4. <u>Traffic Bureau Report – November 2019</u>

Sergeant Reed reviewed the Traffic Bureau Report for the month of November 2019. The report reflects sixty-one (61) collisions, which is the same compared to sixty-one in November 2018. There were six (6) collisions involving persons driving under the influence of alcohol/drugs; one (1) pedestrian and zero (0) bicycle collisions. There were twenty-one (21) hit-and-run collisions and eleven (11) collisions involving damage to city property reported. The Collisions to Date for November 2019, reflect three (3) Fatal; two hundred-seventy (217) Injury, and three hundred-seventy five (375) Property Damage. The three high collision intersections for the month were Florence Avenue/Norwalk Boulevard-3 (Speed); Arlee Avenue/Sunglow Street-1 (DUI); and Broadway/Washington Boulevard-1 (Pedestrian, Right-of-Way).

Commissioner Collins asked if the City has kept the overtime traffic officer enforcement program in effect.

Sergeant Reed indicated that the program was renewed. However, as a result of the recent four fatalities (combined totals for Santa Fe Springs and Whittier) they had to move staff around on Monday and on Wednesday, but will be fully staffed tomorrow.

Commissioner Collins and Vice Chairperson Coca asked about the status of the proposal to revise the 6,000 pound weight limit for large vehicle parking restrictions.

Mr. Lopez indicated that the results of a preliminary survey done of the surrounding cities indicate that the adjacent cities are either using a 6,000 pound limit or a 10,000 pound limit. One city (Bellflower) is using an 8,000 pound limit.

Commissioner Miranda indicated that the crosswalk lights on Whiteland Street and Orr & Day Road are fixed.
