NEW BUSINESS

Vehicle Code Changes for 2012

RECOMMENDATION

This report is for informational purposes only and does not require any action by the Traffic Commission.

BACKGROUND

There were over 4,200 new bill proposals that were introduced during the 2011 legislative session. Out of that total, approximately 745 were eventually enacted into law, which resulted in over 130 changes to the California Vehicle Code.

The following is a listing of selected motor vehicle/driver-related laws that went into effect on January 1, 2012:

HOV Lanes/Green Stickers (SB 535, Yee). Green clean air vehicle stickers pending federal approval will be available as of January 1, 2012 and will be valid through January 1, 2015 to the first 40,000 applicants that purchase or lease vehicles meeting California's enhanced advanced technology partial zero emission vehicle requirements, which also includes plug-in hybrid vehicles. The sunset date for the white stickers issued to fully-electric and compressed natural gas vehicles was extended until January 1, 2015.

<u>Electric Vehicles (EV) (AB 475, Butler)</u>. EV must now be plugged in for refueling when occupying an EV designated parking space, otherwise they can be towed. In addition, the law prohibits a person from obstructing, blocking, or otherwise barring access to an EV-designated parking space.

<u>Driving Under the Influence (AB 1601, Hill).</u> Courts can order a 10-year driver license revocation of any California motorist convicted of a third or subsequent DUI violation, with possible reinstatement after five years if specified conditions are met; specifically the installation of an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) in their vehicle. The law allows the DMV to terminate this restricted license if the IID requirements are not met.

National Database Check for Vehicle Sales (AB 1215, Blumenfield). This law requires all vehicles offered for sale in California to be checked against the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) database to disclose past vehicle damage such as flooding or severe collisions. New vehicle dealers will also be electronically transmitting information to the DMV, ensuring faster delivery of registration documents and license plates to customers. The new law will take effect July 1, 2012.

Child Passenger Safety Seats (SB 929, Evans). A change to California's Child Passenger Safety Seat law will now require children to ride in either a car seat or booster seat until the age of eight, or until they reach a height of four feet, nine inches (4' 9"). This law also requires children who do not meet the age or height requirement to ride in the rear seat of a vehicle unless the vehicle has no back seats, the restraint system cannot be properly installed or the rear seats are already occupied by children under age eight. However, the law still maintains that a child may not ride in the front seat of a vehicle with an active passenger airbag if they are under one year of age, less than 20 pounds, or riding in a rear-facing child safety seat.

<u>Sobriety checkpoints (AB 353, Cedillo).</u> Drivers are required to stop and submit to a sobriety checkpoint. However, peace officers will be prohibited from impounding a vehicle for 30 days out of a sobriety checkpoint if the only offense by the driver is failing to hold a valid driver license. The new law requires that the officer make a reasonable attempt to identify the registered owner in order to release the vehicle.

Reckless Driving (AB 520, Ammiano). Anyone who is convicted of reckless driving under Section 23103.5 of the Vehicle Code can apply for a restricted driver license prior to the completion of their one-year suspension, provided they meet specified conditions, including the installation of an Ignition Interlock Device in their vehicle.

<u>Crossing of Solid White Lines (AB 1105, Gordon).</u> Vehicles are now prohibited from crossing double parallel white lines that are commonly found in carpool lanes on highways except when entering or exiting designated areas of exclusive or preferential use lanes, as provided.

Advertising Signs on Motor Vehicles (AB 1298, Blumenfield). Local governments can now regulate advertising signs on any motor vehicle parked or left standing upon a public street, except for signs that are painted directly upon or permanently affixed to the vehicle for permanent decoration, identification, or display that do not extend the overall length, width, or height of the vehicle.

<u>Santa Monica Buses (AB 607, Brownley).</u> The City of Santa Monica can now operate 25 city-owned buses with illuminated signs displaying advertising messages. This pilot program is authorized through January 1, 2017.

1. CALL TO ORDER

NEW BUSINESS

4. Traffic Bureau Report – January 2012

Officer Igros reviewed the Traffic Bureau Report for the month of January. The report reflected that there were 53 accidents reported during the month of January 2012, a slight increase from January 2011. There were six driving under the influence incidents; one bicycle incident and three pedestrian incidents. There were fifteen hit and run accidents reported. Moving Citations, Moving Violations and Parking Violations all decreased from January 2012 compared to January 2011. The Traffic Enforcement Index was at 3.4 for the month. The intersections with the most accidents for the month were Norwalk Boulevard/Los Nietos Road, Norwalk Boulevard/Florence Avenue and Painter Avenue and Florence Avenue.

Vice Chairperson Radoumis made a motion to receive and file the report for January 2012; Commissioner Berg seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Puentes made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Traffic Commission meeting of January 19, 2012 and Vice Chairperson Radoumis seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

6. **COMMUNICATIONS**
