#### ALL APPLICANTS MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be a resident of Santa Fe Springs.
- 2. Be a senior currently attending Santa Fe High School.
- 3. Provide proof of application to or acceptance from college(s).
- 4. Include a cover letter with application.
- 5. Proof of good moral character, citizenship, and ethics via a reference letter from a counselor, teacher, or businessperson or professional.
- 6. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 for the four years of high school.
  - Must submit an unofficial transcript of high school grades with application.
- 7. Participated in at least one athletic program each year during three years in high school.
- 8. Demonstrated strong leadership qualities during participation in sports programs.

He attended California State University Los Angeles receiving both his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in the School of Administration. Mr. Sandoval also took post-graduate courses at the University of Southern California.

He married his wife Nancy in 1948 and had two children: Ronald and Leova.

He retired from El Rancho Unified School District after 32 years of service as an Educator, Career Counselor, Vice-Principal, and Principal.

Santa Fe Springs was his home for 35 years and some of his community involvements include:

- Councilmember from 1985 to 1990 (served as Mayor for one term)
