinance No. 914 to reuse or recycle 75% of the project waste. Contact the Recycling Coordinator, Teresa Cavallo at (562) 868-0511 x7309.
- 30. That the Applicant shall comply with the City's "Heritage Artwork in Public Places Program" in conformance with City Ordinance No. 909.
- 31. That the landscape area(s) shall be planted with new vigorous plants, flowers, and/or shrubs. That all trees shall be properly pruned which to increase the visibility of the subject site. Said Landscape improvements are to be performed fifteen (15) days from the date of issuance of a City of Santa Fe Springs Business License. All new planting shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).
- 32. That the landscaped areas shall be provided with a suitable, fixed, permanent and automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants. This operating

sprinkler system shall consist of an electrical time clock, control valves, and piped water lines terminating in an appropriate number of sprinklers to insure proper watering periods and to provide water for all plants within the landscaped area. Sprinklers used to satisfy the requirements of this section shall be spaced to assure complete coverage of all landscaped areas. Said plan shall be consistent with AB 1881 (Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance).

- 33. That upon completion of any new landscaping and landscape upgrades, the required landscaped areas shall be maintained in a neat, clean, orderly and healthful condition. This is meant to include proper pruning, mowing of lawns, weeding, removal of litter, fertilizing, and replacement of plants when necessary and the regular watering of all plantings.
- 34. That the damaged areas of the parking lot, including asphalt, concrete and swale (ribbon gutter) shall be repaired. The parking lot area shall then be slurry-sealed and striped within ninety (90) days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission.
- 35. That all activities shall occur inside the building(s). No portion of the required offstreet parking and driveway areas shall be used for outdoor storage of any type or for special-event activities, unless prior written approval is obtained from the Director of Planning and Development, Director of Police Services and the Fire Marshall.
- 36. That all vehicles associated with the business shall be parked on the subject site at all times. Off-site parking is not permitted and would result in the restriction or revocation of privileges granted under this Permit. In addition, any vehicles associated with the property shall not obstruct or impede any traffic.
- 37. That the Applicant shall stripe and maintain 42 parking off-site parking spaces including two (2) handicap stalls on the subject site. In accordance to the Building Code, each handicap stall shall contain the appropriate placard sign, pavement symbol, and van accessible 8' width loading area striped with the appropriate blue color. All compact parking shall be marked as "Compact" written legibly on the pavement, wheel stop, or a placard sign.
- 38. That all fences, walls, gates and similar improvements for the proposed use shall be subject to the <u>prior</u> approval of the Department of Fire-Rescue, Department of Police Services, and the Department of Planning and Development.
- 39. That the Department of Planning and Development shall first review and approve all sign proposals for the development. The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on 24" x 36" maximum-size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Ordinance and the Sign Guidelines of the City.

- 40. That a sufficient number of approved outdoor trash enclosures shall be provided for the development subject to the approval of the Director of Planning and Development or designee. The calculation to determine the required storage area is: 1% of the first 20,000 sq ft of floor area + .3% of floor area exceeding 20,000 sq ft, but not less that 4 ½ feet in width nor than 6 feet in height.
- 41. That within **90 days** from the date of approval by the Planning Commission, the Applicant shall construct a trash enclosure in compliance with existing Building Code requirements.
- 42. That the use shall comply with Section 155.420 of the City's Zoning Regulations regarding the generation of objectionable odors. If there is a violation of this aforementioned Section, the Applicant shall take whatever measures necessary to eliminate the objectionable odors from the operation in a timely manner.
- 43. That the Applicant shall not allow commercial vehicles, trucks and/or truck tractors to queue on Imperial Highway, use street as a staging area, or to backup onto the street from the subject property.
- That any damaged, dilapidated and/or deteriorated siding of the existing metal buildings shall be replaced with quality material when and if the material becomes deteriorated, warped, discolored or rusted. This also pertains to any metal re-clad material.
- That approved suite numbers/letters or address numbers shall be placed on the proposed building in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street fronting the property. Said numbers shall contrast with their background. The size recommendation shall be 12" minimum.
- 46. That any addition or alteration to the site, structural design and related improvements (ex. Metal buildings), shall require Reconsideration of this Conditional Use Permit or Development Approval by the Planning Commission. Plans and specifications are required to be submitted to the Planning Department and Building Division for review. The Applicant shall pay for all fees and cost related to the reconsideration of this permit.
- That the Applicant shall adhere to provisions set forth in the Zoning Regulations for the *Termination of Non Conforming Structures and Uses* and *Metal Buildings*. Therefore, the Applicant shall provide a plan(s) that shows each metal building to be demolished or to receive a non-metallic (re-clad) improvement. Improvements are to occur one year from the date of CUP approval by the Planning Commission (Ordinance 822; passed 3-11-93) and shall be entitled as a Development Plan Approval (DPA).
- 48. That the consolidation of both parcels, 8026-042-014 and 8026-042-017, shall be performed within one year from the date of CUP approval by the Planning

- Commission. The consolidation is to be recorded as a Parcel Map as required by Engineering/Public Works Department.
- 49. That the Applicant shall adhere to the Permitted Noise Levels in the M-2 Zone affirmed in the Zoning Regulations §155.424. Therefore, the use shall not exceed the absolute maximum of 90 decibel measured outside at any time.
- 50. That the Applicant shall maintain the storage area to <u>prevent</u> the harboring of rodents and deterioration of containers. Additionally, the storage area shall be located on the north side of the subject site, and shall not be visible from Imperial Highway. Any storage of hazardous materials inside containers shall be first approved by the Department of Fire-Rescue.
- 51. That if vehicles associated with shipping and receiving impact ongoing traffic on Imperial Highway, the Director of Planning and Development shall have the right to restrict the use of certain vehicles and hours of activity.
- 52. That the entry gate shall remain open at all times during standard business hours for access in/out of the subject site. Further, at no time shall the gate remain closed or locked when expecting the delivery of materials, including irregular work schedules.
- 53. That the installation of emergency generators shall require prior approval from the Department of Planning and Development and the Department of Fire-Rescue. Permit(s) are also required from the Building Division.
- 54. That if there is evidence that any of the conditions of approval have not been fulfilled or the use has or have resulted in a substantial adverse effect on the health, and/or general welfare of users of adjacent or proximate property, or have a substantial adverse impact on public facilities or services, the Director of Planning and Development may refer the use permit to the Planning Commission for review. If upon such review, the Commission finds that any of the results above have occurred, the Commission may modify or revoke the use permit.
- 55. That the Applicant shall be strictly liable for any and all sudden and accidental pollution and gradual pollution resulting from their use within the City, including cleanup, and injury or damage to persons or property. Additionally, operators shall be responsible for any sanctions, fines, or other monetary costs imposed as a result of the release of pollutants from their operations. "Pollutants" means any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, acids, alkalis, chemicals, electromagnetic waves and waste. "Waste" includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reclaimed.
- 56. That prior to issuance of any building permits, the applicant shall comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the City of Santa Fe Springs:
 - a. Covenants.
 - 1. Owner/developer shall provide a written covenant to the Planning Department that, except as may be revealed by the environmental remediation described above and except as applicant may have

otherwise disclosed to the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, in writing, applicant has investigated the environmental condition of the property and does not know, or have reasonable cause to believe, that (a) any crude oil, hazardous substances or hazardous wastes, as defined in state and federal law, have been released, as that term is defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 9601 (22), on, under or about the Property, or that (b) any material has been discharged on, under or about the Property that could affect the quality of ground or surface water on the Property within the meaning of the California Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act, as amended, Water Code Section 13000, et seq

- 2. Owner/developer shall provide a written covenant to the City that, based on reasonable investigation and inquiry, to the best of owner/developer knowledge, it does not know or have reasonable cause to believe that it is in violation of any notification, remediation or other requirements of any federal, state or local agency having jurisdiction concerning the environmental conditions of the Property.
- b. Owner/developer understands and agrees that it is the responsibility of the applicant to investigate and remedy, pursuant to applicable federal, state and local law, any and all contamination on or under any land or structure affected by this approval and issuance of related building permits. The City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, by this approval and by issuing related building permits, in no way warrants that said land or structures are free from contamination or health hazards.
- approvals by the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not indicate any representation that regulatory permits, approvals or requirements of any other federal, state or local agency have been obtained or satisfied by the applicant and, therefore, the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees do not release or waive any obligations the applicant may have to obtain all necessary regulatory permits and comply with all other federal, state or other local agency regulatory requirements. Applicant, not the City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees will be responsible for any and all penalties, liabilities, response costs and expenses arising from any failure of the applicant to comply with such regulatory requirements.
- 57. That prior to occupancy of the property/building, the Applicant, and/or his tenant(s), shall obtain a valid business license (AKA Business Operation Tax Certificate), and submit a Statement of Intended Use. Both forms, and other required accompanying forms, may be obtained at City Hall by contacting Cecilia Pasos at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527, or through the City's web site (www.santafesprings.org).
- 58. That the Applicant shall be responsible for reviewing and/or providing copies of the required conditions of approval to his/her architect, engineer, contractor, tenants,

etc. Additionally, the conditions of approval contained herein, shall be made part of the construction drawings for the proposed development. Construction drawings shall not be accepted for Plan Check without the conditions of approval incorporated into the construction drawings.

- 59. That the Applicant shall require and verify that all contractors and sub-contractors have successfully obtained a Business License with the City of Santa Fe Springs prior to beginning any work associated with the subject project. A late fee and penalty will be accessed to any contractor or sub-contractor that fails to obtain a Business License and a Building Permit final or Certificate of Occupancý will not be issued until all fees and penalties are paid in full. Please contact Cecilia Pasos, Business License Clerk, at (562) 868-0511, extension 7527 for additional information. A business license application can also be downloaded at www.santafesprings.org.
- 60. That the Applicant shall not sublet, lease or rent the proposed development without prior approval from the Director of Planning and Development.
- 61. That the site shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the plot plan, floor plan, and elevations submitted by the Applicant and on file with the case.
- 62. That the final plot plan, floor plan and elevations of the proposed use and all other appurtenant improvements, textures and color schemes shall be subject to the final approval of the Director of Planning and Development.
- 63. That all other requirements of the City's Zoning Regulations, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes shall be complied with.
- 64. That CUP Case No. 724 shall be granted for a period of five (5) years, until July 11, 2016. Approximately three (3) months before July 11, 2016, the Applicant shall request, in writing, an extension of the privileges granted herein, provided that the use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with these conditions of approval. - 67. That the Applicant, Peter Lake, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards concerning CUP Case Permit No. 724, when action is brought within the time period provided for in the City's Zoning Ordinance, Section 155.865. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the Applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof.
- 68. That it is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Approval is violated or held to be invalid, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, this Approval shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse; except that prior to any such action, the entitlements shall be heard before the Planning Commission for review. If upon such review, the Commission finds that any of the results above have occurred, the Commission may modify or revoke the entitlements.

Your attention is called to the fact that this approval is not effective until an affidavit has been signed and notarized to indicate your willingness to accept and abide by the conditions of approval. Two copies of an affidavit are enclosed for this purpose. One copy should be returned to this office upon completion; the other copy is for your files.

The Zoning Regulations set forth an appeal period of fourteen days, beginning with the date you receive this letter, during which any party aggrieved by the Commission's action can appeal the matter to the City Council. You are hereby notified that the time within which judicial review must be sought is governed by the provisions of California Code of Civil Procedure, Section 1094.6.

Hi Vince,

This is an update:

1. Provide proposed plans for metal building re-clad to the Planning Department (Conditions #46 & #47).

a. Hardie panel siding made of fiber cement is my current choice to upgrade the front exterior look of the building. I have requested samples of the paneling and I am working on drawings/sketches to present to you. I have one of their printed brochures to show you. I have the local Lowe's getting a sample of the actual material. Apparently, this will be a week or more to get.

2. Submit Tentative Parcel Map Application to the Planning Department (Condition #22).

a. Is http://www.santafesprings.org/civica/filebank/blobdload.asp?BlobID=4308 the form you need from me?

3. Install an automatically controlled method for watering and sprinkling of plants (Condition #32).

a. I have bought a new controller and I have located the piping runs. I will leave the three palm trees, but I am removing all of the cyprus trees on the south side of the building. This will result in reducing the watering zones for this area. There will also be some trees eliminated on the south side of the property. Once tree removal and pruning is complete, I will complete the irrigation system repair. Eight trees have been removed so far. Now comes pruning of the rest and I may use a contractor for most of them because they are tall.

4. Remove dead fronds on all palm trees and also remove any dead trees on site (Condition #33)

a. This was initially quoted out and the numbers averaged \$6,700.00 to do the work. These quotes did not necessarily accomplish all of what there is to do. Since I have staff that are available at times for random jobs, I've used my own staff to reduce the cost of this issue. We have trimmed the small palm on the west fence as you can see in the attached picture. Five of the cypress have been removed and we intend to remove all of the cypress. Given that we have to re-side the front of the building, these trees obstruct the access to the front wall. This area includes three palm trees, but those I may prune and keep, simply because they look good. The area were the cypress trees where located may become a picnic table area to address part of item 5 of this list. I will try to design this in to the front wall upgrade.

5. Remove all inoperable vehicles and picnic tables from the required off-street parking areas (Condition #35).

a. Inoperable yellow truck was sold and removed. Picnic tables have been removed from the parking areas.

6. Provide signs that prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles. (Condition #2)

a. I have acquired the necessary signs and will have them posted as soon as I add some lettering.

7. Maintain a 26' Fire access path on site at all times. (Condition #6)

a. Almost complete. I have hauled away a large amount of scrap to recycle, sold some items, and have trashed out many items. It is improving steadily.

I am concerned about the cost of all of this work. Spreading the items out over time is helpful to being able to fund this activity and will get it done. I will get the tall palms pruned in the last half of April.

The improvement to the front of the building will be \$30,000 or more. I should be able to make a proposal in about four weeks. I still need to determine the mounting for the panels and cost out all materials and labor.

I have two weeks of planned vacation coming up starting Sunday. While I will leave work for people to do on this matter, no significant progress will happen till I get back to work.

I just wanted to follow up our meeting this afternoon with a recap. It was determined that you will be provided with 90 days to present us with a conceptual design for the façade and a concrete path for the consolidation of parcels. If we do not see a great deal of effort for these items to be accomplished by July 12, 2019, we will proceed to send this to Police Services as a Code Enforcement case. Citations will be issued until these items are complete. After a series of citations, if there is still no effort made, we will take this item before the Planning Commission and request a revocation of the Conditional Use Permit.

As I explained in person, the revocation is never our goal, but in order to treat all applicant's fairly, we need to ensure that the business is being compliant.

12711 Imperial Highway

The Planning Commission, at their respective meeting of July 11, 2011, approved your request for Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 724 for the property located at 12711 Imperial Highway (APN's: 8026-042-014 & 017). As stated within the conditions of approval, your CUP was granted approval subject to a review of compliance after five (5) years. On March 7, 2017, you received written notice of several violations following two (2) site inspections that occurred on January 12, 2017 and February 14, 2017. Since then, two (2) of the seven (7) violations remain outstanding. The remaining violations include: 1) re-cladding of the existing metal buildings; and 2) consolidating the two (2) existing parcels into a single parcel.

On April 12, 2019, staff met with you to discuss the status of the outstanding items. At said meeting, it was concluded that you would have 90-days to submit the materials required to move forward. It was also agreed upon by both parties that if at the end of those 90-days the materials were not submitted, then staff would move forward with the revocation of the subject CUP. After approximately 30 months following the initial site inspection and multiple attempts to resolve the remaining items, the subject property continues to be in violation of the conditions; and therefore, staff will be requesting that the Planning Commission terminate (revoke) CUP Case No. 724.

This matter will be placed on the Planning Commission's agenda for their meeting of August 12, 2019, with a recommendation for termination.

APPLICANT'S WORK SCHEDULE

Based on Mr. Lake's proposed work plan (Attachment #3), the outstanding Lot Line Adjustment will go before the Planning Commission on or before the December 9th Planning Commission meeting.

To help reduce some of the financial burden, the applicant will strive to complete the façade treatment by June 30, 2020. This process will be begin by Mr. Lake submitting conceptual designs by January 15, 2020 with a formal submittal of a Development Plan Approval by March 5, 2020. Assuming that the Planning Commission approves the proposed design, Mr. Lake will immediately go through the plan check process and thereafter, obtain all necessary permits through all appropriate departments. As previously mentioned, Mr. Lake is targeting to have the project complete by the end of June 2020 and therefore, be in full compliance by the July 13, 2020 Planning Commission meeting.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff finds the proposed work plan, up to the submittal of a Development Plan Approval, has a strong likelihood of being accomplished. However, based on past projects, staff believes that a June 30, 2020 completion date seems far less likely to be achieved. If the proposed Development Plan Approval is submitted by March 5, 2020, there's a possibility that it doesn't get placed on a Planning Commission agenda for at least two to three months. Following an approval by the Planning Commission, it would typically take several months to go through plan check and thereafter, obtain the permits needed to begin construction. It would be much more realistic to target the end of March 2021 for an overall completion of the project.

Staff is recommending that the Planning Commission take one (1) of the following actions: 1) Find that the proposed work schedule is acceptable and allow the applicant up to July 13, 2020 to implement all items necessary to be in full compliance with the Conditions of Approval; 2) Find that the proposed work schedule is unacceptable and either recommend necessary changes or allow the applicant a final opportunity to work with staff to devise a plausible schedule to present to the Planning Commission for consideration; or 3) Find that the proposed work schedule is severely unacceptable, and therefore, proceed with the Revocation of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 724.

BACKGROUND

The Planning Commission, at their regularly scheduled meeting of July 11, 2011, originally approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 724 to allow the establishment, operation, and maintenance of an aluminum foundry with each furnace to exceed a capacity of 500 pounds and the combined capacity of furnaces to exceed 1,000 pounds. The subject property is located at 12711 Imperial Highway (APN's: 8026-042-014 & 017), within the M-2-BP, Heavy Manufacturing — Buffer Parking, Zone.

In 1993, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 822, requiring all non-conforming metal buildings and structures to be brought into conformity by means of demolishment or the application of a non-metallic façade treatment by the year 2013. Nevertheless, the Planning Commission should know that when it comes to addressing non-conforming metal buildings, the City understands the financial burden of bringing such buildings into compliance and thus have not been actively pursued compliance. Simply put, staff does not directly target or enforce immediate compliance. Instead, staff allows such buildings to remain non-conforming until improvements requiring a permit are proposed. Any improvements to a non-conforming metal building must not only

meet the requirements set forth in Ordinance No. 822 but all other city regulations.

Typically, a new CUP is approved with the requirement for a compliance review after one year. However, because the subject site contained two existing non-conforming metal buildings, the Planning Commission granted approval of the subject CUP, but provided the applicant with five years to allow sufficient time to meet all conditions of approval and bring said buildings into compliance with Ordinance No. 822.

Throughout the compliance review process, staff has tried to accommodate the applicant. On April 28, 2016, staff mailed the applicant a notice to inform him that the aforementioned CUP was subject to a review for compliance with the existing conditions of approval. Failing to respond to staff's initial notice, a second notice with sent to the applicant on June 30, 2016. A third and final notice was sent on December 12, 2016, via certified mail. On December 20, 2016, the applicant eventually provided staff with the required fee and materials needed to begin the compliance review process. After almost 8 months, staff received the necessary materials.

An initial walk-through inspection was conducted on January 12, 2017; however, due to poor weather conditions, staff had to schedule a follow-up visit. On February 14, 2017, staff conducted a second walk through inspection and provided the applicant with a written notice (Attachment #3) detailing the violations that were discovered during both inspection. Since then, the applicant has adequately addressed five (5) of the seven (7) violations that were identified. The two (2) remaining violations, which do have the largest financial impact to the applicant, include: 1) re-cladding of the existing metal buildings; and 2) consolidating the two (2) existing parcels into a single parcel.

Staff has continued to work with the applicant, Peter Lake, during the last twenty-nine (29) months by evaluating the progress and continually providing him with additional time to bring the subject use/property into full compliance. Until April of this year, staff had found previous actions by Mr. Lake to be a good-faith effort toward correcting the outstanding violations. Unfortunately, based on recent conversations and lack of effort by the applicant, staff now believes that Mr. Lake is no longer conveying that he has any intentions to satisfy the two remaining violations. Nevertheless, understanding the implications of a CUP revocation, staff met with Mr. Lake on April 12, 2019 to discuss the outstanding items. At the meeting, specific tasks and timelines where established to help ensure that continuous progress is made. It was concluded that the applicant would have 90-days to submit the materials required to move forward (Attachment #5). It was also agreed upon by both parties that, if at the end of those 90-days and the materials were not submitted, staff would move forward with the revocation of the subject CUP.

On July 10, 2019, Mr. Lake provided staff with a copy of a bid for a Tentative Parcel Map from one (1) engineering firm and a proposed idea for the façade. Mr. Lake Report Submitted By: Vince Velasco

proposed to grow vines up the building façade to cover the metallic material with vegetation, similar to an office building located along Katella Avenue within the City of Los Alamitos. It was explained to Mr. Lake that his proposal would not satisfy the requirements of the metal building ordinance as it would not be considered a contemporary building design.

It is evident by staff's actions to date, that it was never the intent to revoke the subject CUP or drive the subject business out of the city. Staff has patiently worked with the applicant for the last three years. In fact, staff has continued to provide the applicant with additional time as necessary, provided that progress toward full compliance was observed. Unfortunately, the lack of effort by the applicant during recent months has greatly diminished staff's confidence that full compliance will ever be met. At a minimum, staff's expectations after the 90-day period was for Mr. Lake to have signed an agreement to begin the process to merge the two parcels and to provide conceptual designs for the re-cladding; however, the applicant remains uncommitted to meeting the minimum requirements. After approximately 30 months, following the initial site inspection and multiple attempts to resolve the remaining items, the subject property continues to be in violation of the conditions without an adequate plan for resolution; and therefore, staff is requesting that the Planning Commission consider the revocation of CUP Case No. 724.

MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIREMENTS

City of Santa Fe Springs – Zoning Regulations Section 155.811 – GROUND FOR REVOCATION (B)

Any variance, modification, permit, or other approval may be revoked and nullified if it is found that any one of the following conditions apply:

(B) That the permit or variance has been or is being exercised contrary to the terms or conditions of approval, or is in violation of any statute, ordinance, law or regulation.

As previously described herein, staff believes there is sufficient evidence to confirm that the above-mentioned condition exist, and that there are adequate grounds to revoke the subject conditional use permit.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

Upon review of the proposed project, Staff finds the project would qualify for a categorical exemption pursuant to Section 15321, Class 21 (Enforcement Actions by Regulatory Agencies) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), in that the subject Conditional Use Permit is being exercised contrary to the conditions of approval, and therefore, the City is taking the action to revoke the Conditional Use Permit. Additional environmental analysis is therefore not necessary to meet the requirements of the CEQA. If the Planning Commission agrees, staff will file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk within 5 days from the date

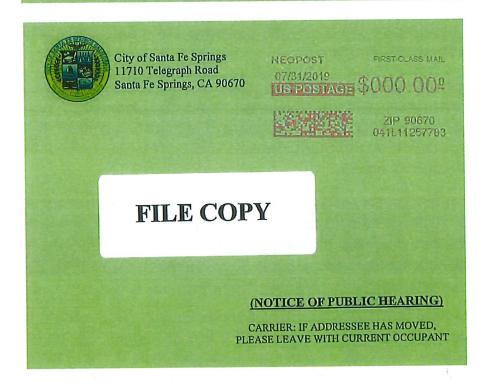

This is based on removal of the current cladding, adding whatever supports and attachment points an architect/engineer will require, and fastening on new materials to the south wall of the two buildings. Some examples of what might work well on the buildings:

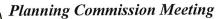

BACKGROUND

In accordance with Section 155.243 (D)(5) of City's Zoning Ordinance, meat processing facilities require approval of a Conditional Use Permit prior to the commencement of such activities. In June of 2005, the Planning Commission initially approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) Case No. 643, a request by St. Michael's Chicharon, to establish, operate and maintain a meat processing facility on the subject property. The use was subsequently reconsidered by the Planning Commission at its December 8, 2014 meeting.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

As is standard practice for all CUP compliance reviews, an inspection of the subject property was performed by City staff to ensure continued compliance with the conditions of approval prior to bringing the matter back to the Planning Commission. Following the initial walk-through inspection by the Planning Department on February 4, 2020, staff concluded the meat processing facility was operating in full compliance.

Staff, therefore, finds that if the meat processing facility continues to operate in strict compliance with the required conditions of approval, the use will continue to be compatible with the surrounding developments and will not pose a nuisance risk to the public and/or environment. Staff is, therefore, recommending that CUP 643-3 be subject to a compliance review in ten (10) years to ensure the use is still operating in compliance with the conditions of approval as contained in this staff report.

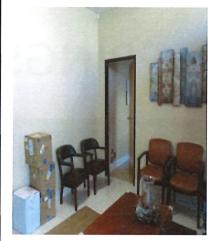

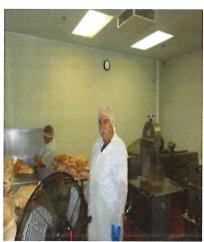

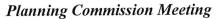

All cost shall be the responsibility of the Applicant, Bulletin Displays, LLC. (Satisfied)
- 21. That the applicant shall comply with the City's Heritage Artwork in Public Places Program" in conformance with City Ordinance No 909, if applicable (Satisfied)
- 22. That the applicant, Bulletin Displays, LLC shall be responsible for reviewing and/or providing copies of the required conditions of approval to his/her architect, engineer, contractor, etc. Additionally, the conditions of approval contained herein, shall be made part of the construction drawings. Construction drawings shall not

- be accepted for Plan Check without the conditions of approval incorporated in the construction drawings. (Satisfied)
- 23. That the proposed digital billboard shall otherwise be substantially in accordance with the plans submitted by the applicant and on file with the case. **(Ongoing)**
- 24. That the applicant, Bulletin Displays, LLC shall require and verify that all contractors and sub-contractors have successfully obtained a Business License with the City of Santa Fe Springs prior to beginning any work associated with the subject project. A late fee and penalty will be accessed to any contractor or subcontractor that fails to obtain a Business License. (Satisfied)
- 25. That the project shall comply with all other requirements of the City's Zoning Ordinance, Building Code, Property Maintenance Ordinance, State and City Fire Code, and all other applicable County, State and Federal regulations and codes (Ongoing)
- 26. That Conditional Use Permit Case No. 750 12 shall be subject to a compliance review in one (1) three (3) years, on or before July 9, 2019 March 9, 2023, to ensure the subject digital billboard use has been continuously maintained in strict compliance with conditions of approval as stated within the staff report. (Revised)
- 27. That the applicant, Bulletin Displays, LLC, agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City or its agents, officers or employees to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval of the City or any of its councils, commissions, committees or boards arising from or in any way related to the subject CUP and/or ZV, or any actions or operations conducted pursuant thereto. Should the City, its agents, officers or employees receive notice of any such claim, action or proceeding, the City shall promptly notify the applicant of such claim, action or proceeding, and shall cooperate fully in the defense thereof. (Ongoing)
- 28. It is hereby declared to be the intent that if any provision of this Permit is violated, or if any law, statute or ordinance is violated, the Permit shall be void and the privileges granted hereunder shall lapse. Prior to voiding the permit, the City shall contact Bulletin Displays, LLC with certified mail return receipt requested and list the specific facts indicating a violation and its applicable code provisions and allow Bulletin Displays, LLC to remedy the violation within seven (7) working days from receipt of the notice or a reasonable amount of time if a remedy cannot be reasonably done in seven (7) days. (Ongoing)
- 29. If any term or provision of this CUP shall be determined invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining conditions shall not be affected and such remaining

conditions are not rendered impractical to enforce or to otherwise deprive Bulletin Displays, LLC or the city of the benefits of this CUP. **(Ongoing)**

787, the Planning Commission concurrently approved Development Plan Approval Case No. 936 to allow for the construction of a new 128,896 sq. ft. mini-warehouse facility along with a new 1,200 sq. ft. office building; and Tentative Parcel Map No. 82031 to allow for the consolidation of seven (7) parcels into a single parcel, measuring 67,260 sq. ft.

TIME EXTENSIONS

Tentative Parcel Map

In accordance with California Government Code Section 66452.6, a tentative parcel map, which has not been utilized within 24 months, shall be null and void. The Code, however, provides that an extension of 12 months be granted by a local agency.

Development Plan Approval

In accordance with Section 155.745 of the City's Zoning Regulation (see Code Section below), a development plan approval, which has not been utilized within 12 months, shall become null and void. The Code, however, provides that an extension of time be granted by Commission or Council action.

City of Santa Fe Springs – Zoning Regulations Section 155.745 – Expiration

Unless otherwise specified in the action granting a conditional use permit, said conditional use permit which has not been utilized within 12 months from the effective date shall become null and void. Also the abandonment or nonuse of a conditional use permit for a period of 12 consecutive months shall terminate said conditional use permit and any privileges granted thereunder shall become null and void. However, an extension of time may be granted by Commission or Council action.

Conditional Use Permit

In accordance with the approved Conditions of Approval, Conditional Use Permit Case No. 787 shall be subject to a compliance review on or before May 14, 2020. Since the approved mini-warehouse has not been constructed, the applicant is requesting for a one (1) year extension for the compliance review.

TENTATIVE PARCEL MAP (TPM 82031-1)

Request for approval to consolidate seven (7) existing lots into one parcel measuring +/- 67,260 sq. ft. (1 .54 acres) on property located at 11212 Norwalk Blvd., within M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, and C-4, Community Commercial, Zones. As mention previously, the seven (7) existing lots were previously consolidated through a lot tie, which is not recognized by the Subdivision Map Act, therefore, the applicant is seeking for approval to consolidate all seven (7) existing lots via Tentative Parcel Map 82031.

DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL (DPA 936)

As stated previously, the applicant is requesting approval of Development Approval (DPA) Case No. 936: to allow for the construction of a new 128,896 sq. ft. miniwarehouse facility and a new 1,200 sq. ft. office building on the subject property.

Site Plan

The proposed development will consist of a four (4) story mini-warehouse facility and a detached single-story office building. The proposed office building will be setback a minimum of 24' from the street facing property lines along Norwalk Blvd. It should be noted that the proposed office building is located within C-4, Community Commercial, Zone while the proposed mini-warehouse facility is located within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone. As a result, the proposed office building meets the minimum setback requirements for properties within the C-4. The proposed mini-warehouse facility will be setback a minimum of 140' from the street facing the property line along Norwalk Blvd. As a result, the proposed mini-warehouse facility meets the minimum setback requirements for properties within the M-2. The proposed development will provide two driveways along Norwalk Blvd. for ingress and egress. It should be noted that the southerly driveway is a shared driveway with the property to the south.

Floor Plan

The floor plan indicates that the proposed single-story office building will have 1,200 sq. ft. of building area with the main entrance located along the north side of the building. The proposed mini-warehouse facility will have four (4) stories of storage area totaling 128,896 sq. ft. with one (1) entrances located along the west portion of the building. All four (4) floors will have one (1) elevator, a lobby and a mini-storage area totaling 32,224 sq. ft. each.

Elevations

The elevations for the proposed office building reflects a contemporary design. The entry to the office building (north elevation) is provided with extensive glazing, canopy, and decorative roofing. The remaining elevations have been provided with a combination of the aforementioned architectural treatments, which results in an aesthetically pleasing building. The height of the proposed office building will be 30 feet.

Landscaping Requirements

The minimum landscape requirements for the proposed development, based on the overall street frontage of approximately 228', is 5,700 sq. ft. According to the submitted plan, the applicant will be providing a total of 8,800 sq. ft. of landscaping throughout the subject property, with a minimum 827 sq. ft. of landscaping within the parking area. The project, therefore, exceeds the minimum landscaping requirement set forth in the City's Zoning Regulation. As required by the City Code, the applicant will landscape at least 6% of the parking area.

Parking Requirements

Per the City's Zoning Regulation, the subject property is required to provide a total of 13 parking stalls.

 Proposed Development - 130,096 sq. ft. of mini-warehouse: 1 stall per 10,000 sq. ft. = 13 stalls.

A total of 14 parking stalls will be provided for the entire site: 11 standard stalls, 2 accessible stalls, and 1 electric vehicle stall. The project, therefore, exceeds the minimum requirement set forth in the City's Zoning Regulations.

Loading Doors

The proposed building will have 12 loading doors, along the west elevation. It should be noted that the loading doors are place strategically away from public view with screen wall and gate.

Trash Enclosures

According to the site plan, one (1) 18'-8" x 8'-8" (161.79 sq. ft.) trash enclosure will be constructed along the northern portion of the property. The size of the trash enclosure might change should the Building Department find it to be deficient.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP 787)

Concurrent with DPA 936, the applicant, is requesting approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to allow for the establishment, operation, and maintenance of miniwarehouse facility use within the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing, Zone. It should be noted that the proposed mini-warehouse facility is located within the M-2 Zone portion of the site.

In accordance with Section 155.637(A) of the City's Zoning Regulations, a mini-warehouse facility shall be permitted in the M-1 and M-2 Zones only after a valid CUP has first been issued.

STAFF CONSIDERATIONS

The applicant, JSF Management, LLC, is currently working with the property owner regarding the purchase of the subject property. The applicant, therefore, is requesting a one (1) year time extension of Conditional Use Permit Case No. 787. Providing the applicant with a time extension to their CUP will keep the CUP valid and allow the applicant to continue their process to negotiate the purchasing agreement of the subject property. Staff is confident that the applicant will finalized the negotiation within the next year.

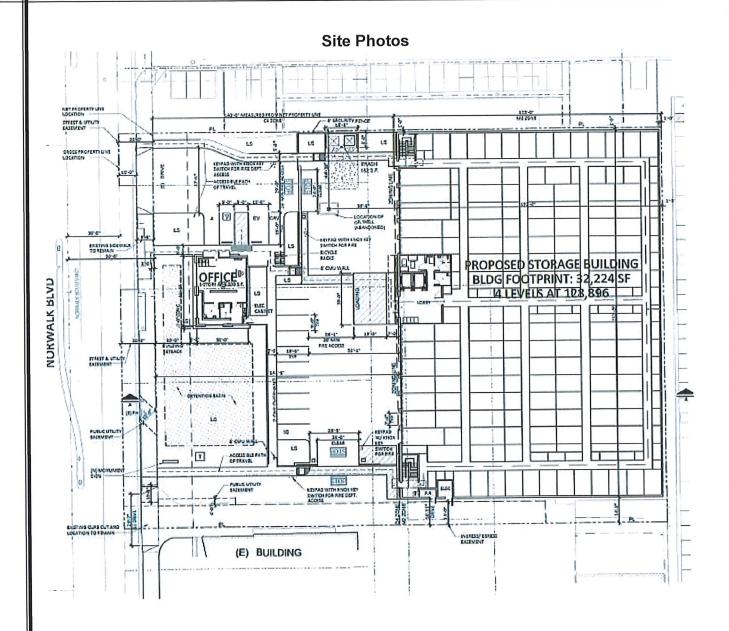

DEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVAL (DPA 936-1)

ENGINEERING / PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

- 1. That the applicant shall pay a flat fee of \$ 5,381 to reconstruct/resurface the existing street frontage to City limit for Norwalk Boulevard.
- 2. That the applicant shall design and construct a 5-foot wide meandering sidewalk per City standards and dedicate an easement along the Norwalk Boulevard street frontage. If applicable, the dedicated easement shall be shown on the Parcel/Tract Map. In addition, the applicant shall remove and construct two driveways per City Standard R-6.4C. Furthermore, said meandering sidewalk and Driveways shall be shown on both the civil and landscape plans.
- 3. That adequate "on-site" parking shall be provided per City requirements, and all streets abutting the development shall be posted "No Stopping Any Time." The City will install the offsite signs and the applicant shall pay \$ 400 to install (2) new sings.
- 4. Proposed driveways shall be located to clear existing fire hydrants, street lights, water meters, etc.
- 5. Storm drains, catch basins, connector pipes, retention basin and appurtenances built for this project shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications in Norwalk Boulevard. Storm drain plans shall be approved by the City Engineer.
- 6. Fire hydrants shall be installed as required by the Fire Department. Existing public fire hydrants adjacent to the site, if any, shall be upgraded if required by the City Engineer. That the applicant shall pay to the City the entire cost of design, engineering, installation and inspection of Fire hydrants.
- 7. That sanitary sewers shall be constructed in accordance with City specifications to serve the subject development. The plans for the sanitary sewers shall be approved by the City Engineer. A sewer study (including a sewer flow test) shall be submitted along with the sanitary sewer plans.
- 8. All buildings shall be connected to the sanitary sewers.
- 9. That the fire sprinkler plans, which show the proposed double-check valve detector assembly location, shall have a stamp approval from the Planning Department and Public Works Department prior to the Fire Department's review for approval. Disinfection, pressure and bacteriological testing on the line between the street

- and detector assembly shall be performed in the presence of personnel from the City Water Department. The valve on the water main line shall be operated only by the City and only upon the City's approval of the test results.
- 10. That the applicant shall obtain a Storm Drain Connection Permit for any connection to the storm drain system.
- 11. That the applicant shall connect the landscape irrigation system to reclaimed water, if available, on Norwalk Boulevard. Separate meter(s) shall be installed to accommodate connection or future connection of irrigation systems to the reclaimed water line.
- 12. The applicant shall have an overall site utility master plan prepared by a Registered Civil Engineer showing proposed location of all public water mains, reclaimed water mains, sanitary sewers and storm drains. This plan shall be approved by the City Engineer prior to the preparation of any construction plans for the aforementioned improvements.
- 13. The applicant shall submit a traffic study prepared by a Professional Engineer. The traffic study shall show the present traffic in the area and projected traffic after the development of the property. Any improvements or mitigation measures including installation of traffic signals and/or modifications, the installation of additional left turn lanes or deceleration lanes, the lengthening of left turn lanes or other median modifications, etc. that are warranted based on the study, the applicant and/or developer shall pay to the City the full cost of design engineering, installation and inspection of the improvements. The City will design and cause construction of the improvements.
- 14. That all point of access to the proposed development shall be reviewed and approved by the City Engineer. Left turns may be prohibited as designated by the City Engineer.
- 15. That the applicant shall comply with Congestion Management Program (CMP) requirements and provide mitigation of trips generated by the development. The applicant and/or developer will receive credit for the demolition of any buildings that formerly occupied the site. For new developments, the applicant and/or developer cannot meet the mitigation requirements, the applicant and/or developer shall pay a mitigation fee to be determined by the City Engineer for off-site transportation improvements.
- 16. That the applicant shall comply with all requirements of the County Sanitation District, make application for and pay the sewer maintenance fee.
- 17. That the applicant shall pay the water trunkline connection fee of \$3,700 per acre upon application for water service connection or if utilizing any existing water service.

- 18. That a grading plan shall be submitted for drainage approval to the City Engineer. The applicant shall pay drainage review fees in conjunction with this submittal. A professional civil engineer registered in the State of California shall prepare the grading plan.
- 19. That a hydrology study shall be submitted to the City if requested by the City Engineer. The study shall be prepared by a Professional Civil Engineer.
- 20. That upon completion of public improvements constructed by developers, the developer's civil engineer shall submit mylar record drawings and an electronic file (AutoCAD Version 2004 or higher) to the office of the City Engineer.
- 21. That the applicant shall comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program and shall require the general contractor to implement storm water/urban runoff pollution prevention controls and Best Management Practices (BMPs) on all construction sites in accordance with the current MS4 Permit. The applicant will also be required to submit a Certification for the project and will be required to prepare a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and Low Impact Development Plan (LID).

- 22. That the applicant shall comply with the Alternate Design Proposal provided by Response Fire Protection in lieu of the required fire department access roads.
- 23. That all buildings over 5,000 sq ft shall be protected by an approved automatic sprinkler system per Section 93.11 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code.
- 24. That the applicant shall comply with the requirements of Section 117.131 of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code, Requirement for a Soil Gas Study, in accordance with Ordinance No. 955, prior to issuance of building permits.
- 25. To prevent the travel of combustible methane gas into any structure, all slab or foundation penetrations, including plumbing, communication and electrical penetrations, must be sealed with an appropriate material. In addition, underground electrical conduits penetrating the slab or foundation of the structure, shall comply with the National Electrical Code (NEC), replete with a seal-off device normally required for classified electrical installations, so as to prevent the travel of combustible methane gas into the structure through conduit runs.
- When applicable, abandoned oil wells must be exposed and inspected under the oversight of a registered engineer or geologist. The wells must be monitored for methane leaks and the precise location of each abandoned well shall be surveyed. A report of findings along with a description of any recommended remedial actions needed to comply with the Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources, signed by a registered engineer or geologist, must be provided to the Fire Department

- 27. That interior gates or fences are not permitted across required Fire Department access roadways unless otherwise granted prior approval by the City Fire Department.
- 28. That if on-site fire hydrants are required by the Fire Department, a minimum flow must be provided at 1,313 gpm with a residual pressure of 20 psi flowing from the most remote hydrant. This flow is based on a maximum fire-flow calculation area of 129,000 square feet and Type IIA construction. If a larger fire-flow calculation area is used or the construction type is changed, Fire Department approval must be obtained. In addition, on-site hydrants must have current testing, inspection and maintenance per California Title 19 and NFPA 25.
- 29. That the standard aisle width for onsite emergency vehicle maneuvering shall be 26 feet with a minimum clear height of 13 feet 6 inches. Internal driveways shall have a turning radius of not less than 52 feet. The final location and design of this 26 feet shall be subject to the approval of the City's Fire Chief as established by the Uniform Fire Code. A request to provide emergency vehicle aisle width less than 26 feet shall be considered upon the installation/provision of mitigation improvements approved by the City's Fire Chief.
- 30. That prior to submitting plans to the Building Department, a preliminary site plan shall be approved by the Fire Department for required access roadways and onsite fire hydrant locations. The site plan shall be drawn at a scale between 20 to 40 feet per inch. Include on plan all entrance gates that will be installed.
- 31. That Knox boxes are required on all new construction. All entry gates shall also be equipped with Knox boxes or Knox key switches for power-activated gates.
- That signs and markings required by the Fire Department shall be installed along the required Fire Department access roadways.

- 33. That prior to issuance of building permits, the applicant shall comply with the applicable conditions below and **obtain notification in writing** from the Santa Fe Springs Department of Fire-Rescue Environmental Protection Division (EPD) that all applicable conditions have been met:
 - a. At a minimum, the applicant must conduct an All Appropriate Inquiries (AAI) Investigation (formerly called a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment) in accordance with ASTM Standard E1527-05. The applicant shall provide the EPD with a copy of the AAI investigation report for review and approval. If the AAI investigation identifies a release, or potential release at the site, the applicant must comply with part b.
 - b. An environmental site assessment may be required based on the information presented in the AAI investigation report. The

- environmental site assessment report must be reviewed and approved by the EPD in writing. Should the report indicate that contaminate levels exceed recognized regulatory screening levels, remedial action will be required. A remedial action work plan must be approved by the authorized oversight agency before implementation. Once remedial action is complete, a final remedial action report must be submitted and approved by the oversight agency.
- c. Soil Management Plan & Report. A Soils Management Plan (SMP) which addresses site monitoring and a contingency plan for addressing previously unidentified contamination discovered during site development activities may be required. If required, the SMP shall be submitted to the EPD for review and approval before grading activities begin. Once grading is complete, a SMP report must be submitted to the EPD for final written approval. Building plans will not be approved until the SMP report has been approved by the EPD in writing.
- 34. <u>Permits and approvals</u>. That the applicant shall, at its own expense, secure or cause to be secured any and all permits or other approvals which may be required by the City and any other governmental agency prior to conducting environmental assessment or remediation on the property. 38. That the applicant shall submit and obtain approval of a proposed lighting (photometric) plan for the property from the City's Department of Police Services. The photometric plan shall be designed to provide adequate lighting (minimum of 1 foot candle power) throughout the subject property. Further, all exterior lighting shall be designed/installed in such a manner that light and glare are not transmitted onto adjoining properties in such concentration/quantity as to create a hardship to adjoining property owners or a public nuisance. The photometric plans shall be

- submitted to the Director of Police Services no later than sixty (60) day from the date of approval by the Planning Commission.
- 39. That the applicant shall provide an emergency phone number and a contact person of the person or persons involved in the supervision of the construction to the Department of Police Services. The name, telephone number, fax number and email address of that person shall be provided to the Director of Police Services no later than 60 days from the date of approval by the Planning Commission. Emergency information shall allow emergency service to reach the applicant or their representative any time, 24 hours a day.
- 40. That in order to facilitate the removal of unauthorized vehicles parked on the property, the applicant shall post, in plain view and at each entry to the property, a sign not less than 17" wide by 22" long. The sign shall prohibit the public parking of unauthorized vehicles and indicate that unauthorized vehicles will be removed at the owner's expense and also contain the California Vehicle Code that permits this action. The sign shall also contain the telephone number of the local law enforcement agency (Police Services Center (562) 409-1850). The lettering within the sign shall not be less than one inch in height. The applicant shall contact the Police Services Center for an inspection no later than 30 days after the project has been completed and prior to the occupancy permit being issued.
- 41. That the proposed buildings, including any lighting, fences, walls, cabinets, and poles shall be maintained in good repair, free from trash, debris, litter and graffiti and other forms of vandalism. Any damage from any cause shall be repaired within 72 hours of occurrence, weather permitting, to minimize occurrences of dangerous conditions or visual blight. Paint utilized in covering graffiti shall be a color that matches, as closely possible, the color of the existing and/or adjacent surfaces.
- 42. That during the construction phase of the proposed project, the contractor shall provide an identification number (i.e. address number) at each building and/or entry gate to direct emergency vehicles in case of an emergency. The identification numbers may be painted on boards and fastened to the temporary construction fence. The boards may be removed after each building has been identified with their individual permanent number address.
- 43. That it shall be the responsibility of the job-supervisor to maintain the job site in a clean and orderly manner. Dirt and debris that has migrated to the street or neighboring properties shall be immediately cleaned. Porte-potties, or equal, shall not be visible from the public street and maintained on a regular basis.

the Mitigated Negative Declaration, shall be made part of the conditions of approval for Development Plan Approval Case No. 936 and Conditional Use Permit Case No. 787. The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program is listed as an attachment to the staff report.

- 53. That the owner/developer shall implement a dust control program for air quality control. The program shall ensure that a water vehicle for dust control operations is kept readily available at all times during construction. The developer shall provide the City Engineer and Building Official with the name, telephone number and e-mail address of the person directly responsible for dust control and operation of the vehicle.
- 54. That during construction, the following information shall be made available on a sign posted at the main entrance(s) to the site:

The sign proposal (plan) shall include a site plan, building elevation on which the sign will be located, size, style and color of the proposed sign. All drawings shall be properly dimensioned and drawn to scale on 11" x 17" maximum-size paper. All signs shall be installed in accordance with the sign standards of the Zoning Ordinance and the Sign Guidelines of the City.
- 72. That all approved outdoor trash enclosures shall be provided for the development subject to the approval of the Director of Planning or designee. The calculation to determine the required storage area shall be determine by the City Building Department.
- 73. All outdoor trash enclosures shall provide a solid roof cover.
- 74. The applicant shall not allow commercial vehicles, trucks and/or truck tractors to queue on Norwalk Blvd., use street(s) as a staging area, or to backup onto the street from the subject property.
- 75. The proposed building shall be constructed of quality material and any material shall be replaced when and if the material becomes deteriorated, warped, discolored or rusted.
- 76. Approved suite numbers/letters or address numbers shall be placed on the proposed building in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street fronting the property. Said numbers shall contrast with their background. The size recommendation shall be 12" minimum.
- 77. That all parking stalls shall be legibly marked off on the pavement, showing the required parking spaces. Additionally, all compact spaces shall be further identified by having the words "Compact" or comparable wording legibly written on pavement, wheel stop or on a clearly visible sign.
- 78. That prior to issuance of building permits, the applicant shall comply with the following conditions to the satisfaction of the City of Santa Fe Springs:

Applicant shall provide a written covenant to the City that, based on reasonable investigation and inquiry, to the best of applicant's knowledge, it does not know or have reasonable cause to believe that it is in violation of any notification, remediation or other requirements of any federal, state or local agency having jurisdiction concerning the environmental conditions of the Property.
- b. Applicant understands and agrees that it is the responsibility of the applicant to investigate and remedy, pursuant to applicable federal, state and local law, any and all contamination on or under any land or structure affected by this approval and issuance of related building permits. The City, Commission, Planning Commission or their employees, by this approval and by issuing related building permits, in no way warrants that said land or structures are free from contamination or health hazards.
- c. - 80. A brief presentation on the 2020 Census

RECOMMENDATION

• The Chairperson may wish to call upon, Cuong Nguyen, Senior Planner, to assist with this presentation.

BACKGROUND

The decennial census has been conducted every 10 years since 1790 and Census 2020 is right around the corner. The census helps shape many different aspects of your community that will not only determine our representation in Congress and redistricting at all levels of government, but also determine how over \$675 billion is distributed each year to communities nationwide for education, healthcare, housing, transportation, and other vital programs.

In Santa Fe Springs, we want everyone to know that everybody belongs and everybody counts. To help ensure that our city has a complete, fair and accurate count in 2020, the City has formed a Complete Count Committee that will be working closely with the Census Bureau on a strategic and concerted effort to engage, educate, and encourage every community member to participate in the upcoming census.
