UPDATE ON CLOSURES AND CANCELLATIONS IN RESPONSE TO CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

The City of Santa Fe Springs continues to monitor guidelines from federal, state and county officials regarding the coronavirus. Due to the recent surge of Coronavirus cases, Los Angeles County continues the implementation of the temporary new Safer at Home Health Officer Order to maintain control of COVID-19 as the vaccination distribution process begins across the county. Established protocols continued to be followed to prevent more cases, more serious illnesses, increased hospitalizations, and more deaths. Based on these directives designed to limit the spread of COVID-19, the City will maintain facility closures to the public until further notice. The reopening date of City facilities for public access is to be determined. All in-person programs and events remain cancelled through May 2021 and some have been modified to virtual programs and activities. The health and safety of City residents remains one of our top priorities, therefore, preventing public interaction during this pandemic will help reduce the exposure to COVID-19.

As a reminder, essential services such as Police, Fire-Rescue, Infrastructure, and Transportation Services for seniors and persons with disabilities are still being offered. Please see below for updates on City operations.

 be done via telephone or email. In-person tax return preparation will not be offered this year due to covid-19. For

- City parks and playgrounds remain open for passive recreation only; however, safety guidelines have been implemented to keep patrons safe. Park amenities such as restrooms, sports fields, basketball, handball & volleyball courts, as well horseshoe pits remain closed. Batting cages at Little Lake Park are also closed. Please visit our website for the park's hours of operation.

Older Adult Services

- SASSFA continues to provide frozen meals to the older adults who have registered. Santa Fe Springs residents may contact a Case Worker at the Gus Velasco Neighborhood Center to receive assistance in securing food.
