4. Traffic Bureau Report – September 2018

Sargent Reed reviewed the Traffic Bureau Report for the month of September 2018. The report reflects 67 collisions, which is an increase of seven (7) compared to sixty (60) in September 2017. There were three (3) collisions involving persons driving under the influence of alcohol/drugs; zero (0) pedestrians and one (1) bicycle collisions. There were twenty-six (26) hit-and-run collisions and ten (10) collisions involving damage to city property reported. The three high collision intersections for the month were Pioneer Boulevard/Florence Avenue (1); Shoemaker Avenue/Meyer Road (1) and Telegraph Road/Bartley Avenue (1).

6. COMMUNICATIONS

Commission

Commissioner Collins is pleased with the traffic flow along Florence Avenue.

Commissioner Coca inquired about the City's current RV parking restrictions. Mr. Lopez indicated that currently there is no restriction pertaining strictly to RV's but there is a blanket 6,000 pound weight restriction on all residential streets. The problem is the restriction is difficult to enforce since several large pick-up trucks and sports utility vehicles exceed 6,000 pounds and therefore are technically not allowed on residential streets. He noted that the City is currently conducting a review of RV parking ordinances that have been adopted by adjacent cities, LA County and Orange County cities to determine what would be the most effective for use in the City.

Commissioner Coca noted that, on Pioneer Boulevard south of Rivera Road, the backing of large trucks into Western Corrugated Design Company are creating traffic congestion and traffic back-ups in the area.

Mr. Lopez indicated that bids were opened for the Florence Avenue Street Rehabilitation project and that Council awarded the project at their October 11, 2018 meeting. The project involves street resurfacing and the new striping will accommodate autonomous vehicles.
